## DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 33 OF THE LABOUR AND INDUSTRY ACT 1953.

Clauses, other than clause 2, of the said Determination shall remain in force, provided that, to the weekly earnings of each piece-worker shall be added the sum of one hundred and thirty-three shillings. Where less than forty hours is worked in any week by any piece-worker, a proportionate amount of such sum of one hundred and thirty-three shillings shall be added in lieu thereof.
