UPPER GOULBURN CATCHMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 22 of the *Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1947* do by this my Proclamation define the water supply catchment to be known as the Upper Goulburn Catchment as follows:—

Commencing at the eastern end of the wall of the Eildon Dam on the Goulburn River; thence southerly along the watershed between Snobs Creek and Jerusalem Creek to Mt. Torbreck; thence continuing southerly along the watershed between the head waters of Snobs Creek, Royston and Taggerty Rivers on the west and the Big River on the east to Mt. Arnold; thence generally in a south-easterly and easterly direction along the Great Dividing Range over Mt. Matlock and Mt. Singleton to Mt. Selma; thence generally in a north-easterly, north-westerly and northerly direction along the Great Dividing Range to Mt. Macdonald; thence continuing along the Great Dividing Range generally in an easterly and north-easterly direction over Mt. Magdala to Mt. Howitt; thence generally in a north-westerly direction along the watershed between the head waters of the King River to the north-east and the Howqua and Delatite Rivers to the south-west; thence continuing generally westerly and north-westerly along the watershed between the Broken River on the north and Ford and Brankeet Creeks on the south; thence in a generally south-westerly direction along the watershed between the Seven Creeks on the north-west and the Gerar and Merton Creeks on the south-east to a point on the watershed west of the Township of Merton; thence generally in a south-easterly direction along the watershed between the head waters of the Home, Colonial and U.T. Creeks on the south-west and the immediate catchment of the Western or Delatite Arm of the Eildon Reservoir to the western end of the wall of Eildon Dam; thence across the crest of the dam to the commencing point.

The area described is more particularly defined on a plan lodged at the Head Office of the Soil Conservation Authority, 378, Cotham-road, Kew.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this eighteenth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifty-six, and in the fifth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

Subordinate Legislation Committee Act 1956.

REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING TRAVELLING EXPENSES FOR MEMBERS OF THE SUBORDINATE LEGISLATION COMMITTEE.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Subordinate Legislation Committee Act 1956*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Subordinate Legislation Committee (Travelling Expenses) Regulations.

2. In addition to the attendance fees payable under the *Subordinate Legislation Committee Act 1956* every member of the Subordinate Legislation Committee shall be entitled to receive for expenses incurred by him when travelling, whenever such expenses have been necessarily incurred by him in the performance of his duties as a member of such Committee, the following sums:—

- (i) If he is resident in the metropolitan area and is required to perform such duties within Victoria, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings for each full day and a proportionate sum for each part of a day during which he is absent from the metropolitan area;
- (ii) if he is not resident in the metropolitan area and is required to perform such duties within Victoria, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings for each full day and a proportionate sum for each part of a day during which he is absent from his place of residence;
- (iii) if he is required to perform such duties outside Victoria, the sum of Four pounds for each full day and a proportionate sum for each part of a day during which he is absent from his place of residence:

Provided that no member shall be entitled to receive any such sum in respect of any day on which the House of which he is a member is sitting unless such duties are performed outside the metropolitan area; and provided further that no member shall be entitled to receive any such sum in respect of any day in respect of which he receives any other sum by way of travelling expenses out of Consolidated Revenue.

3. In these Regulations "metropolitan area" means the area lying within a radius of 20 miles from the post office at the corner of Elizabeth and Bourke streets, Melbourne.

4. These Regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 7th day of November, 1956.

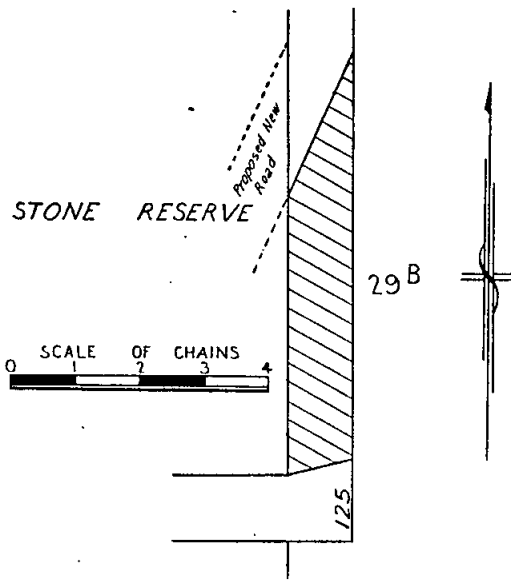

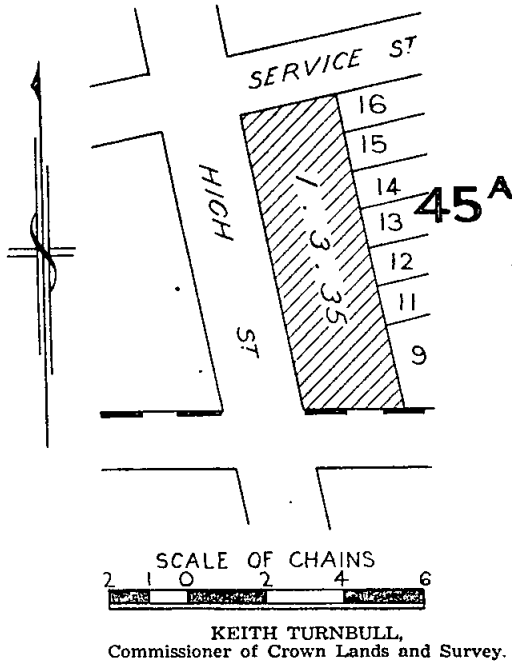

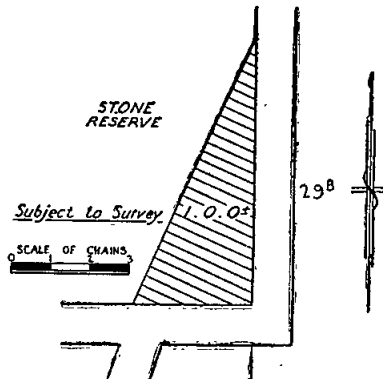

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF THE EUROA RECREATION
RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, or for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Euroa temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 31st July, 1956, as a site for Public Park and Public Recreation together with the adjoining permanent reservation along the banks of the Seven Creeks, the whole known as the Euroa Recreation Reserve (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve.")

The Reserve has been placed under the control of the Council of the Shire of Euroa as a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee.")

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, except on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports or other amusements.

2. No person shall—

(a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct and for maintaining good order in the Reserve the Committee or its employees may refuse any person admission to the Reserve or any structure therein.

(b) Climb or jump over the gates, fences, seats, tables, signboards, building equipment, notices, fittings, or other improvements in or around the Reserve, nor stick or erect therein or thereon any bills or in any way deface, injure, damage, write or paint on or otherwise mark any rocks, gates, fences, seats, tables, buildings, equipment, notices, signboards, or other improvements, structure, or fittings therein or thereon, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

(c) Remove or displace any board, plate or fitting or written or printed notice for the exhibition of any Regulations or notice fixed or set up by the Committee in the Reserve.

3. Every person shall exercise reasonable and proper care in the use of any portion of the Reserve, dressing rooms, conveniences or appurtenances therein.

4. No person shall, without the consent of the Committee, light any fire in the Reserve except in a place set apart by the Committee or as indicated by the curator for the purpose. No such fire shall be left burning or unattended, and before lighting such fire such person shall make provision for extinguishing the same either by water or by loose earth. Every person whilst in the Reserve shall take special precautions against the risk of fire.

5. All fees and charges prescribed by the Committee shall be paid to the secretary of the Committee or other specially authorized officer on demand.

6. No person shall enter the Reserve on any day set apart for cricket or football matches, cycling, sports, fêtes, holiday amusements, or any function whatsoever except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee or any club, association, or person renting the Reserve, or any part thereof, duly authorizing the admission of such person, and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date or during the period provided thereon, and every such ticket shall be produced and, if for one day only, surrendered on demand to the gatekeeper or other person authorized to collect the same.

7. Upon application to the Committee, any club, association or person may be granted the exclusive use of the Reserve or any portion thereof, for the holding of cricket or football matches, shows, sports, fêtes, bicycle races, or other amusements, and may charge for admission thereto of persons subject to the provisions of these Regulations, and shall pay to the Committee such charges as the Committee may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations. The Committee of Management reserves the right to cancel this permission without notice.

8. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at the time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.

9. No person shall offer for sale within the Reserve or deliver therein any article or commodity without the consent, in writing, of the Committee being first obtained, and the payment of such fee as the Committee may impose.

10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or any structure or erections in the Reserve.

11. No unauthorized person shall interfere with, damage, or in any way destroy or have in his possession in the Reserve or take away therefrom any animal, bird, bird's egg or nest, or any live or dead or dressed timber or any vegetation, tree, shrub, fern, plant, or flower.

12. No person shall permit or suffer any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, or other animals belonging to him or under his care or control to be at large in the Reserve, or to graze or wander over the same without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained and upon payment of such fees as may be fixed by such Committee.

13. No person shall bring into or have in his possession or discharge in the Reserve any rifle, firearm, sporting gun, or airgun without the permission, in writing, of the Committee.

14. All persons using the conveniences provided by the Committee shall pay such charges for the use of same as shall be fixed from time to time by the said Committee.

15. No person shall bring or allow any dog belonging to him or under his care or control to enter or remain in the Reserve unless controlled by a leash, cord, or chain, and all dogs found swimming in any water or wandering in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

16. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of trees, shrubs, or flowers without the consent of the Committee first obtained, nor shall any person, without lawful excuse, enter any area made for the purpose in the Reserve.

17. No person shall drive any motor car or other vehicle of any kind or ride any bicycle, motor cycle, or horse except on a road or parking area made for the purpose in the Reserve, and then only as near as practicable to the left-hand side of such road.

18. No person shall park any motor car, cycle, or other vehicle or tether any horse within the Reserve, excepting at such area as is set apart by the Committee for the purpose, and any such person using such area shall obey any order given by the said Committee, the curator, or other employee of such Committee, and shall pay on demand, a fee to be determined by the Committee for use of such parking area.

19. No person shall drive any motor car or other vehicle of any kind or ride any bicycle, motor cycle, or horse within the Reserve or in any parking area or along any road therein recklessly or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, including the nature, and the amount of traffic which actually is at the time or which might reasonably be expected to be on such road, parking area or in the Reserve.

20. The Committee may at its discretion on such conditions and terms and at such times as it may from time to time fix, lease, rent or hire to persons, clubs, or associations any tennis courts, buildings or structures, or other part or parts of the Reserve.

21. The Committee shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of swings or other appliances in the children's playground, nor from any cause howsoever arising within the Reserve.

22. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

23. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve at any time without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

24. No person shall remove any earth, sand, stone, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.

25. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport, including tennis, cricket, quoits, hockey, or any other games or foot-racing, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only with the permission of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the said Committee may determine.

26. No person shall enter the Reserve, or pass over the playing area or oval, with any vehicle, or on horseback, without the permission of the Committee first obtained, nor drive or ride amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve.

27. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee in the proper execution of his work or duty.

28. No person, other than players and officials connected with any game (football, cricket, tennis, bowls, croquet, hockey or golf), and other than any competitors and officials at any sports gathering, shall intrude upon any playground or oval during the course of such games and sports.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.—(Rs.5505.)

Teaching Service Act 1946.

TEACHING SERVICE (TEACHERS TRIBUNAL) REGULATIONS.

AMENDMENT No. 192.

THE Teachers Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act 1946*, hereby rescinds Regulation 1 of the Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations and substitutes therefor the following Regulation:—

REGULATION 1.

Reimbursement of Expenses—General.

1. The provisions of this Regulation shall be read in conjunction with the instructions published from time to time in the *Education Gazette* and *Teachers' Aid*, under the heading of "Teachers' Travelling and Removal Expenses."

2. Members of the teaching service must avoid unnecessary travelling and must not claim payment of any amount in excess of the rate prescribed in this Regulation. No reimbursement shall be payable unless a member has incurred an expenditure which he would not have incurred in ordinary circumstances.

3. The Director and Certifying Officers shall be responsible for ensuring that travelling, for which payment is claimed, was necessary, that it could not have been more economically arranged, and that the claims are correct.

4. Members shall travel by railway whenever practicable.

5. Whenever travelling by railway is not practicable, members entitled to charge for cost of travelling shall be repaid the actual cost of the necessary and most economical means of conveyance upon furnishing receipts for such payments.

6. When the actual and necessary expenses incurred by members exceed the rates allowed by this Regulation, such increases may be granted as the Tribunal, on the recommendation of the Director, shall determine:

Provided that the actual amount of the expenses incurred for sleeping berths when travelling on the railways may be reimbursed if approved by the Director or the Tribunal.

7. When any fare includes meals and/or sleeping accommodation such smaller reimbursement shall be paid as the Tribunal deems reasonable: Provided, however, that such reimbursement shall not exceed one-quarter of the rate to which the member would otherwise be entitled.

Travelling by Motor Car, Motor Cycle, or Bicycle.

8. Members who use their own cars, motor cycles, or bicycles, and who are not being reimbursed a commuted amount in which the cost of locomotion is included, may, with the approval of the Director, be reimbursed at the rates set out hereunder, or such weekly or yearly reimbursement as may from time to time be fixed by the Tribunal.

Provided that, in any case where the Tribunal is satisfied that a rate as above mentioned should be varied, such variation of the rate of reimbursement may be allowed as the Tribunal shall determine.

Provided also that a member shall not incur an expenditure in excess of £250 during any financial year, either for the use of his own car on official business or for motor car hire or both, unless the Director certifies that the expenditure is necessary in the interests of the efficient working of the Department, and the approval of the Tribunal is obtained.

9. A member authorized to claim reimbursement in respect of the use of his own motor vehicle shall not be reimbursed for the hire of motor cars, except in cases where it is proved to the satisfaction of the Director that the hiring was unavoidable or was justified by the circumstances of the case, and the approval of the Tribunal is obtained.

Commuted Reimbursements.

10. The following shall be the scale of commuted reimbursements to cover personal expenses of District Inspectors using their own or Government-owned motor cars on official business:—

11. Members engaged as projectionists, operating on circuits and using their own motor cars shall be paid a commuted reimbursement of £40 a year to cover expenses incurred by periodical visits to headquarters.

12. Where a member who is reimbursed a commuted amount for expenses is absent from duty, either on leave or through illness, for any period over a fortnight, he shall be reimbursed only such portion of the commuted amount as may be approved by the Tribunal.

Personal Expenses.

13. (a) The following shall be the scale of reimbursements for personal expenses of members visiting:—

- (i) Capital cities (other than Canberra and Melbourne) and places in other States—60s. a day.

- (ii) Canberra—67s. 6d. a day.
- (iii) Melbourne and all other places in Victoria—42s. a day.

Provided that, where the visit of a member extends to more than four weeks, the rate of reimbursement thereafter shall be as determined by the Tribunal.

(b) Members visiting places abroad shall be allowed such reimbursements as the Tribunal may determine.

(c) Members of Special Staffs, who are detailed for duties which render it necessary for them to live away from their permanent centres, shall receive reimbursements for living expenses in accordance with the following scale:—

- (i) For periods not exceeding twenty-eight days—42s. a day.
- (ii) For periods exceeding twenty-eight days but not exceeding three months—20s. a day.
- (iii) In special cases, on the recommendation of the Director, the Tribunal may extend the prescribed periods for which the reimbursements specified in this sub-clause may be paid.

(d) Members who are engaged in teaching part-time at schools away from their permanent centres, shall receive reimbursements at the rate of 30s. a day for living expenses.

14. Where the actual and necessary expenses incurred by a member exceed the rates specified in clause 13 the Tribunal may allow additional reimbursements.

15. The Tribunal or the Director may authorize payment as under to a member who is absent from his headquarters when he leaves and returns on the same day:—

- (a) 5s. 6d. for breakfast where a member is required to leave before 7 a.m., and is unable to return until after 9.30 a.m.
- (b) 6s. for lunch where a member is required to leave before 12 noon and is unable to return until after 3 p.m. and is absent for a period of at least seven hours.
- (c) 7s. 6d. for the evening meal where a member is required to leave before 5 p.m., and is unable to return until after 7 p.m.

16 (a) The rates set forth in this Regulation, except as otherwise indicated, are fixed to cover the cost of three meals a day and lodging when a member is necessarily absent from his headquarters overnight. The reimbursement in respect of each meal and of bed shall be one-fourth of the daily rate.

(b) Reimbursement in respect of breakfast, lunch or tea shall not be allowed unless a member commences travelling earlier than or is absent later than the time or times respectively prescribed hereunder, viz.:—

			Time of Leaving	Time of Returning.
Breakfast	7 a.m.	8.30 a.m.
Lunch	12 noon	2.00 p.m.
Tea	6 p.m.	7.00 p.m.

Provided that the Tribunal may, in any special case, authorize reimbursement beyond the hours prescribed, where the circumstances warrant.

17. Reimbursement for personal expenses shall, except where otherwise stated, be in addition to the cost of conveyance.

18. Reimbursement of personal expenses, except such as may be granted by the Teachers Tribunal, shall not be allowed within an area of 15 miles radius of a member's headquarters. The question as to which is a member's headquarters shall be decided by the Director.

19. No member shall be allowed personal expenses in excess of £150 during any financial year unless the Director certifies that the expenditure is necessary in the interests of the efficient working of the Education Department, and the approval of the Tribunal is obtained.

Removal Reimbursements.

20. Subject to the instructions referred to in clause 1 of this Regulation, members shall be reimbursed expenses as follows:—

("Positions" is to be interpreted as "permanent positions" except in special cases approved by the Tribunal.)	(ii) A married man may also claim expenses involved in removing household furniture and effects, and travelling expenses, as in (i), of his wife and children* (names and ages of the latter to be given). *("Children" means children under 16 years of age or students maintained by their parents.)
*(e) Initial permanent posting on first appointment as a classified member.	
(f) First transfer as a married man, provided it occurs not later than three years after the first school day following the conclusion of his course at a teachers' college.	(iii) Expenses involved in removing household furniture and effects.

21. For the purposes of clause 20, members, other than those referred to in paragraph (f), who own motor cars or motor cycles may use them for transport in which case they shall be reimbursed at the rates of 5·7d. and 2d. per mile, respectively, for the distance travelled by them by the shortest practicable route on removal from one centre to another.

22. Furniture shall, where practicable, be removed by railway.

Attendance at Schools of Instruction, Refresher Courses and District Inspectors' Conferences.

23. Where a member of the teaching service has been selected to attend a school of instruction, refresher course or a district conference called by the District Inspector and is required to travel more than 10 miles from his permanent place of residence in order to attend, reimbursements may be granted by the Tribunal under the following conditions:—

- (a) Where railway transport is available, an order for a return railway ticket will be issued: Provided that application is made to the Education Department beforehand.
- (b) Where railway transport is not available, a reimbursement of the return fares for travel by other recognized means of public transport will be made on production of the necessary receipts: Provided that approval to travel by such means is obtained from the Education Department beforehand.
- (c) Where the Tribunal is satisfied that it is necessary for members of the teaching service to travel by motor car or motor cycle they may be reimbursed at a rate not exceeding 5.7d. a mile for a motor car or 2d. a mile for a motor cycle: Provided that approval to travel by such means is obtained from the Education Department beforehand.

Other Reimbursements.

24. Where a member of the teaching service is compelled to reside 5 miles or over from his school or to occupy a departmental residence 3 miles or over from his school and there is no regular means of transport between his place of residence and his school, the Tribunal may authorize reimbursement of travelling expenses at the rates set out hereunder:—

Motor car—not exceeding 5.7d. a mile.

Motor cycle—not exceeding 2d. a mile.

Bicycle—

When the distance between the place of residence and the school is 3 miles or over, but is under 5 miles—5s. a week.

When the distance between the place of residence and the school is 5 miles or over, but is under 8 miles—7s. 6d. a week.

When the distance between the place of residence and the school is 8 miles or over—10s. a week.

Horse or horse-drawn vehicle—10s. a week.

Provided that in no case shall the reimbursement to a member travelling by motor car exceed 40s. a week or to a member travelling by motor cycle exceed 15s. a week.

25. Members travelling between part-time schools shall be reimbursed at the rate of 3s. a mile (one way) a week: Provided that the maximum reimbursement under this clause shall not exceed £1 10s. a week, and that the minimum distance, except in special cases approved by the Tribunal, shall be 3 miles.

26. The Tribunal may authorize reimbursement of other special expenses under the following circumstances:—

Where a married member of the teaching service is transferred or promoted to a position, and being unable to obtain a suitable residence, he is required to—

- (i) live away from his home and pay board and lodging, or
- (ii) pay board and lodging for himself and his family, or
- (iii) incur additional expenditure,

the Tribunal may authorize the payment to him of such allowance, by way of reimbursement, as it considers reasonable.

27. Where an unmarried member of the Teaching Service is appointed, promoted, or transferred to a position and is thereby required to live away from his home and to pay a weekly amount for board and lodging in excess of one-third of the weekly rate equivalent to his annual standard salary plus the amount prescribed under clause 48 of Part XII., Teaching Service (Classification, Salaries and Allowances) Regulations, the Tribunal may authorize payment of an allowance equal to one-half of the excess.

Provided that the allowance so calculated shall be taken to the nearest shilling, an amount of sixpence being taken to the next higher shilling, but no allowance shall be payable if the amount so determined is less than 2s.

Provided further that in no case shall the weekly allowance exceed 40s.

28. (a) Members who teach in their own schools for at least two hours in an evening and thereby find it necessary to have their evening meal away from their usual place of residence may be reimbursed an amount not exceeding 7s. 6d. for a meal: Provided that no payment shall be made unless the member is on full-time duty during the afternoon session of the evening concerned.

(b) Professional Officers who are required to work after office hours may be reimbursed an amount not exceeding 7s. 6d. for a meal: Provided that no such reimbursement shall be allowed unless the officer works after the prescribed time of ceasing duty for at least two hours in addition to the interval taken for such meal.

29. Members engaged at agricultural exhibitions at the Royal Agricultural Show shall be reimbursed at the following rate:—

Metropolitan members (4)—7s. 6d. a day.

Special Circumstances.

30. Where special circumstances exist for which provision is not made in this Regulation, the Tribunal may authorize such reimbursement as it deems reasonable.

AMENDMENT No. 193.

THE Teachers Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act 1946*, hereby amends the Teaching Service (Classification, Salaries and Allowances) Regulations in the manner following, that is to say:—

PART XI.—TEMPORARY TEACHERS.

1. Rescind clauses 25, 25A and 25B and substitute therefor the following clause:—

“25. The commencing salary shall also be subject to the following:—

- (a) For every two years' experience, approved by the Director, such salary shall be increased by one increment;
- (b) In the event of the remainder of such experience exceeding twelve months, the period in excess of such twelve months shall be regarded as approved service for the purpose of payment of increment.

Provided that a woman who prior to resignation for marriage was classified in Class III. or a higher class may, subject to approval by the Tribunal, be classified in Group I.”

2. Rescind sub-clause 28 (a) and substitute therefor the following sub-clause:—

“28 (a) A temporary teacher shall, subject to satisfactory service, be eligible to receive annual increments.”

(These amendments to take effect from and inclusive of the 1st January, 1957).

- that portion lying between a prolongation of the eastern property line of Campbell-road and a prolongation of the western property line of Walsh-street;
- that portion lying between a prolongation of the eastern property line of Cherry-street and a prolongation of the western property line of Iramoo-street;
- that portion lying between a prolongation of the eastern property line of Scheele-street and a prolongation of the western property line of Union-road;
- that portion lying between a prolongation of the eastern property line of Union-road and a prolongation of the western property line of Barton-street.

2. No person shall leave (whether unattended or not) a motor car or other vehicle standing at any time between the hours of 4.30 o'clock in the afternoon and 6.30 o'clock in the afternoon of any Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday or Friday in any of the following portions of that part of the carriageway of Whitehorse-road lying to the north of a line parallel to the northern boundary of such carriageway and running along the centre thereof:—

- that portion lying between a prolongation of the eastern property line of Burke-road and a line running south from a point on the northern property line of Whitehorse-road 120 feet west of the intersection of the western property line of Dale-street with the northern property line of Whitehorse-road;

- (b) that portion lying between a prolongation of the eastern property line of Campbell-road and a prolongation of the western property line of Leonard-street;
- (c) that portion lying between a prolongation of the eastern property line of Austin-street and a prolongation of the western property line of Brenbeal-street;
- (d) that portion lying between a prolongation of the eastern property line of Clapham-street and a prolongation of the western property line of Union-road;
- (e) that portion lying between a prolongation of the eastern property line of Union-road and a prolongation of the western property line of Smythe-street.

3. In this Regulation:

"Motor Car" has the same meaning as in section 3 of the *Motor Car Act* 1951.

"Property Line" in relation to either side of a street means the line forming the boundary between that street and the lands abutting on that side thereof.

"Street" includes road.

For the purpose of the prolongation of a property line regard shall not be had to that part of the property line which is along any street corner which has been rounded splayed or cut.

References in this Regulation to Whitehorse-road are references to that part thereof which lies within the Municipal District of the City of Camberwell.

4. Every wilful breach of this regulation shall be an offence and every person committing any such offence shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds.

CITY OF ESSENDON.

By-LAW No. 143.

A By-law of the City of Essendon made under the Local Government Acts, and numbered 143, for prohibiting or regulating the use of private property situate at the junction of streets or roads for the growing of trees, shrubs or hedges, requiring the reduction to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. of any portion of a fence within 30 other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local feet of the junction of any streets or roads and for Government Acts and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of Essendon order as follows:—

1. No person shall use any private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads for the growing of trees, shrubs or hedges abutting on any such street or road or within 10 feet therefrom or within a distance of 30 feet from the junction of any streets or roads unless no such tree, shrub or hedge at any time exceeds a height of 3 ft. 6 in. above the level of the portion of the street or road nearest to such tree, shrub or hedge.

2. The Council may at any time by notice in writing, under the hand of the Town Clerk require the owner of any private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads (within a time specified in such notice) to remove or lop (to a height specified in such notice) any trees, shrubs or hedges (whether planted before or after the coming into operation of this By-law) from or on such private property where such trees, shrubs or hedges abut on or are within 10 feet of any such street or road or within a distance of 30 feet from the junction of any streets or roads.

3. If any person fails to remove or lop any trees, shrubs or hedges growing or being on private property situate as aforesaid as required by or under this By-law, the Council may at the expense of the owner of such property remove or lop such trees, shrubs or hedges and the amount of such expense may be recovered by the Council in a Court of Petty Session as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

4. The Council may at any time by notice in writing under the hand of the Town Clerk require the owner of any land (within a time specified in such notice) to reduce to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. any portion of a fence on such land which is within thirty (30) feet of the junction of any streets or roads.

5. If any person fails to reduce in height any portion of a fence as required by or under this By-law the Council may at the expense of the owner of such fence, reduce in height such portion of such fence and the amount of such expense may be recovered by the Council in a Court of Petty Sessions as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Essendon.

REGULATIONS.

Regulations made by the Council of the City of Melbourne in pursuance of the provisions of Section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1928* to provide for the routes to be

observed by all carriages, carts, vehicles and persons and/or keeping order in parts of Flinders-street, Wellington-parade and Wellington-parade south, Jolimont-road and between Clarendon-street and Jolimont-terrace, and for preventing any obstruction thereof.

THE Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby in pursuance of the powers conferred by the provisions of Section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1928* and by every other act or power enabling it in that behalf order as follows:—

1. In these Regulations unless the context otherwise requires—

"Alignment" in relation to either side of a street or road means the line forming the boundary between the street or road and the lands abutting on that side of the street or road.

"Horse" includes any draught animal or beast of burden.

"One-way street system" and "system" mean the areas of roadway within the area of land commencing at the intersection of the north-western alignment of Flinders-street with the south-western alignment of Spring-street and bounded by the prolongation north-eastward of the said north-western alignment of Flinders-street to its intersection with the prolongation westward of the northern alignment of Wellington-parade, thence by the said northern alignment of Wellington-parade and prolongations thereof eastward to the point where the latter alignment so prolonged intersects the eastern alignment of Clarendon-street, thence by the prolongation southward of the said eastern alignment of Clarendon-street to its intersection with the prolongation eastward of the southern alignment of Wellington-parade south, thence by the said southern alignment of Wellington-parade south and prolongations thereof westward to the point where the latter alignment so prolonged intersects the said north-western alignment of Flinders-street and thence by the said north-western alignment of Flinders-street north-eastward to the commencing point.

"Eastern restricted area" means that portion of Wellington-parade east of the prolongation northward of the eastern alignment of Jolimont-road and west of the prolongation southward of the western alignment of Clarendon-street.

"Western restricted area" means that portion of Wellington-parade which lies south of the centre line of Wellington-parade east of the prolongation south-eastward of the north-eastern alignment of Spring-street and west of the prolongation northward of the western alignment of Jolimont-road.

"Island" means any raised paving, safety zone, place of refuge or other works or structures wholly or partly within the one-way street system erected for protecting pedestrians or regulating traffic.

(Explanatory diagram is shown in the Schedule to these Regulations.)

"Vehicle" includes any conveyance (other than a tram car) drawn or propelled by human animal mechanical electrical or other power and includes a motor car. Words importing the masculine gender include females and words in the singular include the plural and words in the plural include the singular.

2. No person in charge of a horse or animal-drawn vehicle shall cause that horse or vehicle to enter the eastern restricted area or the western restricted area and no person in charge of a vehicle other than an animal-drawn vehicle shall cause that vehicle to enter either such area except for the purpose of leaving the vehicle standing in an area appointed under any Regulation as a standing place for motor cars or other vehicles.

3. Every vehicle or horse within the one-way street system shall between the point of its entry into and the point of its departure from the system proceed north-eastward when in Flinders-street, eastward when in Wellington-parade, southward when in Jolimont-road or the road leading from the intersection of Wellington-parade and Clarendon-street to Wellington-parade south and westward when in Wellington-parade south subject to the following exceptions, namely:—

(a) a vehicle or horse proceeding north-eastward in Flinders-street may for the purpose of leaving the system proceed northward into Spring-street;

(b) a vehicle or horse proceeding eastward in Wellington-parade may for the purpose of leaving the system proceed northward into Lansdowne-street or Clarendon-street;

- (c) a vehicle or horse proceeding eastward in Wellington-parade may for the purpose of leaving Wellington-parade proceed southward into Jolimont-road or into the road leading southward from the intersection of Wellington-parade and Clarendon-street to Wellington-parade south;
 - (d) a vehicle or horse proceeding westward in Wellington-parade south may for the purpose of leaving the system proceed southward into Jolimont-terrace, Charles-street, Agnes-street or Jolimont-road;
 - (e) a vehicle or horse proceeding westward in Wellington-parade south may for the purpose of leaving Wellington-parade south proceed northward into Flinders-street or south-westward into Flinders-street continuing in that direction until it leaves the system;
 - (f) a vehicle or horse may enter the system from the east at the intersection of Wellington-parade and Clarendon-street then turn to the right and proceed northward into Clarendon-street or turn to the left and proceed southward into the road leading from the said intersection to Wellington-parade south;
 - (g) a vehicle when leaving the eastern restricted area may proceed westward to the prolongation northward of the eastern alignment of Jolimont-road then turn to the left and proceed southward into Jolimont-road;
4. (1) Every vehicle or horse within the one-way street system shall when passing an island proceed so as to keep the island on its right or off side subject to the following exceptions:—
- (a) a vehicle or horse proceeding northward from Wellington-parade south into Flinders-street shall keep the island at the intersection of those two streets on its left or near side;
 - (b) a vehicle or horse proceeding southward from Wellington-parade in order to travel westward in Wellington-parade south shall keep any island wholly situated to the south of the northern alignment of Wellington-parade south on its left or near side;
 - (c) a vehicle or horse proceeding southward into Jolimont-road, after having proceeded eastward in Wellington-parade shall keep the island in the intersection of those streets on its left or near side;
 - (d) a vehicle or horse proceeding eastward along Wellington-parade shall keep the island in the intersection of those streets on its left or near side;
 - (d) a vehicle or horse proceeding eastward along Wellington-parade shall keep the island partly in the intersection of Wellington-parade and Lansdowne-street on its left or near side;
 - (e) a vehicle or horse proceeding north-eastward from Flinders-street into Wellington-parade shall keep the island partly in the intersection of those streets and Spring-street on its left or near side;
 - (f) a vehicle or horse proceeding northward into Clarendon-street after having entered the intersection of Wellington-parade and Clarendon-street from the east shall keep the island in such intersection on its left or near side.
- (2) Every vehicle or horse proceeding southward in Jolimont-road below the Melbourne to Clifton Hill Railway Bridge shall proceed so as to keep the centre supporting piers of the said bridge on its right or off side.
5. Any person in charge of any vehicle or horse who causes that vehicle or horse to proceed in contravention of these Regulations whether wilfully or not except by express direction or permission of a police constable or an officer of the Council shall be guilty of an offence and liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and not less than Five pounds.

CITY OF MELBOURNE.

By-LAW No. 367.

A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under Part VII Division 1 of the *Local Government Act 1946* and numbered 367 to provide for the regulation of traffic in parts of Flinders-street, Wellington-parade and Wellington-parade south, Jolimont-road, and between Clarendon-street and Jolimont-terrace and for other purposes.

THE Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946* and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf order as follows:—

1. In this By-law unless the context otherwise requires—

“Alignment” in relation to either side of a street or road means the line forming the boundary between the street or road and the lands abutting on that side of the street or road.

“Horse” includes any draught animal or beast of burden.

“One-way street system” and “system” mean the areas of roadway within the area of land commencing at the intersection of the north-western alignment of Flinders-street with the south-western alignment of Spring-street and bounded by the prolongation north-eastward of the said north-western alignment of Flinders-street to its intersection with the prolongation westward of the northern alignment of Wellington-parade, thence by the said northern alignment of Wellington-parade and prolongations thereof eastward to the point where the latter alignment so prolonged intersects the eastern alignment of Clarendon-street, thence by the prolongation southward of the said eastern alignment of Clarendon-street to its intersection with the prolongation eastward of the southern alignment of Wellington-parade south, thence by the said southern alignment of Wellington-parade south and prolongations thereof westward to the point where the latter alignment so prolonged intersects the said north-western alignment of Flinders-street and thence by the said north-western alignment of Flinders-street north-eastward to the commencing point.

“Eastern restricted area” means that portion of Wellington-parade which lies south of the centre line of Wellington-parade, east of the prolongation northward of the eastern alignment of Jolimont-road and west of the prolongation southward of the western alignment of Clarendon-street.

“Western restricted area” means that portion of Wellington-parade which lies south of the centre line of Wellington-parade east of the prolongation south-eastward of the north-eastern alignment of Spring-street and west of the prolongation northward of the western alignment of Jolimont-road.

“Island” means any raised paving, safety zone, place of refuge or other works or structures wholly or partly within the one-way street system erected for protecting pedestrians or regulating traffic.

(Explanatory diagram is shown in the Schedule to this By-law.)

“Vehicle” includes any conveyance (other than a tram car) drawn or propelled by human animal mechanical electrical or other power and includes a motor car. Words importing the masculine gender include females and words in the singular include the plural and words in the plural include the singular.

2. No person in charge of a horse or animal-drawn vehicle shall cause that horse or vehicle to enter the eastern restricted area or the western restricted area and no person in charge of a vehicle other than an animal-drawn vehicle shall cause that vehicle to enter either such area except for the purpose of leaving the vehicle standing in an area appointed under any By-law as a standing place for motor cars or other vehicles.

3. Every vehicle or horse within the one-way street system shall between the point of its entry into and the point of its departure from the system proceed north-eastward when in Flinders-street, eastward when in Wellington-parade, southward when in Jolimont-road or the road leading from the intersection of Wellington-parade and Clarendon-street to Wellington-parade south and westward when in Wellington-parade south subject to the following exceptions, namely—

- (a) a vehicle or horse proceeding north-eastward in Flinders-street may for the purpose of leaving the system proceed northward into Spring-street;

- (b) a vehicle or horse proceeding eastward in Wellington-parade may for the purpose of leaving the system proceed northward into Lansdowne-street or Clarendon-street;
- (c) a vehicle or horse proceeding eastward in Wellington-parade may for the purpose of leaving Wellington-parade proceed southward into Jolimont-road or into the road leading southward from the intersection of Wellington-parade and Clarendon-street to Wellington-parade south;
- (d) a vehicle or horse proceeding westward in Wellington-parade south may for the purpose of leaving the system proceed southward into Jolimont-terrace, Charles-street, Agnes-street or Jolimont-road;
- (e) a vehicle or horse proceeding westward in Wellington-parade south may for the purpose of leaving Wellington-parade south proceed northward into Flinders-street or south-westward into Flinders-street or south-westward into Flinders-street continuing in that direction until it leaves the system;
- (f) a vehicle or horse may enter the system from the east at the intersection of Wellington-parade and Clarendon-street then turn to the right and proceed northward into Clarendon-street or turn to the left and proceed southward into the road leading from the said intersection to Wellington-parade south;
- (g) a vehicle when leaving the eastern restricted area may proceed westward to the prolongation northward of the eastern alignment of Jolimont-road then turn to the left and proceed southward into Jolimont-road;
4. (1) Every vehicle or horse within the one-way street system shall when passing an island proceed so as to keep the island on its right or off side subject to the following exceptions—
- (a) a vehicle or horse proceeding northward from Wellington-parade south into Flinders-street shall keep the island at the intersection of those two streets on its left or near side;
- (b) a vehicle or horse proceeding southward from Wellington-parade in order to travel westward in Wellington-parade south shall keep any island wholly situated to the south of the northern alignment of Wellington-parade south on its left or near side;
- (c) a vehicle or horse proceeding southward into Jolimont-road after having proceeded eastward in Wellington-parade shall keep the island in the intersection of those streets on its left or near side;
- (d) a vehicle or horse proceeding eastward along Wellington-parade shall keep the island partly in the intersection of Wellington-parade and Lansdowne-street on its left or near side;
- (e) a vehicle or horse proceeding north-eastward from Flinders-street into Wellington-parade shall keep the island partly in the intersection of those streets and Spring-street on its left or near side;
- (f) a vehicle or horse proceeding northward into Clarendon-street after having entered the intersection of Wellington-parade and Clarendon-street from the east shall keep the island in such intersection on its left or near side.
- (2) Every vehicle or horse proceeding southward in Jolimont-road below the Melbourne to Clifton Hill Railway Bridge shall proceed so as to keep the centre supporting piers of the said bridge on its right or off side.
5. Any person in charge of any vehicle or horse who causes that vehicle or horse to proceed in contravention of this By-law whether wilfully or not except by express direction or permission of a police constable or an officer of the Council shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales 6 Vict. No. 18 and numbered 365 to fix, impose and levy tolls and dues at the Cattle Market of the City of Melbourne.

WHEREAS by Section VI. of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales 6 Victoria No. 18 intituled "An Act to amend an Act passed in the sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty intituled 'an Act to incorporate the inhabitants of the Town of Melbourne'" the Council of the said Town (now City) is empowered to make By-laws fixing tolls or dues to be imposed and levied in the Markets of the said Town.

Now therefore the Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby in pursuance of the power conferred by the said Act 6 Victoria No. 18 and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf order as follows:—

- The provisions of By-law No. 344 are hereby repealed.
- In this By-law the expression "Cattle Market" means the Market of the City of Melbourne bounded by Smithfield-road, Racecourse-road, Bellair-street, Market-street and Epsom-road, Flemington, in the said City.
- From and after the date of this By-law coming into operation the following tolls and dues are fixed as the tolls and dues to be imposed and levied at the Cattle Market in respect to the matters hereinafter mentioned and the same shall be imposed and levied accordingly:—

(a) For the selling or exposing for sale in the Cattle Market—

For every horse, mare, gelding, foal, ass or mule	1	6
For every head of neat cattle (including bulls)	1	6
For every goat	0	1½
For every sheep or lamb	0	1½

(b) For permitting any stock to remain in the yards at the Cattle Market for every day or part of a day—

For every horse, mare, gelding, foal, ass or mule	0	9
For every head of neat cattle (excluding bulls)	1	0
For every bull	2	0
For every sheep, lamb or goat	0	1½

For the purposes of this clause a day shall be deemed to commence at midnight and end on the following midnight.

CITY OF OAKLEIGH.

BY-LAW No. 138.

(i) All that land being lots 106 and 107 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 11724, and having a total frontage of 122 ft. 1½ in. to the south side of Dandenong-road.

- (ii) All that land contained in certificate of title, vol. 8096, folio 026, and having a frontage of 261 ft. 1½ in. to the south side of Dandenong-road.
- (iii) All that land being lot No. 27 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 25118, situate at the corner of Dandenong-road and Surrey-crescent; and
- (iv) All that land being lots 1, 2, and 3 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 25118 having frontages to Dandenong-road, and lot 4 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 25118 having a frontage to Surrey-crescent.

CITY OF WARRNAMBOOL.

BY-LAW No. 113.

A By-law of the City of Warrnambool, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1946*, and numbered 113, for appointing in streets and roads standing places for motor cars, for regulating the use of such standing places, and for the amendment of By-law Nos. 106 and 110 of the City of Warrnambool.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946*, and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Warrnambool order as follows:—

1. (a) Clause 5 of the said By-law No. 106 is hereby repealed.

(b) Sub-paragraph (f) of clause 8 of By-law No. 106 is hereby repealed.

(c) Clause 11 (c) (ii) of the said By-law No. 106 is hereby amended by deleting the words "in Korolt-street" therein appearing.

(d) The second part of the Third Schedule to the said By-law No. 106 is hereby amended by inserting therein the following words:—"Pertobe-road, south side, commencing to a point distant 48 ft. 6 in. north-easterly from a point opposite to the centre of the main entrance to the Beach Kiosk and extending north-easterly for a distance of 142 ft. 6 in."

2. (a) Clause 5 of the said By-law No. 110 is hereby repealed and in lieu thereof there shall be inserted the following clause:—

"5. No driver may park his motor car in a limited parking area for a period longer than two hours on Mondays to Fridays between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. and on Saturdays between the hours of 8 a.m. and 12 noon."

(b) The Schedule to the said By-law No. 110 shall be amended by inserting therein the following limited parking area: "Fairy-street, from Raglan-parade to Korolt-street on both sides".

3. A driver of a vehicle shall when stopping or leaving a vehicle unattended in any of the parts of the streets specified in the First Schedule hereto place such vehicles in such a position that the left or near wheels (if such vehicle has four or more wheels) or (if such vehicle has less than four wheels) the left or near side of such vehicle is parallel with and not more than 10 inches from the edge of the kerb of the footpath at the left or near side of the street and that such vehicle is not less than 3 feet from any other vehicle.

4. A driver of a vehicle shall not stop his vehicle or permit the same to remain stationary (otherwise than for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers or goods and then only for so long as shall reasonably be necessary for such purpose) or any of the parts of the streets specified in the Second Schedule hereto.

5. Any wilful contravention of the foregoing provisions by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law, and every person who is guilty of any such offence shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Warrnambool.

THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

Raglan-parade:

South side, between Liebeg-street and Kepler-street.

On the south side of the southern carriageway, between Banyan-street and Liebeg-street, and between Kepler-street and Henna-street.

On the northern side of the northern carriageway, between Banyan-street and Darling-street, and between Kepler-street and Botanic-road.

THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

Raglan-parade:

On the south side of the northern carriageway, between Banyan-street and Darling-street, and between Kepler-street and Jamieson-street.

Pertobe-road:

West side, between Merri-street and a point situate 485 feet south from the southern boundary of the reserve known as Apex Park.

A hairdresser's shop, beauty parlour or other like establishment, or a chiropodist's establishment £1 0 0

BOROUGH OF MOE.

BY-LAW No. 4.

A By-law of the Borough of Moe, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1946, and numbered 4 for the purpose of—

- (a) prohibiting the deposit or leaving of refuse or rubbish on streets, roads, lanes, or passages;
- (b) prohibiting or regulating the deposit or leaving of refuse or rubbish on any land; and
- (c) requiring the removal or destruction by the owner or occupier of any land of refuse or rubbish thereon (other than refuse or rubbish, the removal of which the Council of the Borough of Moe has undertaken or contracted for under section 39 of the *Health Act* 1928).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Moe order as follows:—

1. No person shall either directly or indirectly in any manner whatsoever deposit or leave, or cause to be deposited or left, any refuse or rubbish on any street, road, lane, or passage, or on any land within the Borough of Moe.

2. The owner or occupier of any land on which any refuse or rubbish (other than refuse or rubbish the removal of which the Council of the Borough of Moe has undertaken or contracted for under section 39 of the *Health Act* 1928) is deposited or left, on receiving written notice from such Council under the hand of its Town Clerk, or of such officer of the municipality who may for the time being be acting on behalf of the Town Clerk, requiring such owner or occupier to remove or effectually destroy any such refuse or rubbish, shall comply with such notice within seven days after the receipt thereof.

3. If default shall be made in compliance with any notice in respect of refuse or rubbish referred to in the preceding clause, then notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the said Council by its inspector or any other of its officers, or by any authorized agent or agents, with a sufficient number of workmen to enter upon any land upon which such refuse or rubbish is deposited or left, and if necessary for that purpose to open forcibly or break down any gate on such land, or to break down any part of any fence surrounding the said land, and to remove and destroy such refuse or rubbish and any expense incurred thereby shall be made good, and paid by the owner or occupier of the said land to the said Council on demand, and in default of such payment the same may be recovered by the Council from such owner or occupier in any court of competent jurisdiction.

4. Any person who shall by any wilful act or default commit a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall for any such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Twenty pounds, and in event of notice having been given to the owner or occupier, as the case may be, in pursuance of clause 2 hereof, and of non-compliance with such notice, such offence shall be a continuing offence, and the offender shall be liable to a further penalty of not more than £1 per day for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction or order by any court.

5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Moe.

BY-LAW No. 42.

A By-law of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh, made under the Local Government Acts, and numbered 42, for prescribing residential and business areas and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, and of any and every other Act or power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh order as follows:—

1. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

“Extractive industry” means and includes mining and quarrying and the extraction from any land and the treatment thereon of sand, gravel, clay, turf, soil, rock, stone or similar substances.

“Rural industry” means and includes the businesses or industries of grazing, dairying, pig farming, poultry farming, bee keeping, viticulture, horticulture, fruit growing, vegetable growing, or the growing of crops of any kind, but does not include the sale of any goods or chattels by retail.

“Rural industry dwelling” means any dwelling erected on land used for the purposes of a rural industry, an extractive industry, or the milling of timber, but only if such dwelling is used solely for occupation by the owner of the industry carried on on such land or by employees employed by him in connexion with such industry.

2. The areas described in the First and Second Schedules hereto are hereby prescribed as residential areas.

3. No person shall, in any such residential areas as are described in the First Schedule hereto, use any land or erect or adapt for use or use any building for the purposes of any class of trade, industry, manufacture, business, or public amusement other than a rural industry. For the purposes of this clause the term “rural industry” shall not include pig farming.

4. No person shall in any such residential area as is described in the Second Schedule hereto use any land or erect or adapt for use or use any building for the purposes of any extractive industry or for pig farming or milling timber.

5. The areas described in the Third and Fourth Schedules hereto are hereby prescribed as business areas.

6. No person shall within any such business areas as are described in the Third Schedule hereto use any land or erect or adapt for use or use any building or portion of a building for the purposes of any extractive industry or of the trades or businesses of pig farming or milling timber.

7. No person shall within any such business area as is described in the Fourth Schedule hereto use any land or erect or adapt for use or use any building or portion of a building for the purposes of a dwelling (other than a rural industry dwelling) or for the purposes of any class of trade, industry, manufacture, business, or public amusement other than a rural industry, an extractive industry, or the trade or business of milling timber: Provided always that nothing in this clause contained shall preclude any person who is carrying on a rural industry on any land from selling by retail any of the produce of such industry from any building erected on such land if such building is situated at a distance of not less than 100 feet from any street or road.

8. No person shall on, from, or after the 31st day of December, 1956—

- (a) erect or use on any land within the municipal district of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh any tent or other temporary structure or building for the sale of goods therein or therefrom; or
- (b) sell any goods in or from any such tent, structure, or building.

9. No person shall sell any goods from any stall, motor car, truck, barrow, or any other vehicle, box, basket, crate, bag, or other receptacle standing or placed on vacant land (not being Crown land or land under the care and management of the municipality or a public place within the meaning of section 3 of the *Public Offences Act 1928*) within the municipal district of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh,

10. No person shall sell any goods from any stall, motor car, truck, cart, barrow, box, basket, crate, bag, or other vehicle or receptacle standing or placed on any street, road, or public place within the municipal district of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh.

11. Any person guilty of a continuing offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £5 for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.
