WHEREAS by the *Road Traffic Act 1956* it is amongst other things enacted that Part II. of the said Act shall apply only in respect of infringements occurring in any area or circumstance specified for the purpose of such Part by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* and occurring after the date of such Proclamation:

And whereas it is also enacted in the said Act that any such Proclamation may provide that such Part of the said Act shall apply only in respect of parking infringements or in respect of traffic infringements or in any particular area or circumstance:

And whereas it is further enacted that no such Proclamation shall be made in relation to parking infringements unless the council of any municipality the municipal district or any part of the municipal district of which is specified therein has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such Part to such municipal district or part thereof:

And whereas the Council of the City of South Melbourne has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such Part in respect only of parking infringements to the City of South Melbourne:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this my Proclamation specify the City of South Melbourne as an area in which Part II. of the *Road Traffic Act 1956* shall apply in respect only of parking infringements occurring after the date hereof.

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this my Proclamation specify the City of Williamstown as an area in which Part II. of the *Road Traffic Act 1956* shall apply in respect only of parking infringements occurring after the date hereof.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW NO. 5136.—CHARGES FOR WATER.—PIMPINIO URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE WESTERN WIMMERA WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. This By-law shall have effect within the Pimpinio Urban District within the Western Wimmera Waterworks District.

2. The maximum quantity of water to be supplied per annum without further charge to properties rated by the Commission shall be the quantity which, if charged for at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, would give an amount equal to that payable per annum in respect of the properties so supplied under the provisions of any By-law of the Commission for making and levying rates.

3. For the supply of water by measure from the pipes of the Commission to lands and tenements within the Pimpinio Urban District which are not liable to any rate made under any By-law of the Commission the charge to be paid for water so supplied shall, except in cases of special agreements with the Commission, be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

4. For all water supplied per annum in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in clauses 2 and 3 of this By-law the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

Such charges shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission at Horsham.

5. The charge as set out in clause 3 of this By-law is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1956, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1957, and shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission at Horsham.

6. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said charges for water.

The foregoing By-law was made by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission on the 11th day of February, 1957, and the common seal of the said Commission was hereunder affixed the 1st day of March, 1957, in the presence of—

THE MURRAYVILLE ELECTRIC LIGHTING ORDER
No. 248—1941.—AMENDMENT TO TARIFF.

WHEREAS on the 26th day of August, 1941, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Walpeup (hereinafter called "the undertakers") were granted an Order in Council, under the *Electric Light and Power Act 1928*, cited as the Murrayville Electric Lighting Order No. 248—1941, authorizing the undertakers to supply electricity within the Township of Murrayville and environs commencing on the twenty-sixth day of August, 1941: And whereas by Orders dated 15th May, 1951, and 22nd December, 1953, the Governor in Council did approve of an amendment to vary the charges which may be charged for electricity supplied: And whereas the said undertakers have made application to have a further amendment made to vary the maximum rates which may be charged for electricity supplied: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, acting pursuant to the provisions of section 13 of the *Electric Light and Power Act 1928*, doth hereby vary the maximum rates set forth in the above-mentioned Order by substituting the following sections for Section 1, Section 3, and Section 4 of the Fourth Schedule thereto, that is to say:—

SECTION 1.

Where the undertakers charge any consumer by the electrical quantity supplied to him they shall be entitled to charge him at the following rates:—

For electricity supplied for any purpose—

One shilling and eight pence (1s. 8d.) per unit.

SECTION 3.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order the undertakers may charge any consumer a minimum charge of 10s. per month irrespective of whether the supply is used for lighting or other purposes. Such minimum charge shall be exclusive of meter rent.

SECTION 4.

Where the undertakers charge any consumer by a fixed periodical or service charge, and a further charge according to the amount of electricity supplied, they shall be entitled to charge him at the following rates:—

For electricity supplied for normal residential use for lighting, cooking, heating, or power—

A service charge of 2s. 6d. per month for every assessable* room which does not exceed 350 square feet in floor area, plus 2s. 6d. per month for every 350 square feet of floor area, or odd fraction thereof, of every assessable room in such premises whose floor area exceeds 350 square feet (but the service charge in respect of any one room shall not exceed 5s. per month) and, in addition, for any amount of electricity supplied, 1s. 8d. per unit; but (subject to the minimum monthly charge provided for in section 3 of this Schedule) the amount chargeable to any consumer under this method shall not be higher than a sum calculated at the rate of 1s. 8d. per unit used in any month.

* An assessable room is any room (whether lighted by electricity or not and other than those exempted below) used or erected for use as a dining-room, kitchen, bedroom, dressing-room, sunroom, ballroom, lounge, servery, library, billiard-room, sleepout, laboratory, dispensary, gymnasium, or the like, or any enclosed verandah or vestibule used for such purpose. The following are normally exempt in assessing service charges:—Passages, pantries, lobbies, bathrooms, lavatories, cellars, entrance halls, porches, garages, private workshops, sculleries, and wash-houses where not combined with kitchens, verandahs, and vestibules, unless such verandahs when enclosed or vestibules are used for the purposes stated above.

2. Provided that within that part of such residential area abutting to a depth of 200 feet on the north side of Church-street, Brighton, from the intersection of the east side of St. Andrew-street, Brighton, with the north side of Church-street aforesaid to the intersection of the west side of Carpenter-street, Brighton, with the north side of Church-street aforesaid the use of any land or the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building for the purposes of a petrol-filling station or garage or service station is hereby prohibited.

(c) By deleting from the Second Schedule thereto the words and figures—"Church-street south side from 100 feet north-westerly of Carpenter-street to 133 feet south-easterly of Male-street north side from 198 feet north-westerly from Carpenter-street to 66 feet south-easterly of Male-street" and inserting in lieu thereof the words and figures—"Church-street south side from the southerly corner of the intersection of Church-street and St. Andrew-street to 133 feet south-easterly of Male-street. THE Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby in pursuance of powers in that behalf conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946* and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf order as follows:—

1. In this By-law unless the context otherwise requires—

"Alignment" in relation to either side of a street or road means the line forming the boundary between the street or road and the lands abutting on that side of the street or road and in relation to a splayed corner of two streets or roads means the line forming the boundary between the splayed corner and the lands abutting thereon.

"Horse" includes any draught animal or beast of burden.

"Intersection" means the area of roadway commencing at the point where the western alignment of Chetwynd-street meets the southern alignment of Arden-street and bounded by the said southern alignment of Arden-street westward to the point where it meets the prolongation south-westward of the alignment of the splayed corner of Arden-street and Courtney-street, thence by the alignment of the said splayed corner and its prolongations south-westward and north-eastward to the north-eastern alignment of Courtney-street, thence by the said north-eastern alignment of Courtney-street and its intervening prolongation across Wreckyn-street south-eastward to the point where it meets the prolongation eastward of the said southern alignment of Arden-street and thence by the said prolongation of the southern alignment of Arden-street westward to the commencing point.

"Island" means any raised paving, safety zone, place of refuge or other works or structures wholly or partly within the intersection and erected for protecting pedestrians or regulating traffic. (Explanatory diagram is shown in the Schedule to this By-law.)

"Central island" means the ring-shaped island centrally situated in the intersection. (Explanatory diagram is shown in the Schedule to this By-law.)

"Vehicle" includes any conveyance (other than a tramcar) drawn or propelled by human animal mechanical electrical or other power and includes a motor car.

Words importing the masculine gender include females and words in the singular include the plural and words in the plural include the singular.

2. Every vehicle or horse passing through the intersection shall proceed so as to keep on its right or off side—

(a) the triangular island situate nearest to the point of entry by such vehicle or horse into the intersection;

(b) the central island, and

(c) the triangular island situate nearest to the point of departure by such vehicle or horse from the intersection—

and on its left or near side any other island it passes while in the intersection.

3. Any person in charge of any vehicle or horse who causes that vehicle or horse to proceed in contravention of this By-law whether wilfully or not except by express direction or permission of a police constable or an officer of the Council shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
