AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.,

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division I, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the areas of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, and 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

CERTAIN SUBSTANCES DECLARED TO BE POTENT DRUGS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 47 of the Poisons Act 1928 it is enacted (inter alia) that, in addition to the substances included in the Seventh Schedule thereto, the Governor in Council may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare any substance which is not included in the Second, Fourth or Sixth Schedules to the said Act, and which in the opinion of the Commission of Public Health should be subject to regulations imposing special restrictions under Part IV. of the said Act with respect to the sale thereof to be a "potent drug" for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas none of the substances hereinafter specified is included in the Second, Fourth or Sixth Schedules to the Act: And whereas the Commission of Public Health is of the opinion that each of such substances should be so subject to regulations:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria,

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, In the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation, declare each of the substances hereinafter specified to be a "potent drug" for the purposes of the said Act, namely:—

Metallic bromides including ammonium bromide in medicinal preparations or admixtures containing more than five grains of such bromides in each adult dose.

Sobisminol Mass and Sobisminol solution.

Endocrine glandular substances and their synthetic substitutes and preparations and admixtures thereof intended for therapeutic use and not elsewhere included in any of the Schedules to the Poisons Act 1928.



THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 25 of the Land Act 1928 as amended by section 2 of the Land Act 1933 do by this my Proclamation revoke the Order dated 26th October 1852 fixing the site for a Township at Elphinstone at the Sawpit Gully (see Government Gazette 1852 page 1238) and rescind the Proclamation dated 18th February 1861 defining certain areas of land as Towns in so far as it refers to the Town of Elphinstone (see Government Gazette 1861 page 403) and in lieu thereof do hereby proclaim as a Township distinguished by the name of Elphinstone the area of land in the Parish of Elphinstone, County of Talbot within the boundaries indicated by conventional township sign, on the plan hereunder.—(E.34(2, 3) (C.96124).

ADULT EDUCATION REGULATIONS (1955).

DURSUANT to the powers conferred by the Adult Education Act 1946, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:-

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Adult Education Regulations (1955).

Repeal of Existing Regulations.

2. The Adult Education Regulations as amended from time to time are hereby repealed.

Interpretation.

- 3. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter
 - "Adult Education Officer" means officer of the Council directly engaged in the teaching and/or organization of adult education.
 - "Clerical Assistant" means an employee of the Council engaged in the performance of clerical work for the Council.
 - "Council" means Council of Adult Education.

 - "Director" means Director of Adult Education.
 "Assistant Director" means Assistant Director of Adult Education.
 - "Executive" means Executive Committee of the Council of Adult Education.
 - "Metropolitan area" means the area lying within a distance 20 miles from the post office at the corner of Elizabethstreet and Bourke-street, Melbourne. "Minister" means Minister of Education.
- 4. The salary of the Director of Adult Education shall be £1,700
- 5. (i) Subject to the provisions of section 12 of the Adult Education Act 1946, an Assistant Director of Adult Education may be appointed.
- (ii) The Assistant Director of Adult Education shall receive a salary of £1,400 per annum.
- (iii) The Assistant Director shall perform such duties as he is directed to perform by the Council, its Executive Committee or the Director of Adult Education.
- 6. (i) Subject to the provisions of section 12 of the Adult Education Act 1946, Adult Education Officers may be appointed.
- (ii) Adult Education Officers shall be responsible in the performance of their duties to the Director and shall carry out such duties they are directed to perform by the Director or in his absence by the Assistant Director.
- (iii) The remuneration of Adult Education Officers shall be determined by the First Schedule to these Regulations, appointments to be made within the appropriate scale according to qualifications and experience:

Adult Education Officer, Grade I.—Scale A. Adult Education Officer, Grade H.A.—Scale B.

Adult Education Officer, Grade II.—Scale C. Adult Education Officer, Grade III.—Scale D.

Subject to satisfactory service, annual increments shall be payable to Adult Education Officers. Such annual increments shall conform to the salaries provided for subdivisions of classes in the First Schedule.

7. (i) Subject to the provisions of section 12 of the Adult Education Act 1946, a Secretary-Accountant may be appointed.

(ii) The Secretary-Accountant shall carry out such duties as he is directed to perform by the Director, or in his absence, by the Assistant Director.

- (iii) The remuneration of the Secretary-Accountant shall be in accordance with subdivisions 1 and 2 of Scale A in the First Schedule, appointment to be made within the scale, according to qualifications and experience. Subject to satisfactory service, annual increments shall be payable to the Secretary-Accountant. Such annual increments shall conform to the salaries provided for subdivisions of classes in the First Schedule.
- (i) Subject to the provisions of section 12 of the Adult Education Act 1946, an Accounts Officer may be appointed.
- (ii) The Accounts Officer shall carry out such duties as he is directed to perform by the Director, or in his absence by the Assistant Director.
- (iii) The remuneration of the Accounts Officer shall be as determined by Scale C in the First Schedule, appointment to be made within the scale, according to qualifications and experience. Subject to satisfactory service, annual increments shall conform to the salaries provided for subdivisions of classes in the First Schedule.
- 9. (i) Subject to the provisions of section 12 of the Adult Education Act 1946, Clerical Assistants may be appointed.
- (ii) Clerical Assistants shall carry out such duties as they are directed to perform by the Director or in his absence by the Assistant Director.
- (iii) Clerical Assistants may be appointed at the rate of remuneration set out in the Second Schedule, Part A, appointments to be made within the scale, according to qualifications and experience. Subject to satisfactory service, annual increments shall conform to the rates set out in the Second Schedule.
- 10. (i) Subject to the provisions of section 12 of the Adult Education Act 1946, a Librarian may be appointed.

(ii) The Librarian shall carry out such duties as he is directed to perform by the Director, or in his absence by the Assistant Director.

- (iii) The salary of the Librarian shall be determined by Scale D in the First Schedule, appointment to be made within the scale according to qualifications and experience. Subject to satisfactory service, annual increments shall be payable to the Librarian. Such increments shall conform to the salaries provided for subdivisions of classes in the First Schedule.
- 11. (i) Subject to the provisions of section 12 of the Adult Education Act 1946, a Technician Projectionist may be appointed.
- (ii) The Technician Projectionist shall carry out such duties as he is directed to perform by the Director, or in his absence by the Assistant Director:
- (iii) The salary of the Technician Projectionist shall be determined by the scale set out in the Second Schedule, Part B, appointment to be made within the scale according to qualifications and experience.
- 12. (i) Subject to the provisions of section 12 of the Adult Education Act 1946, a Driver Storeman may be appointed.
- (ii) The Driver Storeman shall carry out such duties as he is directed to perform by the Director, or in his absence by the Assistant Director.
- (iii) The salary of the Driver Storeman shall be determined by the scale set out in the Second Schedule, Part B, appointment to be made within the scale according to qualifications and experience. Subject to satisfactory service, annual increments shall be payable to the Driver Storeman. Such increments shall conform to the rates set out in the Second Schedule.
- 13. Subject to the provisions of section 12 of the Adult Education Act 1946, Part-time Adult Education Officers may be appointed for special duties for periods not exceeding one year at salaries not exceeding £400 per annum.
- 14. The salaries prescribed in these Regulations for full-time officers and employees appointed by the Council shall be subject to automatic adjustment in accordance with the variations in the cost of living on the same basis and method as may be prescribed from time to time by Regulations under the *Public Service Act* 1946.
 - 15. With the approval of the Minister, the Council may-
 - (a) classify, or raise or lower the classification of, any office contained in Part A of the Second Schedule;
 - (b) set in respect of any officer or class of officers or any employment a salary or wage, or a salary or wage range (with provision for annual increments) within the minimum and maximum limits of a class or grade.

- 16. Except where otherwise provided in these Regulations, the conditions of the Regulations in force from time to time under the *Public Service Act* 1946 with respect to hours of duty and times of attendance of officers shall, with such adaptations as are necessary, apply to officers other than part-time officers appointed by the Council.
- 17. Subject to the approval of the Director in each case, full-time officers directed to perform extra duties necessitating their remaining on duty in excess of the normal hours prescribed shall be paid overtime and meal money on the same basis and method as may be prescribed from time to time under the *Public Service Act* 1946: Provided that no such payment shall be made for work which, in the opinion of the Director, should have been performed during an officer's normal hours of duty.
- 18. Officers, when travelling in the performance of their duties, shall be entitled, in addition to being reimbursed the reasonable cost of conveyance, to receive reimbursement of personal expenses. The rate of such reimbursement shall be in accordance with the scale provided for officers of the Public Service as prescribed from time to time by Regulations under the Public Service Act 1946. Such rate of reimbursement is fixed to cover the expense of three meals a day and lodging and the reimbursement in respect of each meal and of bed shall be one-fourth of the daily rate.
- 19. (i) (a) The fees to be paid to part-time lecturers or demonstrators employed by the Council shall be not less than £1 1s. and not more than £5 5s. per lecture or demonstration: Provided that a special fee of not more than £10 10s. may, with the approval of the Executive, be paid to part-time lecturers or demonstrators for special lectures or demonstrations.
- (b) A special fee of an amount recommended by the Executive may, on the approval of the Council, be paid to artists performing in special demonstrations or productions.
- (ii) The fee to be paid to part-time lecturers, demonstrators or other qualified persons for the preparation of original study or discussion material shall not be less than £1 1s. and not more than £6 6s. for each script accepted by the Director.
- 20. (a) When travelling in the performance of their duties Parttime Adult Education Officers and part-time lecturers shall be entitled, in addition to being reimbursed the reasonable cost of conveyance, to receive reimbursement of personal expenses in accordance with the scale provided for officers of the Public Service other than Permanent Heads whose salaries are less than £1,122 a year, as prescribed from time to time by Regulations under the Public Service Act 1946.
- (b) Such rate of reimbursement is fixed to cover the expense of three meals a day and lodging and the reimbursement in respect of each meal and bed shall be one-fourth of the daily rate.
- 21. (i) The fee to be paid by any person attending adult education courses of not more than twenty or not less than six lectures or demonstrations shall be not less than Ten shillings and not more than £1 1s. for each course.
- (ii) The fee to be paid for single lectures of any such course shall be Two shillings.
- (iii) The fee to be paid by persons enrolled in a Discussion or Study Course shall be Ten shillings per course. The fee to be paid by any individual, association or group of people for units of any such course shall be not less than Five shillings and not more than £1 1s. per unit. The fee to be paid for single copies from any unit shall be not less than Three pence and not more than One shilling per week.
- (iv) The fee to be paid by persons attending special productions lectures demonstrations conferences or schools shall be as determined by the Executive in each case.
- 22. (a) During his absence in the performance of his duties beyond the metropolitan area, or in order to attend meetings of the Council, Executive or Committee when his place of residence is beyond the metropolitan area, a member of the Council or of any advisory committee appointed by the Council shall be entitled, in addition to being reimbursed the reasonable cost of conveyance, to receive reimbursement of personal expenses in accordance with the scale provided for officers of the Public Service other than Permanent Heads whose salaries are more than £1,122 per annum as prescribed from time to time by Regulations under the Public Service Act 1946.
- (b) Such rate of reimbursement is fixed to cover the expense of three meals a day and lodging and the reimbursement in respect of each meal and of bed shall be one-fourth of the daily rate.

23. On the coming into operation of these Regulations, the salary and classification of every officer of the Council shall be as if the scales specified in the First and Second Schedules had been in operation for the whole of the service of an officer in the office occupied by him at the date of such coming into operation.

- A By-law of the City of Horsham, made under the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria, and numbered 39, for the determining, applying, dispensing with, or regulating such matters or things as are left to be determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council of the said City of Horsham under the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria.
- IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria and of any and every power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Horsham order as follows:—
- 1. By-laws Nos. 30 and 37 of the said city are hereby repealed.
- 2. The areas set out and described in the First Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as brick areas, and no person shall in any way construct or cause to be constructed any building the external walls of which are of material other than brick, stone, or concrete.
- 3. All land within the municipal district of the City of Horsham is hereby prescribed as the area in which buildings of Classes II. and III. Occupancy shall not be constructed to contain more than three storeys, including the ground story, and no person shall in any such area construct a building of Class II. or Class III. Occupancy to contain more than three storeys, including the ground story.
- 4. The minimum area, depth, and width of frontage specified in column 3 of Table 803 of the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria (hereinafter called "the Uniform Building Regulations") are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth, and width of frontage of land on which a building shall be constructed throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Horsham.
- 5. (a) The minimum distance of the outer walls of any building of Class I. or Class II. Occupancy (as defined in the Uniform Building Regulations) from the frontage of any land on which such building stands is hereby specified as 20 feet.
- (b) No person shall construct any building of Class I. or Class II. Occupancy (as defined in the Uniform Building Regulations) any part of the outer walls of which is less than 20 feet from the frontage of the land on which such building stands.

- (b) the construction of a building of Classes III., V., VI., VII., or VIII: Occupancy, or a building to which a building of Class IV. Occupancy is attached, on such land having an area, depth, or width of frontage less than that prescribed in clause 808 of the Uniform Building Regulations.
- 7. In the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the said Council and lodged in the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the Uniform Building Regulations, the requirements of clause 811 of the Uniform Building Regulations are hereby dispensed with.
