*Forests Act 1928 (No. 3685).*

VARIATION OF PROCLAMATION RELATING TO THE  
PROHIBITED PERIOD.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the *Forests Act 1928* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* declare any period to be a prohibited period in respect of any fire protected area (other than a State forest or national park) and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may from time to time by Proclamation so published declare different prohibited periods in respect of different parts of any fire protected area (other than a State forest or national park):

And whereas by the said section it is further enacted that any Proclamation so published may subsequently be revoked, amended or varied by the Governor in Council by Proclamation so published:

And whereas by Proclamations issued on the 22nd November, 1955, 29th November, 1955, 6th December, 1955, 13th December, 1955, and 20th December, 1955, and published in the *Government Gazettes* on the 30th November, 1955, 7th December, 1955, 14th December, 1955, and 21st December, 1955, respectively, different prohibited periods expiring on the thirty-first day of March, 1956, were proclaimed in respect of different parts of fire protected areas (other than State forests or national parks); including the areas specified in the Schedule hereto:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Forests Acts*, do by this my Proclamation vary the aforesaid Proclamations by proclaiming that the prohibited period in respect of the parts of any fire protected area (other than a State forest or national park) situated in such Municipalities as are specified in the Schedule hereto shall end at midnight between the twenty-second day and twenty-third day of March, 1956.

SCHEDULE.

The Cities of: Bendigo, Sale, Shepparton.  
The Towns of: Castlemaine, St. Arnaud.  
The Boroughs of: Benalla, Clunes, Eaglehawk, Echuca, Inglewood, Kyabram, Maryborough, Wangaratta.

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The Shires of: Alberton, Alexandra, Avoca, Avon, Bairnsdale, Beechworth, Benalla, Berwick, Bet Bet, Bright, Broadford, Charlton, Chiltern, Cobram, Deakin, Donald, Doncaster and Templestowe, East Loddon, Eltham, Euroa, Fern Tree Gully, Gordon, Goulburn, Healesville, Huntly, Kara Kara, Korong, Lilydale, Maffra, Maldon, Mansfield, Marong, McIvor, Metcalfe, Newstead, Numurkah, Omeo, Oxley, Rochester, Rodney, Rutherglen, Seymour, Shepparton, South Gippsland, Strathfieldsaye, Talbot, Tambo, Towong, Tullaroop, Tungamah, Upper Murray, Upper Yarra, Violet Town, Wangaratta, Waranga, Wodonga, Yackandandah, Yarrowonga, Yea, and those portions of the Shires of Morwell, Rosedale and Traralgon situated south of the main Melbourne to Sale railway line.

Country Fire Authority Acts.

VARIATION OF SUMMER PERIOD IN RESPECT OF  
SPECIFIED PARTS OF THE COUNTRY AREA OF  
VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of section 4 of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944* it is enacted that the Governor in Council, after consultation by the Chief Secretary of Victoria with the Minister of Forests, may from time to time by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* proclaim any period as the summer period in respect of the country area of Victoria or any specified part or parts thereof, and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may proclaim different summer periods in respect of different parts of the said country area:

And whereas by the said sub-section it is further enacted that any Proclamation so published may be revoked, amended, or varied by a subsequent Proclamation so published:

And whereas by Proclamations issued on the 6th December, 1955, 13th December, 1955, and 20th December, 1955, and published in the *Government Gazettes* of the 7th December, 1955, 14th December, 1955, and 21st December, 1955, respectively, different summer periods expiring on the thirty-first day of March, 1956, were proclaimed in respect of different parts of the country area of Victoria, including the parts of the said country area specified in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas it is deemed expedient that the aforesaid Proclamations should be varied in the manner hereinafter described:

And whereas the Chief Secretary and the Minister of Forests have consulted accordingly:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Country Fire Authority Acts, do by this my Proclamation vary the aforesaid Proclamations by proclaiming that the summer period in respect of the parts of the country area of Victoria which are specified in the Schedule hereto shall end at midnight on the twenty-first day of March, 1956.

SCHEDULE.

- The Second Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the City of Bendigo, the Borough of Eaglehawk and those portions of the Shires of Marong and Strathfieldsaye not included in the Twenty-first Fire Control Region;
- the Tenth Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the City of Sale and the Shires of Alberton, Avon, Maffra, Morwell, Rosedale, South Gippsland and Traralgon;
- the Twelfth Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Shires of Alexandra and Yea;
- those portions of the Thirteenth Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Shires of Healesville and Upper Yarra;
- the Sixteenth Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the City of Ararat, the Borough of Stawell and the Shires of Ararat, Avoca, Lexton, Ripon and Stawell;
- the Nineteenth Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Town of St. Arnaud, the Borough of Inglewood and the Shires of Bet Bet, Charlton, Donald, Kara Kara and Korong;
- the Twenty-first Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Town of Castlemaine, the Shires of East Loddon, Gordon, Huntly, Maldon, Metcalfe and Rochester and those portions of the Shires of Marong and Strathfieldsaye not included in the Second Fire Control Region;
- the Twenty-second Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the City of Shepparton, the Boroughs of Echuca and Kyabram and the Shires of Cobram, Deakin, Euroa, Goulburn, Melvor, Numurkah, Pyalong, Rodney, Seymour, Shepparton, Tungamah, Violet Town and Waranga;
- the Twenty-third Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Boroughs of Benalla and Wangaratta and the Shires of Benalla, Mansfield, Oxley, Rutherglen, Wangaratta and Yarrowonga;
- and the Twenty-fourth Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Shires of Beechworth, Bright, Chiltern, Towong, Upper Murray, Wodonga and Yackandandah.

TRANSPORT REGULATION ACTS.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by section 38 (1) of the Transport Regulation Act No. 4198, as amended by section 14 of the Transport Act No. 5559, and upon consideration of a recommendation made

by the Transport Regulation Board to the Minister of the Crown administering the said Act and after a consultation had by the Minister with the said Board His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order consent to the Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Board, subject to compliance with sub-section (4) of section 38 of the Transport Regulation Act No. 4198, operating for the period ending the 31st day of January, 1960, commercial passenger vehicles on the routes and in accordance with the conditions set forth in the Schedule appended.

Commencing at the corner of Waioira-road and Southern-road, via Southern-road, Oriel-road, Bell-street, Oriel-road, Kitchener-street, Livingstone-street, Darebin-street, Victoria-road, Westgarth-street, Ross-street, Urquhart-street, High-street, Queen's-parade, Rushall-crescent, Bennett-street, Holden-street, Amess-street, Park-street, Rathdown-street, Latrobe-street, and Russell-street to the corner of Russell and Lonsdale streets. Return trips from the City to operate via Lonsdale-street and Exhibition-street, thence via Rathdown-street and normal route to Heidelberg.
