#### AMENDING DETERMINATION OF THE GAS METER BOARD.

Note.-This Determination since the 2nd July, 1946, has applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Labour and Industry Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, business, or occupation of making or repairing gas meters" has made the following Determination, namely:—

That as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence on or after the 23rd May, 1957, the Determination made on the 25th October, 1955, and in force as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in November, 1955, shall be amended by:—

1. Deleting clause 5 and inserting in lieu thereof the following:-

#### SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

5. All work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Labour Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Queen's Birthday. Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; shall be paid for at the rate of double time but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

Where an employee is absent from his employment on the working day before or the working day after a public holiday without reasonable excuse or without the consent of the employer, the employee shall not be entitled to payment for such a holiday.

In this clause the expression "double time" shall mean when the employee has worked on any of the days named, double the money he would have earned had the day in question been an ordinary working day.

2. Deleting Clause 11 and inserting in lieu the following:-
