## PUBLIC HIGHWAY—CITY OF NUNAWADING.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946*, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Nunawading requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been acquired or used for a road within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, by this Proclamation, declare that all that piece of land being part of land known as Williams-road, being part of Crown allotment 73, Parish of Nunawading, and being more particularly described hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act:—

Commencing at the north-eastern angle of lot 10, shown on lodged plan of subdivision No. 4104, bounded thence by lines bearing respectively 89 deg. 8 min. 50 feet, 179 deg. 19 min. 990 feet, 269 deg. 8 min. 157 ft. 10½ in., 33 deg. 14½ min. 193 ft. 3½ in. and 359 deg. 19 min. 830 feet to the point of commencement.

### PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 900 (2) of the *Local Government Act 1946* provides—*inter alia*—that the Governor in Council may, by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the Council of any municipality, not being a city or town, extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Rosedale has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to the municipal district of such municipality:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act 1946* to the municipal district of the Shire of Rosedale, and order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the above-mentioned municipal district of the Shire of Rosedale on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 14th October, 1957, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make by-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter, and provided further that no such by-law shall come into operation before the 14th October, 1957.

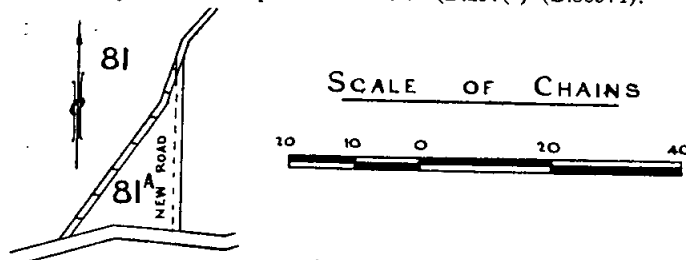

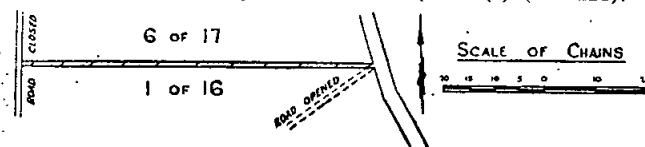

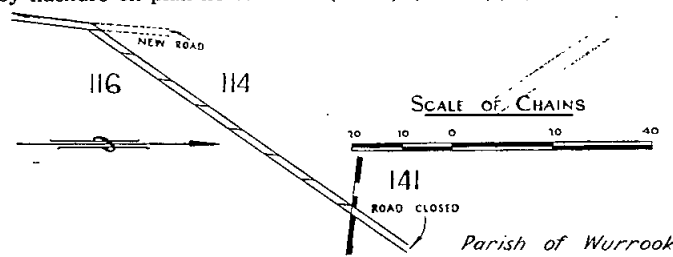

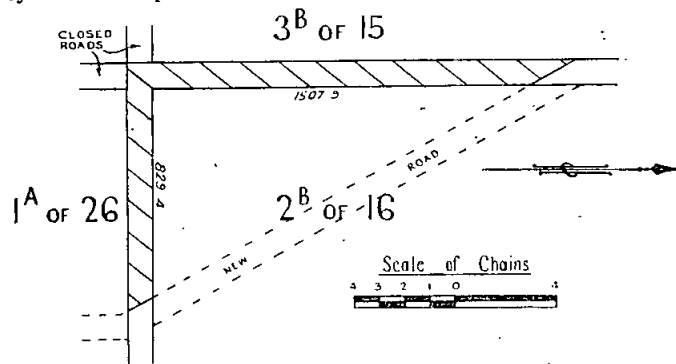
Parish of Minjah North, County of Villiers, being the road indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(M.124<sup>(\*)</sup>) (D.31124).



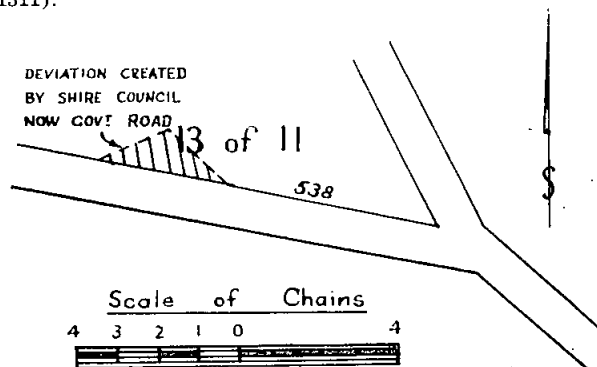

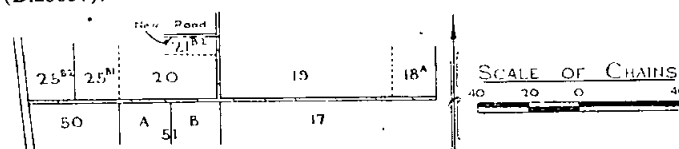
Parish of Minhamite, County of Villiers, being the roads indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(M.411<sup>(2)</sup>) (D.7465).



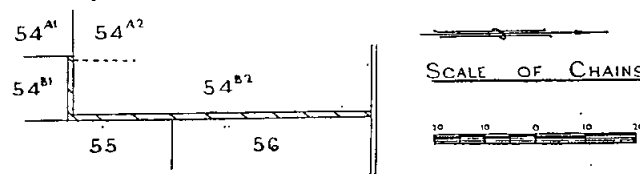

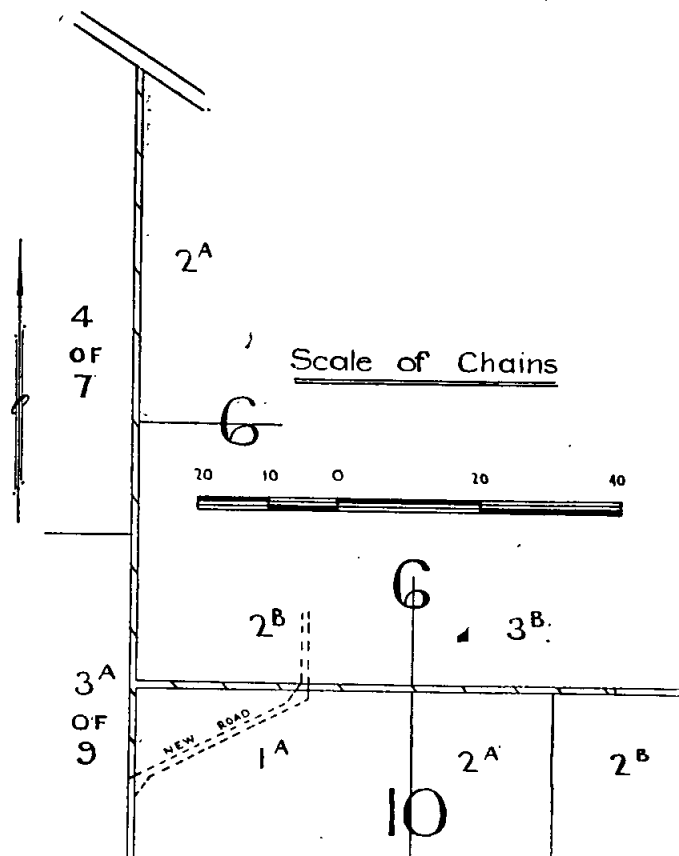

#### POISONS ACTS.

##### PROCLAMATION

BY virtue of the powers conferred by section 66 of the Poisons Act 1928 (No. 3748) I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation amend the Proclamation made under section 47 of the said Act No. 3748 on the eighth day of March, 1955, by deleting therefrom the words:

"Metallic bromides including ammonium bromide in medicinal preparations or admixtures containing more than five grains of such bromides in each adult dose."

And whereas the Commission of Public Health has stated that in its opinion the substances—

Metallic bromides including ammonium bromide—should be subject to regulations imposing special restrictions under Part IV. of the said Act No. 3748 in respect of the sale thereof:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare the substances—

Metallic bromides including ammonium bromide—to be potent drugs for the purposes of the *Poisons Act* 1928 (No. 3748).

## RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Supreme Court Acts and of all other powers hereunto enabling, the following amendment to Chapter I. of the Rules of the Supreme Court is made and shall take effect from the twenty-second day of July One thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven:—

1. In Order LXV. for Rule 9A there shall be inserted the following Rule:—

9A. (1) The total in any bill of costs of the fees as prescribed by Rule 9 of this Order (as distinct from payments) shall, in respect of business done in any cause, matter, or proceeding in the Supreme Court after the twenty-second day of July, 1957, be increased by 50 per cent., and any such increase shall be allowed upon any taxation of costs in respect of any such business, as well between party and party as between solicitor and client and in taxations under or pursuant to the *Supreme Court Act* 1928.

(2) Paragraph (1) of this Rule shall not—

- (a) apply to the remuneration prescribed by or under section ninety-four of the *Supreme Court Act* 1928; or
- (b) affect the question whether a bill of costs when taxed is or is not less by one-sixth part than the bill delivered, sent, or left; or
- (c) affect the power to direct payment of a sum, in lieu of costs, under Order LXV., Rule 23, or the power to allow a fixed sum for costs under Order LXV., Rule 27 (38), or a gross sum under Order LXV., Rule 27 (38A).

(3) Paragraphs (1) and (2) of this Rule shall apply to all references to arbitration, and to all business done in any criminal proceeding, and so far as applicable thereto to all business done in any divorce or matrimonial cause.

(4) The provisions contained in Rule 9A of Order LXV. of Chapter I. of these Rules immediately before the coming into operation of this Rule shall in relation to business done before the coming into operation of this Rule have the same operation and effect as they would have had if this Rule had not been made in substitution therefor.

#### AMENDMENT OF THE DANGEROUS DRUGS REGULATIONS.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Poisons Act* 1928, as amended by any Act, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, doth make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1957 and shall be read and construed as one with the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1930 and all Regulations amending the same.

2. For Regulation 15 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1930 there shall be substituted the following Regulation:—

“15. (a) Every medical practitioner, veterinary surgeon, or dentist who writes a prescription for a dangerous drug shall sign the prescription with his usual signature and shall specify on the prescription his own address and the name and address of the person for whom the prescription is given. The prescription shall be written in ink and shall be dated.

(b) A prescription for a dangerous drug when given by a registered dentist for the purpose of dental treatment shall be marked clearly with the words “*for local dental treatment only*” and such words shall be underlined.

(c) A prescription for a dangerous drug when given by a registered veterinary surgeon shall be for the purpose of treatment of animals and shall be marked clearly with the words "*for animal treatment only*" and such words shall be underlined.

(d) No prescription shall be given for the supply of a dangerous drug otherwise than in accordance with the foregoing conditions.

(e) A medical practitioner or veterinary surgeon who dispenses any medicines to which these Regulations apply shall enter particulars thereof in the register hereinafter specified.

(f) Every medical practitioner who writes a prescription for a dangerous drug shall write on such prescription the maximum number of times such prescription shall be dispensed not exceeding four times.

(g) Where the prescription contains an unusual, or what may be regarded as a dangerous dose, the prescriber shall indicate that such dose is intended by underlining that part of the prescription and by inserting his initials in the margin.

(h) The use of a rubber stamp or other such contrivance in lieu of the written signature on a prescription for dangerous drugs is hereby prohibited.

(i) The prescription shall not be written in a secret code or cypher."

3. For Regulation 17 in the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1930 there shall be substituted the following Regulations:—

"17. (a) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in these Regulations, in any case where in the opinion of a medical practitioner an emergency exists or where a medical practitioner considers it expedient in order to avoid hardship to a patient or undue delay in the supply of a medicine to a patient, such medical practitioner may issue a prescription for a dangerous drug to a pharmaceutical chemist orally or by telephone and such pharmaceutical chemist may dispense and supply any prescription so ordered.

(b) The medical practitioner who so issues any prescription to a pharmaceutical chemist either orally or by telephone shall forthwith reduce the prescription to writing and state thereon that such written prescription is in confirmation of a prescription given orally or by telephone (as the case may be) and shall give or despatch it without delay to the pharmaceutical chemist concerned.

(c) The requirements of this Regulation shall be complied with by the medical practitioner concerned within twenty-four hours of the issue of any prescription either orally or by telephone."

4. For Regulation 18 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1930 there shall be substituted the following Regulation:—

"18. The following conditions shall be observed by the persons dispensing prescriptions:—

(i) The essential particulars of a prescription for a dangerous drug are:

- (a) the date;
- (b) the name of the person for whom the prescription is intended;
- (c) particulars of the drug or medicine to be supplied;
- (d) the quantity to be supplied;
- (e) directions for administration;
- (f) the number of times the prescription is to be dispensed;
- (g) the signature of the prescriber.

(ii) No person shall dispense a prescription for a dangerous drug which is lacking in any essential particular without first communicating with the prescriber and confirming his intention in regard to any point which may be in doubt.

(iii) Without limiting the responsibility of a medical practitioner to write the address of the patient on a prescription for a dangerous drug, a pharmaceutical chemist, if

satisfied beyond doubt as to the genuineness of the prescription and the identity of the patient, may insert the address of the patient and dispense the prescription.

- (iv) A medical practitioner, registered chemist, or registered veterinary surgeon, or an assistant under direct personal supervision and control of a medical practitioner or a registered chemist, shall be the only persons who shall dispense a dangerous drug.
- (v) The following conditions shall be observed by persons dispensing prescriptions:—
  - (a) Subject to the exception mentioned in this paragraph a dangerous drug shall not be supplied more than once on the same prescription, provided that if the prescription so directs the dangerous drug may be supplied subject to the lapse of a specific interval or of specified intervals on more than one, but not exceeding four, occasions as directed in the prescription.
  - (b) The prescription shall be stamped, marked or inscribed in writing with the date on which it is dispensed, and with the name and address of the person who dispenses it.
  - (c) The person who dispenses the prescription for the last occasion, as determined by the maximum mentioned in paragraph (a) hereof, shall, in addition to the requirements mentioned in paragraph (b) hereof, also write, stamp, mark, or inscribe in durable and legible letters across the prescription the word 'cancelled'.
  - (d) A 'cancelled' prescription shall be retained by the person lawfully dispensing the same, and shall be preserved on a file for two years.
  - (e) No person shall dispense a prescription marked 'cancelled'.
  - (f) No person shall dispense any prescription containing any dangerous drug within the scope of these Regulations if he has any reason to believe that the prescription is not genuine.
  - (g) The label on the bottle or package containing the dangerous drug shall be marked with the identifying letters or number of the prescription as appearing in the prescription book.
  - (h) The prescription book shall be kept at the place at which the drug is dispensed, and shall be at all reasonable times produced on demand to any person authorized in that behalf under the *Poisons Act 1928* or the Regulations made under that Act.
  - (i) No person shall dispense any prescription which is illegible or defaced or which appears to have been altered.
  - (j) A prescription which is suspected by a chemist to whom it is presented of being forged or of having been fraudulently issued, or of not bearing the signature of a medical practitioner, shall, notwithstanding that it is not dispensed, be retained by such chemist.
  - (k) No person shall dispense a prescription for a dangerous drug, which prescription bears a date more than six months prior to its presentation."

## TROTTING CONTROL BOARD REGULATIONS 1957.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Racing Acts, and all other powers him thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. (a) These Regulations may be cited as the Trotting Control Board Regulations 1957 and shall come into operation on the eighteenth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven.

(b) On the commencement of these Regulations the Regulations made on the twenty-sixth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and forty-seven, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-seventh day of August, One thousand nine hundred and forty-seven, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Trotting Races Act 1946*, and all amendments thereto, shall be revoked.

2. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context of subject matter:—

“Board” means the Trotting Control Board as constituted by the Racing Acts.

3. (1) On any appeal to the Board against any decision whatsoever, there shall be paid to the Board a deposit of Twenty-five pounds.

(2) After hearing the appeal the Board may, in addition to any other penalties ordered by it—

(a) order that the whole or any part of the said deposit shall be forfeited;

(b) direct that the appellant shall pay such costs of the appeal as may seem reasonable to the Board.

4. (1) On any application to the Board for a re-hearing of any appeal on the ground that new evidence is available there shall be paid a deposit of Twenty-five pounds.

(2) After hearing any such re-hearing the Board may, in addition to any other penalties ordered by it—

(a) order that the whole or any part of the said deposit shall be forfeited;

(b) direct that the person, club, or other body which applied for the re-hearing shall pay such costs of the re-hearing as may seem reasonable to the Board.

5. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations no deposit fees or costs shall be payable on any appeal or on any application for the re-hearing of an appeal by a stipendiary steward in the employ of the Board.

6. The members of the Board shall be entitled to receive travelling allowances which shall be—

(a) in the case of the Chairman—Three hundred and fifty pounds a year;

(b) in the case of each member who lives not less than forty miles from the post office at the corner of Bourke and Elizabeth streets, Melbourne—Four hundred and fifty pounds a year; and

(c) in the case of each other member—One hundred and fifty pounds a year.

7. In the event of any member of the Board being required by the Board to visit any place outside of Victoria on the business of the Board he shall be paid such travelling expenses as are approved by the Board.

8. The members of the Board shall be entitled to receive fees which shall be—

(a) in the case of the Chairman—Five hundred pounds a year; and

(b) in the case of each member other than the Chairman—Five pounds five shillings in respect of each meeting of the Board which he attends.

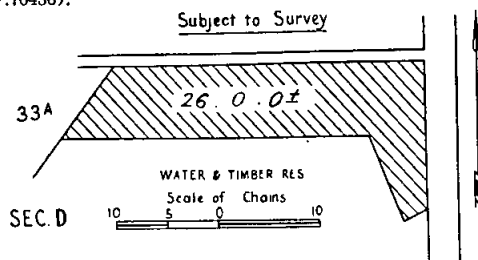

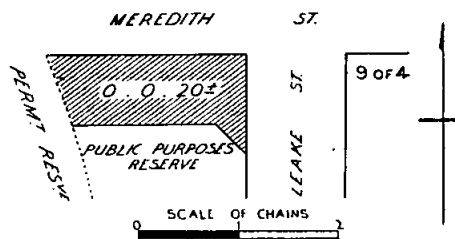

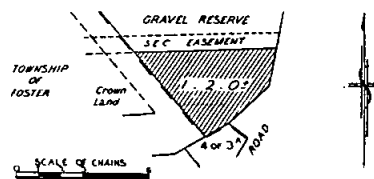

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE TOWN OF BENALLA.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make

Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purposes whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Benalla, temporarily reserved by Orders in Council of the 6th October, 1873, and 28th September, 1915, as a site for Recreation purposes, hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve." These Regulations are made in lieu of all others which are hereby revoked.

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 24 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) may be taken and charged for the admission of every adult to the Reserve, and for admission to any grandstand or enclosure in the Reserve a further sum of Two shillings and sixpence for every adult.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein. No minor games to be played outside the area allotted for the specific purpose.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Any person obtaining permission to graze cows on the Reserve shall obtain chains and tags, pay agistment at the rate of 2s. per week for the first cow, and 2s. 6d. per week for each additional cow, and 2s. 6d. for each chain and tag. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be forwarded annually to the Department of Crown Lands and Survey.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a leash.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, nor any booth, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall conduct any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or in any structure or erection in the Reserve.

10. No person shall bet in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport within the Reserve on Sundays without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

13. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game or sports, and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may deem to be consistent with these Regulations, the use of the grounds so set apart.

14. The amount to be paid by way of rental for the use of the enclosure and buildings in the Reserve by any person or club granted permission to conduct any public entertainment, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements shall be at the rate of Ten pounds per centum of the gross receipts for admission to the entertainment, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, and Ten pounds per centum of the value of all tickets issued for admission to the entertainments, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements.

15. No person, except workmen and labourers employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots for plantations for young trees, or shrubs, or flowers.

16. No person or persons shall park a motor car or motor cycle within the Reserve, except at such parking areas as are set apart by the Committee of Management for that purpose, and every person using such parking areas shall, on demand, pay a fee not exceeding Three shillings per motor car or motor cycle per day for entrance to and use thereof on such days as a charge is being made for admission as provided in clause 1.

17. All fees payable and received in accordance with these Regulations shall be expended in the maintenance, upkeep, and improvement of the Reserve, and an account thereof furnished annually to the Department of Lands and Survey.—(Rs.116.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff or member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "LANCEFIELD RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and

management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Lancefield, temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1957, as a site for Public Recreation known as the "Lancefield Recreation Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve." The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management hereinafter referred to as the "Committee."

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at such times as may be fixed by the Committee from time to time.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, and any person so offending and failing to forthwith leave the Reserve or bath when requested to do so by any bailiff of Crown lands, member of the Police Force, or officer or servant of the Committee, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except in places specified by the Committee.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones or other missiles in the Reserve.

5. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for the admission to the Reserve and use of the bath shall be as follows:—

(a) For admission of every person to the Reserve and use of the bath (except on occasions on which fêtes, sports, carnivals, matches, or displays are held therein) such annual fee as the Committee shall determine, not exceeding Ten shillings.

(b) For admission of every adult person to the Reserve, and use of the bath on occasions (not exceeding ten (10) in any one year) on which fêtes, sports, carnivals, matches, or displays are held therein, such sum as the Committee shall determine, not exceeding Three shillings.

(c) For admission of every person to the Reserve, and use of the bath on any occasion (except those on which fêtes, sports, carnivals, matches, or displays are held therein) such sum as the Committee shall determine, not exceeding Sixpence.

(d) For admission and use of the Reserve for camping for a party of not more than six persons, a fee of 5s. per week, or 2s. 6d. per day.

6. No person shall remain in the Reserve or the bath who has not paid the charge for admission and/or use of bath as prescribed by these Regulations, and any person who, not having paid the said charge, and having been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, member of the Police Force, or officer or servant of the said Committee, or requested by any of such persons to leave the Reserve or bath, fails to forthwith do so shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

7. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

8. No person shall erect any building in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee.

*The Bath.*

9. Every person using a bath shall be clad in a suitable costume.

10. No person suffering from any infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the swimming bath.

11. No person shall use any obscene or profane language or actions within the precincts of the swimming bath or the immediate vicinity thereof.

12. No person under the influence of intoxicating liquor shall be permitted to enter the swimming bath.

13. Children shall, not be permitted to enter the swimming bath except under adequate supervision.

14. The swimming bath may be set apart at stated hours for the use of males, females, or children respectively. Mixed bathing may be permitted on such days and under such conditions as the Committee may at any time determine.—(Rs.7531.)

The Regulations made by the Board on the 28th October, 1929, as notified in the *Government Gazette* of the 6th November, 1929, for the care, protection, and management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the Township of Wycheproof are hereby applied to the land in the Township of Wycheproof temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 12th December, 1938, as a site for Public Recreation and Show Grounds, and the land reserved by Order in Council of 7th November, 1951, as a site for Public Recreation in addition to and adjoining the first-mentioned site, the three areas together known as the "Wycheproof Showground and Recreation Reserve."—(Rs.174.)

#### BY-LAW No. 100.

*Prescribing Business Areas within the Municipal District of the City of Caulfield.*

A By-law of the City of Caulfield, No. 100, made under the Local Government Acts and particularly under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1946*, as amended by the *Local Government Act 1949*, for prescribing business areas and for other purposes hereinafter provided.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Caulfield order as follows:—

1. The area of land set forth and described in the Schedule hereto and being the area referred to in the said Schedule as Area No. 1, which is within the municipality, shall be and is hereby prescribed and declared to be a business area.

2. (a) The use of any land or erection (including adaption for use) or the use of any building for the purposes of all classes and of every class of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements, except the trade or business of a petrol filling station, is hereby prohibited.

(b) For the purposes hereof the business of a petrol filling station shall include the fuelling of motor vehicles with petrol, the carrying out of routine servicing such as oiling, greasing and cleaning, and the sale of accessories and parts, but shall not include the repair of motor vehicles.

3. No person shall erect or cause to be erected any building for the purposes of a petrol filling station or adapt or cause to be adapted any existing building to such purpose in the said area set forth in the Schedule hereto without first obtaining the consent in writing of the Council.

4. (a) The Council may require the owner, builder, or any other person offending as hereinafter mentioned to pull down and remove buildings erected, adapted for use, or used contrary to this By-law.

(b) The Council is hereby authorized to pull down and remove buildings erected, adapted for use, or used contrary to this By-law or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this By-law, and

(c) The Council is hereby authorized to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

5. In addition to the penalties provided for in section 222 of the *Local Government Act 1946*, this By-law hereby imposes a further penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which an offence against this By-law is

continued after notice has been given to the offender by the Council of the commission of the offence, or after a conviction or order of any Court as the case may be.

2. The Schedule to the said By-law is hereby amended as follows:—

By deleting therefrom Area No. 1 set forth and described in the Schedule to the said By-law and in substitution therefor inserting the area of land set forth in the Schedule hereto which last-mentioned area shall be and be deemed to be Area No. 1 in the Schedule to the said By-law.

3. The area of land set forth and described in the Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be a prescribed residential area within the meaning of the Local Government Acts.

4. On and from the date of the coming into operation of this By-law—

(a) The area of land set forth and described in the Schedule hereto shall be substituted respectively for the area of land deleted from the Schedule to the said By-law as aforesaid.

1. This By-law shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Driver” means the person in charge of a vehicle.

“Street” includes every highway, road, carriageway, land, thoroughfare or other public place within the City of Hawthorn other than a footway.

“Motor Car” means motor car within the meaning of the *Motor Car Act 1951*, and includes a trailer within the meaning of that Act.

“Vehicle” includes every conveyance capable of being propelled, pushed, or drawn by human, animal, mechanical, electrical or other power, and includes a motor car.

Singular includes the plural.

3. The driver of a vehicle (other than a tram car) shall not leave such vehicle (whether unattended or not) standing in any of the following places:—

In Glenferrie-road, west side between the north side of Manningtree-road and the south side of Kinkora-road.

In Glenferrie-road, east side between the north side of Oxley-road to the south side of Bowen-street—between the hours of 8 o'clock in the forenoon and 6 o'clock in the afternoon on any day of the week other than Sunday or a Public Holiday or a Saturday afternoon—

(i) In any situation for a period in excess of one hour.

(ii) In any situations within a distance of one-quarter of a mile from each other for a period in excess in the aggregate of one hour.

4. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act of default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds for each and every offence.

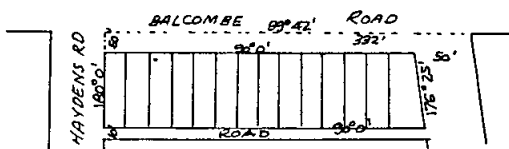
