Prohibiting the Leaving of Motor Cars and Other Vehicles Standing in Streets, &c.

A By-law of the Town of Colac, made under the provisions of section 197 of the Local Government Act 1946, and every other power enabling it in that behalf, and numbered 28, for the purpose of prohibiting the leaving (whether unattended or not) of motor cars and other vehicles standing in the street or road or part thereof specified in the By-law, and for suppressing nuisances.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Colac, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act, order as follows:—

- 1. In this By-law-
 - "Motor car" means a motor car within the meaning of paragraph (c) of sub-section 3 of section 197 of the Local Government Act 1946 the overall length of which exceeds 20 feet and the weight of which when unladen exceeds 2 tons.
 - "Overall length" shall have the same meaning as the definition of overall length in section 3 of the Motor Car Act 1951.
- 2. No person shall leave (whether unattended or not) any motor car standing in such streets or roads or parts thereof as are specified in the Schedule hereto between the hours of midnight and 6 o'clock in the morning.
- 3. Any person committing any breach of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction for a first offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and for any second or subsequent offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

 - (b) requiring persons engaged in tending and slaughtering animals and in dressing carcasses at the said Abattoirs to be licensed and pre-scribing the conditions of licence;
 - (c) fixing the rates of fees and dues payable to the Council of the Borough of Camperdown, under Part XIII. of the said Act;
 - (d) prescribing the times for slaughtering animals at the said Abattoirs;
 - (e) the feeding, watering, and tending, and the preventing of cruelty to and overcrowding of animals in the said Abattoirs and the milking of milch animals at the said Abattoirs.
- IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1928, and the Local Government Act 1928, and the amendments thereof, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Camperdown order as follows:—
- 1. This By-law shall come into operation on the day after the day of the publication hereof in the Victoria Government Gazette and is divided into Parts as follows:—

Part I .- Introductory.

Part II.—Conditions on which Animals may be Received into or Removed from the Abattoirs.

Part III.-Licensing of Slaughtermen and others.

Part IV.-Fees and Dues.

V .- Times for Slaughtering Animals at the Abattoirs.

Part VI.—Opening Chilling Chambers and Cleaning Tripes.
Part VII.—Care of Animals at the Abattoirs.

Part VIII .-- Duties and Conduct of Slaughtermen and Other Persons.

IX.-Penalties.

PART I.—INTRODUCTORY.

- 2. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter:-
 - "The Abattoirs" means the Camperdown Municipal Abattoirs carried on, maintained, and controlled, and managed as Municipal Abattoirs by the Borough of Camperdown, and includes all the lands and premises used or occupied with and forming part of the Abattoirs establishment.
 - "The Council" means the Council of the Borough of Camperdown.
 - The Superintendent" means the Superintendent for he Superintendent" means the Superintendent for the time being of the Abattors appointed by the Council and includes an Acting or Deputy Superin-tendent and also any officer or employee of the Council actually in charge of the Abattors during the temporary absence of the Superinten-

- "Slaughterman's Licence" means a licence granted to a person in accordance with the provisions of Part III. of this By-law and authorizing the licensee to tend and slaughter animals and dress carcasses at the Abattoirs.

 "Meat Inspector" means Meat Inspector appointed under Part XIII. of the Health Act 1928, or any corresponding engagement for the time being in
- corresponding enactment for the time being in

PART II.—CONDITIONS ON WHICH ANIMALS MAY BE RECEIVED INTO OR REMOVED FROM THE ABATTOIRS.

- 3. Every person who shall pay the fees and dues here-inafter fixed shall be entitled to the use for a reasonable time of such portion of the Abattoirs as shall be available and be assigned to him by the Superintendent. No person shall use any portion of the Abattoirs, except for such purpose and at or for such time at the Superintendent shall approve.
- 4. Every person who shall bring any animals to the Abattoirs shall forthwith inform the Superintendent of the number and description thereof, together with the name and address of the owner thereof and locality or district from which the same were brought, and the Superintendent shall thereupon cause such particulars to be entered in a Record Book to be kept at the Abattoirs, and every such person shall place such animals in such portion of the Abattoirs as the Superintendent directs, and in no case shall any animals once brought into the Abattoirs be removed without the consent of the Superintendent. Superintendent,
- 5. No person shall without the previous consent of the Superintendent bring into the Abattoirs any animal known or reasonably suspected by him to be or visibly affected with any infectious or contagious disease.
- 6. (1) The owner of an animal brought to the Abattoirs for slaughter shall:-
 - (a) slaughter the animal or cause it to be slaughtered within 48 hours after it has been brought to the Abattoirs; and
 - (b) remove or cause to be removed the carcass and every part thereof (except the inedible offal therefrom) from the Abattoirs within 48 hours after the carcass has been placed in the chilling chamber; and
 - (c) remove or cause to be removed the said inedible offal from the Abattoirs not later than 4.30 p.m. in the afternoon of the same day upon which such animal was slaughtered.
- (2) If the owner shall fail to remove the inedible offal within the time aforesaid, the Council may forthwith remove the same from the Abattors and dispose of it in such manner as the Council or the Superintendent may such manner as the Council or the Superintendent may decide. The costs and expenses of such removal and disposal shall forthwith be paid to the Council by the owner, but if the said inedible offal is disposed of for a monetary consideration, the Council may apply such consideration, if and when received, in or towards repayment of the costs and expenses of such removal and disposal, and the balance, if any, of the consideration, shall be then paid by the Council to the owner.
- If no monetary consideration, or a monetary consideration less than the costs and expenses of such removal and disposal, is received by the Council, then the whole, or the balance (as the case may be) of such costs and expenses, shall be recoverable by the Council from the
- (3) Nothing herein contained shall impose or be deemed to impose on the Council any duty to seek or obtain a monetary consideration for any such inedible offal not removed by the owner in accordance with paragraph (c) of sub-section (1) of this section, and disposed of by the Council under sub-section (2) of this section.
- 7. The Council shall have a lien on all animals, carcasses, 7. The Council shall have a lien on all animals, carcasses, skins, hides, fat, and offal for the time being in the Abattoirs and owned by any person indebted to the Council, and if such person shall make default for seven days in payment of any fees or dues payable by him to the Council under this By-law the Council (without making any demand or giving any notice) may sell by public auction or private contract all or any part of such animals, carcasses, skins, hides, fat, and offal, and after deducting all such fees and dues so payable to the Council and the expenses of sale, shall pay the proceeds of such sale to the owner of the animals, carcasses, skins, hides, fat, or offal sold. fat, or offal sold.
- 8. The Council will take all reasonable care of animals brought to the Abattoirs for slaughter, but will not be responsible for any injury to or for the death or escape of any animal brought to the Abattoirs for slaughter or

- 9. The Council will take all reasonable care of carcasses, skins, hides, and edible and inedible offal while in the Abattoirs, but will not be responsible for any loss thereof or any damage thereto, and in particular will not be responsible for bone-taint or any other condition which may occur in carcass meat in the chilling chambers or for any break-down or failure in the chilling system, any part of the mechanical electrical or other technical installations of the Abattoirs.
- 10. No person shall remove from the Abattoirs the carcass of any animal slaughtered thereat until the same has been examined by a Meat Inspector and passed by him as fit for human consumption and branded by him with the regulation brand.
- 11. Any person using the Abattoirs who shall do or cause any breakage, injury, damage, or destruction thereto or to any of the plant or appliances used in connexion therewith, whether accidentally or otherwise, shall make good the same to the satisfaction of the Superintendent, and if he shall wilfully do or cause any such breakage, injury, damage, or destruction he shall be guilty also of an offence against this By-law.

PART III.-LICENSING OF SLAUGHTERMEN AND OTHERS.

- 12. After the expiration of 21 clear days from the day on which this By-law comes into operation no person shall tend or slaughter any animal or dress any carcass at the Abattoirs, unless he is the holder of a current Slaughterman's Licence issued to him in accordance with the provisions hereinafter contained.
- 13. Every person who desires to obtain a Slaughterman's Licence shall make application to the Council for such licence in the form in the First Schedule hereto. All such applications shall be lodged with the Superintendent of the Abattoirs
- 14. The Council may in its discretion grant or refuse the application. Every licence granted shall be in the form contained in the Second Schedule hereto, and may be signed for the Council by the Superintendent.
- 15. A Slaughterman's Licence shall continue in operation until the 31st day of December next after the granting or renewal thereof and no longer. Every application for the renewal of a licence shall be in the form in the Third Schedule hereto and shall be lodged with the Superintendent of the Abattoirs not later than the 7th day of December in the year of expiry thereof, and the Council may in its discretion grant or refuse the application. On renewal of a licence a new licence shall be issued to the licensee and shall be dated and be effective on and from the 1st day of January next following the expiry of the previous licence.
- ${\bf 16.}~{\bf A}$ Slaughterman's Licence is not transferable by the licensee to another person.
- 17. (1) Where the Superintendent has reason to believe that the holder of a Slaughterman's Licence has been guilty of an offence against the By-laws of the Borough of Camperdown relating to the Abattoirs or has been guilty at the Abattoirs of an offence against the Health Acts or any Regulation now or hereafter made thereunder, the Superintendent may suspend the licence of such person and shall forthwith submit to the Council a statement in writing setting out the grounds of the suspension.
- (2) On receipt of any statement in pursuance of the last preceding sub-clause the Council shall make a thorough examination of the grounds of suspension set out in the statement, and shall afford the licensee an opportunity of appearing before it in person and showing cause why the suspension of his licence should be removed.
- (3) The Council may either remove the suspension of the licence or confirm such suspension and cancel the licence and shall give notice in writing of its decision to the Superintendent and to the licensee concerned.
- (4) During the period of suspension of a Slaughterman's Licence the licensee therein named shall not tend or slaughter any animal or dress any carcass at the Abattoirs.
- 18. (1) The operation of this part of this By-law may at any time be suspended by Resolutions passed by the Council and in that case the time at which such suspension shall be effective shall be notified by advertisement inserted by the Council in a newspaper published in Camperdown.
- (2) If the operation of this Part is so suspended this Part may again be brought into operation by Resolutions passed by the Council and the time at which this Part shall again come into operation shall be notified by advertisement inserted by the Council in a newspaper published in Camperdown.

PART IV .- FEES AND DUES.

19. The fees and dues payable to the Council under Part XIII. of the *Health Act* 1928 shall be as follows:—

Provided that the fees and dues payable for or in respect of the matters mentioned in the above table shall in the case of animals slaughtered at the Abattoirs on Saturday, Sunday or any public holiday be one hundred and fifty per centum of the fees and due hereinbefore prescribed but so that such fees and dues payable under this paragraph shall not in any case exceed the maximum fees and dues for the time being prescribed by or under section 284 of the Health Act 1928, or the corresponding enactments for the time being in force.

PART V.—TIMES FOR SLAUGHTERING ANIMALS AT THE ABATTOIRS.

- 20. (1) The days for slaughtering animals at the Abattoirs shall be Monday to Friday (both inclusive) in each week (Public Holidays excepted) and the times on those days for slaughtering animals at the Abattoirs shall be as follows:—
 - (a) Between the hours of 7.30 o'clock and 9.45 o'clock in the morning;
 - (b) between the hours of 10 o'clock in the morning and 12 o'clock midday;
 - (c) between the hours of 1 o'clock and 3 o'clock in the afternoon; and
 - (d) between the hours of 3.15 o'clock and 4 o'clock in the afternoon.
- (2) Except with the consent of the Superintendent previously obtained no person shall slaughter any animal at the Abattoirs except on the days and between the hours prescribed by sub-clause (1) of this clause.

PART VI.—OPENING CHILLING CHAMBERS AND CLEANING TRIPES.

- 21. (1) The chilling chambers at the Abattoirs shall be open on Mondays to Fridays (both days inclusive) in each week (Public Holidays excepted) during the following hours:—
 - (a) Between 7 o'clock and 8 o'clock in the morning(b) between 1 o'clock and 1.30 o'clock in the after-
 - noon; and (c) between 4 o'clock and 4.30 o'clock in the after-
- noon.
- (2) No person except the Superintendent or an officer or employee of the Council or other person authorized by the Superintendent shall open or close any chilling chamber at the Abattoirs.
- (3) If any person desires any chilling chamber to be opened on any day or at any time except on the days and between the hours prescribed by sub-clause (1) of this clause he shall make special application to the Superintendent for that purpose and the Superintendent may in his discretion grant or refuse the application and if the application is granted the application shall pay to the Superintendent on behalf of the Council an opening fee of Five shillings.
- 22. No person shall clean any tripe or tripes at the Abattoirs except with the previous consent of the Superintendent and the Superintendent may refuse such consent unless such person or his employer or principal has entered into an agreement with the Council to pay them the sum of Six pence for each tripe cleaned by him or his employees or contractors at the Abattoirs.

PART VII.—CARE OF ANIMALS AT THE ABATTOIRS.

23. No person shall ill-treat or unnecessarily frighten or irritate any animal at the Abattoirs or use any unnecessary or preventible cruelty in slaughtering any animal at the Abattoirs.

- 24. (1) The owner of any animal received into the Abattoirs shall:—
 - (a) Provide the same with good and sufficient food at least once every twenty-four hours and with water when necessary; and
 (b) in the case of a milch animal milk the same once
 - or twice daily, as may be proper.
- (2) If the owner of any such animal shall fail or (2) If the owner of any such animal shall fall of neglect to comply with any of the provisions of subclause (1) of this clause the Superintendent may comply with such provisions on his behalf and such owner shall forthwith pay to the Council all expenses incurred by the Superintendent in complying with such provisions on behalf of the owner. behalf of the owner.

PART VIII.—Duties and Conduct of Slaughtermen and Other Persons.

- 25. Immediately any animal slaughtered is discovered to be diseased the slaughterman in charge shall stop the work of dressing the carcass thereof and shall report the fact to the Superintendent or Meat Inspector on duty at the time and shall not proceed further with such dressing until authorized to do so by the Superintendent or a Meat Inspector.
 - 26. No slaughterman or other person shall-
 - Mix the organs from a diseased carcass with the organs from healthy carcasses; or
 - (2) write on soil or disfigure any of the walls, floors, ceilings, fittings, or fixtures of the Abattoirs or remove, deface, or disfigure any signboard or written or printed matter or notice on or in the Abattoirs; or
 - (3) except with the permission of the Superintendent interfere in any way (save in the course of normal and proper authorized user) with the electric switches, motors, fans, ventilation arrangements or the steam or water pipes or any other plant or appliances whatsoever in the Abattoirs.
- 27. Every slaughterman and every other person having meals at the Abattoirs shall for that purpose use the mess-room provided and shall not eat any meal or snack in any other portion of the Abattoirs.
- 28. (1) No person shall bring any dog other than a cattle or sheep dog into or allow any such dog to remain in the Abattoirs.
- (2) Every person who has brought any sheep or cattle dog into the Abattoirs shall keep such dog when not in use securely tied up in such place as is assigned for that purpose by the Superintendent.
- (3) If there shall in relation to any dog be any contravention of the foregoing provisions of this clause the Superintendent or any person authorized by him may seize and destroy such dog whether or not it is in charge of any person.
- 29. (1) No slaughterman or other person shall slaughter any animal or load or handle any meat in the Abattoirs unless he is wearing clean and suitable clothing.
- (2) No slaughterman shall leave the Abattoirs wearing his slaughtering clothes.
- (3) Every slaughterman shall keep his slaughtering clothes when not in use in such part of the Abattoirs as shall have been assigned to him by the Superintendent for that purpose.
- 30. (1) When the work of slaughtering and dressing the carcass or carcasses of any animal or animals has been completed the slaughterman in charge shall immediately:

 - (a) Clean the portions of the Abattoirs in which such slaughtering or dressing operations have been carried out and leave the same in a proper and tidy condition; and
 (b) deposit the offal, hides, skins, and waste or refuse matter from such, animal or animals in such manner and in such pits, bins or receptacles as the Superintendent shall by any general or special direction have directed.
- (2) No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited any blood, offal, filth, or waste or refuse matter upon any portion of the Abattoirs or on any road or land abutting thereon except in the pits, bins, or receptacles provided and directed for that purpose.
- 31. No person shall without the consent of the Super-intendent place any insoluble or germicidal or other. foreign matter in any urinal or water-closet at the Abattoirs. Every person using any such urinal or water-closet shall use only the sanitary paper provided therein by the Council and shall before leaving such convenience use the flushing water provided for the removal of the excrement deposited in such convenience.

- 32. No person unless having lawful business to transact 32. No person unless having lawful business to transact at the Abattoirs shall enter or remain therein and if any such person shall not leave the Abattoirs immediately upon being requested to do so by the Superintendent such person shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law and may also be forcibly removed from the Abattoirs by the Superintendent or by any person authorized by him.
- 33. Any slaughterman or other person who shall in the Abattoirs:

 - Abattors:

 (a) Be under the influence of intoxicating liquor; or

 (b) behave in a riotous indecent offensive threatenor insulting manner; or

 (c) use any profane indecent obscene threatening abusive or insulting words; or

 (d) create any disturbance; or

 (e) obstruct in the execution of his duty the Superintendent or any Meat Inspector or any other
 officer or person appointed by the Council to
 aid in the conduct management or maintenance
 of the Abattors; or
- aid in the conduct management or maintenance of the Abattoirs; or

 (f) neglect or refuse to comply with any lawful request of any such Superintendent, Meat Inspector, officer, or person shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law and may also be forcibly removed from the Abattoirs by the manager or by any person authorized by him.

PART X.—PENALTIES.

34. Every person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law or is otherwise guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Cantilever Verandahs.

A By-law of the Shire of Warragul, made under Part VII., Divisions 1 and 7, of the Local Government Act 1946, and numbered 56, for—

- (a) prohibiting on, from, and after a date specified herein the erection or placing against or in front of any house or building abutting upon any public footway in any street, or part thereof, specified herein of any verandah over or across such footway, unless such verandah is supported by cantilevers, brackets, or projecting supports, and not otherwise;
- (b) requiring the pulling down and removal before a date specified herein of all verandahs before the first-mentioned date erected or placed against or in front of any house or building abutting upon any such public footway, which verandahs are upon, over, or across such footway and are supported otherwise than by cantilevers, brackets, or projecting supports.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1946, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Warragul order as follows:—

1. In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires, "verandah" shall be construed as having the meaning contained in the definition of "verandah" in the Uniform Building Regulations.

2. By-law No. 20 to the extent to which it adopts paragraphs 2, 3, and 6, under heading (1) ("Porticoes, projections, &c.") of Part 1 of the Thirteenth Schedule of the Local Government Act 1903, is hereby repealed...

- 3. From and after the 1st day of July, 1957, no verandah shall be erected or placed against or in front of any house or building abutting upon any public footway in any street, or part thereof, within the Shire of Warragul, or over and across such footway, unless such verandah is supported by cantileevers, brackets, or projecting supports, and not otherwise and not otherwise.
- 4.
