PUBLIC HIGHWAYS.—CITY OF CHELSEA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946*, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice published in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And, whereas the Council of the City of Chelsea has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been used or reserved for roads within the said City, be so declared to be public highways:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare that all those pieces of land, being parts of Crown allotments 91 and 101, Parish of Lyndhurst, used or reserved for roads, and being the lands more particularly described hereinafter, shall be public highways within the meaning of the said Act:—

WALKERS-ROAD (Portion of).

Commencing at the southern angle of lot 75 on the plan of subdivision No. 4113, lodged with the Office of Titles, and being parts of Crown allotment 91 and 101 of the said parish; thence by lines bearing respectively 70 deg. 36 min. 883.9 links, 153 deg. 11 min. 100.8 links, 250 deg. 36 min. 896.9 links, 340 deg. 36 min. 100 links to the point of commencement.

LEWELLIN-GROVE.

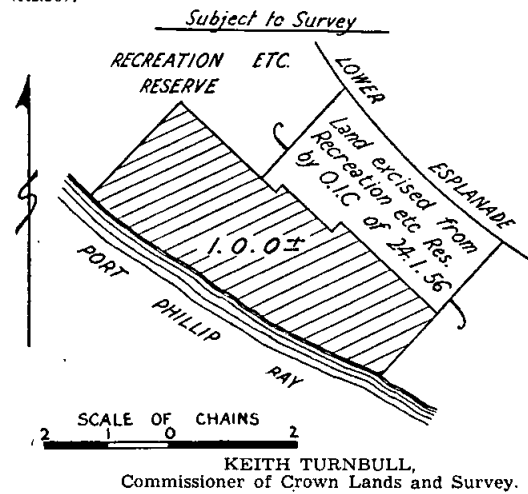

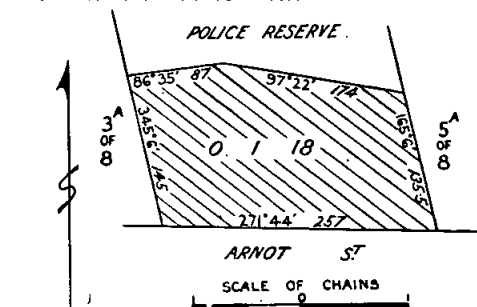

3. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserve, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

4. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or any other animals, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

5. The owner of any horse, cattle, or other animals found wandering upon any part of the Reserve shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and in addition such horse, cattle, or other animals may be impounded.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle trespassing in the Reserve and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purpose of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act* 1928.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.

8. No person shall remove any stone, earth, marl, or gravel from the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained. Such permission shall not be unreasonably or arbitrarily withheld, but shall be conditional on the payment to the said Committee of such fees as the said Committee may from time to time direct for the removal of any stone, earth, marl, or gravel as aforesaid. Such fees shall not exceed the sum of Two shillings and six pence per cubic yard of stone, earth, marl, or gravel removed. Before granting such permission, the Committee of Management may require from any person requesting such permission a deposit of any sum not exceeding Ten pounds by way of guarantee for due care in the removal of stone, earth, marl, or gravel as aforesaid, and for due payment of the fees for removal of such stone, earth, marl, or gravel. All fees collected by the Committee of Management under or by virtue of this Regulation shall be paid by the said Committee into the Consolidated Revenue of the State of Victoria, and a certified return thereof furnished to the Board of Land and Works at the end of each half-year.

9. All gravel to be removed from the said Reserve, in accordance with the permission of the Committee of Management shall be removed therefrom, subject to and in accordance with the directions of the engineer of the Council of the Shire of Portland, provided that and subject to such direction all gravel shall be removed in a face and for full depth of the deposit. All overburden shall be removed and deposited as directed by the Committee of Management. All trees, stumps, logs, roots, branches, and other debris shall be removed from the pit as they are reached and fall, and shall not be left standing on "islands."—(Rs.7342.)

Health Acts.

CITY OF ARARAT.

BY-LAW No. 92.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Acts and of any other power enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the City of Ararat, in the name of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law No. 92 (that is to say):—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply and have operation throughout that portion of the municipal district described in the Schedule hereto, save and except that this By-law shall not apply to premises registered as a poultry-killing premises and poultry saleyards when so exempt in writing by the Council.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter, "poultry" includes fowls, turkeys, ducks and geese; "person" includes the owner or occupier or the person in charge of such premises; "approved materials" means materials approved by the Council of the municipality.

5. No person shall keep or suffer to be kept any live poultry except in a fowlhouse or similar structure to which may be attached an enclosed fowl run.

6. No person shall keep or suffer to be kept in any fowl house or similar structure a number of poultry greater than the number produced by dividing the area in square feet of such fowl house or similar structure by six,

7. No person shall keep or suffer to be kept more than twenty-five (25) live poultry—

(a) within fifty (50) feet of any dwelling on the same land as the fowl house or similar structure in which they are kept; or

(b) within one hundred (100) feet of any dwelling on land adjoining the fowl house or similar structure in which they are kept.

8. Every fowl house or similar structure or any enclosed fowl run on any premises shall be—

(a) Distant at least 75 feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the building has frontage.

(b) Distant at least 10 feet from any other street or road of a greater width than 25 feet.

(c) Distant at least 5 feet from any other street or road of a lesser width than 25 feet.

(d) Distant at least 5 feet from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land.

(e) Distant at least 40 feet from any dwelling whether on the same or adjoining land.

9. Every fowl house or similar structure in which poultry is kept shall be roofed with approved material and paved with approved impervious material and the surface level of the floor shall be at least 3 inches above the level of the surrounding ground.

10. Every fowl house or similar structure shall be rendered ratproof by placing galvanized iron, jointed brick-work or concrete around the foundations to a depth of at least 18 inches below ground level, and all walls shall be constructed of approved ratproof material.

11. The occupier of any premises on which poultry is kept shall cause the fowl house and attached enclosed run to be maintained at all times in a clean and sanitary condition.

12. All poultry food shall be stored in ratproof containers.

13. Any person guilty of any contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and in the case of any offence continuing after such conviction to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

CITY OF NUNAWADING.

BY-LAW No. 35.

A By-law of the City of Nunawading, made under the Local Government Acts and numbered 35, for appointing in streets and roads standing places for motor cars and altering By-law No. 32 of the City of Nunawading, hereinafter called the Principal By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of any and every other power if thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Nunawading orders as follows:—

1. The Principal By-law shall be altered by adding at the end of the Schedule thereto the following expression:—

“Extending along the north side of South-parade for a width of 25 (twenty-five) feet measured in a southerly direction from the northernmost channel kerb from a point 30 (thirty) feet west of the west alignment of Blackburn-road to a point 334 feet west of the west alignment of Blackburn-road; thence from a point 396 ft. 6 in. west of the west alignment of Blackburn-road to a point 536 feet west of the west alignment of Blackburn-road; and thence from a point 550 feet west of the west alignment of Blackburn-road to a point 628 ft. 6 in. west of the west alignment of Blackburn-road.”
