AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwalth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by anction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 3 and 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

And whereas it is also enacted in the said Act that any such Proclamation may provide that such Part of the said Act shall apply only in respect of parking infringements or in respect of traffic infringements or in any particular area or circumstance:

And whereas it is further enacted that no such Froclamation shall be made in relation to parking infringements unless the council of any municipality the municipal district or any part of the municipal district or which is specified therein has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such Part to such municipal district or part thereof:

And whereas the Council of the City of St. Kilda has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such Part in respect only of parking infringements to the City of St. Kilda:

Now therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this my Proclamation specify the City of St. Kilda as an area in which Part II. of the Road Traffic Act 1956 shall apply in respect only of parking infringements occurring after the date hereof.

SHIRE OF TUNGAMAH WATERWORKS TRUST. RATING BY-LAW FOR 1957 IN THE RURAL DISTRICT OF TUNGAMAH.

(By-law No. 236.)

THE Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for stock and domestic purposes of Six pence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Tungamah Rural District.







REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "PUBLIC (ST. VINCENT) GARDENS RESERVE," SOUTH MELBOURNE.

GARDENS RESERVE," SOUTH MELBOURNE.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928 as reenacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is
given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under
the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and
which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees,
and for the further purpose as enacted:

Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred aforesaid, doth hereby
make the following Regulations in respect of the land
in the City of South Melbourne temporarily reserved by
Order in Council of the 22nd May, 1956, as a site for
Public Park and Public Recreation and known as "St.
Vincent Gardens Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the
"Gardens."

REGULATIONS.

- 1. In these Regulations the expression "the Committee " shall mean the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Gardens.
- ment of the Gardens.

 2. The Gardens shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset on every day of the year, except on such days as the Committee may set the Gardens or portion of the Gardens apart for bowling or tennis matches or other games, fêtes, musical performances, or outdoor gatherings on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Ten shillings (10s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of each adult person and a sum not exceeding Five shillings (5s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of each child.
- taken for the admission of each child.

 3. No person shall be permitted to enter any of the buildings the property of the Committee in the Gardens on days on which fees for admission are being charged without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and no person other than the players, performers or competitors, shall enter into or upon or remain in or upon any room, building, structure, enclosure or area set apart for players, performers or competitors at any such games, shows, fête, entertainments or competitions, or for any exhibits, exhibitions or performances at any such games, shows, fêtes, entertainments or competitions, and no person shall at any time enter into or upon any building or structure set apart by the Committee for use by a sporting body or other organization.

- 4. No person, except members of the Committee or its officers or employees duly authorized in that behalf, shall enter any part of the Gardens when a charge for admission is made without payment of the fee chargeable for admission.
- 5. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Gardens to any club, association, or person for the purpose of holding fêtes, entertainments, musical performances, or for the playing of bowls, tennis or other physical recreation, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms and conditions as it may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club association or person to make a charge rize any club, association or person to make a charge for admission to the Gardens or such portion of the Gardens as hereinbefore provided.
- 6. No club or association of any kind, having for its 6. No club or association of any kind, having for its object physical recreation, or any member or members of any club or association, or any person, shall play, practice or engage in any game or sport within the Gardens without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, unless such person is at the time of playing a member of any club or association which is duly authorized to play such game or sport within the Gardens or in such portion of the Gardens at such time, or is a member of a visiting club or association playing against members of any club or association duly authorized as aforesaid.
 - 7. No person shall-
 - (a) enter or remain in the Gardens who may offend (a) enter or remain in the Gardens who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner or create or take part in any disturbance;
 (b) enter or remain in the Gardens whilst in a state of intoxication;
 (c) use indecent or offensive language in the Gardens

 - dens:
 - (c) use indecent or offensive language in the Gardens;
 (d) obstruct, hinder or interfere with any person employed in the Gardens or disturb, interrupt or annoy any other person therein;
 (e) enter, cross, be on or trespass on any bowling green, tennis court, area, enclosure, or any building, room, or any part thereof, whilst any games, sports, fétes, entertainments or musical performances are being played, carried on, or conducted, or at any time between the commencement and conclusion of such events, except as provided in these Regulations;
 (f) interfere with or interrupt any games, sports, fétes, entertainments or musical performances;
 (g) obtain or attempt to obtain permission to enter any part of the Gardens when not entitled to admission under these Regulations;
 (h) interfere with, break, or damage in any way whatsoever any of the grassed lawns, greens, courts, trees, shrubs or plants, or pluck flowers, or walk on the beds or borders in the Gardens;
 (i) climb or jump over any of the trees gates

 - dens;
 - (i) climb or jump over any of the trees, gates, passageways, barriers, railings or fences or other structures in the Gardens, or lie on any
 - other structures in the Gardens, or lie on any seat or other structure in an objectionable manner, or cut names, letters or marks on any seat, roof, gate, post or fence or other structure or write thereon in the Gardens;

 (j) post, stick, paint or otherwise affix or mark any advertisement, bill, placard, or other notice therein, or on any structure, erection, rock, tree, fence or anything in or around the Gardens, or give out or distribute any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets or papers in the Gardens;

 (k) remove, deface, or damage any notice board, structure or fittings in the Gardens;

 (l) throw any stones, earth or sand or other missiles or light any fire or commit any nuisance in the Gardens or in any property therein;

 (m) spit on the paths or in any structure or any part of the Gardens whatsoever;

 (n) leave or deposit or cause to be left or deposited any class bottle paper full road littered.

 - (n) leave or deposit or cause to be left or deposited any glass, bottle, paper, fruit, peel, litter or rubbish or refuse of any kind in the Gardens,
 - except in the receptacles provided by the Committee for such purpose;

 (o) ride or drive any animal, bicycle or other vehicle on any path or in any part of the Cardons.
 - vehicle on any path or in any part of the Gardens;

 (p) gamble or bet publicly in any part of the Gardens, and any person infringing this Regulation shall be liable in addition to any other penalty, to expulsion from the Gardens;

 (q) cause or suffer any dog or other animal belonging to him or in his charge to enter or remain in the Gardens.

- 8. No person while in the Gardens shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee being first had and obtained-
 - (a) hawk, sell, offer for sale, or advertise for sale, any article of food or drink, goods, wares or merchandise;
 - (b) erect any building, tent, structure, or obstruc tion, in any part of the Gardens, and then only under such conditions as may be determined by the Committee;

 - (c) bring any intoxicating liquor into the Gardens; (d) solicit or gather money or other thing; (e) take part in any public entertainment of any
 - sort:
 - (f) take part in any public meeting, assembly for public worship, preach, declaim, harangue, or deliver any address or public speaking of any kind:
 - (g) carry, use or discharge any fireworks, firearms, air gun, or other lethal weapon.
- 9. No person shall use the sanitary conveniences or structures in the Gardens or any part of the same, for any purpose other than that for which the same are constructed, and shall then use only such portion of such structure as are specially constructed for the purpose.
- 10. No person shall use any of the sanitary conveniences in the Gardens whilst suffering from any cutaneous, infectious or contagious disease.
- 11. No male person, other than a boy under the age of six (6) years, shall enter or use any place, room or building set apart for the use of females, and no female person shall enter or use any place, room or building set apart for the use of males.
- 12. The Committee may set apart a portion of the Gardens as and for a Children's Playground.
- 13. No person above the age of fourteen (14) years shall enter upon the children's playground or play on the swings or other appliances set apart for the use of children, provided that parents and others in charge of children shall be at liberty to enter the playground to watch over the children who are in their charge.
- 14. The Committee shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of swings or other appliances, or from any cause howsoever arising within the Gardens.
- 15. The Committee may withdraw, cancel or annul any permit or consent for the occupation of any site within the Gardens.
- 16. No person shall remain in the Gardens or on any property therein at any time when lawfully directed by an officer or employee of the Committee, or by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any member of the Police Force, to leave the same.
- 17. Every person who shall infringe any of these Regulations for the management of the Gardens may be removed therefrom, or from any property therein, or directed to forthwith leave the Gardens or such property therein by any officer or employee of the Committee, or by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, and such person shall, in addition, be liable to prosecution as provided by law.—(Rs.2033.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of the section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as renacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE GROVEDALE PARK, RECREATION AND PUBLIC HALL RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regula-tions in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the

Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the remainder of the land in the Parish of in respect of the remainder of the land in the Parish of Conewarre temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 4th August, 1873, as a site for a Park and Recreation purposes known as the "Grovedale Park Recreation and Public Hall Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve." The Reserve has been placed under the control of a committee of management hereinafter referred to as the "Committee."

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
 - 2. No person shall-
 - (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication and who may offend againt decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
 - (b) Offer any article of food or drink or any other commodity whatsoever for sale, or bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
 - (c) Interfere with, break or damage in any way any of the trees, shrubs or plants, or pluck any of the flowers, or walk on the beds or borders in the Reserve.
 - (d) Leave or deposit any bottles, broken glass, paper,
 - refuse, or rubbish whatever in the Reserve.
 (e) Light a fire in the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee.
 - (f) Carry or discharge any firearms or air guns in the Reserve, or shoot, snare, or destroy any game or birds therein, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

 (g) Bet publicly in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee.
 - of the Committee.
 - (h) Erect any building, tent or structure, or camp on any portion of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained,

 - in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and then only under such conditions as may be determined by the said Committee.

 (i) Do anything whatever in the Reserve for the purpose of making money without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

 (j) Remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by an officer or employee of the Committee to leave the same.
- 3. No person or persons, club or clubs, association or associations, of any kind shall play, practice, train or engage in any game or sport on Sundays or Good Fridays.
- 4. The Committee shall have the power to let the Reserve or any portion thereof to any club or association for the purpose of playing such sport as approved by the Committee, subject to the payment of such rent and/or fees, and on such terms and conditions as it may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.
- 5. The Committee shall have power to let the Grovedale United Services Memorial Hall to a Committee elected from subscribers to the hall, which must be open to all residents of Grovedale, subject to the payment of such rent and on such conditions as it may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.
- 6. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association or person for the purpose of holding fêtes, entertainments, musical performances, shows or sports, or for athletic training or other physical recreation, subject to the payment of such rent and/or fees and on such terms and conditions as it may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regula-
- 7. The fee which may be charged for admission to the C. The fee which may be charged for admission to the Reserve or to any specified part or parts thereof (excluding the Grovedale United Services Memorial Hall) on such days not exceeding twelve (12) days in any one year, shall be such sum as the Committee and the person or club or association may agree, or in default of such agreement then as shall be determined by the Committee. but in no case shall an amount exceeding Five shillings per person be so fixed.
- 8. No club or association of any kind, having for its 8. No club or association of any kind, having for its object physical recreation, or any member or members of any club or association, nor any other person, shall play, practice, train or engage, in any game or sport or athletic exercise within the Reserve without the permission of the Committee being first obtained, unless such person is at the time of playing a member of any club which is duly authorized to play on the Reserve.

- 9. No person except the Committee or its officers and employees on duty shall enter any part of the Reserve when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.
- 10. No person shall enter any building on the Reserve without the permission of the Committee, and any person having entered such building without such permission shall leave the same on being requested so to do by any member of the Committee, or by a police constable or Crown Lands bailiff.
- 11. No person or persons, club or clubs, association or associations, shall play any illegal game on the Reserve or in any building on the Reserve.
- 12. Persons renting or hiring the Reserve and using stands, buildings, erections or enclosures on such occasion, may be required to deposit with the Committee any sum not exceeding £20, which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stands, buildings, erections or enclosures and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may repair or make good any damage or injury sustained by such stands, buildings, erections or enclosures, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee.—(Rs.1367.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any balliff or member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such balliff or member of the police force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "VICTORY PARK" RESERVE, SHEPPARTON.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Shepparton temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 26th February, 1957, as a site for Public Recreation, and known as the "Victory Park" Reserve, Shepparton, hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve." - The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee."

REGULATIONS

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding fifty-two in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.
 - 2. No person shall-
 - (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or may behave in a disorderly or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance or enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
 - (b) Exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve or any part thereof without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- 3. The Committee shall have power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.

- 4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.
- 5. No person, except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without having paid the fees charged for such admission.
- 6. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle or motor cycle in the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee, who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Two shillings for each vehicle.
- 7. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 8. No person shall play, practise or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve at any time without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 9. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasion of any sports, fêtes or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring the Reserve shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.
- 10. No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants or shrubs or pluck any flowers, or climb, jump or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats or other structures therein or roll or throw stones or other missiles or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats or other structures therein.
- 11. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee.
- 12. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 13. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord without the permission of the Committee first obtained.
- 14. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 15. No person shall play, practice or engage in any sport, including tennis, cricket, hockey, or any other games, or foot racing, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose and then only with the permission of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the Committee may determine.
- 16. No person shall enter the Reserve, or pass over the playing area or oval, with any vehicle, or on horseback, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, nor ride nor drive amongst or to the danger of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve, and no person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 17. No person, club or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.
- 18. No person shall remove any earth from the Reserve. —(Rs.1180.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "LAKES ENTRANCE CHILDREN'S PLAYGROUND" RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make, Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees. under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in Township of Lakes Entrance temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 26th February, 1957, as a site for a Children's Playground, and known as the "Lakes Entrance Children's Playground Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve." The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management hereinafter referred to as the "Committee."

REGULATIONS.

- 1. No person above the age of fourteen years shall use the Children's Playground or use any of the swings or other appliances erected thereon. Provided, however, that parents or others in charge of children shall be at liberty to enter the playground to watch over children who are in their charge.
- 2. The swings or other appliances erected in the play-ground shall not be used by the same child or children for a longer period than five minutes if any other child or children is or are waiting to use them.
- 3. No child shall use any of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Playground except for the purposes for which they are respectively provided.
- 4. All papers, fruit peel, and other litter shall be placed in the basket or bins provided by the Committee for the purpose.
- 5. Every person in the Children's Playground shall obey the directions of any officer of the Committee in respect of his or her conduct therein.
- 6. The Committee shall not be responsible for any accident or injury arising from the use of any of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Playground.
- 7. Any bailiff of Crown lands, member of the Police Force, or duly appointed officer or servant of the Committee shall have the right (in addition to any other penalty provided under these Regulations) to remove or exclude from the Children's Playground any person who commits a breach of these Regulations, or who wilfully damages any of the swings or other appliances or property in the Children's Playground.
- 8. No person shall ride or drive any bicycle in any part of the Children's Playground.
- 9. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.
- 10. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or other conduct.
- 11. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, lawns, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 12. No person shall climb or jump over the gates in or around the Reserve, nor stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, erections, gates, fences, seats, or trees, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
 - 13. No person shall camp in the Reserve.
- 14. No person shall erect therein any structure without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

- 15. No person shall offer for sale within the Reserve any article or articles without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 16. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 17. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
- 18. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate, or tablet, or any support, fastening, or fitting used or constructed or adapted to be used for the exhibition of any regulation or notice, and fixed or set by the Committee in the Reserve.
- 19. No person shall affix, print, post, paint, cut, or mark any advertisement, sign, picture, bill, placard, notice, words, letters, or figures to or upon any wall or fence in or enclosing the Reserve, or to or upon any tree, building, barrier, railing, seat, structure, erection, flagging, or path in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee.
- 20. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for the plantation of young trees or shrubs.— (Rs.7551.)
