### REGULATIONS.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Weights and Measures Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth make the Regulations following (that is to say):-

The Weights and Measures Regulations 1952 as amended are hereby further amended, from and inclusive of the seventeenth day of October, 1955, as follows:-

1. Regulation 267 is hereby revoked and the following expression is substituted therefor:-

"267. The fees to be charged for verifying and stamping of weights, measures and instruments used for trade shall be as set out under "I." in the following table when such weights, measures and instruments are verified and stamped at the office of the Superintendent or of an inspector and as set out under
