


WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1946, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice published in the Government Guzette, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:


And whereas the Council of the City of Moorabbin has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been used for roads within the said City, be so declared to be public highways:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare that all those pieces of land, being parts of Crown portion 55 and of Dendy's Crown Special

Survey, Parish of Moorabbin, and being the lands indicatedby hachure on the plans hereunder, shall be public highways within the meaning of the said Acts.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation remove the periods of the close season set opposite the names of the under-mentioned birds in the Third Schedule to the Game Act 1928 by Proclamation made the thirteenth day of December, 1955, and published in the Government Gazette of the fourteenth day of December, 1955. and prescribe instead of such periods the periods specified hereunder which periods shall be the close season in respect of the birds so included in the Third Schedule aforesaid.

PROCLAMATION

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Act and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation revoke the Proclamation made the twentieth day of January, 1926, and published in the Government Gazette of the twenty-seventh day of January, 1926, respecting the prohibition of sale etc. of Quail, Wild ducks and Teal, and in lieu thereof prohibit the buying or selling or exposing for sale of—

Black Duck (Grey) Aras superciliosa

Black Duck (Grey) Anas superciliosa Hardhead (White-eyed Duck) Aythya australis Mountain Duck (Chestnut-breasted Shelduck) Casarca tadornoides

Wood Duck (Maned Goose) Chenonetta jubata Grey Teal Anas gibberifrons Quail Stubble Coturnix pectoralis

or the flesh, skin, feathers or other portion of such native game during the period in each year in which the killing or destroying of such native game is permitted by Proclamation made in accordance with the provisions of the Game Act 1928; and I do hereby prescribe a sum of not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) as the penalty for any breach of this Proclamation.

BY-LAW No. 70.

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts and pursuant to and in exercise and execution of any other powers and authorities in anywise enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and prescribe the following By-law for the control and governance of its employees, that is to say:—

- 1. By-law No. 22 passed by the Board on the 28th day of October, 1924, and gazetted on the 19th day of November, 1924, is hereby repealed as from the date of the coming into operation of this By-law.
- 2. This By-law shall apply to and affect all employees of the Board who are engaged in its Administrative, Technical and General Divisions.
- 3. All such employees are required to acquaint themselves with this By-law and with sections 39, and 41 to 45 (both inclusive) of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts and shall comply with and give effect to all instructions issued for their guidance in the performance of any duty entrusted to them.
- 4. The times of attendance for duty shall be determined by the Officers and Servants' Committee from time to time.
- 5. All employees excepting those who have been specially exempted shall record their times of arrival in the morning and departure in the evening and also their times of departure and return at the luncheon interval by automatic time registers or in attendance books. Such registers or books shall be in the custody or under the control of officers appointed by the Heads of Branches for that purpose.
- 6. Any employee who is required to sign an attendance book and who arrives after the determined time for arrival shall report to the appointed officer, who shall record the time of his arrival.
- 7. Every officer having the custody or control of automatic time registers or attendance books shall at the end of every month report to the Secretary through the Head of his Branch or Division any irregularity of attendance during the month on the part of employees under him. If any employee shall have been found to have been irregular in his attendance for more than three times during any one calendar month he shall be deemed guilty of a breach of these Regulations.

ABSENCE FROM DUTY

- 8. Any officer who is absent from duty during prescribed working hours without permission shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations.
- breach of these Regulations.

 9. Applications for leave of absence on the ground of illness shall be addressed to the Secretary and shall be supported by evidence satisfactory to the Board. When an employee is prevented by illness or other cause from attending his duties he must send notice to the Officer in Charge on the day he is absent. If the absence extends beyond two days a medical certificate shall be furnished, or if absences not covered by medical evidence exceed a period of five days in the aggregate in any calendar year a medical certificate may be required to cover each further absence. The medical certificate shall be accompanied by an application for leave of absence, which must be made within a reasonable period, if possible on the first day of absence.

No leave with pay shall be granted on account of illness or injury caused by misconduct or sustained whilst participating in professional sport or in outside activities for which remuneration is being received.

DUTIES OF EMPLOYEES

- 10. Any employee guilty of incivility or discourtesy in the course of his duties shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations.
- 11. Every employee shall obey promptly all instructions that may be given to him by the officer under whose immediate control or supervision he has been placed. If any employee should consider that he has ground for complaint arising out of such instructions or from any other cause he may lodge his complaint with his immediate superior officer, who shall forward such complaint to the Secretary.
- 12. No employee shall incur, or shall attempt to incur, any liability, or shall attempt to make any contract, on behalf of the Board without first having a general or specific authority to do so. The general conditions and

forms of specifications and of contracts which may from time to time be prescribed shall in all appropriate cases be strictly adhered to by all employees.

- 13. Officers in Charge shall be accountable at all times for the maintenance of good order and discipline and shall afford in all respects the utmost aid and support to the Head of the Branch or Division.
- 14. Except in the course of official duty, no information concerning the business of the Board shall be given by any employee directly or indirectly without express direction or permission.
- 15. An employee shall not, during any period in which he is on duty, indulge in alcoholic beverages or engage in any form of gambling.
- 16. Employees may be required to perform duty beyond the usual hours whenever it may be necessary to bring up arrears of work, or in any temporary pressure of business or other emergency.

TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES.

17. Reimbursement of travelling costs and personal expenses reasonably incurred shall be made when employees are required to travel in the course of their duties.

When an employee is required to travel on a special assignment involving absence from his home for more than one day, the authority of the Secretary therefor shall first be obtained, and also his approval to an estimated amount of expenditure to be incurred and in appropriate cases a cash advance to cover such estimated expenditure.

On the employee's return from his visit he shall submit, on the prescribed form, a detailed statement of his expenses, together with the requisite supporting receipts.

All cases wherein the Secretary considers that claims for reimbursement are not reasonable shall be submitted to the Officers and Servants' Committee for consideration and decision as to what amount of costs and/or expenses has been reasonably incurred and shall be subject to reimbursement.

RECEIPT AND DISBURSEMENT OF MONEYS.

18. All moneys of the Board received by an employee in the course of his duties shall be lodged as soon as possible to the credit of the appropriate bank account of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works in such bank as may be directed.

Employees shall not dispose of any such moneys otherwise than as herein directed.

- 19. When cheques are received they shall immediately be crossed and the words "by cheque" shall be written on the face of the receipt.
- 20. All cheques accepted by an employee in payment of accounts rendered by the Board should be drawn payable to the Board or its order.

Where an employee is tendered a cheque which is not so payable it shall be referred to the Officer in Charge, who, at his discretion, may direct acceptance of the cheque subject to such endorsement as is necessary by the person responsible for the payment of the account.

The practice of accepting chaques for a larger amount than is due and giving change is prohibited.

- 21. Receiving payment without giving a proper receipt or altering any receipt is expressly forbidden and shall be deemed an offence against this By-law.
- 22. Every employee receiving moneys in the course of his duty shall render to the Treasurer of the Board at such times as may be directed a detailed statement on the prescribed forms, supported by duplicate bank credit slips, for the amount of the payments. All duplicate bank credit slips are to be accompanied by the listing of the cheques.

MISCELLANEOUS.

- 23. Before any employee of the Board enters upon any office or employment by reason whereof he will or may be entrusted with the custody or control of money or any other property of the Board, the Board may require and take from him such security for the faithful execution of such office or employment and for duly accounting for all money or other property which may be entrusted to him by reason thereof, as it thinks sufficient. In all cases of security given to the Board, the expense of giving such security shall be borne by the person providing the security.
- 24. An employee shall be responsible for the careful use and preservation of all property of the Board in his custody or care and may be required to make good any article carelessly lost.

25. The application of any employee for promotion, leave of absence or upon any other matter affecting his position shall be made through the Head of his Branch or Division to the Secretary.

26. If an Officer in Charge is of the opinion that any employee under his direction is unfit to perform his duties properly by reason of indulgence in intoxicating liquor, he shall temporarily suspend him from duty and immediately report the matter through the Head of his Branch to the

27. Any employee who is reported as having acted in an insubordinate or improper manner in the discharge of his duties or in breach of these Regulations may be suspended by the Chairman or the Secretary pending such inquiry as may be authorized by the Officers and Servants' Committee.

28. During any period of suspension the employee's pay shall be withheld and shall be forfeited if the inquiry demonstrates that the suspension was justified. If the inquiry shows that the employee was not guilty of the charge for which he was suspended, he shall receive his pay for the period of his suspension.

29. Any employee proved upon inquiry to the satisfaction of the Officers and Servants' Committee to have committed a breach of these Regulations shall be liable

(a) a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20); or (b) suspension from duty pending the Board's dealing with the Committee's report upon the case; or (c) be dismissed or otherwise dealt with by the

Committee.

30. Where these By-laws and Regulations are inconsistent with the provisions of an Award of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration which prescribes working conditions for officers and servants of the Board, the provisions of the Award shall prevail.



TEACHING SERVICE (CLASSIFICATION, SALARIES AND ALLOWANCES) REGULATIONS.

AMENDMENT No. 175.

THE Teachers Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act* 1946, hereby amends the Teaching Service (Classification, Salaries and Allowances) Regulations in the manner following, that is to say:—

PART VI.—STUDENTS IN TRAINING.

In the proviso to paragraph (vii) of sub-clause 16 (a), for the expression "whose course included a four-year diploma" substitute the expression "whose course included a three-year or a four-year diploma".

PART XII.—ALLOWANCES.

- 7. Every fowlhouse or similar structure or any enclosed fowl run on any premises shall be-
 - (a) Distant at least 75 feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the building has a frontage.
 - (b) Distant at least 10 feet from any other street or

 - road of a greater width than 25 feet.

 (c) Distant at least 5 feet from any other street or road of a lesser width than 25 feet.

 (d) Distant at least 5 feet from the boundary of any
 - adjoining allotment of land.
 (e) Distant at least 40 feet from any dwelling whether on the same or adjoining land.
- 8. Every fowlhouse or similar structure in which poultry is kept shall be roofed with approved material and paved with approved impervious material, and the surface level of the floor shall be at least 3 inches above the level of the surrounding ground.
