Stock Foods Acts 1928 and 1936. ALTERING THE CHEMICAL STANDARD OF BRAN AND POLLARD.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (3) of section 10 of the Stock Foods Act 1928 as amended by section 10 of the Stock Foods Act 1936 it is amongst other things provided that the Chief Chemist of the Department of Agriculture shall in every year conduct chemical, physical and milling tests upon a portion of the official fair average quality wheat sample fixed for that year and that if necessary the Second Schedule to the Stock Foods Act 1928 shall by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette be amended by altering any standard provided for therein in accordance with the results of those tests: And whereas, as a consequence of the chemical, physical and milling tests conducted by such Chief Chemist upon a portion of the official fair average quality wheat sample fixed for the year 1956 it is necessary to amend the said Schedule by altering the chemical standards provided for therein to accord with the results of those tests: Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof do by this my Proclamation amend the said Schedule as by this my Proclamation amend the said Schedule as follows:—

(1) For the expression "14 per cent." appearing in the first line of the sentence opposite the words "Chemical Standard" under the heading "Bran" there shall be substituted the expression "13.5 per cent."
(2) For the expression "14 per cent." appearing in the first line of the sentence opposite the words "Chemical Standard" under the heading "Pollard" there shall be substituted the expression "13.5 per cent."

MEDICAL (PHARMACY BOARD FEES) ACT 1955 (No. 5881).

PROCLAMATION

ACT 391.—SECOND SCHEDULE.

A STATEMENT of trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of the Church of England, under the provisions of the "Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion," for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the twenty-second day of May, 1956, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed:—

STATEMENT OF TRUSTS.

Description of Land.—2 acres 0 roods 20 3/10 perches, Township of Fyansford, Parish of Gheringhap, County of Grant, being allotment 4.—Commencing at the north-eastern angle of the State School Reserve; bounded thence by allotment 50, section 6. Parish of Gheringhap, bearing S. 89 deg. 19 min. E. 438 3/10 links; by allotment 5, Township of Fyansford, bearing S. 479 5/10 links; by the Geelong-Hamilton road, bearing west 444 links; and thence by the aforesaid road and State School Reserve, bearing N 0. deg. 41 min. E. 484 8/10 links to the point of commencement.

Name of Trustees.—The Church of England Trusts Corporation for the Diocese of Melbourne, of Cathedral Buildings, Flinders-lane, Melbourne.

Power of Disposition.—Power to sell, lease, mortgage, or exchange all or any part of such land, subject to the approval of the Archbishop of Melbourne for the time being, or during the absence of the Archbishop from the Dlocese or the vacancy of the see, to the approval of the person for the time being administering the affairs thereof. The land, until otherwise disposed of, to be held for the purposes for which it was granted or reserved by the Crown.

Purposes to which Proceeds of Disposition are to be Applied.—To be paid to the Archbishop or administrator aforesaid, to be applied to such purposes of the Church of England in the Diocese of Melbourne as may by such Archbishop or administrator acting under the advice of the Council of the Diocese, be from time to time deemed desirable.

Shrine of Remembrance Site Act 1933, Land Act 1928. REGULATIONS BY TRUSTEES OF LAND UNDER SECTION 182, "LAND ACT 1928."

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE SHRINE OF REMEMBRANCE RESERVE IN THE CITY OF MELBOURNE.

WHEREAS by a Crown grant issued in favour of the Shrine of Remembrance Trustees (incorporated by the Shrine of Remembrance Site Act 1933) in respect of the reserve for a site for a monument known as the Shrine of Remembrance in the City of Melbourne, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted shall be maintained and used as and for a site for a monument known as the Shrine of Remembrance and offices and conveniences connected therewith and for no other purpose whatsoever: And whereas by section 182 of the Land Act 1928 it is enacted that where under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands the Governor in Council has reserved permanently any Crown land for any public purposes whatsoever and has vested such land in trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of the sald section: Now therefore the Shrine of Remembrance Trustees do hereby rescind the Regulations made by them on the 17th day of April, 1935, and the 2nd day of March, 1955, in respect of the said Reserve, and in lieu thereof do hereby make the following Regulations:—

- 1. No person being in the Reserve shall at any time, unless he is authorized in writing so to do by the Trustees, sell or offer for sale, or advertise for sale, any article, whether in being or not in being, or carry on any trade or business or offer any services for remuneration.
- or business or offer any services for remuneration.

 2. No person shall damage deface or impair or do anything likely to damage deface or impair any property of the Trustees whether the monument or the memorial referred to in the Shrine of Remembrance Site Acts or any part thereof or any fixture erection structure building decoration or other improvement or any part of any such on the Reserve or obstruct or interfere with any fixture on the Reserve so as to impair its usefulness for the transmission conveyance supply or use of water gas electricity or other agency or service or with any drain or sewer thereon. The meaning of this Regulation shall not be restricted by any more particular provision or provisions in these Regulations expressed or contained.

 3. No person shall interfere with any tree, shrub, flower,
- 3. No person shall interfere with any tree, shrub, flower, fish or bird in the Reserve, or throw any stone or other missile, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave any bottle, orange peel, paper, or litter of any kind, or light fire anywhere in the Reserve, or engage therein in any sport or game.
- 4. No vehicle, motor-car, motor-cycle, or cycle other than perambulators, go-carts, or children's cycles shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserve, except on the portions thereof specially provided for wheeled traffic.
- 5. No person shall cause or allow any horse to enter or pass over or through the Reserve, or be ridden or exercised in any part thereof, except on some road (if any) expressly made available by the Trustees for horse traffic.
- 6. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who offends against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct; and no person in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain in the Reserve. No person shall create or take part in any disturbance in the Reserve.
- 7. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve after he has been lawfully ordered to keep off or to leave the Reserve by any member of the Police Force, or by any person generally or specially authorized by the Trustees to order or keep persons off the Reserve.
- 8. No public meeting, assembly for a fête, picnic, or concert, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, and no public meeting shall take place in the Reserve except within the hours and for the purpose and under the charge of the persons which the Trustees have consented to in writing.

- 9. No person shall stand on or jump on or over any seat, gate, fence, or other structures, or climb any tree in the Reserve, or lie on any seat or lie on the grass in an objectionable attitude, or stick bills on anything in the Reserve, or cut names, letters or marks on any tree, seat, gate, post or fence, or write thereon or otherwise deface the same or any property of the Trustees.
- 10. No person shall depasture any cattle, sheep, horse or other animal in the Reserve.
- 11. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserve by or with the authority of the Trustees, shall enter any plot therein which may be enclosed for plantation of trees or shrubs, or for other purposes, without the consent of the person having charge thereof.
- 12. Children under the age of twelve years shall not be allowed in the Roserve unless accompanied by and in the direct charge of an adult.
- 13. No person shall offer any chair or seat for hire in the Reserve, or solicit or collect money or other valuable thing therein without permission, in writing, of the Trustees first had and obtained.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 182 of the Land Act 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who so offends, and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of such Trustees or by any member of the Police Force does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to the law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

- 2. Regulation No. 275 paragraph 9 is amended by adding after the word "shed" in the first line the words "where goods are being handled or stored".

THE MÉLÉOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS. REGULATIONS.

N pursuance of the Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1928, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:---

- 1. The Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 21st February, 1951, approved by the Governor in Council on 16th March, 1951, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th May, 1951, and any amendment thereto are hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Regulations".
- 2. Regulation No. 308 of the Principal Regulations is amended by deleting from the third line of the definition of the word "wharf" the words "anchored or moored" and substituting therefor the words "anchored moored or berthed".
- 3. Regulation No. 314 of the Principal Regulations is repealed and the following Regulation is substituted in lieu therefor:—
 - "314. Where any vessel is anchored moored or berthed within the Port at any place or in any manner and shall in the opinion of the Commissioners be laid up and out of commission the same tonnage rates shall be paid as are required by Regulation No. 308. Provided, however, that if the Owner shall give to the Commissioners an undertaking that they are not to be held responsible for any damage to such vessel howsoever caused while she continues to be so laid up and out of commission, and notwithstanding that such damage shall be caused by the negligence of the Commissioners or their servants and shall also furnish security to the satisfaction of the Commissioners for the payment to them of the amount of any damage which shall be caused to any of the property of the Commissioners by such vessel, and of any loss incurred by the Commissioners in raising, removing, or destroying such vessel in the event of her being sunk or stranded within the Port, and becoming in the opinion of the Commissioners an obstruction to the safe and convenient navigation and/or use of the Port, or shall give such other undertaking and/or security in lieu of the foregoing as the Commissioners may in special circumstances require, the tonnage rates payable to the Commissioners in respect of such vessel shall be the following:-

SCALE OF CHAINS



REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF CERTAIN CROWN RESERVATIONS IN THE CITY OF BRIGHTON.

MANAGEMENT OF CERTAIN CROWN RESERVATIONS IN THE CITY OF BRIGHTON.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928; as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of-Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the City of Brighton permanently reserved for Public Purposes indicated by red colour on plan "B" over 7.5.56 with Lands Department correspondence Rs.4534 and known as the "Brighton Beach Foreshore Reserve," the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 16th April, 1935, as a place of Public Resort or Recreation known as the "Green Point Reserve," the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 14th December, 1922, as a site for Public Purposes and the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 12th June, 1919, as a site for Park purposes, all of which are hereinafter referred to as the "Reserves," in lieu of all previous Regulations, which are hereby rescinded.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserves while in a state of intoxication or who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 2. No person shall destroy, damage, pick, pluck, tear, remove, or interfere in any way with any of the trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, seeds, or other vegetation in the Reserves or walk on the beds or borders therein.
- 3. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or bounding the Reserves, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage, disfigure, destroy, or remove any of the buildings, walls, gates, fences, seats, groynes, drains, or any improvements in the Reserves.
- 4. No person shall ride or lead on to or on any part of the Reserves or bring on to or put in the Reserves or tether or cause to be tethered on any part of the Reserves any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals except as otherwise permitted by these Regulations.
- 5. No person shall cause or suffer any dog belonging to him or in his charge to enter or remain in the Reserves unless such dog be or continue to be effectively controlled uniess such dog de or continue to be effectively controlled by means of a chain or cord or leash and be effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person and the owner of any dog which is found in the Reserves and which is not under the effective control of some person by means of a chain or cord or leash shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.
- 6. No person shall park a motor-car or other vehicle within the Reserves except at such places as are set apart by the Committee of Management for this purpose.
 - 7. No person shall camp in the Reserves.

- 8: No person shall erect therein any building or any tent, booth, bathing box, boatshed, or other structure, or offer for sale any article in the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 9. No person shall conduct or take part in any public meeting or entertainment of any sort in the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 10. No person shall preach or declaim, harangue, or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public in any part of the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 11. No person shall play any musical instrument, sing, recite, conduct, or take part in any band performance or entertainment of any sort in the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 12. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserves.
- 13. No person shall light a fire on any part of the Reserves.
- 14. No person shall commit a nuisance on any part of the Reserves or in any bathing box, shed, or other buildings upon the Reserves.
- 15. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport in the Reserves.
- 16. No person shall throw any stone or other substance or play cricket or any other game with a hard ball within the Reserves.
- 17. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited waste paper, bottles, tins, food, refuse, fruit, fruit skins, or any other litter or refuse on any part of the Reserves except in receptacles provided for that purpose.
- 18. No person shall use any of the closets, urinals, or dressing sheds in the Reserves or any portion of the closets, urinals, or dressing sheds for any other purpose than that for which they are constructed.
- 19. No person shall break glass of any kind in the Reserves nor leave therein anything which would injure bathers or other members of the Public.
- 20. No person shall discharge any firearm or air gun or set off any fireworks in any part of the Reserves.
- 21. No person shall use or cause any bathing box or boat shed or other building erected within the Reserves to be used for residential purposes.
- 22. No person shall bring any liquor on to the Reserves or consume it thereon.
- 23. No person shall remove or cause to be removed any, and, stone, soil, or other material from any part of the Reserves.
- 24. No person shall moor or use, place, or leave any boat on the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 25. No person shall use, place, or leave any boat or any mooring or other rope or chain on the Reserves in such a manner as to cause an obstruction to any person using the
- 26. No person shall set up, drive in, or erect any posts, pillars, or poles on any pant of the Reserves, nor lay or place any rails, ramps, or slipways in or upon the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 27. No person shall bring in or on the Reserves any diving stand,
- 28. No person shall pull ropes for netting fish over the Reserves, nor erect or place any galley, fishing nets, stands, ropes, baskets, boxes, or other fishing appurtenances on the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 29. No person clothed in bathing costume shall come on to or be on or remain on any part of the Reserves, unless effectively and decently clad in a suitable bathing costume, and any person bathing from the Reserves shall be attired in a suitable bathing costume.
- 30. No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his or her bathing costume in any place in the Reserves open to the public view.
- 31. No person shall defecate or urinate in any part of the Reserves except in the closets and urinals provided therein for these purposes.
- 32. No person shall post or place any advertisement, bill, poster, or any other like sign in any part of the Reserves.
- 33. No person shall drive, ride, push, or pull any motor-car, cycle, or other vehicle (whether propelled by mechanical or other means) on to, over, across, or along any part of the Reserves, except on the areas set apart or marked out for vehicular traffic.

34. No person shall engage or take part in any vehicular or foot racing upon any part of the Reserves.

35. No person shall obstruct or interfere with the passage of members of the public using the Reserves, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty or insult any employee of the Committee of Management or any member or employee of such Committee

- 36. No person shall behave in an unseemly, improper, riotous, or noisy manner to the annoyance of the public or blaspheme, use profane or obscene language, or behave in an indecent manner in or on any part of the Reserves.
- 37. Any person committing any breach of these Regulations who refuses to state his name and place of abode to any member of the Committee of Management or to an employee of such Committee or who in the opinion of such member or employee states a false name or place of abode shall be guilty of an offence under these Regulations.—(Rs.4354, Rs.2576, C.81372.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of the section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

 - (e) shall be distant not less than 40 feet from any dwelling wherever situate, and

(c) the depth above sea level to which excavating operations may be carried on upon the area described in the permit (such depth to be ascertained by reference to and on the basis of the levels shown on contour survey plans), but nothing herein contained shall apply to excavating operations (other than quarrying or blasting operations) on any land on which any such operations were commenced before the 10th day of November, 1938, and have since that date continued without substantial interruption, or on any other land on which excavating operations were being carried on at the commencement of the Local Government (Amendment) Act 1954, unless the Minister in writing approves of the application of this By-law to such last-mentioned land. such last-mentioned land.

- 2. Every person to whom any permit may be issued by the Council to commence or carry on excavating opera-tions shall, within three months after the expiration of tions shall, within three months after the expiration of such permit (unless in the meantime a new permit shall have been issued to him in respect of the same area) fill in the area excavated under such permit with such material and to such level as the Council, by its Shire Secretary or Engineer, may prescribe by notice in writing to be given to the holder of such permit within one calendar month after the expiration thereof.
- 3. The Council may, before issuing any permit to commence and carry on excavating operations, other than quarrying or blasting operations, require the person applying for the permit to enter into such bond, or deposit, or give such security as it may think sufficient to secure compliance with the requirements of paragraph 2 hereof.
- 4. No excavating operations (whether or not on any land on which such operations were commenced before the 10th day of November, 1938, and since that date continued without substantial interruption or on any other land on which excavating operations were being carried on at the commencement of the Local Government (Amendment) Act 1954 whether or not the Minister in writing approves of the application of this By-law to such land) shall be carried on within a distance of 50 feet from any street or road, or any land set out or reserved as a street or road, on any plan of subdivision lodged in the Office of Titles, or any land which is in fact used as a street, road, lane, or passage, or within a distance of 30 feet from any land the ownership or occupation whereof is in some person other than the owner of the whereof is in some person other than the owner of the land on which such excavating operations are being carried on.

- 5. Every person carrying on excavating operations (hereinafter called "the excavator") shall observe the following rules as to such operations:-
 - (a) If such excavating operations are carried on by manual power, the excavator shall carry on the using either one of the following methods:-
 - (i) The wall or face of such excavation may be terraced, but the vertical wall or face of each step in such terrace shall not be more than 6 feet in height, and the horizontal face of every terrace other than the step at the floor of such excavation shall be of not less width than one-half of the height of the vertical wall or face immediately above it; or
 - (ii) The banks or sides of all such excavations shall be sloped down so that the batter of such banks or sides shall be maintained at a slope ratio of one horizontal to one vertical.
 - (b) If such excavations shall be carried on by means of a hydraulic nozzle or power shovel or simi-lar method, then the excavator may work with a vertical wall or face, subject to the following conditions:-
 - (i) The excavator shall not permit any person, whether employee or otherwise, to be within a distance of 10 feet from such wall or face; and
 - (ii) The excavator shall not allow any over-hang to exist in such wall or face;
 - hang to exist in such wall or face;

 (iii) Every excavator working upon a vertical wall or face of a greater depth than 6 feet shall erect a fence of not less than 4 feet in height either upon the boundary line of the land occupied by the excavator or in such position in relation to the brink of such wall or face as will protect persons on ground level from falling into the pit worked by the excavator. Such fence shall be of substantial construction, and may be of posts and rails or of posts not less than 22 feet apart, with two droppers equally spaced between posts, and of not less than three strands of wire (two of barb and one of eight-gauge plain). The top wire shall be barbed and shall not be more than 6 inches from the top of each post. The bottom wire shall be not more than 15 inches above ground level, and the intermediate wire shall be equidistant from the top and the bottom wires. The bottom wire may be barbed or plain according to the option of the excavator. excavator.
 - (iv) A wall or fence which is not sloped down so that the batter of the banks or sides of the excavations shall be maintained at a slope ratio of one horizontal to one vertical shall be deemed "a vertical wall or face."
- 6. Every person carrying on excavating operations (other than quarrying or blasting operations) and using any mechanical or hydraulic power for such operations shall, within fourteen days from the publication of this By-law in the Government Gazette, notify the Council of the place where such power is used or intended to be used, and in such notice shall furnish the Council with full information of the type and nature of such power.

Every person carrying on excavating operations (other than quarrying or blasting operations) and whether using manual power or mechanical or hydraulic power, and whether working upon a vertical or a sloped or a terraced face, shall work or carry or all such excavations in such a manner that when any part of any excavation made by him is, at ground surface level, 50 feet from a street or road, or 30 feet from land not in the ownership or occupation of such person (which are the limits provided in clause 4 hereof), the banks or sides of such excavations, and of all parts of such excavations. of such excavations, and of all parts of such excavations, shall be sloped down so that a slope or batter of one horizontal to one vertical is maintained.
- 8. In this By-law, the word "corporation." "person" includes
- 9. Any person guilty of any wilful breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such breach to a penalty of not less than Five pounds, nor

more than Twenty pounds, and if such offence be a continuing offence to a further penalty of not more than Five pounds per day for each day of which such offence is continued after a conviction or order by any court.

Carrying on excavating operations (other than quarrying or blasting operations) without a permit or otherwise than in accordance with the limits of a permit (where a permit is required) shall be deemed a continuing offence.

- 10. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Cranbourne.
- 11. This By-law shall come into operation and have effect immediately on its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.
