AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

#### PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

W HEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown Lands comprised in Classes 3 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

#### ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1956.

#### PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c. &c.

WHEREAS by the Road Traffic Act 1956 it is amongst other things enacted that Part II. of the said Act shall apply only in respect of infringements occurring in any area or circumstance specified for the purpose of such Part by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette and occurring after the date of such Proclamation:

And whereas it is also enacted in the said Act that any such Proclamation may provide that such Part of the said Act shall apply only in respect of parking infringements or in respect of traffic infringements or in any particular area or circumstance:

And whereas it is further enacted that no such Proclamation shall be made in relation to parking infringements unless the council of any municipality the municipal district or any part of the municipal district of which is specified therein has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such Part to such municipal district or part thereof:

And whereas the Council of the City of Collingwood has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such Part in respect only to parking infringements to the City of Collingwood:

Now therefore I. the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation specify the City of Collingwood as an area

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in which Part II. of the Road Traffic Act 1956 shall apply in respect only of parking infringements occurring after the date hereof.

CREATION OF A NEW URBAN FIRE DISTRICT IN THE TWENTY-FOURTH FIRE CONTROL REGION.

#### PROCLAMATION - -

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Depen-dencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation of the Governor in Council issued on the sixteenth day of November, 1954, and published in the Government Gazette of the seventeenth day of November, 1954, for the purposes of the Country Fire Authority Act 1944, certain parts of the country area of Victoria were proclaimed as fire control regions; and certain parts of such fire control regions were proclaimed to be urban fire districts; and the remainder (if any) of each such fire control region (being the area not included in any urban fire district) was proclaimed to be a rural district:

And whereas by section sixteen of the Country Fire Authority Act 1944 it is (amongst other things) enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after consideration of a report submitted by the Country Fire Authority by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, create any new urban fire district and amend or alter the boundaries of rural fire districts within any fire control region. control region:

And whereas the Country Fire Authority has submitted a report that it is necessary and desirable that the part of the Twenty-fourth Fire Control Region which is described in the Schedule hereto should be created an urban fire district and that a corresponding alteration of the boundaries of the rural fire district within the Twenty-fourth Fire Control Region should be made:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, after consideration of the said report of the Country Fire Authority, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Country Fire Authority Acts, do by this my Proclamation—

- (a) Create as a new urban fire district that part of the Twenty-fourth Fire Control Region which is described in the Schedule hereto; and
- (b) alter the boundaries of the rural fire district within the Twenty-fourth Fire Control Region to the extent rendered necessary by the excision of the part of such region which is described as aforesaid.

And whereas in pursuance of the provisions of the now recited Act the Governor in Council did, on 28th day of February, 1950, make such regulations for and in respect of the King River Improvement Trust, and did on 1st August, 1950, make General Regulations for the qualification, disqualification, election, appointment, removal and term of office of Commissioners which may be applied to any river improvement trust:

And whereas it is expedient that the said General Regulations made on 1st August, 1950, should be applied to the King River Improvement Trust:

Now therefore the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers thereunto enabling him, doth by this Order—

- (a) repeal the said Regulations made on 28th February, 1950, for and in respect of the King River Improvement Trust; and
- (b) make the following Regulations for and in respect of the qualification, disqualification, election, appointment, removal and term of office of Commissioners of the King River Improvement Trust.

#### 1. General Regulations to Apply.

The general Regulations, made on 1st August, 1950, in pursuance of the provisions of the Act, for the qualification, disqualification, election, appointment, removal, and term of office of Commissioners of River Improvement Trusts, published in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, dated 2nd August, 1950, with any subsequent amendments thereto, shall be read and construed as one with these Regulations.

2. Period for which Elected Commissioners shall Hold Office.

The period for which an elected Commissioner shall hold office shall be until the first Thursday in the month of November in the third year after the year of his election.

3. First Election under these Regulations.

Notwithstanding anything in Regulation 1 hereof the first election of Commissioners under these Regulations shall be held on the first Thursday in the month of November, 1956.

### 4. Date of Ordinary Election of Commissioners.

The ordinary election, other than the first election, of Commissioners under these Regulations shall be held on the first Thursday in the month of November in each triennial year succeeding the year 1956.

#### 5. Voters' List to be Prepared Annually.

For the purposes of any election, other than the first election, of Commissioners the Trust shall cause a list of voters to be prepared on or before the thirteenth day of September in each year, in like manner to that provided by section 117 of the Water Act 1928, as amended by section 2 of the Water Act 1936, in so far as circumstances will admit, which shall, upon the approval by the Commissioners under the common seal of the Trust, be the list of voters for any election of Commissioners for the twelve months then next ensuing.

WHEREAS by virtue of the powers conferred by the Slum Reclamation and Housing Act 1938 (No. 4568): a form has been prescribed in Government Gazette No. 160 of the 4th day of October 1944 relating to the execution of mortgages in favour of Housing Commission and whereas Housing Commission has deemed fit to vary the terms and conditions in the form so prescribed now therefore I the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this Order consent to the cancellation of the form prescribed as aforesaid and the prescription in lieu thereof of the form set out in the Schedule hereto.

#### MORTGAGE

(hereinafter called "the mortgagor") being registered as the proprietor of an estate in fee simple in the land hereinafter described subject to the encumbrances notified hereunder for the purpose of securing to Housing Commission incorporated by the provisions of the *Housing Act* 1937 of the State of Victoria (hereinafter called "the Commission" which expression shall where the context admits or requires be deemed to include its successors and transferees) pursuant to the provisions of Part III. of the said Act the sum of (hereinafter called "the principal sum") do hereby convenant with the Commission and declare and appoint as follows:—

- 1. The mortgagor will repay to the Commission the principal sum together with interest thereon at the rate of per centum per annum computed from the date hereof by monthly instalments of principal and interest combined of each on the first day of each month until the whole of the principal sum with interest as aforesaid shall have been paid the first of which instalments shall be paid on the expiration of one calendar month from the date hereof.
- 2. In addition to the provisions herein for the payment of interest, if any money due hereunder shall at any time be unpaid for fourteen days after the due date for payment thereof or if the time for making payment thereof is extended pursuant to section 19 of the Housing Act 1943 the mortgagor shall when so required by the Commission pay to it interest on the amount so unpaid or the amount the time for payment of which is so extended at the rate aforesaid from the date on which that amount was due or would have been due if the time for payment had not been so extended.
- 3. (1) On any date hereinbefore appointed for the payment of monthly instalments the mortgagor may (if he is not then in arrear with any payment hereunder) pay to the Commission that part of the principal sum then owing or any portion thereof being five pounds or a multiple of five pounds.
- (2) When portion only of that part of the principal sum then owing is so paid that payment shall not affect the payment of monthly instalments as aforesaid or the obligation of the mortgagor in respect thereof and the Commission shall place the amount from time to time so paid to the credit of the mortgagor in its books and shall credit the mortgagor with interest on the amount so paid at the same rate and calculated in the same manner as that which is payable by him on the principal sum provided that the Commission may in its discretion apply in manner provided by sub-clause (2) of clause 14 hereof any moneys standing to the credit of the mortgagor pursuant to this sub-clause.

- not later than five days before each premium becomes payable deposit with the Commission the receipt for the premium.
- (2) As to insurance as aforesaid effected through the Commission the purchaser shall as the Commission requires either—
  - (a) pay to it on each anniversary (occurring on or after the date hereof) of the date of the agreement whereby the mortgagor purchased the said land from the Commission a sum equal to the annual insurance premium from time to time charged to the Commission (herein called "the said premium"); or

All sums which the Commission pays or with which it debits the account of the mortgagor in consequence of any default by the mortgagor in the performance or observance of any covenant or agreement on the part of the mortgagor herein contained or implied (any such default being hereinafter included in the expression "default by the

mortgagor") shall from the date on which they were paid or debited respectively bear interest at the rate aforesaid and shall together with that interest be due and payable (unless payment is demanded on some other day) on the days hereinbefore appointed for payment of monthly instalments.


