Country Fire Authority Acts.

CREATION OF A NEW URBAN FIRE DISTRICT IN
THE SEVENTEENTH FIRE CONTROL REGION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation of the Governor in Council issued on the twentieth day of February, 1945, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-first day of February, 1945, for the purposes of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944*, certain parts of the country area of Victoria were proclaimed as fire control regions; and certain parts of such fire control regions were proclaimed to be urban fire districts; and the remainder (if any) of each such fire control region (being the area not included in any urban fire district) was proclaimed to be a rural fire district:

And whereas by section sixteen of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944* it is (amongst other things) enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after consideration of a report submitted by the Country Fire Authority by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, create any new urban fire district and amend or alter the boundaries of rural fire districts within any fire control region:

And whereas the Governor in Council has from time to time by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* made certain variations in respect of rural and urban fire districts:

And whereas the Country Fire Authority has submitted a report that it is necessary and desirable that the part of the Seventeenth Fire Control Region which is described in the Schedule hereto should be created an urban fire district and that a corresponding alteration of the boundaries of the rural fire district within the Seventeenth Fire Control Region should be made:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State after consideration of the said report of the Country Fire Authority and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Country Fire Authority Acts, do by this my Proclamation—

- (a) create as a new urban fire district that part of the Seventeenth Fire Control Region which is described in the Schedule hereto; and
- (b) alter the boundaries of the rural fire district within the Seventeenth Fire Control Region to the extent rendered necessary by the excision of the part of such region which is described as aforesaid.

SCHEDULE.

Part of Seventeenth Fire Control Region Referred to.

That part of the Seventeenth Fire Control Region comprising those portions of the municipal district of the Shire of Kowree, Parish of Edenhope, County of Lowan, contained within the boundaries of the Township of Edenhope, as proclaimed on the tenth day of March, 1953, and published on page 1184 of *Government Gazette* No. 209, dated the eighteenth day of March, 1953, together with that part of the Seventeenth Fire Control Region being those portions of the municipal district of the aforesaid shire enclosed within the boundaries specified hereunder, that is to say:—

Commencing at the north eastern angle of the aforementioned Township of Edenhope; thence along a northerly projection of the eastern boundary of the township for a distance of ten chains; thence due west by a line to the shore of Lake Wallace; thence generally in a south-westerly direction by the shore of Lake Wallace to the boundary of the aforementioned Township of Edenhope; then in a southerly and easterly direction by the last mentioned boundary to the point of commencement.

ELECTION BY GROUPS OF COUNCILS OF MEMBERS OF THE
MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.

PURSUANT to the provisions of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby repeal the Regulations for Election by Groups of Councils of Members of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works made on the ninth day of January, 1945, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the tenth day of January, 1945, and in lieu thereof doth make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. In these Regulations "Board" means the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works.

2. The councils of the municipalities of Melton and Werribee shall comprise the South Western Group.

3. The councils of the municipalities of Bulla and Keilor shall comprise the North-Western Group.

4. The councils of the municipalities of Whittlesea and Eltham shall comprise the North-Eastern Group.

5. The councils of the municipalities of Mulgrave and Dandenong shall comprise the South-Eastern Group.

6. Every election under these Regulations shall be held under the direction of a returning officer appointed for the purpose by the Governor in Council.

7. In the case of each of the aforesaid groups, on or before the first Monday in February, 1954, and in the case of the South-Western Group on or before the first Monday in February in the year 1955 and every third year thereafter, and in the case of the North-Western and North-Eastern Groups on or before the first Monday in February in the year 1956 and every third year thereafter, and in the case of the South-Eastern Group on or before the first Monday in February in the year 1957 and every third year thereafter, the councils comprising the relevant group shall nominate a member of a council in the group to be a representative of such group on the Board.

8. The name of the councillor nominated by any council as aforesaid shall be forwarded to the Returning Officer so as to reach him not later than Four o'clock in the afternoon of the Thursday next following the aforesaid Monday.

9. If by the hour fixed in clause 8 hereof only one candidate is nominated by the councils of a group, the Returning Officer shall declare such candidate to be the representative member of such group.

10. If by the hour fixed in clause 8 hereof more than one candidate has been so nominated for any group, the Returning Officer shall cause ballot-papers to be prepared containing the names of the councillors so nominated for such group, and shall forthwith send one of such ballot-papers to each council in such group.

11. The municipal clerk of the council shall, in accordance with a resolution passed by the council, mark the ballot-paper forwarded to such council in the same manner as a ballot-paper is required to be marked in elections of councillors for a municipality, and the municipal clerk shall then return the ballot-paper so as to reach the Returning Officer not later than Four o'clock in the afternoon of the fourth Thursday in the same month of February.

12. The Returning Officer shall, in respect only of such ballot-papers as have reached him within the prescribed time, proceed in the

manner provided for the election of councillors of municipalities to count the votes given for each candidate in a group and, after having ascertained the result of the election, he shall declare the candidate who has received the greater number of votes, including, if necessary, the casting vote of the Returning Officer (which casting vote the Returning Officer is hereby authorized to give if the two candidates have received an equal number of votes) to be the representative member of such group.

13. If a candidate for election as the representative member of any group dies after his nomination is received by the Returning Officer, and before the declaration by the Returning Officer of the result of the election, such election shall wholly fail and the Returning Officer shall proceed to hold a new election for such group.

14. When the seat of any member of the Board representing a group becomes vacant owing to the death, disqualification, resignation, election as chairman of the Board, ouster by the Supreme Court or absence of such member, or from any cause whatever other than the retirement of such member at the expiration of the period for which he was elected, such shall be deemed to be an "extraordinary vacancy".

15. When any extraordinary vacancy occurs in the representation of a group, the Returning Officer shall forthwith notify each council included in the group of the vacancy and, having regard to the provisions of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts, of a day and a time by which nominations may be lodged with him, and if more than one nomination is received, the day and time by which a ballot-paper containing the names of the candidates forwarded by him shall be marked and returned to him, and such days and times shall take effect as if prescribed in these Regulations. Subject to this clause, the foregoing provisions of these Regulations shall apply to any extraordinary election.

16. A member elected to fill an extraordinary vacancy shall hold office for the unexpired portion of the period for which the person whose place he fills was elected and no longer.

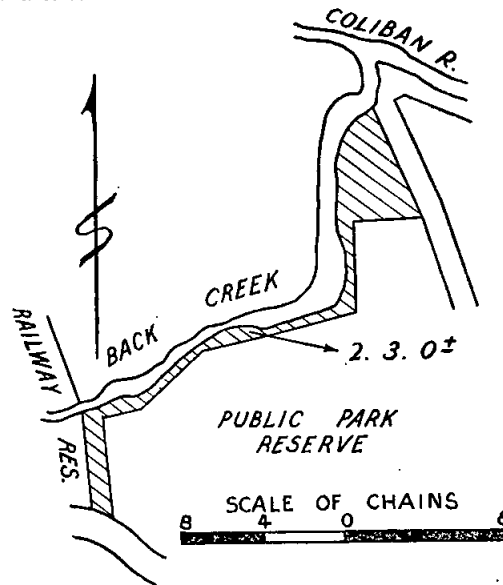

By-law of the Borough of Ringwood, made under the *Local Government Act 1946*, and numbered 33, for:—

- (a) Regulating the use of private property situate at the junction of streets or roads, for growing of trees, shrubs or hedges abutting on any such street or road or within 10 feet therefrom;
- (b) requiring the removal or lopping of trees, shrubs or hedges (whether planted before or after the commencement of the *Local Government Act 1946*) from or on private property so situate where such trees, shrubs or hedges abut on or are within 10 feet of such street or road;
- (c) requiring the reduction to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. of any portion of a fence within 10 feet of the junction of any streets or roads; and
- (d) authorizing the Council, at the expense of the owner (the amount of which expense may be recovered by the Council in a court of petty sessions as a civil debt, recoverable summarily)—
 - (i) To remove or lop trees, shrubs or hedges growing or being on private property so situate, which are not removed or lopped as required by or under this By-law.
 - (ii) To reduce in height any portion of a fence which is not reduced in height as required by or under this By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946*, and of any other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors and Burgesses of the Borough of Ringwood, order as follows:—

(1) No person shall use any private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads for the growing of any tree, shrub or hedge abutting on any such street or road or within 10 feet therefrom, unless for a distance of 20 feet from the corner of such private property each part of such tree, shrub or hedge is kept at a height not greater than 3 ft. 6 in. above that point on the surface level of the adjacent street or road which is nearest to such part of such tree, shrub or hedge.

(2) Where any private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads is used contrary to the provisions of clause 1 hereof, the Council of the said Borough of Ringwood at any time by notice in writing under the hand of an officer of the said Borough of Ringwood, require the owner or occupier of such private property within the time specified in such notice to lop all trees, shrubs or hedges (whether planted before or after the commencement of the *Local Government Act 1946*) growing contrary to clause 1 hereof on such private property where such trees, shrubs or hedges abut on or are within 10 feet of any such street or road in such manner that each part of such trees, shrubs or hedges shall be kept at a height not greater than 3 ft. 6 in. above that point on the surface level of the adjacent street or road which is nearest to such part of such trees, shrubs or hedges.

(3) No person shall cause or permit a fence to remain on private property at a greater height than 3 ft. 6 in. within 10 feet of the junction of any streets or roads.

(4) Where any fence within 10 feet of the junction of any streets or roads exceeds 3 ft. 6 in. in height contrary to the provisions of clause 3 hereof, the Council of the Borough of Ringwood, at any time, by notice in writing under the hand of any officer of the said Borough, may require the owner or occupier of the property upon which fence exists within the time specified in such notice to reduce the fence in height.

(5) Should default be made by any owner or occupier in complying with any notice under this By-law within the time therein limited and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, the said Borough may, by its Engineer, enter upon such private property so situate as aforesaid, with a sufficient number of workmen

and lop any trees, shrubs or hedges growing or being thereon which are not lopped as required by such notice and reduce any fence in height, as required by such notice and the expenses incurred by the said Borough in so doing shall be forthwith paid by the owner of such private property to the said Borough and in default of such payment may be recovered by the said Borough in a court of petty sessions, as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

(6) Any person guilty of a continuing offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £1 for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order is imposed or made on or against such person by any court.

(7) In this By-law the word "corner" shall mean the point at which the building lines of any private property abutting on the streets or roads at the junction of which such private property is situate meet or if extended would meet, and the words "surface level" shall mean—

- (a) Where the footway on that side of the street or road which abuts on the private property in question is paved the level of that part of the paved portion of such footway nearest to the private property in question.
- (b) If such footway is not paved, but the level of the street or road abutting on such private property has been fixed in accordance with the provisions of Division 9 of Part XIX. of the *Local Government Act 1946*, or any previous or subsequent Act of Parliament of a like nature the level as so fixed of that part of such street or road nearest to the private property in question.
- (c) Otherwise the actual level of that part of the street or road nearest to the private property in question.

(8) This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

(3) The occupier or owner of any land shall, if required by the Council, remove or destroy all refuse or rubbish thereon (other than refuse or rubbish, the removal of which the Borough of Ringwood has undertaken or contracted for under section 39 of the *Health Act 1928*).

(4) Any person guilty of a continuing offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £1 for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued, after a conviction or order is imposed or made on or against such person by any court.

(5) This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS The Parliament of Victoria stands adjourned until Thursday, the fourteenth day of January 1954: Now I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria until Tuesday, the ninth day of February, 1954:

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this thirteenth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifty-four, and in the second year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.
