AREAS OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 3, 7, and 8 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say) :—

**RATING BY-LAW FOR 1956 IN THE URBAN DISTRICT OF KATAMATITE.**

(By-law No. 231.)

**T**HE Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Twenty-four pence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Katamatite Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Twenty shillings, and in respect of land on which there is no building, less than Five shillings.

## HOME FINANCE (TRUST) REGULATIONS No. 2.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by the Home Finance Acts and the *Acts Interpretation Act 1928*, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

*Citation.*

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Home Finance (Trust) Regulations No. 2, and shall come into operation upon the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

*Interpretation.*

2. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

“Acts” mean the Home Finance Acts.

“Trust” means the Home Finance Trust constituted under the Acts.

Expressions used have the same meaning as those ascribed to them by the Home Finance Acts.

*Quorum.*

3. Pursuant to sub-section (5) of section 2 of the *Home Finance Act 1956*, two members of the Trust shall constitute a quorum.

*Meetings.*

4. (1) The Trust shall hold meetings at such places and on such days and at such hours as the chairman from time to time appoints. Provided that a meeting shall be called by the chairman at the request of the other members of the Trust.

(2) At every meeting of the Trust the chairman, or in his absence a member chosen by the members present to be chairman of the meeting, shall preside.

(3) If at any meeting of the Trust at which only two members are present a decision cannot be reached on any matter, consideration shall be deferred to a subsequent meeting of the Trust.

*Minutes.*

5. At every meeting of the Trust minutes shall be taken and recorded in the minute-book by the secretary of the Trust or by the person directed by the Trust to act as deputy to the secretary for the time being.

*Confirmation of Minutes.*

6. The minutes of every meeting shall be read and confirmed at the next meeting. Upon the confirmation of the minutes they shall be signed by the chairman of the meeting. Any minutes purporting to be so signed shall be prima facie evidence of the matters therein stated.

*Seal and Authentication of Documents.*

7. (1) The common seal of the Trust shall contain the words “Home Finance Trust Victoria” inscribed within two concentric circles.

(2) The common seal shall be kept at the office of the chairman in the custody of the chairman.

(3) The common seal shall be used only under the authority of a resolution of the Trust, and shall be attested by the signatures of two members and the secretary, or in the absence of the secretary by the person directed by the Trust to act as deputy to the secretary for the time being.

(4) Pursuant to sub-sections (4) and (5) of section 3 of the *Home Finance Act 1956*, any document requiring authentication by the Trust shall be sufficiently authenticated without the common seal if signed by two members and the secretary, or in the absence of the secretary by the person directed by the Trust to act as deputy to the secretary for the time being.

The Regulations made by the Board on the 8th September, 1928, and 29th January, 1954, as notified in the *Government Gazette* of the 12th September, 1928, and 10th February, 1954, for the care, protection and management of the land in the Parish of Lang Lang indicated by pink tint on plan marked A/17.4.24 and by red colour on plan marked L/10.10.1952 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.3606 known as the Lang Lang Foreshore Reserve are hereby applied to the land in the

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "QUEEN VICTORIA PARK" RESERVE, AT BEECHWORTH.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Beechworth, temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated 24th April, 1956, as a site for Public Park and Public Recreation known as "Queen Victoria Park," Beechworth, hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve," such reservation having been placed under control of the Council of the Shire of Beechworth as a Committee of Management hereinafter referred to as the "Committee."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, except on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements.
2. No person shall—
  - (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, and for maintaining good order in the Reserve the Committee or its employees may refuse any person admission to the Reserve or any structure therein.
  - (b) Climb or jump over the gates, fences, seats, tables, signboards, building equipment, notices, fittings, or other improvements in or around the Reserve, nor stick or erect therein or thereon any bills or in any way injure, damage, deface, write, or paint on or otherwise mark any rocks, gates, fences, seats, tables, buildings, equipment, notices, signboards, or other improvements, structure, or fittings therein or thereon, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
  - (c) Remove or displace any board, plate or fitting or written or printed notice for the exhibition of any Regulations or notice fixed or set up by the Committee in the Reserve.
3. Every person shall exercise reasonable and proper care in the use of any portion of the Reserve, dressing rooms, conveniences or appurtenances therein.
4. No person shall, without the consent of the Committee, light any fire in the Reserve except in a place set apart by the Committee or as indicated by the curator for the purpose. No such fire shall be left burning or unattended, and before lighting such fire such person shall make provision for extinguishing the same either by water or loose earth. Every person whilst in the Reserve shall take special precautions against the risk of fire.
5. No person shall camp or erect any tent for residential purposes in or upon the Reserve, except in such places as shall from time to time be set apart for such purposes, and then only on obtaining a permit to do so upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management shall determine.
6. All fees and charges prescribed by the Committee shall be paid to the Secretary of the Committee or other specially authorized officer on demand.
7. No person shall enter the Reserve on any day set apart for cricket or football matches, cycling, sports, fêtes, holiday amusements, or any function whatsoever except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee or any club, association, or person renting the Reserve, or any part thereof, duly authorizing the admission of such person, and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date or during the period provided thereon, and every such ticket shall be produced and, if for one-day only, surrendered on demand to the gate-keeper or other person authorized to collect the same.
8. Upon application to the Committee, any club, association, or person may be granted the exclusive use of the Reserve for the holding of cricket or football matches, shows, sports, fêtes, bicycle races, or other amusements, and may charge for admission thereto of persons subject to the provisions of these Regulations, and shall pay to the Committee such charges as the Committee may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.
9. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at the time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.
10. No person shall offer for sale within the Reserve or deliver therein any article or commodity without the consent, in writing, of the Committee being first obtained, and the payment of such fee as the Committee may impose.
11. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or any structure or erections in the Reserve.
12. No unauthorized person shall interfere with, damage, or in any way destroy or have in his possession in the Reserve or take away therefrom any animal, bird, bird's egg or nest, or any live or dead or dressed timber or any vegetation, tree, shrub, fern, plant, or flower.
13. No person shall permit or suffer any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, or other animals belonging to him or under his care or control to be at large in the Reserve, or to graze or wander over the same without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained and upon payment of such fees as may be fixed by such Committee.
14. No person shall bring into or have in his possession or discharge in the Reserve any rifle, firearm, sporting gun, or airgun without the permission, in writing, of the Committee.
15. All persons using the conveniences provided by the Committee shall pay such charges for the use of same as shall be fixed from time to time by the said Committee.
16. No person shall bring or allow any dog belonging to him or under his care or control to enter or remain in the Reserve unless controlled by a leash, cord, or chain, and all dogs found swimming in any water or wandering in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.
17. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of trees, shrubs, or flowers without the consent of the Committee first obtained, nor shall any person, without lawful excuse, enter any area made for the purpose in the Reserve.
18. No person shall drive any motor-car or other vehicle of any kind or ride any bicycle, motor-cycle, or horse except on a road or parking area made for the purpose in the Reserve, and then only as near as practicable to the left-hand side of such road.
19. No person shall park any motor-car, cycle, or other vehicle or tether any horse within the Reserve, excepting at such area as is set apart by the Committee for the purpose, and any such person using such area shall obey any order given by the said Committee, the curator, or other employee of such Committee, and shall pay on demand a fee to be determined by the Committee for use of such parking area.
20. No person shall drive any motor-car or other vehicle of any kind or ride any bicycle, motor-cycle, or horse within the Reserve or in any parking area or along any road therein recklessly or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, including the nature, and the amount of traffic which actually is at the time or which might reasonably be expected to be on such road, parking area, or in the Reserve.

21. The Committee may at its discretion on such conditions and terms and at such times as it may from time to time fix, lease, rent, or hire to persons, clubs, or associations any tennis courts, buildings or structures, or other part or parts of the Reserve.

22. The Committee shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of the swings or other appliances in the children's playground, nor from any cause howsoever arising within the Reserve.

23. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

24. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve at any time without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

25. No person shall remove any earth, sand, stone, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.

26. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport, including tennis, cricket, quoits, hockey, or any other games or foot-racing, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only with the permission of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the said Committee may determine.

27. No person shall enter the Reserve, or pass over the playing area or oval, with any vehicle, or on horseback, without the permission of the Committee first obtained, nor drive or ride amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve.

28. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee in the proper execution of his work or duty.

29. No person, other than players and officials connected with any game (football, cricket, tennis, bowls, croquet, hockey or golf), and other than any competitors and officials at any sports gathering, shall intrude upon any playground or oval during the course of such games and sports.—(Rs.4250.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

#### BY-LAW No. 165.

A By-law of the City of Sandringham made under section 197 of the Local Government Act as amended by the *Local Government (Amendment) Act 1954* and every other power thereunto it enabling and numbered 165 for regulating the keeping of animals with power to limit the number of any such animals so kept on any property.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of every other power thereunto it enabling the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Sandringham hereby order as follows:—

1. No person shall except as hereinafter provided keep or place or suffer or allow to be kept or placed at any time on any enclosed land in any part of the City of Sandringham for any purpose whatsoever whether temporarily or otherwise any horse or horses, cow or cows, bull or bulls without the consent of the Council of the City of Sandringham signified in writing under the hand of the Town Clerk.

2. Every person desirous of keeping or placing on any such land any such animal or animals shall make application in writing to the Council for its consent so to do specifying in such application the number of animals desired to be so kept and the area and dimensions of such enclosed land and also full particulars of all buildings on such land and on any adjoining land and the distance of each building on such last-mentioned land from the said enclosed land.

3. If there is a dwelling house or place of living or sleeping as the case may be erected on any such enclosed land or on any adjoining land a substantial stable shall be erected on such first-mentioned land in compliance in all respect with the provisions of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, and also with the provisions of the Health Acts and Regulations and By-laws made thereunder.

4. Every such stable and any enclosed yard used in connexion therewith if in a sewered area must be connected with the sewers of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, but if in an unsewered area such stable and yard must be properly drained and kept in good sanitary order and condition and free of any offensive odour to the satisfaction in all respects of the Council.

5. The floors of every such stable and the whole of any such enclosed yard shall be paved with hard bricks, concrete pitchers, and wood blocks or other impervious material that may be approved by the Council and shall always be kept in good sanitary order and condition.

6. A manure pit or pits constructed of impervious material fitted with approved covers shall be provided in connexion with every stable, and every such manure pit shall conform to the same requirements as set out in clause 4 hereof.

7. The provisions of this By-law so far as they relate to the distances stables shall be away from any dwelling or any place of living or sleeping or from the boundary of any land not in the same occupation shall not apply to stables that are at the time of coming into operation of this By-law erected in business areas on land that is being used by bakers, butchers, retail dairymen, or proprietors of wood-yards, in connexion with their respective trades, but in all other respects the provisions of this By-law shall apply to such classes of trade as well as to all other trades and businesses.

8. Every such stable and every part of the premises on which such stables or other outbuildings are erected shall be kept in every respect in such manner as not to be a nuisance or annoyance to the owners or occupiers of adjoining premises or to the general public residing in the neighbourhood of such stables.

9. No person shall keep or place or allow to be kept or placed on any land within the boundaries of the City of Sandringham any bull for stud purposes unless such animal while accompanied by other cattle is confined within a structure approved by the Council.

10. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Five pounds and not exceeding the sum of Twenty pounds for each offence, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which the offence is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.

11. By-laws Numbers 95 and 128 are hereby repealed.

12. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of Sandringham.

### SHIRE OF GISBORNE.

#### BY-LAW No. 29.

A By-law of the Shire of Gisborne, made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts, and numbered 29, for the purpose of declaring streets or roads or parts thereof within the municipal district to be roads of limited access, and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946* and the *Local Government (Amendment) Act 1954*, and of every other power it

thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Gisborne order as follows:—

1. That streets or roads or parts thereof within the municipal district of the Shire of Gisborne, as set out in the Schedule to this By-law, are hereby declared to be roads of limited access.

2. No person shall, without the consent of the Council, provide any further facilities for vehicles to enter or leave any land which abuts on any such roads of limited access or parts thereof, as are set out in the said Schedule to this By-law, and to which reasonable alternative means of vehicular access are or can be made available.

3. No person shall enter or leave with a vehicle or permit any person to enter or leave with a vehicle any such land which abuts on any road of limited access, except by a passage in regular use before the commencement of this By-law or subsequently approved by Resolution of the Council.

4.
