PROHIBITION OF THE USE OF SPOTLIGHTS, ETC.,  
FOR HUNTING NATIVE GAME.

### PROCLAMATION

By the Honorable Sir Charles Lowe, as Deputy for His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I SIR CHARLES LOWE, as Deputy for His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do hereby direct that the Proclamation made the seventh day of September, 1926, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the fifteenth day of September, 1926, prohibiting the use of spotlights or any similar light of any kind whatsoever for taking, killing or hunting, or for attempting or assisting to take, kill or hunt any species of native game shall not apply to the common opossum, the ringtailed opossum or the short eared or mountain opossum during the period from the 1st day of August, 1957, to the 12th day of September, 1957, both days inclusive.

**BAG LIMIT FOR TROUT (NON-INDIGENOUS TO VICTORIA) TAKEN FROM THE ARINGA RESERVOIR NEAR PORT FAIRY.**

## PROCLAMATION

By the Honorable Sir Charles Lowe, as Deputy for His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, SIR CHARLES LOWE, as Deputy for His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation prescribe that no person shall on any one day during the period in which the taking of trout from the Aringa Reservoir is permitted take from such water more than five of such fish, being either Brown Trout or Rainbow Trout or have in his or her possession more than five Trout taken from such water.

## REGULATIONS AMENDING THE INFECTIOUS DISEASES REGULATIONS 1941.

"Provided that in respect of a case of influenza no particulars apart from those furnished by the notifier need be included."

**Evidence (Amendment) Act 1955 (No. 5877).****EXAMINATION OF APPLICANTS FOR LICENCE AS SHORTHAND WRITERS—REGULATIONS.**

**T**HE Public Service Board, pursuant to the provisions of section 130 of the *Evidence Act 1928* (No. 3674), as amended by the *Evidence (Amendment) Act 1955* (No. 5877), hereby makes the following Regulations for or with respect to determining the nature, character, standard, and requirements of the examinations or tests which are to be applied to applicants for a shorthand writer's licence, and these Regulations shall replace the existing Regulations:—

1. Examinations shall be held at such times and places as may from time to time be notified by the Public Service Board in the *Government Gazette* and in two newspapers.

2. Every applicant shall, prior to admission to examination, produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

- (a) of name in full;
- (b) of having attained the age of twenty-one (21) years; and
- (c) of good moral character.

3. On the production of the aforesaid evidence, and the payment to the Board of an examination fee of Twenty-one shillings, an applicant may be admitted to the examination.

4. No applicant shall be registered as qualified for licence unless he passes, to the satisfaction of the examiners, examinations in rapidity and correctness—

- (a) in writing shorthand;
- (b) in transcribing shorthand notes; and
- (c) in reading shorthand notes.

5. The standard required for passing shall be—

- (a) To write correctly in shorthand from the examiner's dictation 600 words at the rate of 120 words a minute; five minutes in all.
- (b) To transcribe at once in longhand, legibly and correctly, without abbreviations, in 30 minutes, the passage written from dictation under sub-clause (a).
- (c) To write correctly in shorthand from the examiner's dictation 1,500 words at the rate of 150 words a minute; ten minutes in all.  
The writings of all candidates shall be collected at once without revision.
- (d) To read aloud correctly to the examiners, in not more than 20 minutes, the paper written in accordance with sub-clause (c).

6. While applicants are under examination, no communication between them will be allowed.

7. As soon as practicable the examiners who conduct an examination shall furnish to the Board a return signed by each examiner showing the names of the applicants who satisfied the examiners thereat.

8. The applicants whose names are included in the return furnished as aforesaid shall be registered by the Board as persons qualified for licence as shorthand writers in the Law Courts.

9. Notwithstanding the conditions imposed in the preceding Regulations, any applicant for licence as shorthand writer who, at the time of such application, is a member of a Parliamentary Reporting Staff (Hansard) in Australia, and who has served on such staff as a shorthand writer for a period of five years, and who shall produce evidence of his fitness satisfactory to the examiners may, on the certificate of such examiners, be registered as a person qualified for licence as a shorthand writer in accordance with the Evidence Acts.

## BOROUGH OF STAWELL.

## BY-LAW No. 41.

A By-law of the Borough of Stawell, made under the *Health Act 1928* and under section 197 (1) of the *Local Government Act 1946*, and numbered 41, for—

(a) Controlling the deposit, removal, or destruction of refuse or rubbish.

(b) Regulating the use of private property, at junction of streets, for the growing of trees, &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1928* and the *Local Government Act 1946*, and any other power thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Stawell order as follows:—

*Deposit, Removal, or Destruction of Refuse or Rubbish.*

(1) The deposit or leaving of refuse or rubbish on streets, roads, lanes, passages, or any other land under the care, control, or management of the aforesaid Council is hereby prohibited, except in those areas reserved by the said Council as rubbish tips, provided that any refuse or rubbish deposited in these areas shall be deposited in such manner and in such positions as are indicated either by an employee of the Council so authorized to act, or by public notice.

For the purposes of this By-law "refuse" and "rubbish" include among other things dust, sludge, mud, soil, ashes, saw-dust, rags, waste matter, filth, blood, offal, dung, manure, or any other material which is offensive or likely to become offensive.

(2) The occupier of every house, dwelling, or premises shall not deposit refuse or rubbish in the yard or ground belonging thereto or occupied therewith, and shall keep such yard or ground in a clean and tidy condition, and in such a manner as not to be a nuisance, dangerous to health or offensive, or to attract or harbor rodents or other vermin.

(3) No occupier of any house, building, or premises shall place, leave, or suffer to remain in the yard or ground belong thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, any house garbage, refuse, sweepings, rubbish, or waste food, save in the covered receptacle, as required by this By-law.

(4) Any owner or occupier of any land shall, when required by the Council, in writing, remove or destroy any refuse or rubbish thereon (other than refuse or rubbish), the removal of which the Council has undertaken under this By-law.

(5) The occupier of every house, building, or premises shall provide, keep, and maintain at all times upon his premises a properly constructed receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building, or premises.

(6) Such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not more than 26-gauge or other approved material, in such manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein, or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle.

(7) Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than 4 cubic feet, and shall be so constructed as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man.

(8) It shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.

(9) Such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close-fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle, and shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse is deposited therein or discharged therefrom), and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep such refuse in an inoffensive condition.

(10) No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle, nor shall deposit any moist refuse in such receptacle unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in paper.

(11) The occupier shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and inoffensive, and shall coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance when deemed necessary by the Council.

(12) The occupier (at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse) shall cause such receptacle to be deposited close to and inside and within 10 feet of the entrance to such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which house, building, or premises abut in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council.

(13) No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, except in the case of business premises built on the street alignment where such on a suitable right-of-way or land on which such receptacle could be placed for collection and emptying.

(14) The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall be responsible for the complete emptying (without spilling any of the contents) of such receptacle or receptacles directly into a vehicle provided for its reception.

Such contractor or person shall also be responsible for the replacement of such receptacle properly covered with its lid, and shall also close the gate or gates of the premises from which such receptacle is taken.

(15) The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall at least once in each week, or at such greater frequency as the Council directs, collect and remove such refuse in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness.

(16) Such vehicle shall be provided with a cover and kept covered, except when refuse is being put into or discharged from such vehicle.

(17) Such vehicle shall as far as practicable be rendered water-tight by means of an impervious lining or painting the inside thereof with tar or by other suitable means.

(18) The person in charge of such vehicle shall cause it to be taken when full by the shortest practicable route to the tip, incinerator, or destructor.

(19) The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall cause all vehicles used for the reception and removal and such refuse to be properly constructed, kept clean, and thoroughly disinfected with approved disinfectant, and maintained in a proper state of repair.

(20) Where refuse is authorized to be disposed of at a tip, the occupier thereof shall cause it to be deposited and covered in accordance with Schedule 4 of the General Sanitary Regulations 1950, or any amendment thereof.

(21) Land upon which refuse has been deposited shall be seasonably planted or sown with seed of grass or any forage or cereal crops or other such vegetable life as the Council shall direct or approve.

#### *Regulating the Use of Private Property, at Junction of Streets, for the Growing of Trees, &c.*

(22) No person shall use that portion of any private property situated at the junction of any streets or roads having a frontage of 30 feet to such street or road measured from the junction thereof and a depth of 10 feet from the alignment of such streets or roads for the growing of trees, shrubs, or hedges of height exceeding

(23) The owner or occupier of any such property, within fourteen days of written notice being served by the Council requiring such owner or occupier to do so, shall lop to height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. all trees, shrubs or hedges, whether planted before or after the commencement of this By-law, which are situated on that portion of the property as described in clause 22 of this By-law.

(24) The owner or occupier, within fourteen days of written notice being served by the Council requiring such owner or occupier to do so, shall reduce to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in., any portion of a fence within 10 feet of the junction of any streets or roads.

(25) The Council may, at the expense of the owner concerned, on the failure of the owner or occupier to carry out any direction of the Council, under clauses 23 and 24 of this By-law, carry out such direction, and the

amount of expense so incurred by the Council may be recoverable in a court of petty sessions as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

(26) Any contravention of any of the foregoing sections, by act or omission, shall be an offence against this By-law, and every person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall, for a first offence, be liable to a penalty of not less than Two pounds nor more than Twenty pounds, and for any second or subsequent offence, to a penalty of not less than Five pounds nor more than Twenty pounds, and any person guilty of a continuing offence shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order of any court.

(27) This By-law shall have application throughout the whole of the Borough of Stawell, and shall come into operation immediately on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

(28) If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.
