WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And, whereas the Council of the Shire of Frankston and Hastings has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved for a road within the said Shire, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land being part of Crown allotment 6B Township of Frankston, Parish of Frankston, reserved for a road and described hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, namely:

FRANCIS-STREET.

Commencing at the north-western angle of lot 37 shown on plan of subdivision No. 12128 lodged at the Office of Titles, bounded thence by lines bearing respectively north 19 deg. 16 min. east 50 feet, south 70 deg. 45 min. east 775 ft. 10½ in., south 19 deg. 15 min. west 50 feet and north 70 deg. 45 min. west 775 ft. 10½ in. to the commencing point.

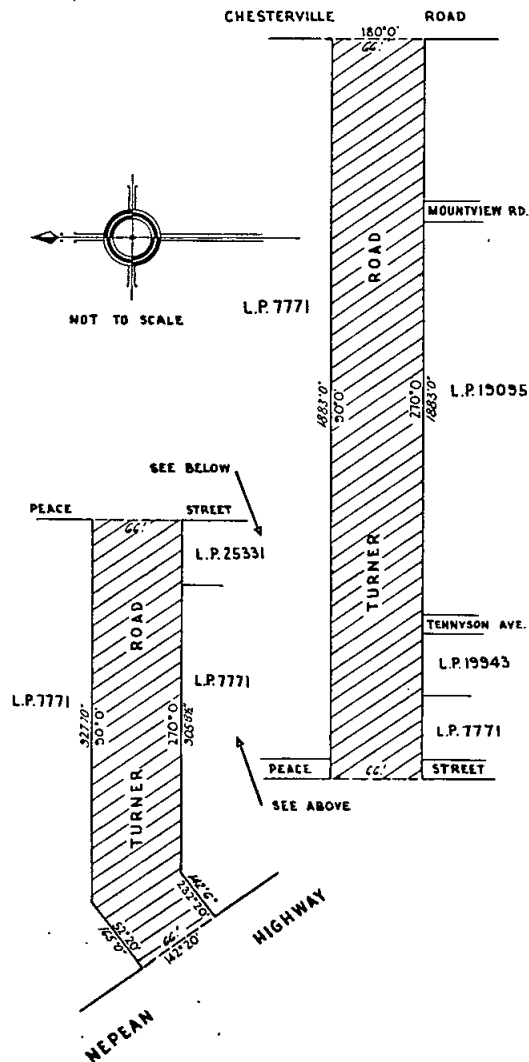

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act* 1946, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice published in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And, whereas the Council of the City of Moorabbin has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned which has been reserved for a road within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare that all that piece of land reserved for a road, shown as Turner-road on lodged plan of subdivision No. 7771, being part of Crown allotment 42, Parish of Moorabbin, and being the land indicated by hachure on the plan hereunder shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

PROCLAMATION SPECIFYING A COMPANY.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS pursuant to sub-section (2) of section 2 of the above-mentioned Act the Governor in Council on the recommendation of a law officer may from time to time in and by a Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* specify for the purposes of the said Act any company (*inter alia*) incorporated in Victoria: And whereas Her Majesty's Attorney-General being a law officer in and for Victoria has as required by sub-section (3) of the said section satisfied himself that it is necessary for the protection of the public or of the shareholders or creditors of Freighters Limited a company incorporated in the said State that the affairs thereof should be investigated under the said Act and has recommended accordingly: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the said State, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth in and by this Proclamation specify Freighters Limited aforesaid for the purposes of the said Act.

SIMULTANEOUS DESTRUCTION OF VERMIN ORDERED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 7 of the Vermin and Noxious Weeds Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation specify a day on from and after which any vermin shall be simultaneously destroyed by every owner and occupier of any land within the whole of Victoria, or any part of Victoria specified in the Proclamation:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby name the Sixth day of August One thousand nine hundred and fifty-six as the day on from and after which certain vermin, to wit rabbits, shall be simultaneously destroyed by every owner and occupier of any land within the whole of Victoria.

In addition to the attendance fees payable under *The Constitution Act Amendment (Committee of Public Accounts) Act 1956*, every member of the Committee of Public Accounts shall be entitled to receive for expenses incurred by him when travelling, whenever such expenses have been necessarily incurred by him in the performance of his duties as a member of such Committee, the following sums:—

- (i) If he is resident in the metropolitan area and is required to perform such duties within Victoria, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings for each full day and a proportionate sum for each part of a day during which he is absent from the metropolitan area;
- (ii) if he is not resident in the metropolitan area and is required to perform such duties within Victoria, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings for each full day and a proportionate sum for each part of a day during which he is absent from his place of residence;
- (iii) if he is required to perform such duties outside Victoria, the sum of Four pounds for each full day and a proportionate sum for each part of a day during which he is absent from his place of residence:

Provided that no member shall be entitled to receive any such sum in respect of any day on which the House of which he is a member is sitting unless such duties are performed outside the metropolitan area; and provided further that no member shall be entitled to receive any such sum in respect of any day in respect of which he receives any other sum by way of travelling expenses out of Consolidated Revenue.

3. In these Regulations "metropolitan area" means the area lying within a radius of 20 miles from the Post Office at the corner of Elizabeth and Bourke streets, Melbourne.

4. These Regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 12th day of June, 1956.

1. The Finance, Water Supply, Sewerage, Farm and Officers and Servants Committees shall each consist of eight members, the Planning and Highways Committee of ten members, the Legislative Committee of seven members and the Stores Committee shall consist of the Vice-Chairman for the time being of the Finance, Water Supply, Sewerage, Farm, Officers and Servants, Planning and Highways and Legislative Committees, and the quorum for such Committees shall be as follows, namely:—For the Finance, Water Supply, Sewerage, Farm Committees and for the Planning and Highways Committee, five members, for the Officers and Servants, three members, and Legislative and Stores Committees, four members."

3. Clause 65 of the said By-law is hereby amended by the insertion after the words "Special Committees" of the words "at an Ordinary Meeting of the Board held within one month after the coming into operation of this By-law and thereafter".
