DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 33 OF THE LABOUR AND INDUSTRY ACT 1953.

I, Henry Norman Jones, Secretary for Labour and Industry, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Labour and Industry Acts, hereby make and issue the following adjusted Determination of the Wages Board referred to hereunder showing adjusted rates and prices to operate from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in February, 1956.

PROPORTION (by any employer). Two apprentices to every five or fraction of five workers receiving at wages rates or piecework prices not less than 363s. 4d. per week.

An amended indenture of apprentice-ship has been prescribed by the Board.

PROPORTION (by any employer). One improver to the first twenty workers and thereafter one improver to every twenty or fraction of twenty workers receiving not less than the minimum wage of 363s. 4d. per week.

Persons employed stripping or repairing roofs or recovering with second-hand materials or using battens that have been treated, painted, sprayed, or dipped in any anti-corrosive, anti-boreant, or such like solution shall be paid ls. 6d. per day or portion of a day in addition to the rates set out above.

Note.—No person under the age of 16 years shall be employed as an apprentice or improver.
