## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim that the whole of the Elphinstone Waterworks District, the boundaries of which district are set out and described in an Order in Council bearing date the 19th June, 1956, constituting the said district, shall be and become an "Urban District" for the purposes of the said Acts, and shall be known as Elphinstone Urban District.

## MILK PASTEURIZATION ACT 1949.

### PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the *Milk Pasteurization Act 1949* (No. 5444) it is provided that a day be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* in relation to a prescribed district: And whereas the municipal districts of the Cities of Brighton, Oakleigh, Sandringham, Caulfield and Moorabbin have been prescribed as districts for the purposes of the said Act:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof,

do by this my Proclamation fix Monday the tenth day of September, 1956, as the day after which no person shall in the prescribed districts of the Cities of Brighton, Oakleigh, Sandringham, Caulfield and Moorabbin—

- (a) sell or deliver milk except milk pasteurized at licensed pasteurizing premises and bottled and sealed as prescribed; or
- (b) (in the case where the milk is sold and delivered at a shop for immediate consumption by a customer at the shop) sell or deliver milk except milk pasteurized at licensed pasteurizing premises.

GRAIN ELEVATORS BOARD.

BY-LAW AMENDING BY-LAW No. 16.

THE Grain Elevators Board, in the exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the Grain Elevators Acts, hereby, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council, makes the following By-law:—

By-law No. 26.

By-law No. 16, as amended by By-laws Nos. 18, 20, 21, 22, and 23, is hereby amended as follows:—

- (1) In section 57, sub-section (3) (c), for the amount of "£970" there shall be substituted the amount of "£1,030".
- (2) In section 57, sub-section (4), for the amount of "£1,300" there shall be substituted the amount of "£1,400".
- (3) In section 58, sub-section (1), the words "Provided that no such allowance shall be paid until the officer has served in that position for

an aggregate period of one month in the preceding twelve months" shall be deleted and the words "from the date of assignment" substituted therefor.

The amount of "£970" shall be deleted and the amount of "£1,030" substituted therefor.

The above amendment shall take effect as on and from 6th May, 1956.

*County Court Act 1928.*  
RULES OF THE COURT.

**WE**, the undersigned Judges of County Courts, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 87 of the *County Court Act 1928*, do hereby amend the County Court Rules 1930 as follows:—

1. (a) In the heading to Order XLIII. for the figures "1928" there shall be substituted the figures "1938."

(b) In Rule 1 of Order XLIII. for the words "under sub-section 1 of section 5 of the *Money Lenders Act 1928*" there shall be substituted the words "under sub-section 1 of section 28 of the *Money Lenders Act 1938*."

(c) In Rule 2 of Order XLIII. for the words "under sub-section 2 of section 5" there shall be substituted the words "under sub-section 3 of section 28."

2. The amendments made by paragraph 1 hereof, shall be deemed to have come into force on the 20th day of March, 1939.

3. (a) In Form 7 in the Schedule of Forms to Rules of Court, for the words "Two shillings and six pence" there shall be substituted the words "Five shillings", and for the words "One shilling" wherever occurring, there shall be substituted the words "Two shillings."

(b) In Form 8 in the said Schedule for the words "One shilling" wherever occurring there shall be substituted the words "Two shillings."

(c) In Form 11 (A) in the said Schedule, for the words "One shilling" there shall be substituted the words "Two shillings."

4. The amendments made by paragraph 3 hereof, shall be deemed to have come into force on the 19th day of March, 1956.

#### GEE LONG WATERWORKS AND SEWERAGE TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 88.

A By-law for Making and Levying the Rates for the Year Commencing on the First day of July, 1956.

GEE LONG Waterworks and Sewerage Trust (hereinafter called "the Trust"), in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on such Trust by the *Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Act 1928*, and of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling the said Trust in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law for the area supplied with water by the Geelong Water Supply Works or any extension of such works.

1. The following rates are hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said area and supplied with water for domestic and/or other purposes:—

- (a) On any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £14—Twenty shillings per annum.
- (b) On any such tenement the annual valuation whereof exceeds £14—One shilling and five pence in the pound of the amount of the annual valuation.
- (c) On any land on which there is no building the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £7—Ten shillings per annum.
- (d) On any such land on which there is no building the annual valuation whereof exceeds £7—One shilling and five pence in the pound of the amount of the annual valuation.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of July, 1956, and ending on the thirtieth day of June, 1957, and shall be payable on the tenth day of September, 1956.

3. Such persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, sue for and recover the said rates.

4. For making and levying such rates within the said area, the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district in which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes for such rate be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Acts by the Council of such municipality on the written application of the Trust as provided for in such case by the Water Acts.

Plans of all buildings proposed to be erected on the land shall be submitted to the Board for its consideration, and work shall not be commenced until approval is given.

The site shall not be used for the storage of any explosive combustible or inflammable materials unless and until an application has been submitted and consented to by the Board.

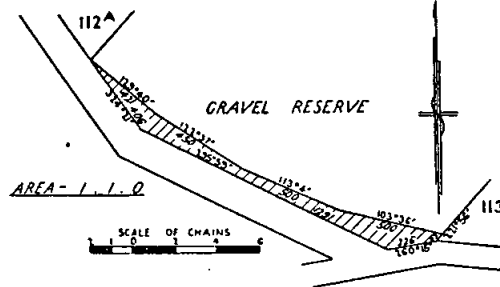

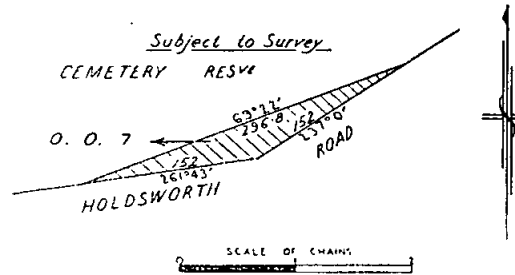

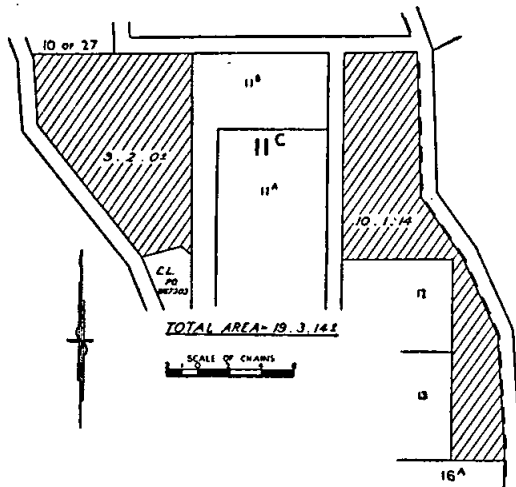

A By-law of the City of Ballaarat, made under the Local Government Acts, and numbered 143, for the purpose of amending By-law No. 107 of the City relating to Lake Wendouree, and for the purpose of controlling or limiting the use of boats on the lake during the rowing and canoeing events to be held there during the months of October, November, and December in the year 1956, under the management of the International Rowing Federation and the Organizing Committee of the XVI. Olympiad.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Ballaarat doth order as follows:—

1. This By-law may be cited as "the amending Lake Wendouree (Olympic Games) By-law" and shall be read and construed as one with By-law No. 107 of the City, and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.
