Labour and Industry Acts.

DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 33 OF THE LABOUR AND INDUSTRY ACT 1953.

I, Henry Norman Jones, Secretary for Labour and Industry, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Labour and Industry Acts, hereby make and issue the following adjusted Determination of the Wages Board referred to hereunder showing adjusted rates and prices to operate from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in May, 1956.

Except in the case of an apprentice or an improver, the minimum wage shall be, where the employer—
 (a) boards the employee with three meals per day, 35s. per week less, or
 (b) boards and lodges the employee, 56s. per week less.

NOTE.—A copy of this Determination shall be displayed at or near the entrance of every establishment where the Determination of this Wages Board applies.

Under the provisions of Section 129 of the Labour and Industry Act, 1953, every employer of any emyloyee in any Boarding-house is required to keep a time-book or other record in the prescribed form wherein each employee shall enter daily a record of the hours worked.

Clauses, other than clause 2, of the said Determination shall remain in force.
