TOWN OF CASHEL ALTERED TO TOWNSHIP OF CASHEL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 25 of the *Land Act 1928* as amended by section 2 of the *Land Act 1933* do by this my Proclamation alter the designation Town of Cashel of the area of land in the Parish of Dookie, County of Moira defined as the Town of Dookie by Proclamation dated 17th February 1873 (see *Government Gazette* 1873 page 348) and altered to the Town of Cashel by Proclamation dated 1st May 1876 (see *Government Gazette* 1876 page 843) as reduced by Proclamation dated 2nd February 1904 (see *Government Gazette* 1904 page 510) to Township of Cashel.—(C.482⁽²⁾) (D.96⁽³⁾) (C.96267).

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF MOORABBIN.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946*, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and

from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Moorabbin has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved for a street within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare that all that piece of land reserved for a street, being part of Dendy's Crown Special Survey, Parish of Moorabbin, County of Bourke, and being the land described hereunder shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, namely:

Tovan Akas-avenue (Western Portion).

Commencing at the north-western angle of lot 15 shown on lodged plan of subdivision No. 12818, bounded thence by the Nepean Highway bearing 314 deg. 27 min. 69 ft. 6 in., thence by lines bearing respectively 88 deg. 18 min. 704 ft. 10 in., 88 deg. 33 min. 140 ft. 10 in., 177 deg. 5 min. 50 feet, 268 deg. 33 min. 142 feet and 268 deg. 18 min. 656 ft. 6 in. to the point of commencement.

UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS AMENDING
REGULATIONS No. 5.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 897 of the *Local Government Act* 1946 (No. 5203) that the Governor in Council, after consideration by the Minister of any report and draft Regulations submitted to the Minister by the Committee appointed under section 892 of the said Act, may make Regulations for or with respect to regulating, restricting, restraining, or prohibiting the construction, pulling down, or removal of buildings and any matters connected therewith and (without affecting the generality of the foregoing) for or with respect to all or any of certain matters therein specified, and whereas the Minister has duly considered a report and draft Regulations submitted to him by the said Committee for the purpose of further amending the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, made by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of June, 1945, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th day of June, 1945:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the aforesaid section 897, doth hereby make the following Regulations which may be cited as the Uniform Building Regulations Amending Regulations No. 5, and which shall be read and construed as one with the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, as amended by the Uniform Building Regulations Amending Regulations Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4, and doth fix the eighth day of August, 1955, as the day on which the Regulations so made shall come into operation.

The Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, as amended, are hereby further amended as follows:—

1. In sub-clause (a) of clause 303, for the words "the proper officer of the Government department, council or public authority administering such provisions shall give notice", there shall be substituted the words "the Government department, council or public authority administering such provisions shall, through its proper officer, give notice".

2. In sub-clause (b) of clause 503, for the word "coloured" there shall be substituted the expression "(and, for alterations, coloured)".

3. In clause 506—

(a) In sub-clause (c) the words "provided that where the height of the structure does not exceed four times its average width, the calculation for wind pressure forces and moments on the columns, floor beams, girders, and slabs need not be submitted" shall be repealed.

(b) After sub-clause (c) the following sub-clause shall be inserted:—

"(d) Every new structure or alteration to an existing structure shall conform to the requirements of S.A.A. Code for Minimum Design Loads on Buildings No. Int. 350-1952, and calculations showing such conformity shall be lodged with the surveyor."

4. For clause 808 there shall be substituted the following clause:—

"808. **Site Dimensions.**—No person shall construct a building of Class III, V, VI, VII, VIII, or IX. Occupancy unless the site thereof has an area of not less than 800 square feet and a frontage of not less than 16 feet, provided that where a building of Class IV. Occupancy is attached thereto the area of the site shall be not less than 2,000 square feet."

5. In clause 809, for paragraphs (a), (b), (c) and (d), there shall be substituted the following paragraphs:—

- (a) The minimum distance from a boundary other than frontage shall be the minimum distance prescribed under clause 805 for a one-storey building, plus 6 inches for every foot by which the height of the wall constructed adjacent to such boundary exceeds 12 feet;
- (b) nothing in this clause shall require a building to be set back from any portion of a side or rear boundary where the wall of a building on the adjoining allotment abuts on such portion;
- (c) this clause shall not apply in respect of any building on a site shown as a shop site on a plan of subdivision approved by the council and lodged in the Office of Titles prior to the commencement of these Regulations;
- (d) where the site of a building is not in a locality in the opinion of the council used or intended to be used primarily for the erection of dwellings, the council may grant a dispensation from the requirements of this clause where the outlook from and the natural lighting of adjacent buildings of Class I. or Class II. Occupancy will not be unreasonably affected.

6. In sub-clauses (d) and (e) of clause 813, after the word "building" there shall be inserted the expression "of Class I. or Class II. Occupancy".

7. Sub-clause (f) of clause 813 shall be repealed and a new clause shall be inserted after clause 813 as follows:—

"814. Sites Below Minimum Requirements.—(a) In any case where—

- (i) on the date the Uniform Building Regulations came into force in a municipality any land having less area, depth or width of frontage than specified in column 1 of Table 803; or
- (ii) on the date of commencement of the relevant by-law adopting any other column of Table 803 any other land having less area, depth or width of frontage than specified in such column—

existed as a separate allotment and had not subsequently been reduced in area, the council may permit the construction of a building of Class I. Occupancy on such land notwithstanding that such land has less area, depth or width of frontage than specified in the relevant column of Table 803, and may permit such building to be constructed nearer to any boundary than prescribed by clauses 805 and 806.

(b) In any case where on the date the Uniform Building Regulations came into force in a municipality any land existed as a separate allotment and had not subsequently been reduced in area, the council may permit the construction thereon of a building of Class III., V., VI., VII., or VIII. Occupancy, or a building to which a building of Class IV. Occupancy is attached, notwithstanding that such land has less area, depth or width of frontage than specified in clause 808.

(c) For the purposes of this clause, land shall be deemed to have existed as a separate allotment—

- (i) if it was shown as a separate allotment on any plan of subdivision lodged in the Office of Titles; or
- (ii) if the council is satisfied that on the relevant date such land existed as a separate allotment, whether by ownership, occupation, use or otherwise."

8. In clause 1003 for the words "a habitable room built wholly or partly in the roof" there shall be substituted the words "any habitable room in an attic".

9. For sub-clause (c) of clause 1006 there shall be substituted the following sub-clause:—

"(c) The surveyor may, on the recommendation of the Chief Inspector of Factories, in any particular case, vary any of the requirements of this clause where the circumstances so warrant."

10. In clause 1008, for the expression "Class II., III., IV., V., VII., or VIII. Occupancy", there shall be substituted the expression "Class I., II., III., IV., V., VI., VII., or VIII. Occupancy".

11. In clause 1144, for the expression "2 ft. 6 in.", there shall be substituted the expression "2 feet."

12. In clause 1303, for the expression "S.A.A. Specification for Building Bricks, No. A.21-1934", there shall be substituted the expression "S.A.A. Specification for Burnt Clay and Shale Building Bricks, No. Int. 323".

13. Clause 1304 shall be repealed and clauses 1305, 1306, and 1307 shall be renumbered 1304, 1305, and 1306, respectively.

14. In clause 1305, for the expression "No. A2-1948", there shall be substituted the expression "No. A2-1953".

15. A new clause, numbered 1307, shall be inserted as follows:—

"1307. Perlite and Vermiculite.—Perlite and vermiculite aggregates shall conform to the requirements of the American Society for Testing Materials Tentative Specifications for Inorganic Aggregates for Use in Interior Plaster, No. C.35-52T."

16. In paragraph (i) of sub-clause (d) of clause 1315, for the expression "S.A.A. Specification for B.S.W. Bright Hexagon Bolts, Set Screws and Nuts, No. B.48-1932", there shall be substituted the expression "S.A.A. Specification for Precision Hexagon Bolts, Screws and Nuts No. B117-1953".

17. For clause 1320, there shall be substituted the following clause:—

"1320. Precast Concrete Masonry Units.—Precast concrete masonry units may be either hollow or solid and shall conform to the requirements of S.A.A. Housing Specification (Interim Series) for Precast Concrete Masonry Units, No. 306."

18. In clause 1324, for the expression "No. 690-1945", there shall be substituted the expression "No. 690-1953".

19. In sub-clause (j) of clause 1325, for the expression "(Second Edition)" there shall be substituted the expression "(Third Edition)".

20. In clause 1401:—

(a) In sub-clause (a) for the expression "S.A.A. Specification, No. A.30-1935" there shall be substituted the expression "British Standard Specification for Fire Tests on Building Materials and Structures No. 476-1953".

(b) For sub-clause (b) there shall be substituted the following sub-clause:—

"(b) The materials or combinations of materials set out in this chapter have or shall be deemed to have the fire-resistance ratings given:

Other materials or combinations of materials may be used in place thereof if such materials or combinations of materials have, when subjected to the Standard Fire Test, a fire-resistance rating at least equal to that required by these Regulations for the part of the structure in which it is proposed to use them, provided that the Standard Fire Test shall not be necessary when the materials or combinations of materials are shown by official reports issued by the Australian Commonwealth Experimental Building Station, the National Bureau of Standards in the U.S.A., the Underwriters' Laboratories in the U.S.A., or the Joint Fire Research Organization in Great Britain to have the required fire-resistance ratings and provided further that for the purpose of this chapter any reference in such reports to the fire-resistance rating of gypsum perlite or gypsum vermiculite plasters shall be deemed to apply equally to both gypsum perlite and gypsum vermiculite plasters."

21. In clause 1402, after sub-clause (e), there shall be inserted a new sub-clause as follows:—

"(f) Where gypsum perlite or gypsum vermiculite plaster is permitted for thicknesses up to 1 inch, it may be applied in one or two coats, which shall consist of 2½ cubic feet.

of perlite or vermiculite (and for the first coat 5 lb. of hydrated lime) to 100 lb. of gypsum plaster. For a thickness exceeding 1 inch, the plaster shall be applied in two coats, of which the first shall consist of 2 cubic feet of perlite or vermiculite and 5 lb. of hydrated lime to 100 lb. of gypsum plaster and the second of 3 cubic feet of perlite or vermiculite to 100 lb. of gypsum plaster."

(a) In paragraph (ii), after the expression "3-in. reinforced concrete," there shall be inserted the expression "2½-in. gypsum perlite or gypsum vermiculite plaster on expanded metal or wire lath on incombustible studding", and

(b) In paragraph (iii), after the expression "2½-in. solid Portland cement plaster or gypsum plaster on expanded metal or wire lath on incombustible studding", there shall be inserted the expression:—

"2-in. gypsum perlite or gypsum vermiculite plaster on expanded metal or wire lath on incombustible studding."

23. In sub-clause (c) of clause 1404:—

(a) At the end of paragraph (i) there shall be inserted the following expression:—

"Floor and beam construction consisting of 2-in. reinforced concrete floor on steel floor units mounted on steel beams, or steel joists or light steel construction carrying 2½-in. reinforced concrete or gypsum slab, in each case having a securely suspended ceiling consisting of expanded metal lath weighing not less than 3 lb. per square yard covered with gypsum perlite or gypsum vermiculite plaster ½ inch thick, as measured from the underside of the metal lath to the under surface of the plaster ceiling. The upper surface of the metal lath shall not be less than ¼ inch from the steel load-bearing members. The ceiling shall be continuous, but in any 100 square feet it may have duct openings of a total area not exceeding 70 square inches, spaced not less than 8 inches clear from any load-bearing member, and one electrical outlet. All duct openings shall be protected by approved fire dampers"; and

(b) At the end of paragraph (ii), there shall be inserted the following expression:—

"Floor and beam construction consisting of 2-in. reinforced concrete floor on steel joists or light steel construction, with a securely suspended ceiling consisting of ½-in. perforated gypsum lath covered with gypsum perlite or gypsum vermiculite plaster ½ inch thick. The upper surface of the gypsum lath shall not be less than ¼ inch from the steel load-bearing members. The ceiling shall be continuous, but in any 100 square feet it may have duct openings of a total area not exceeding 70 square inches spaced not less than 8 inches clear from any load-bearing member, and one electrical outlet. All duct openings shall be protected by approved fire dampers."

24. For sub-clause (d) of clause 1404, there shall be substituted the following sub-clause:—

(d) **Steel Columns.**—Thicknesses given below are the minimum thicknesses measured from the face of the steel exclusive of rivet heads, but in the case of columns in buildings of Class VI and Class VII. Occupancy, such thicknesses shall be increased by ½ inch. In columns required to have 4-hour or 3-hour ratings, re-entrant or other accessible spaces behind the specified outer protection shall, unless otherwise stated, be filled with concrete or with the material of the outer protection. When re-entrant or other accessible spaces behind the specified outer protection are not filled, the spaces shall be effectively sealed at each floor level. Where the edges of the

flanges of the columns project beyond the webs, the thicknesses specified may be reduced by not more than $\frac{1}{2}$ inch immediately opposite such edges. (See also clause 2408.)

(i) 4 Hours.

- 2½ in. concrete or precast concrete,
- 2 in. concrete, plastered,
- 4½ in. brick,
- 4 in. solid concrete block, Grade A or B,

29. Clauses 1504 and 1505, Table 1505, clauses 1506, 1509, 1510, 1511, and 1513 shall be repealed, and clauses 1507, 1508, 1512, and 1515 shall be renumbered 1504, 1505, 1506 and 1508 respectively.

30. Clause 1514 shall be renumbered 1507, the letter "(a)" shall be inserted before the word "Where" in the first line, and new sub-clauses shall be added thereto as follows:—

- (b) Where asbestos cement is used for the roof covering, the following additional requirements shall be complied with:—
 - (i) Wire meshing of adequate strength shall be securely fixed between the roof sheathing and the purlins or other members supporting the sheathing;

- (c) Measurements of settlement shall be made every hour for six hours after each application of load and at least every twelve hours thereafter.
- (d) Each of the above tests shall be commenced within 24 hours of the opening of the test hole.
- (e) Samples of foundation material in an undisturbed condition may be submitted to an approved soil-testing laboratory for approved testing. The results of such test may, at the discretion of the surveyor, be used in the determination of the safe bearing pressure for foundations at the site from which the sample was taken.

38. For paragraph (c) of clause 2046, there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

"(c) reinforced concrete not less than 4 inches in thickness, provided it is connected to a reinforced concrete roof or wall."

39. For clause 2047, there shall be substituted the following clause:—

"**2047. Minimum Heights.**—Every parapet shall be carried to a height not less than 16 inches from the highest part of the adjoining gutter, or where no gutter adjoins, from the roof covering measured at right angles to the slope of the roof."

40. Clause 2048 shall be repealed.

41. In clauses 2402 and 2403 for the expression "S.A.A. Code for Structural Steel in Building, No. C.A.I.-1939", wherever occurring and in clause 2405 for the expression "S.A.A. Code C.A.I.-1939", there shall be substituted the expression "S.A.A. Code for Use of Structural Steel in Building, No. Int. 351-1952".

42. In clause 2807, for the expression "(other than a building of Class I, II, or III: Occupancy exceeding two storeys in height)" there shall be substituted the expression "(not being a building of Class I, II, or III: Occupancy containing only one or two storeys)".

43. At the end of clause 2907, there shall be inserted the expression—

"The provisions of this clause shall not apply to screens not exceeding 7 ft. 6 in. in height."

44. In clause 3103, at the end of sub-clause (a), there shall be inserted the words "A laundry may be combined with a bathroom, but not with any other room".

45. In clause 3128—

(a) for sub-clause (b) there shall be substituted the following sub-clause:—

“(b) (i) A garage shall not without the permission of the council be constructed closer to the frontage than the building to which it is appurtenant or closer to any other street alignment than the minimum distance prescribed by these Regulations for such building provided that a garage may be attached to the front of a building without such permission so long as no part thereof is closer to the frontage than the maximum distance prescribed for such building.

(ii) No part of a garage permitted to be closer to the frontage than the minimum distance prescribed for the said building shall be constructed nearer than four feet to the boundary of an adjoining allotment.”

(b) In sub-clause (e) the expression “Notwithstanding anything in sub-clause (b) hereof,” and paragraph (i) shall be repealed.

ALLOWANCES TO WITNESSES AND INTERPRETERS IN CRIMINAL CASES ON PROSECUTIONS BY OFFICERS ON BEHALF OF THE CROWN AND AT INQUESTS.

UNDER and by virtue of the powers and authorities under thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind the Order

in Council made on 7th June, 1938, as amended by Orders in Council dated 19th September, 1938, 23rd December, 1947, 19th June, 1950, 28th April, 1953, and 21st June, 1955, and doth make the following Order in lieu:—

ALLOWANCES TO WITNESSES AND INTERPRETERS IN CRIMINAL CASES ON PROSECUTIONS BY OFFICERS ON BEHALF OF THE CROWN AND AT INQUESTS.

Transport.

1. (a) To every witness and interpreter, when it is necessary to travel by public transport to attend Court, the sum actually and properly paid for fares. Provided that when more than one class of accommodation is available on any public conveyance the witness or interpreter must use that class which is suitable to his or her station in life.

(b) To every witness and interpreter, when travel by public transport is not practicable, the sum actually paid but not exceeding Six pence per mile for each mile he or she may have to travel to and from the Court attended.

Attendance.

For each day of attendance at Court and for each day necessarily absent from home travelling to and from Court.

(a) To every Barrister, Solicitor, Medical Practitioner, Pharmaceutical Chemist, Dentist, Veterinary Surgeon, Civil Engineer, Architect, Surveyor, Accountant (defined clause 11), Notary or Expert Witness—

When attending in a professional capacity, the amount agreed upon not exceeding

when not attending in a professional capacity and to every Clergy, Bank Officer, Merchant or Auctioneer—the amount actually lost by such attendance not exceeding

(b) To every Interpreter—for each case in which he or she acts in a professional capacity, for each full day or portion thereof, the amount agreed upon but not exceeding

(c) To every witness who is in receipt of a salary or wage, the amount actually lost in salary or wage through attendance at Court—not exceeding

(d) To every other witness the actual expense incurred for sustenance necessarily incurred through attendance at Court, not exceeding the amounts specified in clause 3.

Accommodation and Sustenance.

3. To every witness and interpreter there may be allowed for accommodation and sustenance, the amount actually incurred but not exceeding the rates for meals and accommodation fixed from time to time by the Public Service Board as the rates of travelling expenses for officers, other than Permanent Heads, of the State Public Service.

4. A witness or interpreter who has lost salary, wages or earnings in excess of the amounts allowed under clause 2 or who has incurred expenses in excess of the amounts allowed under clause 3 or has incurred expenses not provided for in these allowances may be paid such further amount as the Secretary of the Law Department or in his absence the Acting Secretary of the Law Department shall approve.

5. A witness or interpreter who has been necessarily detained or prevented from proceeding on his journey to or from the Court attended may be paid the allowances set forth in these Regulations.

6. Witnesses who attend in more than one prosecution or matter are entitled to a proportionate payment only in each case.

7. No allowance is payable to a member of the Police Force.

8. No allowance is payable to an aboriginal native or to any prisoner of the Crown, but every Protector, Constable Warder or other person having charge of such native or prisoner may receive the expenses incurred through the attendance of such witness at Court.

9. A witness, other than a professional or expert witness, shall not be paid more than is sufficient to cover the loss which has been or will be sustained through attendance at Court, not exceeding in any event the maximum amounts provided in these Regulations, and it shall be the duty of the Stipendiary Magistrate, or if no Stipendiary be present, the Chairman of the Bench or Presiding Justice, as the case may be, or the Coroner to satisfy himself that such loss has been or will be sustained through such attendance and a special minute to that effect must be placed on the face of the account, signed by such Stipendiary Magistrate, Chairman, Presiding Justice or Coroner. When paying a witness who has attended the Supreme Court or a Court of General Sessions the paying officer shall similarly satisfy himself and shall endorse and sign on the back of the abstract a general certificate that he has done so.

10. The abstracts of payments to witnesses and interpreters must be certified as inspected and approved as follows:—

- (a) Supreme Courts—by the Sheriff or Deputy Sheriffs, as the case may be.
- (b) Courts of General Sessions—by the Clerks of the Peace, countersigned, except at Melbourne, by the Prosecutors for the Crown.
- (c) Courts of Petty Sessions—by the Stipendiary Magistrates, Chairmen of Benches or Presiding Justices.
- (d) Inquests—by the Coroners or Deputy Coroners.

11. "Accountant" shall mean and include a member or associate of any recognized Society or Association of Accountants or Actuaries in Great Britain or Ireland, a member of any institute approved by the Governor in Council in accord with the provisions of section 134 of the *Companies Act 1938* (No. 4602), a person holding the Degree of Bachelor of Commerce or the Diploma of the University of Melbourne, a Public Accountant or Auditor practising as such, a Government Auditor of Municipal Accounts or any person licensed by the Companies' Auditors Board.

FORESTS COMMISSION OF VICTORIA.

OFFERS FOR WATTLE BARK IN THE STATE FORESTS, ETC., 1955.

OFFERS, endorsed "Offer for Wattle Bark, lot—," and addressed to the Secretary, Forests Commission, Melbourne, will be received at this office up to Twelve noon on Friday, 2nd September, 1955, for the right to strip and remove wattle bark on and from the following areas. The general conditions hereunder will apply in every case where not expressly stated to the contrary, and special conditions will also apply where provided. Full particulars may be obtained from the officer in charge in each case, or on application to the Commission.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

1. No offer will necessarily be accepted.
2. The deposit specified in Schedule must accompany each offer.
3. The licensee shall do everything within his power to strip and remove all bark available on the area upon which he is licensed to operate.
4. Stripping shall be commenced within six weeks from date of acceptance of offer unless otherwise authorized by the Commission.
5. No stripping shall be commenced until the applicant has lodged the deposit specified and is in possession of the requisite licence.
6. Notification, in writing, that stripping operations have been commenced must be forwarded to the officer in charge within 48 hours from date thereof.
7. No tree shall be felled or stripped on any area which the officer in charge directs is not to be operated upon, and no particular tree specially marked by him to remain standing shall be felled or stripped.
8. In the event of stripping being permitted on any area regarded as a tourist resort all tops must be lopped, stacked, and burned under the direction of and in accordance with the written conditions specified by the officer in charge.
9. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any water-course or to obstruct any road or track.
10. Except with the permission of the officer in charge, no tree of less than 5 inches diameter shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated in the licence. Wherever a size limit is stated it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground.

11. All stripping must cease by 31st March following the date of issue of licence unless otherwise authorized, in writing, by the officer in charge.

12. Bark must be properly bundled, securely tied, and stacked in heaps of not less than 10 cwt. in clear places only, and the licensee must take such precautions as the officer in charge may direct to safeguard such bark from loss by fire.

13. No bark shall be removed without the permission of the officer in charge, and it must be carted from the forest and weighed not later than one month from the date of stripping the bark unless otherwise authorized by the officer in charge.

14. The whole of the work shall be done under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the officer in charge and at a rate satisfactory to the Commission.

15. All bark must be weighed at the weighbridge stipulated in the licence, or at such other weighbridge as may be approved by the officer in charge, and in all cases at the expense of the licensee. Duplicate weighbridge tickets must be provided and, if so directed by him, the bark must be weighed in the presence of the officer in charge.

16. Prior to removal of the bark satisfactory arrangements must be made with the Commission for payment of royalty. The licensee shall pay such royalty at the rate tendered on weights as disclosed by the weighbridge dockets.

17. Camps must be pitched and fires lighted only in such places as shall be determined by the officer in charge, and the licensee shall, on demand of the officer, instantly dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall carelessly use, leave, or light any fire otherwise than in accordance with the Forests Acts and Regulations.

18. The licensee shall forthwith comply with any direction given to him by the officer in charge for the effective protection from fire of the forest within the boundaries of the area upon which he is licensed to operate, and he shall do everything that is reasonably within his power to prevent from spreading and to extinguish any fire which may break out on such area or which may spread to it.

19. The violation of any of the above conditions will render the licence null and void, and the Forests Commission shall have absolute power to forfeit the whole or part of the deposit to the Crown and to seize all bark stripped to date of voidance. The officer in charge shall have power to suspend operations pending the decision of the Forests Commission.

In event of failure of any owner or occupier (as the case may be) of any property or premises to comply with the requirements of Clause 1 hereof the Council may cause measures to be taken to destroy the vermin or pests at the expense of such owner or occupier and recover the cost thereof as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

3. Every person shall for wilful act or default contrary to any provision of this By-law be guilty of an offence and be liable for every offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and to a penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after conviction or order by any court.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Caulfield.

A By-law of the Borough of Kyabram, made under the Local Government Act and the Uniform Building Regulations of Victoria, and numbered 2, for determining, applying, dispensing with or regulating such matter or things as are left to be determined, applied, dispensed with or regulated by the Council of the said Borough of Kyabram, under the Uniform Building Regulations of Victoria.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by the Local Government Act and Uniform Building Regulations of Victoria and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors and Burgesses of the Borough of Kyabram order as follows:—

1. The areas set out as described in the First Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as Brick Areas and no person shall in any such area construct or cause to be constructed any building the external walls of which are of material other than brick, stone or concrete.

2. The minimum area, depth and width of frontage specified in column 3 of Table 803 of Uniform Building Regulations of Victoria (hereinafter called the Regulations) are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth and width of frontage of land on which a building shall be constructed throughout the whole of the municipal district of the said Borough of Kyabram.

3. (a) The minimum distance of the outer wall of any building of Class I. and II. Occupancy from the frontage of any land is hereby specified as 15 feet.

(b) No person shall construct any building of Class I. and II. Occupancy closer to the frontage of any land than 15 feet.

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulations, any person may with the consent of the Council in any case where on the date of commencement of the Regulations such land existed as a separate allotment and has not since been reduced in area or is shown on any plan of subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles.

(a) Construct a building of Class I. Occupancy on land having a lesser area, depth, or width of frontage than those specified in Column 3 of Table 803 of the Regulations or having a lesser distance from the frontage than that specified in Clause 3 of this By-law (as the case may be); or

(b) Construct a building of Class III., V., VI., VII., or VIII. Occupancy or a building to which a building of Class IV. Occupancy is attached on land having an area, depth, or width of frontage less than that prescribed in Clause 808 of the Regulations.

5. In the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the Council and lodged with the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the Regulations the requirements of Clause 811 of the Regulations are hereby dispensed with.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

(a) That portion of Allan-street lying between the eastern building lines of Dawes-road and Saunders-street and the point where the Echuca-Toolamba railway line crosses Allan-street at the eastern end thereof.

Limit of Three Storeys.

3. The area set out and described in the Second Schedule hereto, are hereby prescribed as areas in which buildings of Classes II. and III. Occupancy shall not be constructed to contain more than three storeys, including the ground storey, and no person shall in any such area construct a building of Class II. or III. Occupancy to contain more than three storeys, including the ground storey.

Limit of Two Storeys.

4. The area set out and described in the Third Schedule hereto, excluding those areas set out and described in the Second Schedule hereto, are hereby prescribed as areas in which buildings of Classes II. and III. Occupancy shall not be constructed to contain more than two storeys, including the ground storey, and no person shall in any such area construct a building of Class II. or III. Occupancy to contain more than two storeys, including the ground storey.

Minimum Area, Depth, Width of Frontage, and Minimum Distance of Outer Walls from Boundaries.

5. The minimum area, width of frontage, and minimum distance of outer walls from boundaries specified in Column 3 of Table 803 of the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria (hereinafter called the Regulations), are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth, width of frontage, and minimum distance of outer walls from boundaries for land on which a building shall be constructed throughout the whole of the area proclaimed as set out in the Third Schedule hereto.

Sites Below Minimum Requirements.

6. Subject to the Regulations made pursuant to section 17 of the Slum Reclamation and Housing Act, in any case where on the date of the commencement of the

Regulations, land existed as a separate allotment and has not since been reduced in area, or is shown on any plan approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles,

- (a) a building of Class I. 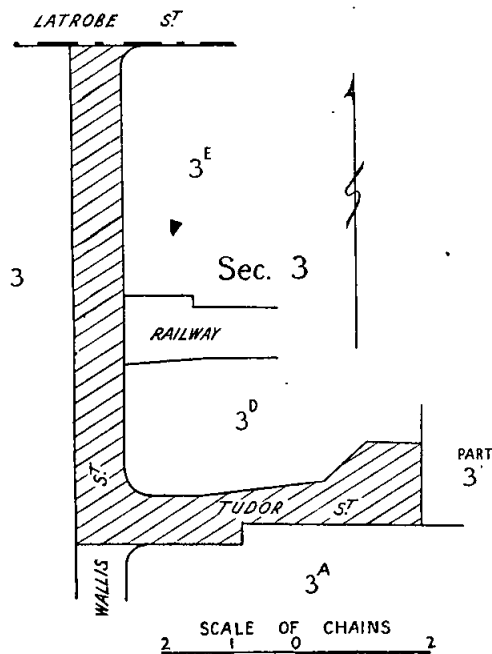

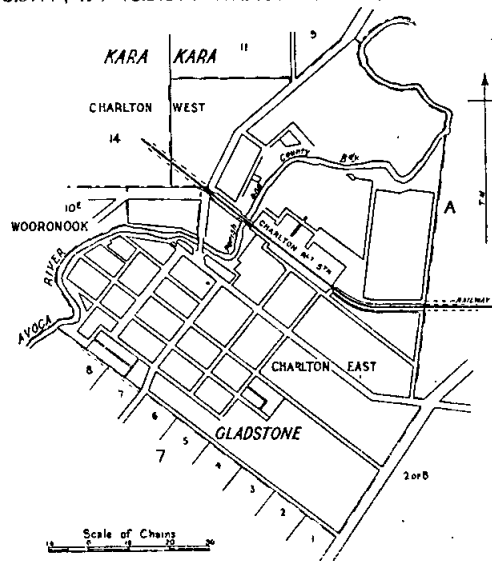

Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935 (No. 4337).

DECLARING THAT EGGS SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE EGG AND EGG PULP MARKETING BOARD FOR A FURTHER PERIOD OF TWO YEARS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 16 of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935* it is enacted that where a product has been declared a commodity and a board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation—

(a) provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith, upon the date of publication of the Proclamation or on from and after a later date specified in the Proclamation, be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the board as the owner thereof and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent Proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the board as the owner thereof; and

(b) make such further provision as will enable the board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner, and to deal with the same. And whereas by a Proclamation made on the 16th day of June, 1936, under the provisions of section 6 of the said Act, the Governor in Council declared eggs to be a commodity and for the purposes of the said Act. And whereas by an Order made on 8th February, 1937, the Governor in Council appointed a marketing board in relation to eggs and egg pulp and assigned to such board the name of "The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board". Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby provide and declare that on from and after the sixteenth day of August, 1955, all eggs shall, subject to and in accordance with the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935*, be divested from the producers of eggs and become vested in and be

the absolute property of The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any eggs coming into existence within two (2) years from the sixteenth day of August, 1955, they shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board as the owner thereof, and to enable The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board as owners of the above-mentioned commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with the same I do further provide that all such eggs shall subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act be delivered by the producers thereof to The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times at such places and in such manner as The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board by public notice, or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by regulations made under the said Act.

BENDIGO SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

BY-LAW No. 3.

A By-law of the Bendigo Sewerage Authority relating to consents, licences, &c., and levels, dimensions, construction, maintenance, ventilation, and cleansing of sewers and other matters relating to house connexion work.

THE Bendigo Sewerage Authority, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Sewerage Districts Acts and of any and every other power or authority in any wise enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and prescribe the following By-law, that is to say:—

In the construction and interpretation of this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Acts" means the Sewerage Districts Acts and any amendment thereof, and any Act incorporated therein, or amendment of such Acts.

"Anti-siphonage vent" (or "back vent") means any vent pipe from any individual trap to the open air, or to a main or branch vent pipe having for its purpose the prevention of loss of water seal in the trap.

"Approved" means approved by the Authority or its Proper Officer.

"Authority" means the Bendigo Sewerage Authority.

"Bore, diameter or size" in reference to any pipe means the nominal internal diameter thereof.

"Building" means any building used as a work place, residence, place of business, place of amusement, or place of human habitation, or for the storage of food intended for human consumption, but does not include out-buildings unless such are used for any of the above purposes.

"Combined pipe system" means that type of plumbing installation in which disconnector traps are omitted, and both soil and waste pipes are connected directly to the drain or to a common pipe taking both soil and waste discharge, and in which a common system of venting is used for all classes of pipe.

"Combined waste pipe" means any pipe which receives the discharges from both soil and waste fixtures and conveys the same to the drain. Combined waste pipes are connected directly to the drain, and are used only in connexion with the combined pipe system.

"Disconnector trap" means a trap for isolating or disconnecting waste pipes from the drain and soil pipes and providing inlet ventilation to the waste pipe or pipes discharging into it.

"Drain" means that portion of a drainage system, not vested in the Authority, which conveys the discharge from soil, waste, combined waste, and other drainage pipes from any system to the sewer, and includes any drain for draining any group or block of houses by combined operation under order of Authority, but does not include storm-water drainage pipes.

"Educt vent" means an opening or pipe for the exit of air from, and the induction of draught in, a soil pipe, waste pipe, combined waste pipe, or drain.

"Engineer" means the Engineer of the Authority, and shall also include any officer or person appointed by the Authority for the purposes of discharging the duties or exercising the powers of the Engineer.

"External closet" means and includes any closet other than an "internal closet."

"Fittings" mean all apparatus or appliances, together with their necessary appurtenances and connexions, for use in connexion with the plumbing or drainage system of any property, with the exception of fixtures and straight piping.

For the purpose of computing fees payable under this By-law "fitting" includes any sanitary or plumbing fixture or each piece of equipment which is connected to or discharges its waste water through a waste outlet or to a common outlet.

"Fixtures" mean all apparatus or appliances, together with their necessary appurtenances and connexions, which may be attached to the plumbing or drainage system of any property, and which are intended for the collection or retention of any wastes or waste waters for ultimate discharge into the sewerage system.

"Flat" means that portion of a building used, or intended, adapted or designed for use as a separate dwelling.

"Induct vent" means an opening or pipe for the admission of air to a soil pipe, waste pipe, combined waste pipe, or drain.

"Interceptor trap" (or "boundary trap") means a trap for preventing the passage of air or gases from the sewer to the drain, and situated on the drain at some point between the sewer and the lowest inlet to the drain.

"Internal closet" means any closet which is entered from or has an opening into any building.

"Owner" means the person for the time being who receives or is entitled to receive the rent of the land or premises in connexion with which the word is used (whether on his own account or as the agent of or as trustee for any other person), or who would be entitled to receive the same if the land or premises were let at a rent.

"Premises" includes any house and any building whatsoever and any part of any house or building, and any garden, stable, yard, or other offices used together or in connexion with any house or building and every part thereof.

"Proper officer" means the officer appointed by the Authority for the purpose of insuring the carrying out of the relevant divisions of the By-law.

"Separate pipe system" means that type of plumbing installation in which separate pipes are provided for soil and waste discharges and for the ventilation of soil and waste fixtures and in which every waste pipe is connected to the drain through a disconnector trap.

"Sewer" means any conduit for the carriage of sewage, which is vested in the Authority.

"Sewerage district" means any area which under the Sewerage Districts Acts is proclaimed the Sewerage District of the Authority, and includes any area which is added to and forms part of such Sewerage District.

"Sewerage installation" of a property means all soil, waste, and combined waste pipes and drains conveying household drainage, sewage, and trade wastes to the sewers of the Sewerage Authority, and all vent pipes, fixtures, fittings, apparatus and appliances connected thereto.

"Sewerage system" includes all sewers, fittings, fixtures, appliances, plant, machinery, and any other sewerage works vested in the Authority.

"Sewered property" means as well as any sewered land or premises any land or premises which have been declared by a general notice given by the Authority under the Acts to be deemed and taken to be a sewered property within the meaning of the Acts.

"Slop sink" means any fixture, other than a closet pan or urinal used for the discharge of soil or urine waters and provided with a flushing apparatus.

"Soil pipe" means any pipe, which conveys the discharge from water closets, slop sinks, mortuaries, operating theatres, or urinals to the drain.

"Stack" means any vertical line of soil, waste, combined waste, or vent piping, with its offsets, if any.

"Trade waste" means the liquid fluid or suspended refuse from any business, trade, or manufacturing property, other than domestic sewage, storm water, or unpolluted water.

"Trap" means any fitting designed to retain a quantity of water to arrest the passage of air or gases through such fitting.

"Waste pipe" means any pipe which conveys the discharge from any fixture, except water closets, slop sinks, mortuaries, operating theatres, or urinals to a disconnector trap in the case of the separate pipe system or directly to the drain in the case of the combined pipe system.

"Water seal" (or "trap seal") means the vertical distance between the dip and the crown weir of a trap.

"Wrought iron" and "sheet iron" include mild steel sheet.

"Yard gully" means a drainage trap which is used externally and fitted with a dished top and grating.

PART 1.—DIVISION 1. EXISTING BY-LAWS.

Section 1.

All parts of this Authority's By-law No. 2 are repealed.

PART 2.—DIVISION 2.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

Section 2.

Uses of Sewers and Drains.—The owner and the occupier of any sewered property shall discharge into the sewerage system all faecal matter, urine, household slops, and household liquid refuse from such property, and such other polluted water from stables, washing areas, manure bins, basements, cellars, and roofed yards, and no other substance except as further herein provided.

Section 3.

Prohibited Discharges and Trade Wastes.—No person shall cause or permit to be discharged into any sewer of the Sewerage Authority, excepting with the written consent of the Authority, any trade or manufacturing liquid, refuse or waste other than domestic sewage. No person shall cause or permit to flow, or pass or be carried, from any manufacturing or business or other premises of any such person into any sewer of the Authority or any drain or pipe communicating therewith, any wastes, liquids or refuse:—

1. The pH. of which is less than five (5) or greater than ten (10).
2. Containing more than 10 parts per million of the following gases:—Hydrogen, sulphide, sulphur-dioxide, nitrous oxide, or any of the halogens.
3. Containing any explosive substances.
4. Containing any flammable substance with the flash point lower than 187 degrees Fahrenheit.
5. Having a temperature higher than 140 degrees Fahrenheit.
6. Containing grease or oil or other substance that will solidify or become viscous at temperatures between 32 degrees and 140 degrees Fahrenheit.
7. Containing substances in suspension exceeding a daily average of 500 parts per million.
8. Containing total solids in solution and suspension in excess of 20,000 parts per million or exceeding a daily average of 2,000 parts per million.
9. Containing gases or vapours either free or occluded, in concentrations which are toxic or dangerous to humans or animals.
10. Containing more than 100 parts per million of any antiseptic substance.
11. Containing phenols in excess of 0.005 parts per million.
12. Containing any toxic or irritating substance which will create conditions hazardous to public health and safety.
13. Containing in excess of 100 parts per million or exceeding a daily average of 25 parts per million of any grease or oil or any oily substances.
14. Containing cyanogen compounds capable of liberating hydro-cyanic acid on acidification.
15. Containing tar or tar oil.
16. Containing carbide of calcium.
17. Containing sulphides, hydrosulphides and/or polysulphides.
18. Containing carbon bisulphide.
19. Consisting of or containing condensing water or cooling water.
20. Containing any radio-active constituents.
21. Containing mercury, copper, or other metals with antiseptic action.

Before the written consent of the Authority may be obtained as required under this section it shall be necessary for any person desiring such consent to apply to the Authority in writing and to execute on demand by the Authority the standard agreement between the said person and the Authority to admit trade wastes to the Authority's sewer.

Section 4.

Sub-soil Water.—The discharge of sub-soil water into the sewer shall be prohibited except by permission of the Authority under conditions approved by the Authority.

DIVISION 3.

CONSENTS, ETC.

Section 5.

Connexion.—The Authority may, if it thinks fit, authorize or require that any of the following places, namely:—Stables, cow sheds, dairies, market places, abattoirs, areas for washing vehicles, and any other polluted place be connected with the sewers, subject to such conditions as the Authority may impose.

Section 6.

Conditions Governing Connexion.—No such connexion shall be made unless the following conditions have been complied with:—

- (a) The place to be connected shall, if required, be so roofed as to prevent the entry of rain water from it to the sewers, and in no case shall rain water be permitted to discharge on to such place from adjoining surfaces.
- (b) The place to be connected shall be paved above the level of the yard with approved materials, and graded to the satisfaction of the Proper Officer.
- (c) The drain from any such place shall be provided with an approved silt trap with a removable grating and connected with the drain inside the boundary line of the property. A water tap connected with a satisfactory water service shall be provided in a suitable position over the area.

Section 7.

Application for the Authority's consent to connect with the sewerage system or to do plumbing or drainage work connected therewith must be made in writing by the owner of the property to be so connected, or by his authorized agent.

Section 8.

Such application shall give the precise location of the property, the name of the owner, and the name of the person employed to do the work, and shall be in form prescribed by the Authority. For any wilful misrepresentation in such applications the owner or authorized agent as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law. No consent given by the Authority shall be deemed to authorize anything not stated in the application, nor to confer or grant the right to lay a drain through any land intervening between the sewer of the Authority and the land proposed to be connected, and every owner or agent applying for the Authority's consent shall satisfy himself as to his legal right to drain through such intervening land, and he shall be solely responsible for any trespass or damage thereon or thereto.

Section 9.

Consents to make connexions with the sewerage system will be issued only when the plumbing and draining in the property to be connected is planned to be made in accordance with the rules for plumbing and draining hereinafter prescribed, and after such plan has been inspected and approved of by the Proper Officer appointed by the Authority for the purpose, or, in the case of new buildings, when a proper plan of the plumbing and of the drainage of the building into the branch, of which the Authority shall have fixed the position, has been approved of in writing by the Authority. All connexions with drains or sewers and all plumbing and drainage connexions therewith shall be made under the direction of the Proper Officer of the Authority. No person shall be engaged or employed as a workman in the actual performance of any plumbing or drainage work unless he is the holder of a certificate, licence or permit issued by the Authority authorizing him to do such work. Any person who shall at any time or at any place make up, form, affix or repair any fitting, pipe, bend, trap, or other thing connected or intended to be connected with the Authority's sewerage system unless he be the holder of a certificate, licence or permit from the Authority authorizing him to do such work shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for each and every such offence.

If any person, whether he is or is not the holder of a Plumber's Licence or Permit from the Authority, alters, removes, or in any way interferes with any drain, fitting, pipe, bend, trap, or other thing which drain, fitting, pipe, bend, trap or other thing is connected with the Authority's sewerage system, he shall, unless he has previously received consent, in accordance with the provisions of this section for the execution of such work, and such consent is in full force and effect, be guilty of a breach of this By-law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

DIVISION 4.

APPROVAL OR DIRECTION.

Section 10.

Where the approval or direction of the Authority is prescribed in this By-law, such approval or direction may be given by the Secretary or the Proper Officer.

DIVISION 5.

PENALTIES, RECOVERY OF COST OF WORK, ETC.

Section 11.

Where anything is by this By-law directed to be done or forbidden to be done, or where any power is given to the Authority or any of its officers to direct or forbid anything to be done, and such act so directed to be done remains undone, or such act forbidden to be done is done, then, and in every such case the person making default as to the said direction or prohibition respectively shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

Section 12.

Every person guilty of an offence against this By-law, not otherwise specially provided for by or under the authority hereof, shall be liable for every such offence, besides any costs or expenses which may be incurred in remedying such default, as particularly provided for in this By-law or the Acts, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and to a further penalty of One pound for each day during which such offence is continued by such person after notice of the offence shall have been given by the Authority to him; and such penalty shall be recoverable notwithstanding that the Authority may not have chosen to exercise any power given to it by the Acts or by this By-law to remedy such default.

DIVISION 6.

HOUSE DRAINAGE PLANS.

Section 13.

Copies of the Authority's plans and/or designs of individual house drainage will be furnished by the Authority upon application in the prescribed form and on payment for the same and subject to such conditions as follows:—

(a) 1. Where the Authority designs the work and has same carried out for the owner, a charge shall be made equal to five per centum (5 per cent.) of the capital cost for designing, specifying, letting contract, and supervising all details in connexion with such work.

2. Consent for additions to and/or amendments of approved plans or to works previously approved will be made only on the application of the owner or his authorized agent, and on payment of a fee of Ten shillings (10s.).

(b) When the Authority designs the work for the owner and the owner has his own work carried out:

1. For plan of design a fee of Forty shillings (40s.) plus Five shillings (5s.) for each fitting.

2. For making and/or examining any alterations or additions to a plan previously issued or approved by the Engineer, a fee of Ten shillings (10s.) shall be made by the Authority for each fitting, or drain altered or added.

3. For inspecting drains and testing by the Authority's Proper Officer a fee of Ten shillings (10s.).

4. For inspecting plumbing by the Authority's inspector a fee of Ten shillings for each ten (10) fittings or part of ten fittings in the installation.

The Engineer may, during construction of the work, order the owner to carry out such additions and/or amendments as may be necessary for the satisfactory completion of the work.

The house connexion will not be passed until the installation together with the amendments ordered have been completed to the Engineer's satisfaction.

5. For each additional inspection to be made as a result of work not in accordance with the directions of the Proper Officer there shall be charged an additional fee of Ten shillings.

(c) Where an owner has his own designs made and his own work carried out:

1. For the supply of a block plan a fee of Ten shillings (10s.).

For tenements exceeding 4,000 square feet in ground floor area and/or properties exceeding 2 acres in extent an additional fee of Five shillings (5s.) shall be charged for each additional 4,000 square feet or part thereof and/or for each additional 2 acres or part thereof.

2. The owner shall submit for examination a properly drawn design on tracing cloth or good quality paper and a type-written specification. The specification shall be supplied to the Authority in triplicate. The work shall not proceed until the owner's design and specification have been approved and the third copy returned with the official endorsement.

3. For the examination of the owner's plan of design and specification a fee of One pound (£1) for each plan of from one to five fittings, plus Five shillings (5s.) for every fitting over five.

4. For examining any alteration or additions to a plan previously issued or approved by the Engineer a fee of Ten shillings shall be made by the Authority for each fitting or drain altered or added.

5. For inspecting drains and testing by the Authority's inspector a fee of Ten shillings.

6. For inspecting plumbing by the Authority's inspector a fee of Ten shillings (10s.) for each ten (10) fittings or part of ten fittings in the installation.

The Engineer may, during construction of the work, order the owner to carry out such additions and/or amendments as may be necessary for the satisfactory completion of the work.

The house connexion will not be passed until the installation together with the amendments ordered have been completed to the Engineer's satisfaction.

DIVISION 7.

MAINTENANCE AND DEFECTIVE WORK.

Section 14:

Any drain pipe, soil pipe, trap, water closet, urinal, sink, grease trap, or other fixture or fitting laid, used, or constructed otherwise than in accordance with this By-law, or which shall, in the opinion of the Authority, be or become bad or of defective quality, shall upon notice in writing from the Authority to the owner or occupier of the property, be by such owner or occupier removed or repaired in the manner determined and within the time fixed by the Authority, and if such owner or occupier fails to comply with the requirements of the notice, he shall be liable to prosecution and a penalty for an offence against this By-law or the Authority may, if it thinks fit, remove or repair the said defective fitting and recover from such owner or occupier the cost so incurred.

DIVISION 8.

LICENCES AND PERMITS.

Section 15.

Plumbers Licences: Working Plumbers Certificate:— All plumbing work for sewerage shall be done and carried out only by persons certificated as Working Plumbers; or by the persons in this section hereinafter mentioned but subject in all things to the conditions and terms of the said section.

The Authority may, if it thinks fit, and subject to the provisions of this section, issue a Working Plumber's Certificate to any person who is the holder of a Certificate of Competency issued by the Sanitary Plumbers Examination Board of Victoria.

The Authority, before issuing such Working Plumbers Certificate may require the applicant to satisfy it that he possesses the requisite knowledge of the Laws, By-laws and Regulations relating to the sewerage system of the Authority, and it shall appoint officers to examine the said applicant as to his knowledge, and, after consideration of the report thereon of such officers, may refuse to grant such licence, if, in its opinion, the applicant has not the requisite knowledge of such Laws, By-laws and Regulations.

The Authority may, if it thinks fit, and subject to the provisions of this section, issue a permit to work as a plumber to any person who has passed the practical examination of the Sanitary Plumbers Examination Board of Victoria.

In the event of the holder of a permit to work as a plumber being granted a Certificate of Competency by the Sanitary Plumbers Examination Board of Victoria, the Authority may issue a Working Plumbers Certificate to him subject to the provisions of this section and upon his returning his permit.

The Authority may refuse to grant a Certificate or Permit to any person or may suspend or cancel any Certificate or Permit previously granted, if in its opinion—

(a) Such person has been guilty of an offence against the By-laws and Regulations of the Authority;

(b) Such person has failed to comply with the instructions issued by any responsible officer of the Authority;

(c) Such person at any time or place has so conducted himself as to warrant, in the opinion of the Authority, the refusal, suspension, or cancellation of such Certificate or Permit.

On application for renewal, the Authority may renew any such Certificate or Permit.

No person, other than a Plumber's Apprentice, Plumber's Improver, the holder of a Permit to work as a Plumber, or the holder of a Working Plumber's Certificate, shall be engaged or employed as a workman in the actual performance of any of the plumbing work of the sewerage.

No such Plumber's Apprentice, Plumber's Improver, or holder of a Permit to work as a Plumber, shall be permitted to work in the actual performance of, or to do, any plumbing work for sewerage except under the supervision of the holder of a Working Plumber's Certificate, who shall be responsible for such work and for compliance with the By-laws and Regulations of the Authority in respect thereof.

"Drainer's Licence."—The Authority may issue a "Drainer's Licence" to any person who is to the satisfaction of the Authority, competent to carry out the work of drainer, and for that purpose may require such person to satisfy it as to his competency by passing an examination conducted by the Engineer and such other examiners as the Authority may determine, or in any particular case may decide that he has a thorough knowledge of the following subjects:—

Plans.—The reading of plans and the meaning of scales and of elevation, plan and section drawing.

Levelling.—The use of the straight-edge, spirit-level, and boning rods.

Excavation, Timbering and Refilling.—The use of tools for excavation, the protection of trenches by timbering, the treatment of different soils, tunnelling, and tunnel timbering, precautions near buildings, and manners of refilling trenches and tunnels.

Drain-laying.—The preparation of the bottom of trenches, the laying and jointing of stoneware, cement, concrete, and cast-iron pipes, cement, bitumen, lead, and self-fitting joints, laying of drains under houses and in soft ground, and the depth below surface.

Drainage Details.—Junctions to sewers, diminishing of sizes of pipes, yard gullies, grease and other traps, inspection openings, and cast-iron drainage details.

Drainage Works.—Knowledge of the provisions of this By-law and of the Acts, insofar as same relate to the work and duties of drainers in regard to the construction, maintenance, and protection of the sewerage system and the construction and use of drains and drainage traps.

Candidates for Drainer's Licences shall give notice in writing to the Authority of their intention to submit themselves to examination, and this examination shall be at such a time and at such a place as shall be appointed by the Authority. Candidates must provide themselves with their own tools and materials, and pay a fee of 7s. 6d. for each examination.

Section 16.

Conditions upon which all licences, certificates and permits will be issued, are as follow:—

1. That every certificate, licence and permit will be subject to suspension or cancellation at the will of the Authority, and that all such licences or renewals thereof will expire on the 31st day of December next following.

2. That every holder of a licence from the Authority who shall have received the consent of the Authority to execute any works in connexion with sewerage or drainage, or who shall (where such consent of the Authority is not required before the execution of any such works) have notified the Authority of his intention to carry out such works:

(a) Shall obtain permission when necessary for the execution of such works on, over, or through any private property, or any streets, roads, parks, reserves, or other public places or properties.

(b) Shall pay any fees demanded by the Municipal Authority for opening any street, road, or thoroughfare, or otherwise in connexion with the works.

(c) Shall execute such works in accordance with the provisions of the Acts and of the By-laws made thereunder, and of any special directions or orders given or issued by the Authority or its Proper Officer.

(d) Shall use materials of a quality required by this By-law.

(e) Shall employ only competent operatives or assistants.

(f) Shall execute such works in a thorough and tradesman-like manner to the satisfaction of the Authority as expeditiously as practicable, and leave site clean and un-defaced.

(g) Shall in the execution of such works take such proper and necessary precautions that no accident or damage or unnecessary inconvenience may be directly or indirectly occasioned thereby.

(h) Shall restore any part of any street, road, or thoroughfare interfered with by the work to the satisfaction of the Municipal Authority having control thereof upon the completion of the work.

(i) Shall restore any other property interfered with by the work to the satisfaction of the Proper Officer of the Authority.

(j) Shall in all cases notify the Proper Officer immediately upon completion of any work in hand, promptly amend any defects therein, and again at once notify the said Officer, and subsequently take steps forthwith to secure the certificates of satisfactory completion, and give the same to owner.

(k) Shall not interfere, remove, cut, or in any way damage any portion of any electrical, gas, water, telephone installation, and/or any other municipal or public utility or service, unless such is carried out with the permission of the Proper Officer of the Authority controlling the utility concerned, and in accordance with such conditions, that shall be made by such Authority.

(l) Shall, when so directed by the Authority, make good at his own expense any defect found within twelve months of the date of completion of any such work which, in the opinion of the Engineer is due to faulty workmanship, or defective material.

Section 17.

Fees.—Prior to the issue of any licence or permit the person to whom the same is to be issued shall pay to the Authority the fee named hereunder:—

For every Working Plumber's Certificate ..	5s.
For every Permit to Work as a Plumber ..	5s.
For every Drainer's Licence ..	5s.
For the Renewal of any Licence ..	5s.

DIVISION 9.

NEW BUILDINGS.

Section 18.

Authority to be Notified of New Buildings, Alterations, Additions.—Every person who shall intend to erect a building on any property within the Sewerage District or to rebuild or to make any alterations or additions to any such building shall, before commencing such work, give to the Authority fourteen (14) days' notice in writing of such intention, accompanied by plans and sections of such intended buildings, alterations, or additions, showing their positions, dimensions, depth and levels of foundations, cellars or basements, all appurtenant walls and fences, the intended lines of drainage, and the boundary of the land, which plans and sections shall become the property of the Authority.

DIVISION 10.

DIRECTIONS.

Section 19.

Any work or thing in respect of or in connexion with sewerage not specifically mentioned in this By-law shall be performed in accordance with the directions of the Authority.

DIVISION 11.

INSPECTION, TESTS AND MAINTENANCE.

Section 20.

Notice.—The owner or his authorized agent, as well as the plumber, drainer, or contractor, shall give at least 48 hours' notice to the Authority, in writing, of his intention to commence work and of work ready for inspection. All work shall be left uncovered and accessible for examination until inspected and approved.

The Contractor carrying out any work shall, within seven (7) days of the completion of such work, file in the office of the Authority on forms furnished for this purpose, a correct statement of the work done and the cost thereof. Such statement shall be countersigned by the Proper Officer of the Authority, and a certificate embodying such statement shall be forwarded to the contractor.

Section 21.

Inspection.—All materials, pipes, bends, junctions, fittings, fixtures, and apparatus shall be in accordance with the relevant Australian Standard Specification and/or this Authority's working drawings and By-laws where applicable, and will be inspected by the Proper Officer of the Authority to ensure compliance with the By-law and approved plan.

It shall be the duty of every plumber, contractor or drainer to submit such material as may be required by the Proper Officer for testing accordingly, and where such tests require the destruction or mutilation of such materials submitted for test, it will be required of the said plumber, contractor or drainer to supply such materials free of cost to the Authority provided that the Proper Officer shall have power to permit existing fittings and fixtures to be re-used where, in his opinion such will reasonably comply with this By-law.

Section 22.

Stoppages in Drains.—Where stoppage in a drain occurs the owner of the property shall immediately employ a certificated plumber or licensed drainlayer to rectify such stoppage, whether the stoppage is within the owner's premises or between the premises and the sewer into which such drain leads.

Before any person commences to clear the stoppage he shall notify the Authority of his intention and carry out the work in the same manner as is required for new work.

Section 23.

All fixtures and fittings including drains which are not connected to the Authority's sewers owing to disuse shall forthwith be dismantled so as to prevent mis-use.

Whenever the fitting is abolished, all drains shall either be removed or sealed to the approval of the Proper Officer in such a manner as will prevent any discharge from such fittings to reach the Authority's sewers.

Section 24.

This By-law shall be read in conjunction with sections 3806 to 4205 inclusive of the Uniform Building Regulations, together with any amendments thereof made from time to time by Order in Council, which Regulations apply within all Sewerage Districts in Victoria including the Bendigo Sewerage District.

If any such owner or occupier shall within the time limited by such notice fail to comply with the requirements thereof, it shall be lawful for the Council, notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, to enter upon such property or premises and take such measures as may be reasonably necessary to destroy such rats, ants or other vermin or pests at the expense of such owner or occupier and may recover the cost thereof from such owner or occupier as a civil debt recoverably summarily.

6. Every person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

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THE "VICTORIA GOVERNMENT GAZETTE."

ATTENTION is invited to the following procedure in relation to the publication of official matter in the *Government Gazette*:—

1. Matter submitted to the Executive Council.

Matter submitted to the Executive Council which requires gazettal will normally be published in the issue of the following week.

Where urgent gazettal is required, special arrangements should be made with the *Gazette* Officer.

Publication will be facilitated by the submission of carbon copies for the use of the *Gazette* Officer.

2. Other matter.

(a) All other matter duly certified by a responsible officer for publication should be lodged with the *Gazette* Officer not later than half-past Ten a.m. on Tuesday.

(b) Lengthy or involved notices should be forwarded several days before publication.

(c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested, or at the direction of the *Gazette* Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.

(d) No additions or amendments to matter for publication will be accepted by telephone.

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
