Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Local Government Act 1946 to the municipal district of the Shire of Heytesbury, and order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the abovementioned municipal district of the Shire of Heytesbury on publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 2nd January, 1956, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make By-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter, and provided, further that no such By-law shall come into operation before the 2nd January, 1956. Nurses Acts.

NURSES REGULATIONS 1955 (No. 2).

THE Nurses Board of the State of Victoria by virtue of the powers conferred by section 29 of the *Nurses Act* 1928 (No. 3744) as amended by any Act, hereby makes the following Regulations, that is to say:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Nurses Regulations 1955 (No. 2) and shall be read and construed as one with the Nurses Regulations 1941 and all Regulations amending the same.
- 2. These Regulations shall come into operation upon approval by the Governor in Council and publication in the Government Gazette.
- 3. For paragraph (i), Regulation 4, of the Nurses Regulations 1941 there shall be substituted the following:—
 - "(i) (1) A trainee, prior to entering upon training at a training school, shall have attained the age of seventeen years, shall have been interviewed and selected for training by the Matron or other responsible nursing officer of the training school and shall produce evidence satisfactory to such Matron or other responsible nursing officer, of his or her medical fitness.
 - (2) The training school, within 30 days of the commencement of training of each trainee, shall submit to the Board the following information concerning such trainee—
 - (i) full name.
 - (ii) birth certificate (or other evidence satisfactory to the Board of date of birth),
 - (iii) evidence of educational qualifications in accordance with these Regulations,
 - (iv) date of commencement of training,
 - (v) any other particulars required from time to time by the Board.
 - (3) The Board shall keep an index of trainee nurses and on receipt of the information as set out in sub-paragraph (2) of this paragraph the name of the trainee shall be entered in such index.
 - (4) At the expiration of a period of not more than seven months from the date of commencement of training, the Matron of each training school shall forward to the Board a completed First Schedule Form 17 in respect of each such trainee.
 - (5) Any trainee in respect of whom a completed First Schedule Form 17 is not forwarded to the Board in accordance with subparagraph (4) of this paragraph shall be deemed by the Board to have discontinued her training and her name shall be removed from the Index of Trainee Nurses.
 - (6) The Matron of a training school shall forward to the Board the names of all trainees who discontinue training and in respect of such trainees and of trainees whose training is deemed to be discontinued under this paragraph shall submit a report setting out the reasons for such discontinuance.
 - (7) The Board shall be entitled in particular cases at its discretion to extend the period of seven months by a further period of fourteen days."



REGULATIONS FOR THE RECEIPT AND COINAGE OF GOLD AT THE MELBOURNE BRANCH OF THE ROYAL MINT.

Gold can be deposited at the Mint, in small or large parcels, subject to the following charges, allowances, and conditions:—

Charges.

- 1. For a deposit containing 5,000 ounces gross or over, Three pence per ounce.
- 2. For a deposit containing 1,000 ounces gross or over and less than 5,000 ounces gross, Three pence half-penny per ounce.
- 3. For a deposit containing 950 ounces gross or over and less than 1,000 ounces gross, a charge of £14 11s.
- 4. For a deposit containing 900 ounces gross or over and less than 950 ounces gross, a charge of £14 6s.
- 5. For a deposit containing 850 ounces gross or over and less than 900 ounces gross, a charge of £14 1s.
- For a deposit containing 800 ounces gross or over and less than 850 ounces gross, a charge of £13 15s.
- 7. For a deposit containing 750 ounces gross or over and less than 800 ounces gross, a charge of £13 9s.
- 8. For a deposit containing 700 ounces gross or over and less than 750 ounces gross, a charge of £13 2s.
- 9. For a deposit containing 650 ounces gross or over and less than 700 ounces gross, a charge of £12 15s.
- 10. For a deposit containing 600 ounces gross or over and less than 650 ounces gross, a charge of £12 7s
- 11. For a deposit containing 550 ounces gross or over and less than 600 ounces gross, a charge of £11 18s.
- 12. For a deposit containing 500 ounces gross or over and less than 550 ounces gross, a charge of £11 8s.
- 13. For a deposit containing 450 ounces gross or over and less than 500 ounces gross, a charge of £10 17s.
- 14. For a deposit containing 400 ounces gross or over and less than 450 ounces gross, a charge of £10 4s.
- 15. For a deposit containing 350 ounces gross or over and less than 400 ounces gross, a charge of £9 10s.
- 16. For a deposit containing 300 ounces gross or over and less than 350 ounces gross, a charge of £8 15s.

- 17. For a deposit containing less than 300 ounces gross, Seven pence per ounce, provided that
 - the minimum charge for any one deposit shall be Fourteen shillings.

The above charges will be made on the gross weight before melting.

- 18. For deposits containing old jewellery or manufactured gold-
 - (a) 500 ounces gross or over, Eleven pence per ounce.
 - (b) Less than 500 ounces gross, One shilling and two pence per ounce. Thirty shillings shall be the minimum charge for any one deposit.

If a deposit other than old jewellery or manufactured gold contains more than 2 per cent. of base metal, an extra charge, to be fixed by the Deputy Master, will be made for its extraction.

Provided that of these charges One penny per ounce standard shall be considered to be an assay and coinage charge.

Allowance.

Silver in a deposit will be allowed for, at a rate to be fixed periodically by the Deputy Master, as follows:—

In a deposit of less than 500 ounces gross—all silver in excess of 8 per cent. of the weight of the deposit after melting.

In a deposit of 500 ounces gross or over and less than 5,000 ounces gross—all silver in excess of 6 per cent. of the weight of the deposit after melting.

In a deposit of 5,000 ounces gross or over—all silver in excess of 5 per cent. of the weight of the deposit after melting.

Mode of Payment.

Deposits will be paid for by cheque and will be due for payment eight working days after the date of lodgment.

Payment can be obtained for gold deposits as soon as they have been assayed and valued by paying a discount charge, to be fixed from time to time by the Deputy Master, for the unexpired days.

N.B.—These arrangements respecting payment will be carried out as far as possible, but the Deputy Master cannot be held responsible for their absolute performance, and shall have power to postpone the date of payment.

Conditions.

- 1. Each parcel for which a separate assay is required shall be considered as a separate deposit: Provided always that the value of all deposits shall be determined upon the report of the Assay Department of this Branch of Her Majesty's Mint, which shall be final, and that the Deputy Master may refuse any deposit which he may deem unsuitable for treatment; and that it shall be in his discretion to make exceptional arrangements in cases in which he may consider it desirable to do so for the advantage of the Public Service.
- 2. The receiving office at the Mint will be open daily for the receipt and issue of bullion from $10\,$ a.m. to $3\,$ p.m., except on Saturdays and holidays.

Note.—Gold and silver bullion can be obtained at the Mint, to a limited extent, at such price as the Deputy Master may think proper to accept, but in no case shall the price for gold be below £3 17s. 10å. the ource standard

- 3. Each Order in Council authorizing the appointment of one of Her Majesty's Counsel shall specify the order of precedence of the appointee in relation to those previously appointed.
- 4. Any barrister, being one of Her Majesty's Counsel, who for the time being holds the office of Solicitor-General and any barrister who after accepting such office may be appointed to be one of Her Majesty's Counsel shall notwithstanding the precedence specified in the Order in Council authorizing such appointment take precedence over each and every one of Her Majesty's Counsel who may be briefed jointly with him to appear in any Court in any cause or matter Criminal or Civil on behalf of Her Majesty or the Attorney-General or at or before any Royal Commission, Board or Court of Inquiry, or other form of investigation whatsoever.
- 5. Upon application made by or on behalf of the Attorney-General any Court or a Judge or Stipendiary Magistrate upon being satisfied that for reasons of urgency any cause or matter in which Her Majesty the Queen or the said the Attorney-General is a party or intervenor should be heard in priority to any other cause or matter previously set down or listed for hearing may, except where otherwise provided by Statute, but notwithstanding any Rule of Court to the contrary, order that such first-mentioned cause or matter be heard without undue delay and in priority to any other cause or matter.
- 6. Courts and persons acting judicially shall take judicial notice of the provisions of the last two preceding Regulations.

MOTOR RACING ON HIGHWAYS AT MILDURA.

And whereas the Mildura and District Motor Cycle And whereas the Mildura and District Motor Cycle Club has requested that such an Order be made so as to enable motor-cycle races to be conducted by the said club on certain portions of highways on Sunday and Monday, the twenty-fifth and twenty-sixth day of December, 1955, respectively:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Motor Car Act 1951, doth by this Order specify the portions of highways within the municipal district of the Shire of Mildura, which are described in the Schedule hereunder as portions of highways in respect of which any motor-car may, without being subject to the application of the said sub-section (2) of section 80 of the Motor Car Act 1951, be used for purposes of racing or of trial of speed under the control and supervision of the said Mildura and District Motor Cycle Club on Sunday, the twenty-fifth day of December, 1955, between the hours of Two o'clock and Five o'clock in the afternoon, and on Monday, the twenty-sixth day of December, 1955, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Five o'clock in the afternoon, subject to the following Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the and Five o'clock in the afternoon, subject to the following conditions:

- (a) That all spectators view the race from outside the course;
- (b) That safety runs of at least 75 yards be erected at three points, viz., at the intersections of Sturt Highway and Oak-avenue, Sturt Highway and Dow-avenue, Oak-avenue and Smythe'sroad, with customary straw baling precautions;
- (c) That all refreshments, cycle pits, &c., be outside the course:
- (d) That barriers be erected at points where safety runs are provided;
- (e) That the course be fully manned by officials at all times the track is being used, including practice runs;
- (f) That large appropriate notices be erected at points where normal traffic will be diverted from Sturt Highway;
- (g) That no racing be permitted on Sunday, the 25th December, 1955, competing drivers being allowed to make only trial runs on that day to accustom themselves to the track.

- A By-law of the City of Coburg, made under the Local Government Acts, and numbered 81, for requiring the destruction of rats, ants, or other vermin or pests, and the destruction of noxious weeds, and for other purposes.
- IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of any and every other power thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Coburg order as follows:—
- The Council of the City of Coburg may at any time cause to be served on the owner or occupier of any property or premises a notice, in writing, requiring such

owner or occupier within a time limited by such notice to destroy all rats, ants, or other vermin or pests as may be specified in such notice, and which are on such property or premises.

- 2. The said Council may at any time cause to be served on the owner or occupier of any property or premises a notice, in writing, requiring such owner or occupier within a time limited by such notice to destroy all such noxious weeds as may be specified in such notice and which are on such property or premises. Any such notice may be signed by the Town Clerk or Health Inspector of the municipality.
- 3. If any such owner or occupier shall within the time limited by such notice fail to comply with the requirements thereof, the Council may take such measures as may be reasonably necessary to destroy such rats, ants, vermin, or pests at the expense of such owner or occupier and may recover the cost thereof from such owner or occupier as a civil debt recoverable summarily.
- 4. In this By-law the words "noxious weeds" mean and include the following:—

Scientific Name; Common Name.

Foeniculum vulgare; fennel. Homeria miniata; cape tulip. Cynara Cardunculus, L.; artichoke thistle. Cytisus canariensis; cape broom. Lycium ferocissimum, Miers; box thorn. Rosa rubiginosa, L.; sweet briar.
