# DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 33 OF THE LABOUR AND INDUSTRY ACT 1953.

I, Henry Norman Jones, Secretary for Labour and Industry, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Labour and Industry Acts, hereby make and issue the following adjusted Determination of the Wages Board referred to hereunder showing adjusted rates and prices to operate from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in May, 1956.

#### DISPENSARIES BOARD.

Clause 2 of the Determination made on the 28th February, 1956, and in force as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence on or after the 14th March, 1956, shall be replaced by the following clause:—

#### PROPORTION (IN ANY PLACE).

- (a) Unregistered Assistants.
  - One unrogistered assistant to every three or fraction of three Pharmaceutical Chemists receiving not less than £21 3s. 6d. per week.
- (b) Apprentices.
  - One apprentice to every three or fraction of three workers receiving not less than £21 3s. 6d. per week.
- (c) Juvenile Workers.

One juvenile worker (i.e., a shop assistant not engaged in dispensing or compounding medicines, drugs, or medicinal preparations, and who is under the age of 21 years) may be employed in any dispensary.

Clauses, other than clause 2, of the said Determination shall remain in force.
