PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF
THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 900 (2) of the *Local Government Act* 1946 provides—*inter alia*—that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the council of any municipality, not being a city or town, extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality, or any part thereof:

And whereas the Council of the Borough of Moe has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to the municipal district of such municipality:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this my proclamation, doth hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act* 1946 to the municipal district of the Borough of Moe, and order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the above-mentioned municipal district of the Borough of Moe on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 1st December, 1956, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make by-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter, and provided, further, that no such by-law shall come into operation before the 1st December, 1956.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1956.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Road Traffic Act 1956* it is amongst other things enacted that Part II. of the said Act shall apply only in respect of infringements occurring in any area or circumstance specified for the purpose of such Part by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* and occurring after the date of such Proclamation:

And whereas it is also enacted in the said Act that any such Proclamation may provide that such Part of the said Act shall apply only in respect of parking infringements or in respect of traffic infringements or in any particular area or circumstance:

And whereas it is further enacted that no such Proclamation shall be made in relation to parking infringements unless the Council of any municipality the municipal district or any part of the municipal district of which is specified therein has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such Part to such municipal district or part thereof:

And whereas the Council of the City of Kew has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such Part in respect only to parking infringements to the City of Kew:

Now therefore, I the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this my Proclamation specify the City of Kew as an area in which Part II. of the *Road Traffic Act 1956* shall apply in respect only of parking infringements occurring after the date hereof.

THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1928*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

1. The Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 8th August, 1956, approved by the Governor in Council on 4th September, 1956, and published in the *Government Gazette* on 17th September, 1956, are hereafter referred to as “ the Principal Regulations.”

2. Regulation No. 316 is amended by deleting the figures 0 10 0 opposite the words "Berth B" under the heading Appleton Dock and substituting therefor the figures £1 2 6 and by deleting the figures £1 7 6 opposite the words Berth No. 22 under the heading Victoria Dock and substituting therefor the figures £1 10 0.

3. Regulation No. 318 is amended by adding the following paragraph:—

(iii) Goods including foodstuffs and beverages for use in connexion with the XVIth Olympiad imported up to the 8th December, 1956, by overseas or interstate competitors (either as individuals or as a team) and their attendants, officers and members of the International Olympic Committees and International Sporting Federations and persons designated by those bodies to act in official capacities in the administration of the Games and representatives of foreign publications, news, photographic, broadcasting and television organizations, provided that any person or persons importing the goods as aforesaid is accredited by his or their country's Olympic Committee, shall be exempt from the payment of wharfage rates, subject to the following:—

(a) This exemption may be limited to such quantities as the Commissioners consider reasonable.

(b) Goods imported for use in connexion with the XVIth Olympiad as aforesaid which—

(i) are not used for that purpose, or

(ii) not being consumable goods are so used but are not exported by the 8th June, 1957, or

(iii) having been so used are sold within Australia,

shall be liable for payment of wharfage rates.

CASTLEMAINE SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

By-LAW No. 2 (TRADE WASTES).

THE Castlemaine Sewerage Authority, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Sewerage District Acts, doth hereby make the following By-law:—

1. This By-law is to be read and construed as one with By-law No. 1, duly passed by the Authority on the 1st day of October, 1936, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 21st day of December, 1936, and gazetted on the 23rd day of December, 1936.

2. The said By-law No. 1 is hereby amended as follows:—

For Division 9, section 24 (d) of the said By-law there shall be substituted the following clause:—

(d) All such liquid refuse or waste shall be passed through such settling, screening and/or neutralizing chambers and/or such other appliances and/or otherwise treated as ordered or approved by the Authority to ensure that the resulting effluents shall comply with the conditions as listed:—

1. The pH shall not be less than five (5) nor greater than ten (10).
2. Shall not contain more than ten (10) parts per million of the following gases:—
Hydrogen sulphide, sulphur dioxide, nitrous oxide, or any of the halogens.
3. Shall not contain any explosive substance.
4. Shall not contain any inflammable substance with a flash point lower than 187° Fahrenheit.
5. Shall not have a temperature higher than 140° Fahrenheit.
6. Shall not contain grease or oil or other substance that will solidify or become unduly viscous at temperatures between 32° and 140° Fahrenheit.
7. Shall not contain substances in suspension exceeding a daily average of 500 parts per million.
8. Shall not contain total solids in solution and suspension in excess of 20,000 parts per million or exceeding a daily average of 2,000 parts per million.
9. Shall not contain gases or vapours either free or occluded, in concentrations which are toxic or dangerous to humans or animals.
10. Shall not contain more than 100 parts per million of any antiseptic substance.
11. Shall not contain phenols in excess of 0.005 parts per million.
12. Shall not contain any toxic or irritating substance which will create conditions hazardous to public health and safety.
13. Shall not contain an excess of 100 parts per million or exceed a daily average of 25 parts per million of any grease or oil or oily substances.
14. Shall not contain cyanogen compounds capable of liberating hydrocyanic acid on acidification.
15. Shall not contain tar or tar oil.
16. Shall not contain carbide of calcium.
17. Shall not contain sulphides, hydrosulphides, and/or polysulphides.
18. Shall not contain carbon bisulphide.
19. Shall not consist of or contain condensing water or cooling water.
20. Shall not contain any radioactive substances.
21. Shall not contain mercury, copper or other metals with antiseptic action.

SHEPPARTON SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

BY-LAW No. 5.

THE Shepparton Sewerage Authority, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Sewerage Districts Acts and of any and every other power or authority in any wise enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and prescribe the following By-Law, that is to say:—

1. This By-Law is to be read and construed as one with By-Law No. 1, duly passed by the Authority on the 22nd day of March, 1937, and confirmed on the 7th day of June, 1937, approved by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of July, 1937, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 4th day of August, 1937.

2. Section 8 of Division 3 of Part 1 of the said By-Law No. 1 is hereby deleted and the following section 8 inserted in lieu thereof:—

Section 8—Copies of the Authority's plans and/or designs of individual house drainage will be furnished by the Authority upon application and payment for the same and subject to such conditions as follows:—

(a) Where an owner designs and carries out his own work—

(i) For the supply of a block plan, a fee of Seven shillings and six pence (7s. 6d.). For tenements exceeding 4,000 square feet in ground floor area and/or properties exceeding 2 acres in extent, an additional fee of Seven shillings and six pence (7s. 6d.) shall be charged for each additional 4,000 square feet, or part thereof, and/or for each additional 2 acres or part thereof.

(ii) The owner shall submit for examination a properly drawn design on tracing cloth or good quality paper and a typewritten specification. The design and specification shall be submitted to the Authority in triplicate. The work shall not proceed until the owner's design and specifications have been approved by the Engineer and third copy returned to him with the official endorsement.

(iii) For the examination of the owner's plan of design and specification, a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.) for each plan of from one to five fittings, plus Seven shillings and six pence (7s. 6d.) for every fitting over five.

(iv) For examining any alterations or additions to a plan previously issued or approved by the Engineer, a fee of Seven shillings and six pence (7s. 6d.) shall be made by the Authority for each fitting or drain altered or added.

- (v) For inspecting drains and testing by the Authority's inspector, a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.) plus Fifteen shillings (15s.) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.
- (vi) For inspecting plumbing by the Authority's inspector a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.) for each ten fittings, or part of ten fittings in the installation, plus Fifteen shillings (15s.) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.
- (vii) For the final inspection by the Authority's Engineer and charting work on the Authority's plans, a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.) for each ten fittings or part of ten fittings in the installation, plus Fifteen shillings (15s.) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.
- (viii) The Engineer may during construction of the work order the owner to carry out such additions and/or amendments as may be necessary for the satisfactory completion of the work. The house connexion will not be passed until the installation together with the amendments ordered have been completed to the Engineer's satisfaction.
- (b) When the Authority designs the works for the owner and the owner then carries out his own work—
- (i) For plan of design, a fee of Three pounds (£3) plus Seven shillings and six pence (7s. 6d.) for each fitting.
- (ii) For making and/or examining any alterations or additions to a plan previously issued or approved by the Engineer, a fee of Fifteen shillings (15s.) shall be made by the Authority for each fitting or drain altered or added.
- (iii) For inspecting drains and testing by the Authority's inspector, a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.), plus Fifteen shillings (15s.) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.
- (iv) For inspecting plumbing by the Authority's inspector, a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.) for each ten fittings or part of ten fittings in the installation, plus Fifteen shillings (15s.) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.
- (v) For the final inspection by the Authority's Engineer and charting the work on the Authority's plans, a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.) for each ten fittings or part of ten fittings in the installation, plus Fifteen shillings (15s.) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.
- (vi) The Engineer may during construction of the work, order the owner to carry out such additions and/or amendments as may be necessary for the satisfactory completion of the work. The house connexion will not be passed until the installation, together with the amendments ordered, have been completed to the Engineer's satisfaction.
- (c) Where the Authority designs the work and has same carried out for the owner, a charge shall be made equal to seven and a half per cent. (7½%) on the capital cost of the work for designing, specifying, letting contract, and supervising all details in connexion with such work. Consent for additions to and/or amendments of approved plans or to works previously approved will be made only on application of the owner or his authorized agent and on payment of a fee of Fifteen shillings (15s.).

THE GEELONG WATERWORKS AND SEWERAGE TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 89.

THE Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust (hereinafter called "The Trust"), pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Acts and the Water Acts and every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following By-Law:—

Clauses 2, 3, 4 and 9 of By-law No. 36 of the Trust as amended by By-law No. 84 and any other By-law shall be and the same are hereby repealed and in lieu thereof there shall be substituted the following:—

Maximum Allowance for Rated Premises.

2. Where any lands and tenements are rated by the Trust the owner or occupier thereof shall be supplied without further charge with a quantity of water determined by allowing 900 gallons for each £1 of the net annual value.

Charge for Excess Water.

Any water supplied in excess of the quantity so determined shall be paid for at the rate of One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons.

Water Supplied for Other than Rated Premises to be by Measure Only.

3. Where any owner or occupier of lands and tenements other than lands or tenements rated by the Trust, or any other person is supplied with water by the Trust, such water shall be supplied by measure only.

Charges for Water supplied by Measure.

4. (a) The amounts to be charged (subject to clause 5 of By-law No. 36 and to any provision to the contrary contained in the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust Acts or the Water Acts) shall be as follows:—

Shipping.

(i) To the Geelong Harbor Trust Commissioners for use in shipping other than shipping owned by the said Commissioners at the rate of Two shillings and six pence per 1,000 gallons.

Parks, Gardens, and Rockeries.

(ii) For parks (but excluding areas used as football or cricket ovals or sports grounds), gardens, and rockeries under municipal control at the rate of Six pence per 1,000 gallons.

Victorian Railways or Geelong Harbor Trust Commissioners.

- (iii) For the Victorian Railways Commissioners or the Geelong Harbor Trust Commissioners for the use of such Commissioners at the rate of Six pence per 1,000 gallons, as prescribed under section 52 of Act No. 3692.
- (iv) In all cases other than the foregoing at the rate of One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons.

Minimum Charges for Water Supplied by Measure.

(b) Where the owner of occupier of lands and tenements is supplied with water by measure under the preceding clause the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be the quantity determined by allowing 900 gallons for each £1 of the net annual value of the said land and tenements, the said net annual value to be ascertained in the same manner as the net annual value of lands and tenements rated by the Trust. Save as aforesaid, in every case where the supply is by measure the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, if charged for as provided by paragraph (iv) of the preceding sub-clause, would give a sum of Ten shillings for any continuous period of six months or portion of six months.

Nothing in this sub-clause shall affect the charges for the supply of water determined pursuant to paragraphs (i), (ii), and (iii) of the preceding sub-clause.

Allowance for Sanitary Flushing.

9. Every consumer of water who shall receive his supply of water through a meter, and shall pay for such supply by measure an amount exceeding the sum which he would be required to pay upon the rating of his premises, shall, in the calculation of such excess to be allowed 7,000 gallons of water per annum on account of each water closet on his premises, the supply of water for the flushing whereof shall pass through, and be recorded by such meter, provided always the total deduction allowed to any such consumer shall not in any case exceed 21,000 gallons in respect to such premises.

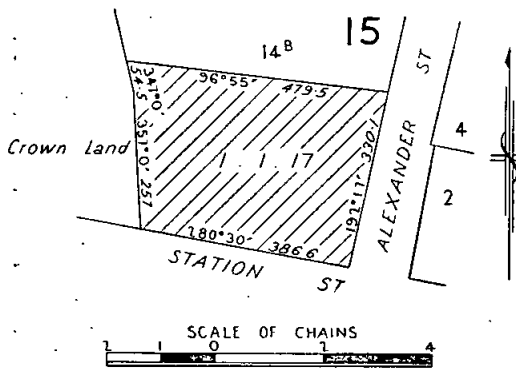

AMENDMENT OF COOKING TRADE APPRENTICESHIP REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby amend the Cooking Trade Apprenticeship Regulations, as follows, that is to say:—

(1) Regulation 8 shall be deleted and the following substituted therefor:—

"Minimum Rates of Wages of Apprentices.

8. The minimum weekly rates of wages to be paid to apprentices in the said trade as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in September, 1956, shall be the under-mentioned percentages of the minimum weekly rate of wages for 'Other first cooks or cook employed alone,' male or female, as the case may be, prescribed from time to time in the Determination of the Hotel and Restaurant Wages Board (Hotels and Wine Saloons Section):—

(a) In the term of apprenticeship of five years—

The total wages of apprentices shall be calculated to the nearest 6d., half or less than half of 6d. to be disregarded."

(2) Regulation 15 shall be deleted and the following substituted therefor:—

"Increased Rates of Pay for Proficiency.

15. When an apprentice attains in any year the standard of proficiency prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course, he shall—

- (1) for the first occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 4s. per week, in addition to the prescribed minimum weekly wage;
- (2) for the second occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 5s. per week, in addition to the prescribed minimum weekly wage;
- (3) for the third occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 6s. per week, in addition to the prescribed minimum weekly wage;
- (4) for the fourth occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 6s. per week, in addition to the prescribed minimum weekly wage."

(3) Regulation 16 shall be deleted and the following substituted therefor:—

"Payment of School Fees.

16. (1) The school fees of apprentices for attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction shall be paid by such apprentices, but on receipt by the employer of a report from the Commission that any such apprentice has secured during the period covered by the report a record of 100 per cent. of the possible attendances at the prescribed day classes and not less than 80 per cent. of the possible attendances at the prescribed evening classes, the employer shall refund to the apprentice the school fees paid by him for such period of instruction. Provided, however, that if such report states that the apprentice has, in the opinion of the Commission, failed to be diligent or has behaved in an indecorous manner while in attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction during such period, the employer shall not be required to make the refund as aforesaid.

(2) In cases where the apprentice is prevented from attendance at the said classes through illness or accident, or for other reasons accepted by the Commission, such occasions shall not be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid percentage; provided that the employer may require the apprentice to produce a medical certificate as proof of such illness or accident and in that case, if the apprentice fails to produce such certificate, such occasions shall be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid percentage.

(3) For the purposes of this Regulation, 'apprentices' means apprentices or probationers."

70. (1) The Authority shall pay the personal and travelling expenses actually incurred (not exceeding the limits fixed herein) by not more than twenty-one members of each of the governing bodies of the Urban Fire Brigades Association and of the Rural Fire Brigades Association respectively in relation to their attendance at not more than four meetings of the relevant association in any year.

(2) The maximum amount of personal and travelling expenses payable to any such member shall be—

- (a) where the place of meeting is more than fifteen miles from the usual place of residence of the member, personal expenses not exceeding One pound seventeen shillings and six pence for each day such member is necessarily absent from his usual place of residence but not exceeding Five pounds in respect of his attendance at any one meeting;
- (b) where travelling from the usual place of residence of a member to the place of meeting is necessary, an amount equal to first-class rail fare from the railway station nearest to the place of residence of such member to the railway station nearest to the place of meeting and return.

(3) The appropriate officer of each of the aforesaid governing bodies shall within seven days after the date of each of the meetings referred to in these Regulations deliver or post to the office of the Authority a claim in writing for personal and travelling expenses containing—

- (a) the date and place of the meeting, the names of the members who attended, and the place of residence of each such member;
- (b) the amount of the personal and travelling expenses actually incurred by each such member;
- (c) a certificate signed by the appropriate President (or Chairman) and Secretary that the claim is true and correct.

(4) The Secretary of each afore-mentioned governing body shall obtain an acquittance from each member to whom expenses are paid, and shall forward all such acquittances to the Authority within seven days after the date of such payment.

REGULATIONS.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by the *Road Traffic Act 1956*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Infringements) Regulations 1956 and shall come into operation upon the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

(2) All Regulations made under the Parking of Vehicles Acts are hereby revoked.

2. In these Regulations—

“Act” means the *Road Traffic Act 1956*.

“Infringement” means a parking infringement or a traffic infringement.

3. The person who detects any parking infringement shall at the time of detecting such parking infringement attach to the vehicle a notice headed with the name of the municipality or “Victoria Police”, as the case may be, and containing the words “Parking Infringement Reported”. Such notice shall be placed on the vehicle in a position which would be conspicuous to the driver.

4. The notice to accompany or to be written on any summons for an infringement, pursuant to sub-section (2) of section 12 of the Act, shall be in the form contained in the First Schedule to these Regulations, or to the like effect.

5. Where a defendant elects to defend a charge for an infringement, he shall forward to the informant and to the clerk of petty sessions at the court where the summons is returnable, a notice of election in the form contained in the First Schedule to these Regulations, or to the like effect.

6. A certificate signed, or purporting to be signed, by the Officer-in-Charge of the Motor Registration Branch or his deputy, pursuant to section 13 of the Act, shall be in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these Regulations, or to the like effect.

Take notice that the defendant in this summons may, by election in writing in the form attached hereto, deliver by post or otherwise to the informant and to the Clerk of Petty Sessions at not later than / / 19 , being 7 days before the return date stated in such summons a notice stating that he *elects to appear*.

Instructions.—If the defendant *elects to appear*, he should complete the Forms of Election below, detach and forward one copy to the informant and one copy to the Clerk of Petty Sessions at so as to reach them not later than / / 19 , being 7 days before the return date of the summons.

The following extracts from the Act are quoted for the information and guidance of the defendant:—

“11. (1) When any parking infringement occurs in relation to any vehicle the person who at the time of the occurrence of the infringement is the owner of the vehicle shall by virtue of this section be and be deemed to be guilty of an offence against the by-law rule or regulation concerned in all respects as if he were the actual offender guilty of the infringement unless the court is satisfied that the vehicle was a stolen vehicle or a vehicle illegally taken or used.

(2) Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this section shall affect the liability of the actual offender, but where the full amount of any penalty has been paid by the actual offender or owner in relation to any parking infringement no further penalty shall be imposed on or recovered from the owner or actual offender in relation thereto.

(3) (a) Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this section no owner of the vehicle shall by virtue of this section be guilty of an offence if—

(i) before or within fourteen days after the service on him of a summons in respect of the parking infringement concerned he supplies in a sworn statement in writing to the informant the name and address of the person who was in charge of the vehicle at the relevant time; or

(ii) he satisfies the court that he did not know and could not with reasonable diligence have ascertained such name and address.

(b) Any statement purporting to be made under sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (a) of this sub-section if produced in any proceedings against the person named therein and in respect of the parking infringement concerned shall be prima facie evidence that such person was in charge of the vehicle at all relevant times relating to such parking infringement.

12. (2) Any summons for an *infringement whether served by post or served personally may be served at least fourteen days before the time appointed therein for the hearing thereof and be accompanied by or have written thereon—

(a) a notice in the prescribed form advising the defendant that he may by election in writing in the prescribed form (copies of which form shall be attached to the notice) delivered by post or otherwise to the informant and also to the appropriate Clerk of Petty Sessions not later than the date specified in that behalf in the notice (being seven days before the time appointed for the hearing) elect to appear; and

(b) a sworn statement of the informant shortly describing the facts of the alleged infringement.

(3) If an election as aforesaid is received by both the informant and the Clerk of Petty Sessions on or before the date so specified in the notice the information shall proceed in the usual manner, and such election shall be evidence of due service of the summons notice forms and statement aforesaid.

(4) If such an election is not received by both the informant and the Clerk of Petty Sessions on or before the date so specified then notwithstanding anything in the Justices Acts or in any other Act a stipendiary magistrate in chambers on reading—

(a) such summons and sworn statement;

(b) an affidavit endorsed on the summons stating that a true copy of the summons accompanied by or having written thereon as aforesaid—

(i) a notice advising the defendant of his right of election;

(ii) the sworn statement of the informant; and

(iii) copies of the form of election—

was served personally or by post on the defendant and the time and place of such service or posting;

(c) if the case so requires, a sworn statement purporting to be made under sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (a) of sub-section (3) of the last preceding section that the defendant was in charge of the vehicle at the relevant time relating to the parking infringement concerned—

and without hearing any oral evidence except evidence (if any) tendered as to prior convictions of which prior notice has been given to the defendant may convict and impose a penalty on the defendant, but in any proceedings under this section it shall not be competent to impose a term of imprisonment or to cancel or suspend a driving licence or to declare a person disqualified from obtaining a licence; but if the stipendiary magistrate considers that it may be appropriate to consider the imposition of a term of imprisonment or the cancellation or suspension of a driving licence or disqualification from obtaining a licence he may adjourn the information to be heard in court in the usual manner at a time and place to be then appointed and the Clerk of Petty Sessions shall give due notice in writing thereof to the informant and defendant by post or otherwise.

(5) If the defendant has not elected to appear as aforesaid within the time so prescribed he shall not be allowed to make any defence to the information, but if the defendant or his solicitor attends the hearing in chambers the stipendiary magistrate may adjourn the information to be heard in court in the usual manner at a time and place to be then appointed and the Clerk of Petty Sessions shall give due notice in writing thereof to the informant and defendant by post or otherwise."

MOTOR RACING ON HIGHWAYS AT MILDURA.

WHEREAS it is enacted by sub-section (2) of section 80
 of the Motor Car Act 1951 that if a motor car is
 used on a highway for purposes of racing or of trial of
 speed the driver or the person in charge thereof shall be
 liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty pounds, pro-
 vided that the said sub-section (2) shall not apply to a
 motor car used as aforesaid on any highway or portion
 thereof specified by Order in Council published in the
Government Gazette and on such day and during such
 hours as are specified in the Order:

And whereas the Mildura and District Motor Cycle
 Club has requested that such an Order be made so as to
 enable motor cycle races to be conducted by the said
 club on certain portions of highways on Wednesday, the
 twenty-sixth day of December, 1956:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the
 State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive

the twenty-sixth day of December, 1956, between the

- (a) That all spectators view the race from outside
 the course.
- (b) That safety runs of at least 75 yards be erected
 at three points, viz., at the intersections of
 Sturt Highway and Oak-avenue, Sturt Highway
 and Dow-avenue, Oak-avenue and Smythe's-
 road, with customary straw baling precautions.
- (c) That all refreshments, cycle pits, &c., be outside
 the course.
- (d) That barriers be erected at points where safety

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "PENGUIN RESERVE" AT PHILLIP ISLAND.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been received under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Phillip Island temporarily reserved by Orders in Council of the 13th December, 1955, and 6th June, 1956, as sites for a Penguin Rookery both areas together known as the "Penguin Reserve at Phillip Island" hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve". The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management hereinafter referred to as the "Committee".

REGULATIONS.

1. The beach front of the Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to 6 p.m. After the hour of 6 p.m. an admission charge of One shilling will be made on all adults and children over the age of 14 years.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
3. No person shall damage or remove in any way the trees, shrubs, native growth, penguins, penguin burrows, penguin eggs, soil or sand from the Reserve.
4. No person shall light or use fires in the Reserve save in fireplaces which may be provided by the Committee of Management except by special leave or direction of the said Committee.
5. No person shall shoot, trap or destroy any birds or native game.
6. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep or other animals. The Committee shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (and with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.
7. No person shall camp on the Reserve or occupy any of the buildings thereon without having first obtained the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
8. No person shall erect in the Reserve any booth or other structure for the sale of any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No dogs shall be allowed within the Reserve.
10. No persons shall use flashlight cameras within the Reserve except in very special circumstances unless the permission of the Committee in writing, is first obtained. —(Rs.7419.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "NORADJUHA RECREATION RESERVE".

PRELIMINARY.

In Regulation 2 the expression "Part IV.—Automatic adjustment of Salaries and Wages in accordance with the variation in the cost of living. (R.82.)" is deleted.

PART IV.—AUTOMATIC ADJUSTMENT OF SALARIES AND WAGES IN ACCORDANCE WITH VARIATIONS IN THE COST OF LIVING. The whole of Part IV. is revoked.

PART III.—SALARIES INCREMENTS AND ALLOWANCES.

The proviso to sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 61 is revoked and the following proviso is substituted therefor:—

"Provided that where a rate assigned to any such office is a rate which is stated to be in accordance with a Commonwealth Award or a State Wages Board Determination, the amount of the basic wage portion of such rate shall be the basic wage rate which the officer occupying the office received on the 3rd November, 1956."

After Regulation 76 the heading "Employees" is deleted.

The first proviso to sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 77 is revoked and the following proviso is substituted therefor:—

"Provided that where a rate assigned to any such position is a rate which is stated to be in accordance with a Commonwealth Award or a State Wages Board Determination, the amount of the basic wage portion of such rate shall be the basic wage rate which the person occupying the position received on the 3rd November, 1956."

BY-LAW No. 121.

Requiring the Destruction of Noxious Weeds.

A By-law of the City of Williamstown made under section 197 (1) (x) of the *Local Government Act 1946*, as amended by section 10 (b) of the *Local Government (Amendment) Act 1954*, and numbered 121 for the purposes of—

(a) Requiring the destruction of noxious weeds; and

(b) providing that in the event of failure of any owner or occupier of any property or premises to comply with the requirements of this By-law, the Council may cause measures to be taken to destroy such weeds at the expense of the owner or occupier and recover the cost thereof as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of any and every other power enabling, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Williamstown order as follows:—

(1) The Council of the City of Williamstown may at any time cause to be served on the owner or occupier of any property or premises a notice, in writing, requiring such owner or occupier within a time limited by such notice to destroy all such noxious weeds as may be specified in such notice and which are upon such property or premises. Any such notice may be signed by the Town Clerk or any other duly authorized officer of the municipality.

(2) If any such owner or occupier shall within the time limited by such notice fail to comply with the requirements thereof, the Council may take such measures as may be reasonably necessary to destroy such noxious weeds at the expense of such owner or occupier and may recover the cost thereof from such owner or occupier as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

(3) In this By-law the words "noxious weeds" include the following weeds:—

Botanical Name; Common Name.

Rubus fruticosus, L.; Blackberry bramble.

Lycium ferocissimum; Miers boxthorn.

Ulex europaeus, L.; Furze.

Salpichroa rhomboidea, M.; Pampas Lily of the Valley.

Rosa rubiginosa, L.; Sweet briar.

Foeniculum vulgare; Mill, Fennel.

Hemeria collina; Vent, Cape Tulip.

Watsonia meriana; Mill, Merians Bugle Lily (Watsonia).

Lepidium drapa; Horay cress.

Marrubium vulgare; Horehound.

Sisymbrium officinalis; Hedge mustard.

Brassica Tournfortii; Wild turnip.

Raphanus raphanistrum; Wild radish.

Convolvulus aerubescens; Australian bindweed.

Convolvulus arvensis; Field bindweed.

(4) Notwithstanding any action taken under clause 2 of this by-law and apart from and in addition to any liability under that clause, any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable for every offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

(5) This by-law shall apply and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Williamstown.

SHIRE OF LOWAN.

BY-LAW No. 45.

A By-law of the Shire of Lowan, made under the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, and numbered 45, for determining, applying, dispensing with, or regulating such matters or things as are left to be determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council of the said Shire of Lowan, under the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, hereinafter called "the Regulations," and of every and any other power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Lowan order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 43 is hereby repealed.

Brick Areas.

2. The areas set out and described in the First Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as brick areas, and no person shall in any such area construct or cause to be constructed any building, or any stable, workshop, laundry, motor garage, sleep-out, or like out-building the external walls of which are of material other than brick, stone, or concrete, and this clause shall apply to any addition to or extension of existing buildings (other than dwellings) within the said brick areas not having external walls of brick, stone, or concrete.

Minimum Area, Depth, and Width of Frontage.

3. The minimum area, depth, and width of frontage specified in column 4 of Table 803 of the Regulations as amended are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth, and width of frontage of land on which a building of Class I. or Class II. occupancy shall be constructed throughout that portion of the municipal district to which the operation of the Regulations have been or shall hereafter be extended by proclamation.

Distance from Frontage.

4. (a) The minimum distance of the outer walls of any building from the frontage of any land is hereby specified as 20 feet.

(b) No person shall construct any building closer to the frontage of any land than 20 feet.

Rear Access.

5. In the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the Council and lodged with the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the Regulations, the requirements of clause 811 of the Regulations are hereby dispensed with.

Fowlhouses, Kennels, &c.

6. Fowlhouses, kennels, and similar structures may be constructed appurtenant to buildings of Classes I., II., III., and IV. occupancy provided that such structures—

(a) shall have a height not exceeding 8 feet and a total superficial area not exceeding 200 square feet, provided however that the Council may

- upon application in writing permit buildings of a larger size to be erected on sites having an area of not less than ¼ acre;
- (b) shall be distant not less than 75 feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the building has a frontage;
- (c) shall be distant not less than 10 feet from any other street or road of a greater width than 33 feet;
- (d) shall be distant not less than 5 feet from any other street or road of a width not exceeding 33 feet or from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land;
- (e) shall be distant not less than 30 feet from any dwelling whether on the same or any adjoining land;
- (f) shall be covered and roofed with a material approved by the Council's Building Surveyor.

Penalties.

7. Any person who shall be guilty of any wilful breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and, if such offence is continued, to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day such offence is continued.

PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF VICTORIA.

12th October, 1956.

I.—CORPORATION TRUSTEES.

1. The first members of the corporate body of trustees, which body is hereinafter called "The Corporation", shall be appointed by a Resolution of the General Assembly, in pursuance of section 3 of the said Act.

2. All future members of the Corporation shall be appointed by a Resolution of the General Assembly, of which due notice shall have been given.

3. All members of the Corporation shall hold office until death, or resignation, or removal by Resolution of the General Assembly.

4. The General Assembly may remove any member of the Corporation who shall cease to be a member or adherent of the Presbyterian Church of Victoria, or who shall leave Victoria and remain absent without leave for six months in succession, or who shall be absent without leave from six successive meetings of the Corporation, or who shall become incapable to act by reason of bodily or mental infirmity, or who shall become insolvent, or compound with his creditors, or who shall be guilty of any conduct rendering him, in the opinion of the said General Assembly, unfit to act as a trustee.

5. The General Assembly shall be the sole and final judge of the incapacity or unfitness to act of any trustee.

6. The number of members of the Corporation shall be not more than 16, nor less than 12, and vacancies shall be filled up at the meeting of the General Assembly, at which any trustee is removed, or the meeting next following the occurring of any vacancy by death, resignation, or removal.

7. The seal of the Corporation shall be kept in the custody of the Secretary of the Church, and there shall be two keys to the seal, one of which shall be kept by the Convenor of the Board of Investment and Finance of the Church, and the other by the said Secretary; and the seal shall be affixed to documents only in pursuance of a Resolution of the Corporation, or of a committee appointed by the Corporation from the trustees, with authority to act either specially or generally in the matter, of which committee three trustees shall form a

quorum, and the affixing thereof shall be verified by two of the trustees, the Law Agent of the Church (or in his absence a partner of his), and the Secretary of the Church (or in his absence the Acting Secretary). Provided that, if the affixing of the seal shall be duly verified as herein-before provided, such verification shall be sufficient evidence that the affixing thereof was duly authorized by a Resolution of the Corporation.

8. The Corporation shall appoint one of its members to be chairman, and two other of its members to be vice-chairman, and may at any time revoke such appointments. Meetings of the Corporation may be called at any time by or by the direction of the chairman, or, in his absence, by or by the direction of one of the vice-chairmen, and shall be called on a requisition by any three trustees.

9. Two days' notice of every meeting shall be given to the trustees.

10. Three trustees shall form a quorum at every such meeting.

II.—CONSENT OF MODERATOR TO DEALINGS WITH PROPERTY.

1. The consent of the Moderator to any transfer, conveyance, mortgage, exchange, or lease, under section 20, sub-section 1, of the said Act, shall not be given unless a Law Agent of the Church shall first approve thereof.

III.—TRUSTEES OF CONGREGATIONAL PROPERTY NOT VESTED IN THE CORPORATION.

1. Trustees of property not vested in the Corporation and not held under any Act of Parliament or deed containing any specific provision for the appointment and removal of trustees shall be appointed, and vacancies filled up as follows:—

2. The real property of each congregation is vested in trustees, whose powers and duties are defined in the Model Trust Deed. The number of trustees for any congregation is not less than three nor more than five. They are nominated by the congregation, who, at a meeting duly called for the purpose, select for the office the number of persons required, and transmit the list to the Presbytery of the Bounds, by whom the appointment is made. The parties nominated must all be members or adherents of the Presbyterian Church of Victoria, and free from Church scandal.

3. Trustees, after being nominated by the congregation, and before their appointment by the Presbytery, shall subscribe a declaration agreeing to hold the property in trust for the Presbyterian Church of Victoria conformably to such rules as the Assembly may determine. This declaration, when signed, is forwarded to the Clerk of Presbytery to be kept by him *in retentis*.

4. Trustees, after their appointment by the Presbytery, and immediately after the property is vested in them, are required to subscribe a further declaration acknowledging the jurisdiction of the Presbyterian Church of Victoria over the property entrusted to their charge. This declaration, on being subscribed by them, is forwarded to the General Secretary of the Church, by whom it is deposited with the other documents of the Church in the strong-room of the Assembly Hall.

5. Any such last-mentioned trustee may be removed by a Resolution of the Presbytery in which the property of which he is a trustee is situated, or of the General Assembly, on any of the following grounds:—

- (a) That he has been called upon to resign by the congregation for which he is a trustee, which call has been approved and confirmed by the Presbytery, and has refused or neglected to resign.
- (b) That he has ceased to be a member or adherent of the said congregation.
- (c) That he has removed his residence to a distance of 100 miles from the place of worship of the said congregation for at least twelve consecutive months.
- (d) That he has refused to exercise or execute any of the powers and authorities reposed in him as trustee when lawfully required so to do.
- (e) That he has disobeyed or neglected or refused to carry out any order, instruction, or decision of the General Assembly or the said Presbytery.
- (f) That he has been declared by the General Assembly to have been guilty of conduct unbecoming a trustee.
- (g) That the congregation for which he was a trustee has ceased to exist, within the meaning of the Model Trust Deeds as amended.

6. Upon the removal of all the existing trustees of a congregation which has ceased to exist as aforesaid, and upon the Moderator giving his certificate in writing that there are no trustees of the property of such congregation,

the Presbyterian Church of Victoria Trusts Corporation shall thereupon become the trustees thereof, and the property shall vest in it accordingly.

7. Any such trustee may resign his trust.

8. Notice of the appointment of every new trustee and of the removal of any trustee of Church property shall be sent to the Moderator by the Clerk of the Presbytery making the appointment, or removing such trustee, within one week after such appointment or removal.

9. Notice of the death or resignation of any trustee shall be sent to the Moderator of the Assembly and to the Clerk of the Presbytery by the Clerk of the Session, or the minister of the congregation to which such trustee belonged, within one week after such death or resignation becomes known to such clerk or minister.

IV.—TRUSTEES FOR METROPOLITAN PRESBYTERIES CHURCH EXTENSION BOARD.

1. (a) All property purchased by or on behalf of the Metropolitan Presbyteries Church Extension Board shall be vested in trustees appointed by the Board either for a special property or properties or generally for all properties so purchased.

(b) The number of trustees in whom any property is vested shall not be more than five nor less than three.

(c) The Board may remove any trustee appointed by it and appoint another in his place or in the place of any trustee who shall die or resign his office.

2. The trustees shall hold every property vested in them upon trust—

- (a) To hold and use same or permit the same to be used for such purposes as the Board may from time to time direct.
- (b) If so directed by the Board and on such terms as it may determine to transfer or convey any property to the Corporation or to trustees for a newly formed congregation.

1. Any property held for the purpose of any special work of the Church shall be vested either in the Corporation, or if the Corporation shall be unwilling to accept the same, then in trustees nominated by the governing body of the work and approved by the Presbytery of the Bounds wherein the property is situate.

2. Each trustee so approved and each trustee in whom any such property is already vested shall execute a declaration of trust setting out the trusts on which the property is to be or is now held by him.

3. The form of declaration of trust shall be prepared by or on behalf of such governing body as aforesaid and approved by the said Presbytery and may be varied from time to time in like manner.

VI.—TRUSTS AND BENEFACTIONS.

1. Any congregation, institution, or organization of the Church receiving a bequest, endowment, or other substantial benefaction, shall report it within a month to the Board of Investment and Finance with all relative documents on the matter.

2. The trustees of all administrative trusts shall send to the Board of Investment and Finance an annual report as to the fulfilment of trust conditions.
