PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 900 (2) of the *Local Government Act 1946* provides—*inter alia*—that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the council of any municipality, not being a city or town, extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of the 27th August, 1952, the operation of the Uniform Building Regulations was extended to part of the municipal district of the Shire of Tambo:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Tambo has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to a further part of the municipal district of such municipality:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act 1946* to the Township of East Cunninghame in the municipal district of the Shire of Tambo and order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in such part of the municipal district of the Shire of Tambo on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 16th September, 1957, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make by-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter, and provided, further, that no such by-law shall come into operation before the 16th September, 1957.

RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Supreme Court Acts and all other powers hereunto enabling the following amendments to Chapter 1 of the Rules of the Supreme Court are made and shall take effect from the first day of August, 1957:—

1. For Rules 16 and 16A of Order XLII. there shall be substituted the following Rules:—

16. Every writ of execution for the recovery of money shall be endorsed with a direction to the Sheriff (or other officer or person to whom the writ is directed) to levy—

- (a) the amount really due and payable and sought to be recovered under the judgment or order stating, the total amount, the amount exclusive of taxed costs and the amount of any taxed costs; and
- (b) interest at the rate of £8 per cent. per annum (or such other rate as may have been agreed upon by the parties) calculated from the date of judgment or order on the amount thereof exclusive of taxed costs and from the date of the Taxing Master's certificate of costs or such other date as the Court or a Judge has ordered on the amount of any taxed costs.

16A. Every writ of *fi fa* shall be endorsed as follows:—

“Levy £ (being £ due and payable exclusive of taxed costs and £ for taxed costs) and £ for costs of execution and also interest at 8 per cent. per annum (or other agreed rate) on £ (amount of judgment or order exclusive of taxed costs) from the day of (date of judgment or order) and on £ (amount of taxed costs) from the day of (date of Taxing Master's certificate or other date ordered by the Court or a Judge) till payment, plus Sheriff's poundage, officer's fees, cost of levying, the fees, expenses and costs mentioned in Order XLII. Rule 15A if and when incurred, and all other legal incidental expenses.”

2. For the note to Form I. of Appendix H there shall be substituted the following note:—

“Date of judgment or order, date of Taxing Master's certificate of costs or other date ordered by the Court or a Judge, as the case may be.”

3. At the end of Rule 2 of Order LXVII. there shall be inserted the following expression “or if posted in a prepaid registered envelope addressed to the person to be served at such address for service as aforesaid: provided that where service under this Rule is made by registered post, the time at which the document so posted would be delivered in the ordinary course of post shall be considered as the time of service thereof.”

County Court Act 1928.

RULES OF COURT.

WE, the undersigned Judges of County Courts, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 87 of the County Court Act 1928 do hereby amend the County Court Rules 1930 as follows:—

1. In Order XII. the following Rule shall be added:—

“ 5. (1) Where, in any action in which damages are claimed against an alleged tortfeasor, a defendant takes proceedings (in this rule referred to as “contribution proceedings”) to recover contribution or indemnity pursuant to section 2 of the *Wrongs (Tortfeasors) Act 1949*, against any person, whether a defendant to the action or not, any party to the contribution proceedings may at any time serve upon the other party or all of the other parties (if more than one) to the contribution proceedings a notice in writing stating his willingness—

(a) that liability to the plaintiff shall be admitted by all parties to the contribution proceedings who are defendants in the action; and

(b) himself to pay a proportion, specified in the notice, of whatever damages and costs the plaintiff may recover in the action.

In such notice he may in addition, if he so desires, state his willingness to contribute in the said proportion towards a specified total sum to be paid into Court with an admission of liability by a defendant to be named in such notice.

(2) (a) Subject to paragraphs (b), (c) and (d) of this sub-rule, any such notice, whether or not it is expressed to be without prejudice, shall stand in the same position as regards admissibility in evidence in any proceedings as if it were an offer of settlement expressed to be without prejudice;

(b) No communication or disclosure of the contents of any such notice or of the fact that a notice has been served under this Rule shall be made either to the Judge or to the Jury at the trial of the action or the contribution proceedings until all issues in the action and in such proceedings have been determined;

(c) After all such issues have been determined any party may prove the service of any such notice and the Judge may thereupon, in exercising his discretion as to costs as between the party serving the notice and the party or parties served, take into account the service and contents of the notice provided that he is satisfied that the party serving it was in fact at all material times willing and able to carry out his part of what was proposed therein;

(d) The costs referred to in paragraph (c) shall include costs recoverable by the plaintiff against any party to the contribution proceedings, as well as costs incurred in defending the action and in the contribution proceedings but shall not include the costs incurred by any party in relation to the issue of damages in the action unless the party serving the notice shall have signified in the manner aforesaid his willingness to contribute towards the payment into Court of a total sum not less than the damages adjudged to be paid and the contribution by him as so proposed is not less than the amount which he is bound by order or agreement to contribute towards those damages.

(3) (a) Where any sum is paid into Court by one of two or more defendants either in conformity with, or under an agreement or arrangement arising out of, a notice given pursuant to this Rule the notice of payment given under Order XVII. shall state this fact and the name and address for service of each party to the contribution proceedings (not being a defendant to the action) who is a party to the agreement or arrangement under which such payment into Court is made and except by leave of the Court or a Judge the sum paid in shall not be paid out to the party claiming the damages in respect of which the payment in has been made until he files and serves upon all the defendants in the action notice that he accepts the sum paid in in satisfaction of his claim to such damages against every defendant in the action against whom such damages were claimed and executes in favour of each such party to the contribution proceedings a binding release from any claim to such damages which he may have against him.

(b) Any sum contributed by a party and paid into Court by any other party either in conformity with, or under an agreement or arrangement arising out of, a notice given pursuant to this Rule and which is not taken out of Court by, or ordered to be paid out of Court to, the party claiming the damages in respect of which such payment in was made, shall be dealt with as between the party who contributed such sum and the party who paid the same into Court as the Judge at the trial, if any, shall order or if no such order is made as may be ordered by a Judge in Chambers.”

2. (1) In sub-rule (3) of Rule 1 of Order XVII. before the word “Form” there shall be inserted the words “or to the effect of.”

(2) For sub-rule (1) of Rule 2 of Order XVII. there shall be substituted the following new sub-rule:—

“ (1) Where money is paid into Court under Rule 1 the plaintiff may within seven days of the receipt of the notice of payment into Court accept the whole sum or any one or more of the specified sums in satisfaction of the cause or causes of action to which the specified sum or sums relate by giving notice to the defendant in or to the effect of Form 51 and complying with sub-rule (3) (a) of Rule 5 of Order XII. in cases to which it applies; and thereupon he shall be entitled to receive payment of the accepted sum or sums in satisfaction as aforesaid.”

(3) For sub-rule (2) of Rule 4 of Order XVII. there shall be substituted the following new sub-rule:—

“ (2) If the Plaintiff elects within seven days after receipt of notice of payment into Court to accept the sum or sums paid into Court he shall give notice in or to the effect of Form 51 to each defendant and complying with sub-rule (3) (a) of Rule 5 of Order XII. in cases to which it applies.”

3. For Rule 1 of Order XXII. there shall be substituted the following new Rule:—

“ 1. Unless otherwise ordered a list of actions and all other business for hearing shall be made out by the Registrar as follows:—

(a) Jury Actions,

(b) Non Jury Actions and all other business to be dealt with by a Judge sitting alone.

In making out such list the Registrar shall set out the actions and other business in the order of the date upon which each such action or other business was commenced in or remitted to the Court."

4. For Rule 8 of Order XXII. there shall be substituted the following new Rule:—

" 8. (a) In addition to the powers conferred by these Rules of transferring an action or matter from one Court to another a Court or a Judge may in any action or matter in which it or he thinks fit and at any stage of such action or matter direct that the hearing or further hearing thereof or the taking of accounts or all or any further proceedings therein shall be heard and taken in any other Court and such hearing or further hearing or taking of accounts or further proceedings shall be heard and taken in such last-mentioned Court accordingly.

(b) Whenever the powers conferred by this Rule have been exercised the final judgment decree or order shall be entered and all proceedings for enforcing the same shall be taken in the Court in which such action or matter was commenced unless the Court or Judge by which such judgment decree or order was made shall otherwise order."

5. For paragraph (d) of Rule 2 of Order LI. there shall be substituted the following new paragraph:—

" (d) Subject to the provisions of these Rules, all costs taxed by the Registrar shall be taxed as follows:—

(i) As to all business done on or after the first day of July, 1957, according to the Schedule of Scale of Costs which came into force on the sixth day of May, 1953, with the addition thereto of fifty per centum on all allowances set forth in that Scale (other than for Counsel's fees and other disbursements and payments);

(ii) As to all business done on or after the Sixth day of May, 1953, but before the First day of July, 1957, according to the Schedule of Scale of Costs which came into force on the Sixth day of May, 1953;

(iii) As to all business done on or after the First day of November, 1949, but before the Sixth day of May, 1953, according to the Schedule of Scale of Costs which came into force on the Nineteenth day of December, 1930, with the addition thereto of fifty per centum on all allowances set forth in that Scale (other than for Counsel's fees and other disbursements and payments);

(iv) As to all business done on or after the First day of February, 1947, but before the First day of November, 1949, according to the Schedule of Scale of Costs which came into force on the Nineteenth day of December, 1930, with the addition thereto of twenty per centum on all allowances set forth in that Scale (other than for Counsel's fees and other disbursements and payments); and

(v) As to all business done prior to the First day of February, 1947, according to the Schedule of Scale of Costs which came into force on the Nineteenth day of December, 1930."

DETERMINATION NO. 63 OF THE POLICE CLASSIFICATION BOARD.

THE Police Classification Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Police Regulation Act 1946*, hereby makes the following Determination, that is to say:—

(ii) Adding the words "Station Officers," in the heading before the words "Sub-Officers and Constables".

BY-LAW No. 5141.—CHARGE FOR WATER DIVERTED FROM DRAINAGE CHANNELS.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following charge for water is hereby made under the provisions of the Water Acts and shall be levied

upon the occupiers or owners of all lands to which water is authorized by agreement to be diverted for irrigation from drainage channels in the Deakin, Dingle, Katandra, Shepparton, North Shepparton, Rochester, Tongala-Stanhope, Tragowel Plains, Murray Valley, Cohuna, Kerang, Swan Hill, Central Gippsland, Maffra-Sale, and Werribee Irrigation and Water Supply Districts:—

The charge for the diversion of water from drainage channels for the irrigation of lands in the aforesaid districts shall be—

(a) At the rate of 7s. 6d. for each acre-foot of water to be diverted where such diversion is by gravitation, and

(b) at the rate of 2s. 6d. for each acre-foot of water authorized to be diverted where such diversion is by pumping.

2. Such charge is made and shall be levied for the period beginning with the 1st day of July in each year and ending with the 30th day of June in the year next ensuing, and shall be payable on the 1st day of July in each year at the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, at 100 Exhibition-street, Melbourne.

3. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said charge for water diverted for irrigation from drainage channels.

Orders dated the 4th September, 1951, and the 25th October, 1955, the Governor in Council did approve of amendments varying the maximum charges which may be charged for electricity supplied: And whereas the undertakers have made application to have a further amendment made to the Fourth Schedule annexed to the said Order: Now therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, acting pursuant to the provisions of section 13 of the *Electric Light and Power Act 1928*, doth hereby vary the maximum charges which may be charged for electricity supplied by substituting the following sections for those set forth in the Fourth Schedule annexed to the said Order, that is to say:—

SECTION 1.

Where the undertakers charge any consumer by the electrical quantity supplied to him, they shall be entitled to charge him at the following rates:—

For electricity supplied for lighting purposes—
Two shillings and six pence (2s. 6d.) per unit.

For electricity supplied for purposes other than lighting—
One shilling and six pence (1s. 6d.) per unit.

SECTION 3.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order, the undertakers may charge any consumer a minimum charge of 12s. 6d. per month irrespective of whether the supply is used for lighting or other purposes. Such minimum charge shall be exclusive of meter rent.

And the foregoing amendment shall be effective as from the date on which the Governor in Council approves of such amendment.

And the Honorable George Oswald Reid, Her Majesty's Minister of Electrical Undertakings for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

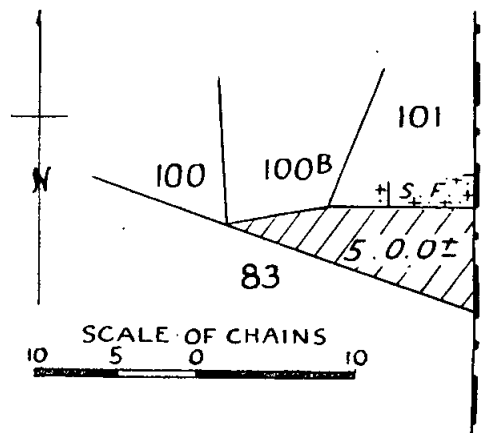

DECLARATION OF CITY AND SUBURBAN FUNERALS PROPRIETARY LIMITED AS AN ASSOCIATION EXEMPT FROM THE PROVISIONS OF THE BENEFIT ASSOCIATIONS ACTS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Benefit Associations Acts and all other powers him thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth by this Order declare City and Suburban Funerals Proprietary Limited, an association carrying on funeral benefit business, shall be exempt from the provisions of the Benefit Associations Acts, subject to the terms and conditions following (that is to say):—

1. That Nelson Brothers transfer certain securities to Trustees as set out in an agreement dated 10th August, 1956, entered into with the Government of Victoria by Nelson Brothers and City and Suburban Funerals Proprietary Limited (hereinafter called "the company").

2. That the benefits under contracts which were in force as at the 8th May, 1952, be restored, subject to the following conditions:—

- (a) Where contributions are not fully paid at least four weeks' contributions are to be paid to the company before the 1st of October, 1957. After that date contributions are to be paid regularly as provided for in the contracts.
- (b) Where all payments had ceased under the contract as at the 8th of May, 1952, such contract will be restored and be operative.
- (c) All contributions which would have fallen due since the 8th of May, 1952, are to be paid to the company either in one lump sum or by instalments before 1st October, 1952.
- (d) Where the death of a contributor or his or her dependants occurs between 8th May, 1952, and 1st October, 1957, and but for the winding-up order such contributor would have been eligible for benefits and where funeral arrangements in respect of such death are or were carried out by undertakers other than Nelson Brothers, the company will refund to such contributor an amount which the Trustees may determine, such amount to be not less than the amount of the contributions paid.
- (e) If Nelson Brothers or the company is unable to or refuses to carry out the funeral of a contributor which inability or refusal shall be determined by the Trustees, the company will refund to the contributor an amount which the Trustees shall determine, such amount being not less than the amount of the contributions paid.
- (f) Where any payment or refund is made in respect of any contract or where a benefit is given under any contract or where in the opinion of the Registrar such payment, refund or benefit should have been made or given the amount of payment, refund or benefit, as the case may be, shall be reduced by the amount of arrears of contributions outstanding.
- (g) Arrears of contributions will be calculated from the date to which contributions were paid to the date of death, and in determining such period the full period of time which has elapsed since the last date to which contributions are paid and the date of death will be allowed without regard to the winding-up order.

3. That in the event of any dispute arising under a contract or as to whether any person is or has been a contributor or as to the amount of contributions paid or as to the date to which contributions have been paid or as to whether the conditions of this exemption have been observed, it shall be referred for decision to the Registrar, whose decision shall be final.

4. No contract shall operate to provide any funeral benefit to any person other than children who were not entitled to such benefit as at the 8th of May, 1952, nor shall any such benefit be increased beyond the benefit operating as at the 8th of May, 1952.

5. That the securities shall be held upon trust by the Trustees and if an order is made pursuant to the Act for the winding up of the company the Trustees shall apply them as directed by the Registrar for the purpose of winding up the company in accordance with the Benefit Associations Acts, but so that each of the contributors shall be entitled to payment of at least one-half of the amount remaining after deduction from the contributions paid by him to the company on or before the date of winding up of the amount of benefits received in respect of his contract with the company.

6. That so long as the securities are held by the Trustees and until an order is made pursuant to the Act for the winding up of the company, the company shall within 42 days after the end of each quarter ending 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December—

- (i) pay to the Trustees an amount equal to one-half of the contributions due by the contributors surviving at the end of the quarter and one-half of any arrears of contributions paid by those contributors during the quarter;
- (ii) furnish the Trustees with a statement as to the contributors who have died during the quarter, together with such other information as the Trustees may require.

7. That until an order is made pursuant to the Act for winding up the company the Trustees shall hold the securities and any moneys paid to them pursuant to the last preceding paragraph upon trust—

- (i) within 90 days after the end of each quarter release to the company the securities and money so held to the extent of an amount equal to the interest on the securities received by the Trustees during the quarter and one-half of the amount remaining after deduction from the contributions paid by contributors dying during the quarter to the end of the last preceding quarter the amount of the benefits received in respect of the contracts of those contributors with the company.

Provided that if—

- (A) the Government Statist for the time being of the said State certifies that in his opinion, having regard to the interests of surviving contributors, the amount to be released should be reduced to an amount specified in the certificate then the Trustees shall be obliged only to release the amount so specified; and
- (B) at any time by reason of the securities not being divisible in amount the Trustees are unable to comply with the foregoing provisions of this subparagraph without releasing an amount greater than that to which the company is entitled then the Trustees may retain the securities until they have been varied in accordance with paragraph 8 hereof so as to enable the release of the amount to which the company is entitled;
- (ii) within 90 days after the end of the quarter in which the last surviving contributor dies to release to the company the residue (if any) of the securities and moneys so held.

8. That the Trustees from time to time may—

- (i) invest any moneys held by them on the trusts hereof in any investment or investments for the time being authorized by law for the investment of trust money; and
- (ii) vary and transpose all or any of the securities (other than money) and all or any of the other investments held by them hereunder for or into any investment or investments for the time being so authorized.

9. That the company will furnish the Registrar, within a time to be fixed by him, with such documents, returns or other information which he or the Government Statist may require in connexion with their duties under the conditions of this exemption.

10. The company will provide to the Registrar by the 30th June, 1957, a list setting out the names and addresses of each contributor in lexicographical order showing for each contributor the total amount of contribution paid to the 8th May, 1952, the amount of contribution payable each week, the amount of benefit paid as at the date of the winding-up order and the benefit payable in respect of each person covered.

11. The company will forward to the last-known address of each contributor, and where possible the addresses will be submitted by the Registrar, setting out the terms and conditions of the Exemption Order in précis form for the notice of each contributor.

12. The Trustees to have power by themselves or their agents to inspect books and documents as required.

13. Books of account will be kept by the company as required by the Trustees, and such books will be audited once every six months at the expense of the company.

14. Any questions arising as to repayments and entitlements generally as to the contract shall be determined by the Trustees, who shall act upon such evidence as they shall require or deem necessary, and the decision of the Trustees shall be final.

WHEREAS the Country Roads Board constituted under the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) has represented to His Excellency the Governor in Council that it appears to it desirable that the deviation herein-after referred to from the existing Midland Highway in the Shire of Corio (declared to be a State highway under the said Act which declaration was confirmed by the Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th November, 1933, on page 2830) should be made by the said Board: And whereas the said Board in accordance with the requirements of section 19 of the said cited Act has caused to be prepared a map plan and estimate showing the points between which and on and through what land the said deviation is proposed to be made and the cost of acquiring the land: And whereas on an inspection of the said map and plan and a consideration of the said estimate His Excellency the Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring the land: Now therefore be it known by this present Order that His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby approve of the said highway being made, that is to say:—

All those pieces of land in the Parish of Moorpanyal, the boundaries of which are as follow:—

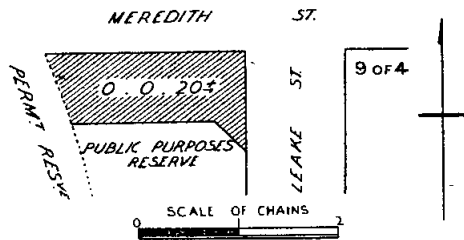

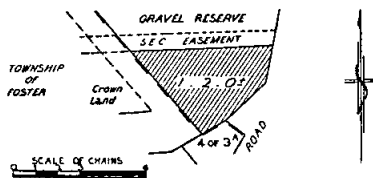

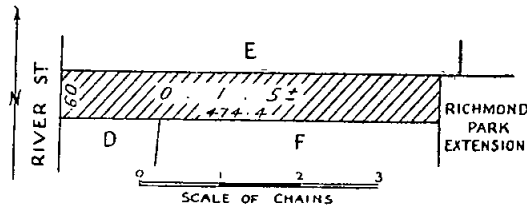

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "PICOLA RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Picola, temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 3rd November, 1954, as a site for Public Recreation, known as the "Picola Recreation Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve." The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, hereinafter referred to as the "Committee":—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding 52 in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall—

- (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
- (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
- (c) Bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- (d) Exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

3. The Committee shall have the power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.

4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows, or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.

5. No person, except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.

6. The Committee may set apart the whole or any part of the Reserve as a place for the parking of vehicles.

7. No person shall park a vehicle within the Reserve, except in places set apart by the Committee for the parking of vehicles.

8. The Committee may fix such fee, not exceeding 2s. per day, as they think fit as the fee for the parking of vehicles in any place set apart within the Reserve for the parking of vehicles.

9. Every person who parks a vehicle in a place set apart for the parking of vehicles shall pay to the Committee or its authorized representatives, on demand, such fee as has been fixed by the Committee pursuant to these Regulations as the fee for parking in such place.

10. Every person bringing a vehicle into the Reserve shall obey the reasonable direction of the Committee or its authorized representatives in relation to the driving or parking of such vehicles within the Reserve.

11. No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or any other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein.

12. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

13. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

14. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

15. No person, club, or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

16. No person shall remove any earth, sand, stone, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.

17. The Committee shall not be held responsible in any way for any accident or injury sustained by or to any person or persons whilst within the boundaries of the Reserve.

18. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve, except at such place or places as is or are set aside for that purpose by the Committee.—(Rs.7298.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff or member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE ORBOST RECREATION RESERVE.

THE Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred on it, doth hereby amend the Regulations made on 23rd November, 1928, and 17th March, 1956, for the care, protection, and management of the Reserve for Cricket and other purposes of Public Recreation in the Township of Orbost, by the substitution in Regulation 1 for the words "Two shillings" the words "Three shillings."
