IN accordance with the provisions of the Midwives Act, the following copy of the Supplement to the Midwives Register, as at 31st December, 1954 is hereby published.

Section 15 (1) (c) indicates that the midwife had completed the prescribed course of training and passed the prescribed examination.

Section 16 indicates that the Midwife has been fully or partly trained and registered in any part of the world, and has undergone such supplementary training and passed such examinations as the Board directs; and has in the aggregate undergone training and passed examinations substantially equivalent to that prescribed under the Midwives Act, Victoria.

## DECLARING A PROCLAIMED AREA.

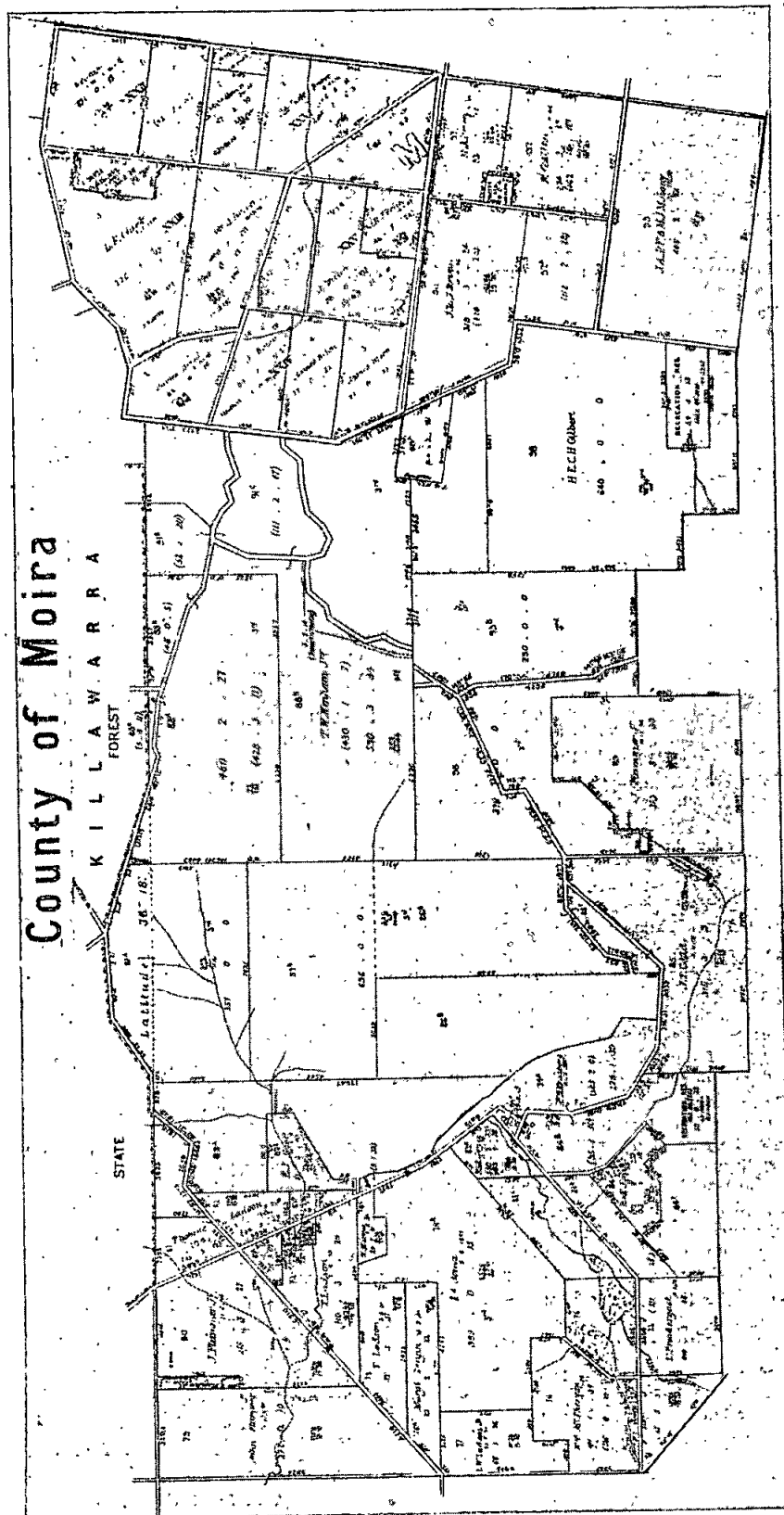
## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the *Vegetation Diseases (Fruit Fly) Act 1947* (No. 5258), it is provided that, where the Governor in Council is of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family *Trypidae* (commonly known as fruit flies), he may by Proclamation declare any portion of Victoria specified therein to be a proclaimed area, and prohibit the planting on any land in the proclaimed area of any plant or vegetable specified, and prohibit the removal from any property within the proclaimed area to any other property within the area and from any place in the proclaimed area to any place outside the area of any fruit or vegetable, and require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take such action for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit fly as is specified in the Proclamation: Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family *Trypidae* (commonly known as fruit flies), and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby—

## 1. Declare that portion of Victoria—

Within the Shires of Benalla and Wangaratta and being the portions of the Parishes of Tamnack and Wangaratta South in the County of Moira, as indicated by hachure on the plan hereunder, to be a proclaimed area.



2. Prohibit the removal from any property within the proclaimed area to any other property within the area and from any place within the proclaimed area to any place outside the proclaimed area of any fruit or vegetable grown within the proclaimed area excepting fruit and vegetables removed on the instruction of an inspector, provided the Superintendent of Horticulture of the Department of Agriculture may approve of the occupier or owner of a commercial orchard, as defined in the Act, situated not less than one mile from where fruit fly is known to have occurred, removing any of the foregoing fruit and/or vegetables to a specified place outside the proclaimed area if each fruit and/or vegetable in the consignment from such commercial orchard is examined by an inspector immediately prior to despatch and every such fruit and/or vegetable is found to be free from fruit fly.

3. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to give access to such land at all times to an inspector and/or his assistants for the purpose of inspection and/or applying to trees and plants on such properties any spray material which, in the opinion of an inspector, is necessary for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit flies and/or for the purpose of removing any fruit or vegetables or prohibited plant.

4. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take action as and when directed by a notice served on such occupier or owner by an inspector and within the time specified in such notice—

(a) To remove all plants of—

Tomato (*Lycopersicum* sp.),  
Pepper (*Capsicum* sp.),  
Egg Plant (*Solanum melongena*),  
Ornamental Solanum (*Solanum* sp.),  
Rock Melon (*Cucumis* sp.),  
Sweet Melon (*Cucumis* sp.),  
Cucumber (*Cucumis* sp.),  
Cape Gooseberry (*Physalis edulis*),  
Brambles (except cultivated varieties),

Box thorn provided that where box thorn is grown as a hedge along a boundary or dividing fence the occupier or owner may continue to so grow it on the following conditions:—

(i) Cut back the hedge forthwith and periodically as necessary to retain it within a height not exceeding six (6) feet from the ground level and a width not exceeding two (2) feet.

(ii) That when such hedge has been cut back to within the foregoing dimensions, he shall thoroughly spray it forthwith to cover all parts of the plants forming the hedge with a solution containing two thousand (2,000) parts of two-four Dichloro-phenoxy-acetic acid (2-4D), or one of its derivatives, to one million (1,000,000) parts of water (0.2 per cent.) and he shall spray it thereafter as often as is necessary to prevent the plants from forming fruit.

and refrain from planting such plants while this Proclamation remains in force.

(b) To remove from all trees and plants growing upon the said land and to pick up from the said land all of the following fruits and/or vegetables:—

Apples, apricots, brambles and other berry fruits, cape gooseberries, cherries, citrus fruits, cucumbers, egg fruit, figs, gooseberries, grapes, guavas, loquats, medlars, nectarines, passion fruit, peaches, pears, peppers, persimmons, plums, prunes, quinces, rock melons, sweet melons, tomatoes, and all edible fruits of all trees and plants, including all such fruits and vegetables which shall form on such trees and plants after the service of the said notice during such time as this Proclamation remains in force.

(c) To dispose of all such fruits and/or vegetables by boiling for fifteen (15) minutes, or burning them so as to destroy all eggs and larvae of the fruit fly or burying them under a depth of soil of at least 3 feet after having applied to the upper layer of such buried fruit or vegetables D.D.T. at the rate of not less than one half-ounce per square yard in the form of a spray containing not less than 0.2 per cent. of the pure para para isomer of D.D.T. or in the form of a dust containing not less than 2 per cent. of the pure para para isomer of D.D.T., or by otherwise treating them as an inspector may direct, in such a manner as to kill all eggs, larvae and pupae of fruit flies.

(d) To spray all trees and plants growing on the said land with a solution containing two thousand (2,000) parts of Dichloro-diphenyl-trichloroethane (D.D.T.) to one million parts of water (0.2 per cent.), or, in the case of a commercial orchard equipped with a power spraying plant approved by an inspector, with a solution containing one thousand (1,000) parts of D.D.T. to one million parts of water (0.1 per cent.) at intervals not exceeding twenty-one (21) days during the period specified in such notice.

(e) To treat the soil beneath and around trees suspected by an inspector to be infested or to have been infested with fruit fly by applying uniformly to the surface of an area or areas marked by an inspector a dust containing 1 per cent. of the pure gamma isomer of benzene hexachloride at the rate of not less than two (2) ounces per square yard.

(f) To reduce, if necessary, all tall growing trees and plants covered by this Proclamation, except when grown as a commercial orchard or plantation, to a height which will permit them to be stripped of fruit and/or sprayed to the satisfaction of an inspector.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the *Vegetation Diseases (Fruit Fly) Act 1947 (No. 5258)*, it is provided that, where the Governor in Council is of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family *Trypetidae* (commonly known as fruit flies), he may by Proclamation declare any portion of Victoria specified therein to be a proclaimed area, and prohibit the planting on any land in the proclaimed area of any plant or vegetable specified, and prohibit the removal from any property within the proclaimed area to any other property within the area and from any place in the proclaimed area to any place outside the area of any fruit or vegetable, and require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take such action for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit fly as is specified in the Proclamation: Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family *Trypetidae* (commonly known as fruit flies), and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby—

## 1. Declare that portion of Victoria—

Within the Shire of Upper Murray and the Parishes of Walwa and Jemba in the Shire of Towong to be a proclaimed area.

2. Prohibit the removal from any property within the proclaimed area to any other property within the area and from any place within the proclaimed area to any place outside the proclaimed area of any fruit or vegetable grown within the proclaimed area excepting fruit and vegetables removed on the instruction of an inspector, provided the Superintendent of Horticulture of the Department of Agriculture may approve of the occupier or owner of a commercial orchard, as defined in the Act, situated not less than 1 mile from where fruit fly is known to have occurred, removing any of the foregoing fruit and/or vegetables to a specified place outside the proclaimed area if each fruit and/or vegetable in the consignment from such commercial orchard is examined by an inspector immediately prior to despatch and every such fruit and/or vegetable is found to be free from fruit fly.

3. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to give access to such land at all times to an inspector and/or his assistants for the purpose of inspection and/or applying to trees and plants on such properties any spray material which, in the opinion of an inspector, is necessary for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit flies and/or for the purpose of removing any fruit or vegetables or prohibited plant.

4. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take action as and when directed by a notice served on such occupier or owner by an inspector and within the time specified in such notice—

## (a) To remove all plants of—

Tomato (*Lycopersicum* sp.),  
Pepper (*Capsicum* sp.),  
Egg Plant (*Solanum melongena*),  
Ornamental Solanum (*Solanum* sp.),  
Rock Melon (*Cucumis* sp.),  
Sweet Melon (*Cucumis* sp.),  
Cucumber (*Cucumis* sp.),  
Cape Gooseberry (*Physalis edulis*),  
Brambles (except cultivated varieties),  
Box Thorn, provided that where box thorn is grown as a hedge along a boundary or dividing fence the occupier or owner may continue to so grow it on the following conditions:—

(i) Cut back the hedge forthwith and periodically as necessary to retain it within a height not exceeding six (6) feet from the ground level and a width not exceeding two (2) feet.

(ii) That when such hedge has been cut back to within the foregoing dimensions, he shall thoroughly spray it forthwith to cover all parts of the plants forming the hedge with a solution containing two thousand (2,000) parts of two-four Dichloro-phenoxy-acetic acid (2-4D), or one of its derivatives, to one million (1,000,000) parts of water (0.2 per cent.) and he shall spray it thereafter as often as is necessary to prevent the plants from forming fruit.

and refrain from planting such plants while this Proclamation remains in force.

(b) To remove from all trees and plants growing upon the said land and to pick up from the said land all of the following fruits and/or vegetables:—

Apples, apricots, brambles and other berry fruits, cape gooseberries, cherries, citrus fruits, cucumbers, egg fruit, figs, gooseberries, grapes, guavas, loquats, medlars, nectarines, passion fruit, peaches, pears, peppers, persimmons, plums, prunes, quinces, rock melons, sweet melons, tomatoes, and all edible fruits of all trees and plants, including all such fruits and vegetables which shall form on such trees and plants after the service of the said notice during such time as this Proclamation remains in force.

(c) To dispose of all such fruits and/or vegetables by boiling for fifteen (15) minutes, or burning them so as to destroy all eggs and larvae of the fruit fly or burying them under a depth of soil of at least 3 feet after having applied to the upper layer of such buried fruit or vegetables D.D.T. at the rate of not less than one half-ounce per square yard in the form of a spray containing not less than 0.2 per cent. of the pure para para isomer of D.D.T. or in the form of a dust containing not less than 2 per cent. of the pure para para isomer of D.D.T., or by otherwise treating them as an inspector may direct, in such a manner as to kill all eggs, larvae and pupae of fruit flies.

(d) To spray all trees and plants growing on the said land with a solution containing two thousand (2,000) parts of Dichloro-diphenyl-trichloro-ethane (D.D.T.) to one million parts of water (0.2 per cent.) or, in the case of a commercial orchard equipped with a power spraying plant approved by an inspector, with a solution containing one thousand (1,000) parts of D.D.T. to one million parts of water (0.1 per cent.) at intervals not exceeding twenty-one (21) days during the period specified in such notice.

(e) To treat the soil beneath and around trees suspected by an inspector to be infested or to have been infested with fruit fly by applying uniformly to the surface of an area or areas marked by an inspector a dust containing 1 per cent. of the pure gamma isomer of benzene hexachloride at the rate of not less than (2) two ounces per square yard.

(f) To reduce, if necessary, all tall growing trees and plants covered by this Proclamation, except when grown as a commercial orchard or plantation, to a height which will permit them to be stripped of fruit and/or sprayed to the satisfaction of an inspector.

**WHEREAS** by sub-section (2) of section 4 of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944* it is enacted that the Governor in Council, after consultation by the Chief Secretary of Victoria with the Minister of Forests, may from time to time by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* proclaim any period as the summer period in respect of the country area of Victoria or any specified part or parts thereof, and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may proclaim different summer periods in respect of different parts of the said country area:

And whereas by the said sub-section it is further enacted that any Proclamation so published shall remain in force until revoked, amended, or varied by a subsequent Proclamation so published:

And whereas by Proclamations issued on the 7th December, 1954, 14th December, 1954, and 21st December, 1954, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th December, 1954, 15th December, 1954, and 22nd December, 1954, respectively, different summer periods expiring on the thirty-first day of March, 1955, were proclaimed in respect of different parts of the country area of Victoria, including the parts of the said country area specified in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas it is deemed expedient that the aforesaid Proclamations should be varied in the manner hereinafter described:

And whereas the Chief Secretary and the Minister of Forests have consulted accordingly:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Country Fire Authority Acts, do by this my Proclamation vary the aforesaid Proclamations by proclaiming that the summer period in respect of the parts of the country area of Victoria which are specified in the Schedule hereto shall end on the seventh day of April, 1955.

## DAIRY PRODUCE REGULATIONS AMENDED.

" (f) Fair copies of all account sales issued to suppliers of milk or cream by a factory shall be kept at such factory for at least twelve months after the end of the financial year to which such account sales refer, and shall be made available by the owner of the factory for inspection by an inspecting officer when required."

## REGULATIONS.

I, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Vermin and Noxious Weeds Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Vermin and Noxious Weeds Regulations 1955 and shall come into operation upon the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. The Regulations under the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1949* are hereby amended as follows:—

(1) In sub-clause (1) of clause 1, the words "Regulations under the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1949*" shall be deleted and the words "Vermin and Noxious Weeds Regulations 1949" shall be inserted in place thereof.

(2) In Forms 1 and 2 in the Schedule to Part 1 the expression "free of all vermin." shall be deleted and the expression "free of all vermin for six months after the service of this notice." shall be inserted in place thereof.

(3) In Forms 4, 5, 6 and 7 in the said Schedule the words "three months" shall be deleted and the words "fifty-six days" shall be inserted in place thereof.

(4) After Form 7 in the said Schedule, there shall be inserted the following form:—

PART 1—FORM 7A.  
Vermin and Noxious Weeds Acts.

(Section 9)

NOTICE AS TO WARRENS, BURROWS OR UNDERGROUND COVER.

being an Inspector under the Vermin and Noxious Weeds Acts, do with the authority of the Superintendent heretofore obtained, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, hereby require you to cause the warrens, burrows or underground cover on the land owned or occupied by you in the (State municipal district and division thereof in which the land is) comprising about \_\_\_\_\_ acres and which are a harbour or cover for vermin to be destroyed.

And I hereby give you notice that if, after fifty-six days from the date of service hereof upon you, you have not complied with the requirements hereof, I will, without further notice, obtain the authority of the Superintendent to take such measures in accordance with the provisions of the Vermin and Noxious Weeds Acts as I may think necessary.

(5) Form 19 in the said Schedule shall be deleted.

(6) Part 2 and the Schedule to Part 2 of the Regulations shall be deleted and the following clauses and Schedule shall be inserted in place thereof:—

PART 2.

SUPPLY OF FUMIGANTS, POISONS AND WEEDICIDES AT A REDUCED PRICE.  
(Section 25)

1. The Superintendent upon the direction of the Treasurer of Victoria shall at the commencement of each financial year declare for what purposes fumigants, poisons or weedicides may be supplied at a reduced price during that financial year.

2. Any owner or occupier of land requiring under Section 25 of the Act a supply of fumigant, poison or weedicide at a reduced price shall apply to the Inspector in the form of Form 1 of the Schedule to this part.

3. The Inspector after being satisfied that the requirements of the owner or occupier, in respect of fumigant, poison or weedicide for a purpose declared by the Superintendent, are reasonable and necessary for carrying out his duties under the Act may issue to such owner or occupier an authority to purchase in the form of Form 2 of the Schedule to this Part. Such an authority shall be valid for six months and no longer.

4. Any owner or occupier having obtained such authority may present same to a distributor and on the supply of the said fumigant, poison or weedicide shall acknowledge receipt of same by, signing the form in the appropriate place and inserting the price paid or charged.

5. The Distributor shall at the end of each month forward to the Superintendent a claim in accordance with Form 3 of the Schedule to this Part for payment by the Treasurer of an amount which would represent a reasonable difference between the wholesale and the retail price of any materials supplied by him during the said month pursuant to Section 25 of the Act. The amount which would represent a reasonable difference between the wholesale and the retail price of any materials supplied as aforesaid shall not exceed fifteen per cent. of the retail price in respect of small quantities of fumigants, poisons or weedcides or twelve and one-half per cent. of the retail price in respect of large quantities.

6. Any distributor on making a claim pursuant to Section 25 shall produce to the Superintendent or other person authorized by him, such evidence as may in the opinion of the Superintendent be necessary to ascertain the wholesale and the retail price of any fumigants, poisons or weedcides, and in the absence of such evidence, the Superintendent may withhold his certificate.

7. Any person who, having obtained a supply of fumigants, poisons or weedcides at a reduced price pursuant to Section 25 of the Act, fails to use the same for the purpose for which it was obtained, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and shall be liable on conviction before a Court of Petty Sessions to a fine not exceeding Ten pounds.

8. The Superintendent upon satisfying himself—

- (a) that the fumigants, poisons and weedcides referred to by a distributor in his claim have been duly supplied;
- (b) that the amount claimed represents a reasonable difference between the wholesale and retail prices; and
- (c) that the claim is accurate

shall certify to the Treasurer that the claim is properly payable whereupon the Treasurer shall cause it to be paid.

"Dust, unspecified", and
- (b) In Column Four, immediately below the expression "38,000,000" and in line with the item "Dust, unspecified", shall be inserted the expression  
"50,000,000".
- (c) The expression "Acrylonitrile . . . 20" shall be deleted.

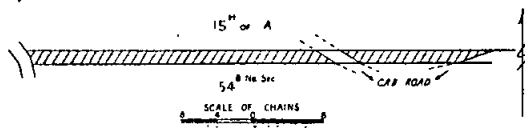

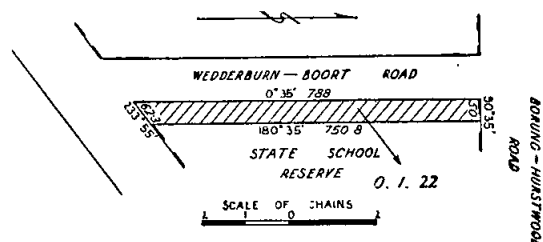

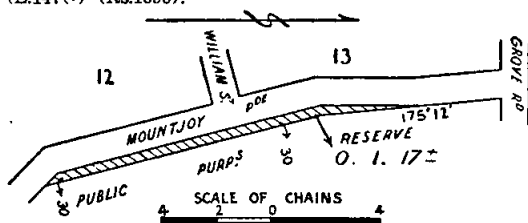

1. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

"Argentine ants" means the specie of ants known by the entomological name of *Iridomyrmex humilis* Mayr.

"Council" means the Council of the City of Moorabbin.

"Health Inspector" means any person appointed by the Council to carry out the duties of a health inspector.

2. (a) Every owner or occupier of property or premises shall keep such property or premises free of Argentine ants.

(b) If the Health Inspector finds or believes that Argentine ants exist in or about any property or premises, he may give notice to the owner or occupier thereof to forthwith effectively destroy such Argentine ants.

(c) Any owner or occupier so notified who, within seven days after service of the notice, has not effectively destroyed all Argentine ants in or about his property or premises shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

3. If after three days from the date of the service of any notice under clause 2 (b) hereof on any owner or occupier of any property or premises, such owner or occupier has not complied with the requirements thereof, the Council may—

(i) Cause measures to be taken to effectively destroy any Argentine ants existing in or about any such property or premises at the expense of the owner or occupier thereof; and

(ii) Recover the cost thereof as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

4. Every person guilty of a wilful breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Five pounds or more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.

5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Moorabbin.

## MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.

### REGULATIONS RELATING TO INSCRIBED STOCK AND DEBENTURES.

**T**HE Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works (hereinafter called "the Board"), pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts (hereinafter shortly referred to as "the Act"), and pursuant to and in exercise and execution of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and prescribe the following Regulations, that is to say:—

#### PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

1. The Regulations relating to the issue of Inscribed Stock made and passed by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works and to which the common seal of the Board was affixed the twenty-fourth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and twenty, and which were approved by the Governor in Council on the thirtieth day of March, One thousand nine hundred and twenty, are hereby revoked as from the date of the coming into operation of these Regulations. Such repeal shall not affect anything done any rights privileges or powers acquired or any liabilities or forfeitures incurred under the said Regulations before the date of coming into operation of these Regulations. Repeal.

2. These Regulations may be cited as the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Inscribed Stock Regulations. Citation.

3. These Regulations are divided into Parts and Divisions as follows:— Division.

Part I.—Preliminary.

Part II.—Provisions relating to Stock.

Division 1.—General Provisions.

Division 2.—Purchase of Stock.

Division 3.—Transfers and Transmissions of Stock.

Division 4.—Payment of Interest and Repayment of Principal.

Part III.—Provisions relating to Debentures.

Part IV.—Miscellaneous.

Inter-  
pretation.

4. In these Regulations, unless there be something in the subject matter or context inconsistent therewith—

"The Board" means the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works.

"The Registrar" means the Treasurer or other officer for the time being appointed by the Board.

"The office" means the offices of the Board, at Melbourne.

"The Chairman" means the Chairman for the time being of the Board.

"Stock" means Inscribed Stock created or issued by the Board under the provisions of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts.

"Stock Ledger" means the ledger or ledgers of the Board in which the stock held is recorded or inscribed.

"Stock Holder" means the person or persons whose name or names is or are inscribed in the stock ledger of the Board in respect of any stock.

"Schedule" means the Schedule to these Regulations.

"Debentures" means debentures created or issued by the Board under the provisions of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts.

"Registry" means the Registry of the Board for the inscription of stock.

"The Act" means the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts.

"Debenture Register" means the book or books of the Board in which the debentures issued are recorded.

Words importing the singular shall include the plural and vice versa.

Words importing the masculine shall include the feminine.

Forms.

5. In these Regulations any reference to a Form shall be read as a reference to a Form in the Schedule to these Regulations.

Where these Regulations require the use of any Form, any Form to the like effect approved by the Registrar may be used.

## PART II.—PROVISIONS RELATING TO STOCK.

### DIVISION 1.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

Issue of  
Stock.

6. (a) The Board may issue Inscribed Stock to the extent that Parliament has given or may give authority to borrow.

(b) Subject to these Regulations—

(i) Stock may be issued in such amounts and manner and on such terms and conditions as the Board may from time to time direct.

(ii) Stock shall be redeemable at par on or after a date to be determined by the Board prior to the issue thereof.

Security  
therefor.

7. The principal money secured by any such Stock and the interest thereon shall—

(a) be charged and secured upon the Metropolitan General Fund and upon all rates which the Board is authorized to make, and

(b) be made payable in London or in Melbourne at the discretion of the Board.

Registries.

8. (a) The Board may—

(i) establish Registries for the inscription of Stock within the Commonwealth,

(ii) establish such Registries for the inscription of Stock in London,

(iii) appoint such Registrars of Stock and Deputy Registrars of Stock,

as it deems necessary.

(b) Unless otherwise determined by the Board the Registry in Melbourne shall be open for transaction of business on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday in each week from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. except when any such day be a public holiday.



9. (a) Stock may be inscribed in the names of one or more persons not exceeding four in number provided that any document in relation to a joint holding shall set out the full names of the holders in the order in which they are inscribed or are to be inscribed in the stock ledger.

(b) More than one account may be opened in the same name or names provided that each account is designated in a manner approved by the Registrar.

10. (a) Stock may be inscribed in the name of a body corporate but the Registrar must first be furnished with—

Inscription of

- (i) a copy of the certificate of incorporation, or, if the body corporate is specifically established by any law or by any Royal Charter or similar instrument, a copy of that law, Royal Charter or instrument;
- (ii) a specimen of the seal of the body corporate authenticated in accordance with Form 1;
- (iii) a copy of any Regulations or Resolution of the body corporate governing the affixing of the seal certified or authenticated to the satisfaction of the Registrar. The document containing such information shall, if so required by the Registrar, be signed and sealed in the presence of an officer of the Board.

(b) Should the Registrar so require, any document hereinbefore required to be authenticated shall be so authenticated in the presence of an officer of the Board.

(c) If from any cause any alteration should occur in any of the particulars furnished under this clause or if the authority given to any specified person is cancelled or withdrawn or if authority is given to some person not previously specified, notification under seal must be given to the Board.

(d) In the case of a body corporate incorporated outside Victoria, the Registrar may determine that it shall not be necessary to furnish a specimen of the seal of the body corporate authenticated in accordance with Form 1 provided there is furnished to the Registrar a power of attorney authorizing dealings in stock on behalf of the body corporate executed under the seal of the body corporate and notarially attested.

11. Stock will not be inscribed in the name of a firm, but may be inscribed in the names of the individual partners.

Firms not to  
be inscribed.

12. The Registrar shall, for all purposes, be entitled to regard the person or persons whose name or names are inscribed in the Stock Ledger as the true and lawful owners and holders of the stock in relation to which such name or names is or are so inscribed, and all receipts acquittances discharges releases and documents whatsoever executed by such person or persons in relation to such stock or to the interest thereon shall be deemed for all purposes and against all persons as documents duly executed by the person or persons entitled to such stock or interest as the case may be.

13. Save as herein or by statute otherwise provided no entry of any Trust shall be made in the Stock Ledger, and the Board shall be entitled to treat the person or persons whose name or names are inscribed in the Stock Ledger in respect of any stock as the absolute owner or owners thereof, and accordingly shall not, except as ordered by a court of competent jurisdiction, or as by Statute required, be bound to recognize any equitable or other claim to or interest in such stock on the part of any other person.

Trusts not  
Recognized.

14. Except with the approval of the Registrar to the contrary the minimum holding of stock shall be £100. Where the sum inscribed exceeds £100 it shall be a multiple of £50.

Minimum  
Holding.

15. (a) All stock issued shall be inscribed in a Stock Ledger at a Registry by entering therein the full name and address of the holder of the stock and the amount thereof, and such other particulars as are necessary.

Stock to be

(b) Stock Ledgers may be kept in a loose-leaf system or in some other system approved by the Board.

(c) The officer authorized to make entries in Stock Ledgers shall initial all entries made by him in a Stock Ledger.

Attestation

16. Every entry in the Stock Ledger shall be attested by the Registrar or such other officer of the Board as the Board may from time to time appoint, and such Ledger shall be audited from time to time by the Auditor-General of the State of Victoria or an officer appointed by him for that purpose.

Certificate of  
Inscription.

17. (a) Upon inscription of any stock the Registrar shall issue a Certificate of Inscription in accordance with Form 2 in respect of each holding of stock.

(b) If any Certificate of Inscription is lost mislaid or destroyed, the Registrar shall, upon application, issue a duplicate certificate in place of the certificate so lost mislaid or destroyed, and such duplicate certificate shall be delivered only to the stock holder.

(c) Upon written application therefor being made by a stock holder, the Registrar shall issue to him or to such other person as the stock holder may direct a certificate setting forth the amount of stock inscribed in the name of the stock holder on such date as shall have been specified in the application.

18. Any stock holder or joint holder of stock or his accredited agent shall be at liberty to inspect his account in the Stock Ledger at all reasonable times upon furnishing satisfactory evidence of his identity.

19. (a) On receipt of a written request to correct a mistake in the Stock Ledger, the Registrar may amend the Stock Ledger if he is satisfied that the stock is inscribed incorrectly.

(b) If the Registrar so requires, a statutory declaration as to the circumstances shall be furnished.

Change of  
Address of  
Stockholder.

20. Where any stock holder changes his address he shall give written notice thereof to the Registrar who shall record the change of address in the Stock Ledger.

Marriage of  
Female  
Stock Holder.

21. On the marriage of a female who is the holder of stock, her name and description shall be altered in the Stock Ledger with respect to stock standing in her name solely or in the name of herself and any other person jointly, on lodgment with the registrar of a request, in accordance with Form 3, signed by her, stating the name in full of her husband and setting forth particulars of the stock concerning which it is desired to have the alteration made. If the Registrar so requires, the request shall be accompanied by a copy of the marriage certificate.

Specimen

22. (a) The Registrar shall take steps to secure, either by post or personally, specimen signatures of all stock holders.

(b) Specimen signatures obtained by post shall be witnessed.

(v) Any other person authorized by the Registrar to witness signatures.

(Other than those covered by the Apprenticeship Commission.)

*Apprenticeship Trades.*

3. (a) Minors shall not be employed in the following occupations otherwise than under a contract of apprenticeship as hereinafter provided:—

Electrical fitter and/or armature winder (except the winding of armatures by specialized processes),  
Electrical mechanic,  
Refrigeration mechanic or serviceman.

*Contract of Apprenticeship.*

(b) Every contract of apprenticeship hereinafter made shall contain—

- (i) the names of the parties;
- (ii) the date of birth of the apprentice;
- (iii) a statement of the trade or trades to which the apprentice is to be bound and which he is to be taught during the course and for the purpose of the apprenticeship;
- (iv) a covenant by the master to teach and instruct or cause the apprentice to be taught or instructed in the trade to which the apprentice is bound;
- (v) the date at which the apprenticeship is to commence or from which it is to be calculated;
- (vi) all other conditions of apprenticeship.

*Cancellation or Suspension of Indenture.*

(c) Subject to the approval of the Secretary for Labour and Industry, but not otherwise, an indenture of apprenticeship may be suspended or cancelled—

- (i) by mutual consent;
- (ii) if through lack of orders or financial difficulties an employer is unable to find suitable employment for an apprentice and a transfer to another employer cannot be arranged;
- (iii) if, in the opinion of the Secretary for Labour and Industry, circumstances exist which render such suspension or cancellation necessary or desirable.

Any covenant in an indenture inconsistent with the provision of this clause shall be null and void, and of no force or effect while this Determination remains in force and applies to the parties to the indenture.

*Instruction in Welding.*

(d) The training of apprentices to electrical fitting shall include sufficient instruction in welding to enable them to perform the work of their trade in the shop in which they are trained.

*Proportion.*

(e) (i) An employer shall not employ apprentices in excess of the proportion hereinafter prescribed.

Subject to this sub-clause the proportion of apprentices who may be taken by an employer shall not exceed one apprentice to every three or fraction of three tradesmen in the trade concerned.

In the trade of—

Electrical mechanic,

the proportion of apprentices who may be taken by an employer shall not exceed one apprentice for every two or fraction of two tradesmen in the trade concerned.

For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices, the number of tradesmen shall be deemed to be the average number working during the immediately preceding six months, and in ascertaining such proportion an employer actually working in any workshop shall be deemed to be a tradesman.

A person who is, for a term not exceeding two years, taking practical training in a workshop in continuance of a course of training for professional work shall not be taken into account in calculating the proportion of apprentices to journeymen.

(ii) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore provided in the trades of—

Electrical fitter,

Electrical mechanic, and

Refrigeration mechanic or serviceman,

an employer may with the consent of an apprenticeship authority and upon satisfying that authority that he has the plant, equipment and staff necessary for the proper tuition of each apprentice concerned take apprentices in excess of the proportion herein prescribed. Until further order apprentices so taken shall not be counted in future calculations of the proportion of apprentices to journeymen authorized by the Determination.

*Period of Apprenticeship.*

(f) The periods of apprenticeship shall be as follows:—

If the apprentice, when indentured is under the age of seventeen years—five years; if over the age of seventeen—four or five years, at the option of the contracting parties.

*Adult Apprentices.*

(g) Any apprentice who cannot complete his full term of apprenticeship before reaching his 22nd birthday may, by agreement with his master, serve as an apprentice until he reaches the age of 23 years.

*Probationary Period.*

(h) Minors may be taken on probation for three months, and if apprenticed such three months shall count as part of their period of apprenticeship. An employer shall within fourteen days of employing a probationer notify the appropriate apprenticeship authorities of the employment of such probationer to any of the trades mentioned herein.

**LEADING HANDS.**

Leading hands in charge of not less than three and not more than ten employees, 15s. per week extra; more than ten and not more than twenty employees, 30s. per week extra; more than twenty employees, 45s. per week extra.

**Wages.**

(i) The minimum weekly rates of wage for apprentices shall be the undermentioned percentages of the contemporaneous basic wage prescribed for the area in which they are employed, and in all contracts of apprenticeship hereafter made the employer shall covenant to pay wages of not less than such rates.

The total wages of apprentices and improvers shall be calculated to the nearest sixpence, any broken part of sixpence in the result not exceeding threepence to be disregarded.

An employee who is under 21 years of age on the expiration of his apprenticeship and thereafter works as a minor in the occupation to which he has been apprenticed shall be paid at not less than the adult rate prescribed for that classification.

**Hours.**

(k) The ordinary hours of employment of apprentices shall not in each workshop exceed those of the journeymen.

**Overtime and Shift Work.**

(l) No apprentice under the age of 18 years shall be required to work overtime or shift work unless he so desires.

No apprentice shall except in an emergency work or be required to work overtime or shift work at times which would prevent his attendance at technical school as required by any statute, Determination or regulation applicable to him.

**Payment by Results.**

(m) An apprentice shall not work under any system of payment by results.

**Lost Time.**

(n) The apprentice at the end of the calendar period of any year in which he has actually given service to the master upon less than the ordinary working days prescribed in this Determination, or in which he has unlawfully absented himself without the master's consent, shall, for every day short of the said number of working days, and for every day of such absence, serve one day, and the calendar period of the succeeding year of his service shall not be deemed to begin until the said additional day or days shall have been served. Provided that in calculating the extra time to be so served the apprentice shall be credited with time which he has worked during the relevant year in excess of his ordinary hours.

**Prohibition of Premiums.**

(o) An employer shall not, either directly or indirectly, or by any pretence or device receive from any person or require or permit any person to pay or give any consideration in the nature of a premium or bonus for the taking or binding of any probationer or apprentice.

**Attendance at Technical Schools.**

(p) Apprentices attending technical colleges or schools and presenting reports of satisfactory conduct shall be reimbursed all fees paid by them.

**Annual and Sick Leave.**

(q) Apprentices shall be entitled to sick and annual leave in accordance with the provisions of clauses 16 and 17 hereof respectively.

*APPRENTICESHIP.*

3. (a) An employer may employ any minor as an apprentice in any work covered by this Determination provided that no minor shall be employed in the trade or occupation of an Electroplater—1st class otherwise than under a contract of apprenticeship as hereinafter provided.

*Contract of Apprenticeship.*

(b) Every contract of apprenticeship hereinafter made shall contain—

- (i) the names of the parties;
- (ii) the date of birth of the apprentice;
- (iii) a statement of the trade or trades to which the apprentice is to be bound and which he is to be taught during the course and for the purpose of the apprenticeship;
- (iv) a covenant by the master to teach and instruct or cause the apprentice to be taught or instructed in the trade to which the apprentice is bound;
- (v) the date at which the apprenticeship is to commence or from which it is to be calculated;
- (vi) all other conditions of apprenticeship.

*Cancellation or Suspension of Indenture.*

(c) Subject to the approval of the Secretary for Labour and Industry, but not otherwise, an indenture of apprenticeship may be suspended or cancelled—

- (i) by mutual consent;
- (ii) if through lack of orders or financial difficulties an employer is unable to find suitable employment for an apprentice and a transfer to another employer cannot be arranged;
- (iii) if, in the opinion of the Secretary for Labour and Industry, circumstances exist which render such suspension or cancellation necessary or desirable.

Any covenant in an indenture inconsistent with the provision of this clause shall be null and void and of no force or effect while this Determination remains in force and applies to the parties to the indenture.

*Proportion.*

(d) An employer shall not employ apprentices in excess of the proportion hereinafter prescribed:—

- (i) In the trade of an electroplater 1st class—One apprentice to every three or fraction of three electroplaters—1st class.
- (ii) In all other cases—Three male apprentices to every three or fraction of three male workers receiving not less than 236s. per week, and two female apprentices to every three female workers receiving not less than 176s. per week.

For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices, the number of tradesmen shall be deemed to be the average number working during the immediately preceding six months, and, in ascertaining such proportion an employer actually working in any workshop shall be deemed to be a tradesman.

A person who is for a term not exceeding two years taking practical training in a workshop in continuance of a course of training for professional work shall not be taken into account in calculating the proportion of apprentices to journeymen.

*Period of Apprenticeship.*

(e) If the apprentice when indentured is under the age of seventeen years—five years; if over the age of seventeen years—four or five years, at the option of the contracting parties.

*Adult Apprentices.*

(f) Any apprentice who cannot complete his full term of apprenticeship before reaching his twenty-second birthday may, by agreement with his master, serve as an apprentice until he reaches the age of 23 years.

*Probationary Period.*

(g) Minors may be taken on probation for three months and if apprenticed such three months shall count as part of their period of apprenticeship. An employer shall, within fourteen days of employing a probationer, notify the apprenticeship authorities of the employment of such probationer to any of the trades mentioned herein.

*Wages.*

(h) The minimum weekly rates of wages for apprentices shall be the undermentioned percentages of the contemporaneous basic wage, and in all contracts of apprenticeship hereafter made the employer shall covenant of pay wages of not less than such rates.

The total wage of apprentices shall be calculated to the nearest sixpence, any broken part of sixpence in the result not exceeding threepence to be disregarded.

An employee who is under 21 years of age on the expiration of his apprenticeship and thereafter works as a minor in the occupation to which he has been apprenticed shall be paid at not less than the adult rate prescribed for that classification.

*Hours.*

(j) The ordinary hours of employment of apprentices shall not in each workshop exceed those of the journeymen.

*Overtime and Shift Work.*

(k) No apprentice under the age of 18 years shall be required to work overtime or shift work unless he so desires.

No apprentice shall except in an emergency work or be required to work overtime or shift work at times which would prevent his attendance at technical school as required by any statute, Determination or regulation applicable to him.

*Payment by Results.*

(l) An apprentice shall not work under any system of payment by results.

*Lost Time.*

(m) The apprentice at the end of the calendar period of any year in which he has actually given service to the master upon less than the ordinary working days prescribed in this Determination, or in which he has unlawfully absented himself without the master's consent shall, for every day short of the said number of working days, and for every day of such absence, serve one day, and the calendar period of the succeeding year of his service shall not be deemed to begin until the said additional day or days shall have been served.

Provided that in calculating the extra time to be so served, the apprentice shall be credited with time which he has worked during the relevant year in excess of his ordinary hours.

*Prohibition of Premiums.*

(n) An employer shall not, either directly or indirectly, or by any pretence or device receive from any person or require or permit any person to pay or give any consideration in the nature of a premium or bonus for the taking or binding of any probationer or apprentice.

*Attendance at Technical Schools.*

(o) Apprentices attending technical colleges or schools and presenting reports of satisfactory conduct shall be reimbursed all fees paid by them.

*Annual and Sick Leave.*

(p) Apprentices shall be entitled to sick and annual leave in accordance with the provisions of clauses 16 and 17 hereof respectively.

as furnaceman or assistant to furnaceman; or  
as a roller, extrusion press operator, pipe trap machine operator, roller's assistant or as a melter.

Clauses, other than clauses 2 and 3, of the said Determination shall remain in force.
