AREAS OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette at any time diminish or increased the case of the land of the council may. WHEKEAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

## PROCLAMATION

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1946 (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And, whereas the Council of the Shire of Corio has

And, whereas the Council of the Shire of Corio has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved or acquired for a road within the said Shire, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land being part of Crown portions 82 and 84, Parish of Moranghurk, reserved or acquired for a road and described hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, namely:—

Commencing at the south-eastern angle of the said Commencing at the south-eastern angle of the said Crown portion 84 and bounded on the south by a Government road 66 feet wide known as Purnell-road bearing west 68 ft. 11 in., thence on the west by other part of the said Crown portions bearing N. 16 deg. 44 min. E. 2,771 ft. 8½ in., thence on the north by a road 66 feet wide known as School-road bearing N. 89 deg. 58 min. E. 68 ft. 11 in. to the north-east corner of Crown portion 82, thence on the east by the Geelong-Melbourne railway bearing S. 16 deg. 44 min. W. 2,771 ft. 9 in. to the commencing point.

# THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS. REGULATIONS.

N pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act* 1928, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

- 1. The Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 21st February, 1951, approved by the Governor in Council on 16th March, 1951, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th May, 1951, and any amendment thereto are hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Regulations".
- 2. Regulation No. 308 of the Principal Regulations is amended by deleting from the third line of the definition of the word "wharf" the words "anchored or moored" and substituting therefor the words "anchored moored or berthed".
- 3. Regulation No. 314 of the Principal Regulations is repealed and the following Regulation is substituted in lieu therefor:—
  - "314. Where any vessel is anchored moored or berthed within the Port at any place or in any manner and shall in the opinion of the Commissioners be laid up and out of commission the same tonnage rates shall be paid as are required by Regulation No. 308. Provided, however, that if the Owner shall give to the Commissioners an undertaking that they are not to be held responsible for any damage to such vessel howsoever caused while she continues to be so laid up and out of commission, and notwithstanding that such damage shall be caused by the negligence of the Commissioners or their servants and shall also furnish security to the satisfaction of the Commissioners for the payment to them of the amount of any damage which shall be caused to any of the property of the Commissioners by such vessel, and of any loss incurred by the Commissioners in raising, removing, or destroying such vessel in the event of her being sunk or stranded within the Port, and becoming in the opinion of the Commissioners an obstruction to the safe and convenient navigation and/or use of the Port, or shall give such other undertaking and/or security in lieu of the foregoing as the Commissioners may in special circumstances require, the tonnage rates payable to the Commissioners in respect of such vessel shall be the following:-

## THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS. REGULATIONS.

N pursuance of the Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1928, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:-

- 1. The Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 21st February, 1951, approved by the Governor in Council on 16th March, 1951, and published in the Government Gazette on the 28th May, 1951, and any amendment thereto are hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Regulations ".
- 2. Regulation No. 275 paragraph 9 is amended by adding after the word "shed" in the first line the words "where goods are being handled or stored".

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE OMEO TOURIST CAMPING AREA.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the

Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Omeo, temperarily reserved by Orders in Council dated 8th September, 1953, and 20th December, 1955, as a site for Tourist Camping purposes, known as the Omeo Tourist Camping Area, hereinafter referred to as the "Area," such reservation having been placed under control of a Committee of Management hereinafter referred to as the "Cemmittee."

#### REGULATIONS.

- 1. No person offending against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct shall remain on the Area.
- 2. No person shall climb or jump over any fences or gates in or around the Area, stick bills thereon, or cut names on fences, trees, seats, or other improvements therein, cr otherwise disfigure, injure, or destroy the said fences, trees, seats, or other improvements, or remove soil therefrom.
- 3. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited waste paper, bottles, or any other litter on any part of the Area, except in receptacles provided for the purpose.
- 4. No person shall erect any structure on the Area other than a tent or booth and then only as hereinafter provided.
- 5. No person shall camp, or erect any tent in or upon the Area, except in such places as shall from time to time be set apart for such purposes, and then only on obtaining a permit to do so upon such terms and conditions, and the payment of such fees fixed by the Committee.
- 6. No person shall erect a booth in the Area for the purpose of offering for sale any articles, ncr shall any person offer for sale in the Area any articles, without the permission, in writing, and subject to such conditions and payment of such fees fixed by the Committee.
- 7. All persons using the conveniences provided by the Committee on the Area shall pay such charges (if any) for the use of same as shall from time to time be fixed by the Committee.
- 8. No person shall light fires, except in places set apart for that purpose by the Committee, and no refuse material shall be burnt on the Area, except by a representative of the Committee, and then only in places set apart for the purpose.
- 9. No person shall break glass of any kind on the Area or leave thereon anything which shall or may injure any person.
- 10. No person shall discharge any gun, pistol, rifle, airgun, or any firearm in or upon the Area.
- 11. No person shall put in or on the Area any cattle, goats, pigs, horses or other animals, or any vehicles, without the permission of the Committee first obtained.
- 12. No person shall bring into the Area any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 13. Permission of the Committee must be obtained beforehand for the holding of all organized sports, picnics, or functions of any kind in the Area.—(Rs.7158.)

A By-law of the City of Sandringham, made under sections 198 and 228 of the Local Government Acts, and numbered 164, for the purpose of altering By-law No. 150 as altered by By-law No. 157.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and every other power thereunto it enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Sandringham, with the approval of the Governor in Council, hereby order as follows:—

By-law No. 150 of the City of Sandringham, prohibiting the leaving (whether unattended or not) of motor-cars or other vehicles standing in parts of certain streets, as altered by By-law No. 157, is hereby further altered in manner hereinafter appearing:—

- 1. Under the heading "Central Ward" in clause 4 of the said By-law, as altered, the following sub-clauses are added after sub-clause (c):—
  - (d) All that part of the southern half of Bay-road commencing at a point 354 ft. 6 in. from the intersection of the south building line of Bayroad with the west building line of Reserveroad and extending westerly for a distance of 140 feet.
  - (e) All that part of the eastern half of Stationstreet between lines which run westerly from points on such half which are respectively 382 feet and 651 feet south from the intersection of the south building line of Abbottstreet and the eastern half of Station-street.
- 2. Under the heading "Central Ward" in clause 5 of the said By-law No. 150, sub-clauses (a) to (f), both inclusive, are deleted and the following sub-clauses substituted therefor:—
  - (a) Melrose-street, both sides, from its intersection with Station-street to Beach-road.
  - (b) All that part of Bay-road, both sides, between Beach-road and Trentham-street.
  - (c) Waltham-street, both sides, from Abbott-street to Station-street.
  - (d) All that part of the western half of Stationstreet between Abbott-street and Melrosestreet.
  - (a) All that part of the eastern half of Stationstreet which lies between Abbott-street and a point 382 feet south therefrom.
  - (f) All that part of the eastern half of Stationstreet from a line which is the prolongation of the north building line of Bay-road northerly to a line which is parallel to and 351 feet distant from it.
- This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout such parts of the municipal district of the City of Sandringham as are herein specified.

A By-law of the City of Sandringham, made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria, as amended by the Uniform Building Amending Regulations Nos. 1, 2, 3, and 4, with the approval of the Governor in Council, and numbered 159, for determining, applying, dispensing with, or regulating such matters or things, as are left to be determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council of the said City of Sandringham under the said Uniform Building Regulations Victoria.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria, amended as aforesaid (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations"), and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Sandringham order as follows:—

- 1. The areas set out and described in the Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as brick areas, and no person shall in any such area construct or cause to be constructed any building of Classes 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9, the external walls of which are of material other than brick, stone, or concrete, and for the purposes of this clause buildings of brick veneer construction shall be deemed to have external walls of brick.
- 2. The whole of the municipal district is hereby prescribed as an area in which buildings of Classes II. and III. Occupancy shall not be constructed to contain more than two stories, including the ground story, and no person shall in any such area construct a building of Class II. or Class III. Occupancy to contain more than two stories, including the ground story.
- 3. The minimum width of frontage, minimum depth, and minimum area of site specified in column 3 of Table 803 of the Uniform Building Regulations of Victoria, as amended by the Uniform Building Regulations of victoria, as amended by the Uniform Building Regulations amending Regulation No. 4 (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations") are hereby adopted as the minimum width of frontage depth, and area of site of land on which a building shall be constructed throughout the whole of the municipal district municipal district.
- 4. The minimum distance of the outer walls of any building from the frontage of any land is hereby specified as 25 feet.
- 5. No person shall construct any building closer to the frontage of any land than  $25\ \text{feet}.$
- 6. The requirements of clause 811 of the Regulations are hereby dispensed with in the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the Council, and lodged in the Office of Titles prior to the date of the commencement of the Regulations.
- 7. By-law Nos. 131 and 139 are hereby repealed.
- 8. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

- 3. This By-law shall apply and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district, except to premises registered as a poultry-killing premises and poultry sale-yards when so exempt in writing by the Council.

In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, "poultry" includes fowls, turkeys, ducks, geese, cage birds, and pigeons; "person" includes the owner or occupier or the person in charge of such premises; "approved materials" means materials approved by the Council of the municipality.
- 5. No person shall keep or suffer to be kept any live poultry, except in a fowlhouse or similar structure to which may be attached an enclosed fowl-run.
- 6. No person shall keep or suffer to be kept in any fowlhouse or similar structure a number of poultry greater than the number produced by dividing the area in square feet of such fowlhouse or similar structure by six.
- 7. Every fowlhouse or similar structure or any enclosed fowl-run on any premises shall be-
  - (a) Distant at least 75 feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the building has a

  - the street or road to which the frontage.

    (b) Distant at least 10 feet from any other street or road of a greater width than 25 feet.

    (c) Distant at least 5 feet from any other street or road of a lesser width than 25 feet.

    (d) Distant at least 5 feet from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land.

    (e) Distant at least 40 feet from any dwelling, whether on the same or adjoining land.
- 8. Every fowlhouse or similar structure in which poultry is kept shall be roofed with approved material and paved with approved impervious material, and the surface level of the floor shall be at least 3 inches above the level of the surrounding ground.
- 9. Every fowlhouse or similar structure shall be rendered rat-proof by placing galvanized iron, jointed brickwork, or concrete around the foundations to a depth of at least 18 inches below ground level, and all walls shall be constructed of approved rat-proof material.
- 10. The occupier of any premises on which poultry is kept shall cause the fowlhouse and attached enclosed run to be maintained at all times in a clean and sanitary condition.
- 11. All poultry food shall be stored in rat-proof containers.

12. Any person guilty of any contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and in the case of any offence continuing after such conviction to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds, but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.
