I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 25 of the Land Act 1928 as amended by section 2 of the Land Act 1933 do by this my Proclamation revoke the Orders named in the Schedule hereunder.

# Vegetation Diseases (Fruit Fly) Act 1947 (No. 5258). DECLARING A PROCLAIMED AREA.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.



WHEREAS by section 3 of the Vegetation Diseases (Fruit Fly) Act 1947 (No. 5258) it is provided that, where the Governor in Council is of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family Trypetidae (commonly known as fruit flies), he may by Proclamation declare any portion of Victoria specified therein to be a proclaimed area, and prohibit the planting on any land in the proclaimed area of any plant or vegetable specified, and prohibit the removal from any property within the proclaimed area to any other property within the area and from any place in the proclaimed area to any place outside the area of any fruit or vegetable, and require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take such action for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit fly as is specified in the Proclamation: Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, being of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family Trypetidae (commonly known as fruit flies), and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby—

1. Declare that portion of Victoria—

1. Declare that portion of Victoria-

Within the Shire of Cobram and being the portion of the Parish of Cobram in the County of Moira as indicated by hachure on the plan hereunder, to be a proclaimed area.



2. Prohibit the removal from any property within the proclaimed area to any other property within the area of any fruit or vegetable grown within the proclaimed area and from any place within the proclaimed area to any place outside the proclaimed area of any fruit or vegetable excepting fruit and vegetables removed on the instruction of an inspector, provided the Superintendent of Horticulture of the Department of Agriculture may approve of the occupier or owner of a commercial orchard, as defined in the Act, situated not less than 1 mile

from where fruit fly is known to have occurred, removing any of the foregoing fruit and/or vegetable to a specified place outside the proclaimed area if each fruit and/or vegetable in the consignment from such commercial orchard is examined by an inspector immediately prior to despatch and every such fruit and/or vegetable is found to be free from fruit fly.

- 3. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to give access to such land at all times to an inspector and/or his assistants for the purpose of inspection and/or applying to trees and plants on such properties any spray material which in the opinion of an inspector is necessary for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit flies and/or for the purpose of removing any fruit or vegetable or prohibited plant.
- 4. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take action as and when directed by a notice served on such occupiers or owners by an inspector and within the time specified in such notice—
  - (a) To remove all plants of-

Tomato (Lycopersicum sp.),
Pepper (Capsicum sp.),
Egg Plant (Solanum melongena),
Ornamental Solanum (Solanum sp.),
Rock Melon (Cucumis sp.), Sweet Melon (Cucumis sp.), Cucumber (Cucumis sp.), Cape Gooseberry (Physalis edulis), Brambles (except cultivated varieties),

Box Thorn, provided that where box thorn is grown as a hedge along a boundary or dividing fence the occupier or owner may continue to so grow it on the following conditions:—

- (i) Cut back the hedge forthwith and periodically as necessary to retain it within a height not exceeding six (6) feet from the ground level and a width not exceeding two (2) feet.
- (ii) That when such hedge has been cut back to within the foregoing dimensions, he shall thoroughly spray it forthwith to cover all parts of the plants forming the hedge with a solution containing two thousand (2,000) parts of two-four Dichloro-phenoxy-acetic acid (2-4D), or one of its derivatives, to one million (1,000,000) parts of water (0.2 per cent.) and he shall spray it thereafter as often as is necessary to prevent the plants from forming fruit—and refrain from planting such plants while this Proclamation remains in force.

(b) To remove from all trees and plants growing upon the said land and to pick up from the said land all of the following fruits and/or vegetables:—

Apples, apricots, brambles and other berry fruits, cape gooseberries, cherries, citrus fruits, cucumbers, egg fruit, figs, gooseberries, grapes, guavas, loquats, medlars, nectarines, passion fruit, peaches, pears, peppers, persimmons, plums, prunes, quinces, rock melons, sweet melons, tomatoes and all edible fruits of all trees and plants, including all such fruit and vegetables which shall form on such trees and plants after the service of the said notice during such time as this Proclamation remains in force.

- (c) To dispose of all such fruits and/or vegetables by boiling for fifteen (15) minutes, or burning them so as to destroy all eggs and larvae of the fruit fly or burying them under a depth of soil of at least 3 feet after having applied to the upper layer of such buried fruit or vegetable D.D.T. at the rate of not less than one-half ounce per square yard in the form of a spray containing not less than 0.2 per cent. of the pure para para isomer of D.D.T. or in the form of a dust containing not less than 2 per cent. of the pure para para isomer of D.D.T. or by otherwise treating them as an inspector may direct, in such a manner as to kill all eggs, larvae and pupae of fruit flies.
- (d) To spray all trees and plants growing on the said land with a solution containing two thousand (2,000) parts of Dichloro-diphenyl-trichloro-ethane (D.D.T.) to one million parts of water (0.2 per cent.) or in the case of a commercial orchard equipped with a power spraying plant approved by an inspector, with a solution containing one thousand (1,000) parts of D.D.T. to one million parts of water (0.1 per cent.) at intervals not exceeding twenty-one (21) days during the period specified in such notice.
- (e) To treat the soil beneath and around trees suspected by an inspector to be infested or to have been infested with fruit fly by applying uniformly to the surface of an area or areas marked by an inspector a dust containing 1 per cent. of the pure gamma isomer of Benzene hexachloride at the rate of not less than (2) two ounces per square yard.
- (f) To reduce, if necessary, all tall growing trees and plants covered by this Proclamation, except when grown as a commercial orchard or plantation, to a height which will permit them to be stripped of fruit and/or sprayed to the satisfaction of an inspector.

Require occupiers and owners of land in the pro-claimed area to give access to such land at all times to an inspector and/or his assistants for the purpose of inspection and/or applying to trees and plants on such properties any spray material which in the opinion of an inspector is necessary for the eradication or preven-tion of the spread of fruit files and/or for the purpose of removing any fruit or vegetables or prohibited plant.
- 4. Require occupiers and owners of land in the pro-claimed area to take action as and when directed by a notice served on such occupiers or owners by an inspector and within the time specified in such notice—
  - (a) To remove all plants of-

### AMENDMENT OF PILOTAGE RATES.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by section 79 of the *Marine Act* 1928, and under all other powers it in that behalf enabling, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, doth ordain and determine as follows:

"That on and after the twenty-third day of May, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-five, the Pilotage One thousand nine hundred and fifty-five, the Pilotage Rate from without Port Phillip Heads to an anchorage or pier in Hobson's Bay or Corio Bay, or vice versa, for steamships and ships propelled by electricity or other mechanical power, shall be Four pence three farthings (4\frac{3}{2}\text{d.}) per ton, calculated on the vessel's net registered tonnage subject in any case to a maximum charge of One hundred and eighty-seven pounds ten shillings (£187 10s.), and a minimum charge of Five pounds (£5)."

The foregoing ordinance and determination was passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria held on the 11th day of May, in the year of our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-five -

State Electricity Commission Acts.

AGREEMENT RELATING TO THE ACQUISITION BY THE STATE ELECTRICITY COMMISSION OF VICTORIA OF AN ELECTRICITY SUPPLY UNDERTAKING OPERATED BY THE CITY OF HORSHAM.

### Dairy Products Acts. QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE. BUTTER QUOTA.

CLIVE PHILLIP STONEHAM, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of butter at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for butter as follows:—

The proportion shall be ninety-seven point five six per cent.

# BOROUGH OF MOE CONSTITUTED AND SHIRE OF NARRACAN REDUCED.

And it is further enacted that every Order severing any part of any subdivided municipal district may abolish the subdivisions and either constitute the municipal district an unsubdivided municipal district or re-subdivide district an unsubdivided municipal district or re-subdivide the same; and as regards every subdivision of which portion only is severed, may cancel such subdivision and annex the residue thereof to some other subdivision on may declare that such residue shall thenceforth be deemed such subdivision and that every Order under the provisions of Part II. of the said Act shall be published in the Government Gazette and shall take effect as from the day specified in the Order in that behalf or, if no day is specified, as from the day of publication of the Order in the Government Gazette: in the Government Gazette:

And whereas a request was submitted to the Governor in Council, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, for the severance of portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Narracan and constitution of such portion as a separate municipality under the name of the Borough

- (3) Where an instrument application or document comprises two or more sheets of paper those sheets shall be securely sewn or otherwise fastened together.
- 5. (1) Except with the consent of the Registrar, no Crown Grant or Certificate of Title may comprise land which is subdivided into more than 30 allotments on an approved plan of subdivision or land which is the subject of more than one such approved plan.
- (2) The Registrar may in respect of any existing Crown Grant or Certificate of Title require the issue of sufficient Certificates of Title to comply with this regulation.
- $6.\,\,{}^{\circ}(1)$  When any person requires the Registrar to do any act or perform any duty he shall make an application therefor.
- (2) Where no form of application is prescribed by the Act or by these Regulations the applicant shall in his application firstly state his name address and occupation and then-
  - (a) state the act or duty required to be done or performed and the relative section of the Act;
  - (b) give a sufficient description of the relative land and, if he is not the registered proprietor, particulars of such registered proprietor; and
  - (c) set out any other particulars which are required.
- 7. Applications notifications and requests made pursuant to the provisions of sections 54, 57, 63, and sub-section (3) of section 99 of the Act, shall be in or to the effect of the appropriate form in the Schedule hereto.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "WHARPARILLA RECREATION RESERVE."

RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as reenacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Wharparilla, temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated 12th October, 1954, as a site for Public Recreation, and known as the "Wharparilla Recreation Reserve" (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve"). The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee"):—

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 52 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, agricultural shows, sports, concerts, band recitals, public entertainments and the like, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings (5s.) may be charged and taken for admission of each adult person to the Reserve.
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, and no male person shall enter or remain in any lavatory, building, enclosure, or portion of the Reserve set apart for females.

- 3. No person not being a player, performer, competitor, or official shall enter or remain in or on any room, building, structure, enclosure, or area set apart for players, performers, or competitors at any games, sports, entertainments, or competitions, or for any exhibits, exhibitors, or performers at any shows, fêtes, entertainments, or competitions, and no person shall at any time enter into any building or structure set apart by the Committee for the use of any sporting body or other organization.
- 4. No person shall damage or interfere in any way with the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve.
- 5. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- 6. No person shall jump or climb over or pass under the fences or gates in, on, or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats or in any way damage them, or roll or throw stones, sticks, or other missiles in the Reserve.
- 7. No person shall climb on any building, room, gate, or structure in the Reserve nor open or force any door or window of such building, room, or structure, or in any way deface, damage, or injure any such building. room, or structure.
- 8. No person shall bring into the Reserve or use or carry therein any firearms or offensive weapon.
- 9. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, litter, or rubbish in the Reserve, except in the place provided for the purpose by the Committee and indicated by notice-board.
- 10. No person shall put into the Reserve any livestock of any kind, without the consent or permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 11. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without authority, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 12. No person shall camp in the Reserve or in any room, building, or structure therein without the consent of the Committee first obtained, nor shall any person erect therein any building, hut, or attachment without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 13. No person shall buy, sell, or offer for sale in the Reserve any goods, wares, articles, merchandise, or stuff without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 14. No person or organization shall take part in any public entertainment, meeting, or gathering in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- 15. No person shall expectorate or otherwise foul or commit any nuisance in any part of the Reserve, or in any room, building, structure, or enclosure therein.
- any room, building, structure, or enclosure therein.

  16. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any sport, game, or competition, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart by the Committee for that purpose, and such Committee may from time to time grant to any club, society, or association of clubs or to any person or persons the use of the Reserve, or any part thereof, so set apart for the purpose of any lawful games, fêtes, sports, amusements, or entertainments and the like upon such terms and conditions and the payment of such fees as the Committee deems reasonable and consistent with these Regulations and with the terms of the reservation.
- 17. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any officer, employee, or authorized agent of the Committee in the execution of his lawful duties or any person permitted to use the Reserve.
- 18. No person shall bring into the Reserve any cycle, horse, carriage, cart, motor-car, or any other vehicle except into such parts as may be set apart for the purpose by the Committee, and such Committee reserves the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Three shillings (3s.) in respect of any such horse, carriage, motor-car, or other vehicle.
- 19. Any person committing on any part of the Reserve or in any of the rooms, buildings, structures, or enclosures for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations:
  - (a) Assaulting or threatening any person or persons.
  - (b) Being under the influence of liquor.
  - (c) Entering, crossing, being on or trespassing on any playing ground, area, enclosure or course, or building, room or structure, or any part thereof whilst any sport, game, competition, race, entertainment, or amusement is being played, conducted, or carried on, or at any time between the commencement and conclusion of such event without the consent of the Committee.

- (d) Using profane, indecent, obscene, or unseemly language.
- (e) Using threatening, abusive, offensive, or insulting words.
- (f) Behaving improperly, offensively, or riotously,
- (g) Interfering with, or interrupting any game, sports, competition, entertainment or amusement, or practice thereat.
- (h) Obtaining or attempting to obtain admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to admission under these Regulations.
- 20. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.
- 21. No person shall cross or trespass upon any portion of the Reserve when it would be injurious to such portion as a sports area and when notices are posted up to that effect.—(Rs.4741.)

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Myamyn temporarily reserved as a site for Public Recreation by Order in Council dated the 10th August, 1954, and known as the "Mount Eckersley Recreation Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve." The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management hereinafter referred to as the "Committee."

# REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding 52 in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.
  - 2. No person shall-
    - (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
    - (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
    - (c) Bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained
    - (d) Exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- 3. The Committee shall have power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided,

- 4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows, or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.
- 5. No person, except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.
- 6. No person shall park a motor-car, vehicle, or motor-cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee, who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Two shillings for each vehicle.
- 7. No person shall play or engage in any organized sport, game, or competition within the Reserve on Sundays, Good Friday, or Anzac Day without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 9. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve at any time without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 10. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury, or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring, shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee.
- 11. No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein.
- $12.\ \mbox{No person}$  shall light a fire in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee.
- 13. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 14. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without permission in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 15. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 16. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport, including tennis, cricket, quoits, hockey, or any other games, or foot racing, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only with the permission of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the said Committee may determine.
- 17. No person shall enter the Reserve, or pass over the playing area or oval, with any vehicle, or on horseback, without the permission of the Committee first obtained, nor drive or ride amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve.
- 18. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 19. No person, club, or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

20. No person shall remove any earth, sand, stone, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.—(Rs.7287.)

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any Public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following additional Regulation in respect of the Reserve for Recreation purposes in the City of Ballaarat (Ballaarat East), known as the "Llanberris Reserve":—

The provisions of By-law No. 139 as amended by By-laws Nos. 164, 210, 234, 277, and 333 so far as they relate to slaughtering dues, examination, and branding fees and fees for certificates as to examinations are hereby repealed and the provisions hereinafter set forth are substituted therefor.
