PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF PART XLIII. TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICTS OF THE CITIES OF NUNAWADING AND SUNSHINE AND TO PART OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF BROADMEADOWS.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 793 of the Local Government Act 1946 provides, inter alia, that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, extend the operation of Part XLIII. of the Act to any city or town, or, at the request of the council concerned, to any other municipality or part thereof:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of Part XLIII. of the Local Government Act 1946 to the

municipal districts of the Cities of Nunawading and Sunshine, and to that part of the municipal district of the City of Broadmeadows to which the operation of the said Part has not been previously extended.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Vegetation Diseases (Fruit Fly) Act 1947 (No. 5258), it is amongst other things enacted that any Proclamation made under section 3 of the said Act may be revoked by a subsequent Proclamation: Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby revoke this my Proclamation hereby revoke-

- A. The Proclamation made on the 27th September 1955 relating to the Shire of Oxley.
- B. The Proclamation made on the 27th September 1955 as amended on the 4th September 1956 relating to the Shires of Rutherglen, Wodonga, Towong, Upper Murray, Omeo, Bairnsdale, Tambo and Orbost, and the Borough of Wangaratta.
- C. The Proclamation made on the 10th April 1956 as amended on the 24th April 1956 and the 4th September 1956 relating to the Cities of Northcote, Collingwood, Fitzroy, Heidelberg and Kew and the Shires of Maffra, Morwell, Narracan, Rosedale and Traralgon and the Borough of Moe.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,

1. Declare that portion of Victoria-

Within the Shires of Bairnsdale. Upper Murray, Omeo, Orbost, Tambo, Towong and Wodonga, to be a proclaimed area.

- 2. Prohibit the removal from any place within the area prescribed in 1. above to any other place within the area or to any place outside the area of any fruit or vegetable or any case or package which has contained any fruit or vegetable unless such removal is made on the instruction of an inspector.
- 3. Require occupiers and owners of land, not being a commercial orchard, in the proclaimed area to apply to all trees and plants of the following kinds:—

Apples, apricots, brambles and other berry fruits, appress, appress, cherries, citrus fruits, cucumbers, egg fruit, figs, gooseberries, grapes, guavas, loquats, medlars; nectarines, passion fruit, peaches, pears, peppers, persimmons, plums, prunes, quinces, rock melons, sweet melons, tomatoes and all other trees and plants which have edible fruits.

one of the following treatments:-

- of the following treatments:—

  (a) Thoroughly spray with an efficient garden spray pump the whole of the foliage with a solution containing Two thousand (2,000) parts of Dichloro-diphenyl-trichloroethane (D.D.T.) to One million (1,000,000) parts of water (0-2 per cent.) at intervals of not more than twenty-one (21) days commencing at the time fruit on such trees and plants has set and continuing until one (1) month after it has been harvested, or
- (b) Apply by spraying, or by splashing the required quantity of solution on the foliage of trees and plants by any suitable method such as with a large paint brush dipped in an open container or from a bottle with a perforated stopper at intervals not longer than seven (7) days commencing at the time the fruit has set and continuing until one (1) month after it has

been harvested to the foliage on at least three (3) different parts of each tree and to the foliage of all plants a solution consisting of two (2) ounces of tartar emetic and two and one-half (2½) pounds of white sugar in four (4) gallons of water, or a solution consisting of two (2) ounces of sodium fluosilicate and two and one-half (2½) pounds of white sugar in four (4) gallons of water, at the rate of ten (10) fluid ounces per tree and ten (10) fluid ounces per Two hundred (200) square feet of planted area of such plants.

- 4. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take action as and when directed by a notice served on such occupier or owner by an inspector and within the time specified in such notice—
  - (a) To remove all plants of-Tomato (Lycopersicum sp.),
    Pepper (Capsicum sp.),
    Egg Plant (Solanum melongena).
    Ornamental Solanum (Solanum sp.),
    Rock Melon (Cucumis sp.),
    Sweet Melon (Cucumis sp.),
    Cleumber (Cheumis sp.)

Sweet Melon (Cucumis sp.),
Cucumber (Cucumis sp.),
Cape Gooseberry (Physalis edulis),
Brambles (except cultivated varieties),
Box Thorn, provided that where box thorn is
grown as a hedge along a boundary or
dividing fence the occupier or owner may
continue to so grow it on the following conditions:-

- (i) Cut back the hedge forthwith and periodically as necessary to retain it within a height not exceeding six (6) feet from the ground level and a width not exceeding two (2) feet.
- width not exceeding two (2) feet.

  (ii) That when such hedge has been cut back to within the foregoing dimensions, he shall thoroughly spray it forthwith to cover all parts of the plants forming the hedge with a solution containing Two thousand (2,000) parts of two-four Dichlorophenoxy-acetic acid (2-4D), or one of its derivatives, to One million (1,000,000) parts of water (0.2 per cent.) and he shall spray it thereafter as often as is necessary to prevent the plants from forming fruit,

and refrain from planting such plants while this Proclamation remains in force.

(b) To remove from all trees and plants growing upon the said land and to pick up from the said land all of the following fruits and/or

Apples, apricots, brambles and other berry fruits, cape gooseberries, cherries, citrus fruits, cucumbers, egg fruit, figs, gooseberries, grapes, guavas, loquats, medlars, nectarines, passion fruit, peaches, pears, peppers, persimmons, plums, prunes, quinces, rock melons, sweet melons, tomatoes and all edible fruits of all trees and plants, including all such fruit and vegetables which shall form on such trees and plants after the service of the said notice during such time as this Proclamation remains in force.

- force.

  (c) To dispose of all such fruits and/or vegetables by boiling for fifteen (15) minutes, or burning them so as to destroy all eggs and larvæ of the fruit fly or burying them under a depth of soil of at least 3 feet after having applied to the upper layer of such buried fruit or vegetables D.D.T. at the rate of not less than one-half ounce per square yard in the form of a spray containing not less than 0.2 per cent. of the pure para para isomer of D.D.T. or in the form of a dust containing not less than 2 per cent. of the pure para para isomer of D.D.T. or by otherwise treating them as an inspector may direct, in such a manner as to kill all eggs, larvæ and pupæ of fruit flies.

  (d) To spray all trees and plants growing on the
- (d) To spray all trees and plants growing on the said land with a solution containing Two thousand (2,000) parts of Dichloro-diphenyltrichloro-ethane (D.D.T.) to One million parts of water (0·2 per cent.) (or in the case of a commercial orchard equipped with a power spraying plant approved by an inspector, with a solution containing One thousand (1,000) parts

- of D.D.T. to One million parts of water (0.1 per cent.), at intervals not exceeding twenty-one (21) days during the period specified in such notice, and/or with such other solution as is specified in the said notice and at times specified therein.
- (e) To treat the soil beneath and around trees suspected by an inspector to be infested or to have been infested with fruit fly by applying uniformly to the surface of an area or areas marked by an inspector a dust containing 1 per cent. of the pure gamma isomer of Benzene hexachloride at the rate of not less than two (2) ounces per square yard, and/or by giving such other treatment as is specified in the said notice.
- (f) To reduce, if necesary, all tall growing trees and plants covered by this Proclamation, except when grown as a commercial orchard or plantation, to a height which will permit them to be stripped of fruit and/or sprayed to the satisfaction of an inspector.
- 5. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to give access to such land at all times to an inspector with or without assistants for the purpose of an inspection and/or applying on such properties any spray material and/or for the purpose of removing any fruit or vegetables or prohibited plant, and/or performing such other acts which in the opinion of an inspector are necessary for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit flies.

### RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

- 1. Rule 110 is hereby amended as follows:--
  - (a) For the words "with the Master within twenty-eight days of such pronouncement" there shall be substituted the words "within 28 days of such pronouncement with the Prothonotary who shall transmit it as soon as possible to the Master to be settled."
  - (b) The words "the Master or" and the expression "(as the case may be)" shall be repealed.
- In clause (b) of paragraph (1) of Rule 143 for the words "Twenty pounds" there shall be substituted the words "Forty pounds."
- For Rule 144 there shall be substituted the following rule:—
   "144. An application under Section 114 of the Marriage Act or under Rule 143 shall be made by summons supported by affidavit"







# EGG AND EGG PULP MARKETING BOARD REGULATIONS AMENDED.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Marketing of Primary Products Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and on the recommendation of the Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board, doth hereby further amend the Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board Regulations 1953 made on the 21st July, 1953, as amended on the 9th November, 1954, and the 17th July, 1956, as follows (that is to say):—

Regulation 35 shall be deleted and the following Regulation shall be substituted in lieu thereof:—

- "35. (1) (a) Any officer, servant, or employee of the Board duly authorized by the Board in that behalf may from time to time and at any time by notice in writing order any producer who owns or controls, or has upon his premises more than 40 female domesticated fowls to furnish to him a return in or to the effect of Form 5 of the Schedule setting out in respect of each period specified in such notice the number of eggs produced by female domesticated fowls which during each such period were owned or controlled by him or were upon his premises, and setting out the manner in which and the names and addresses of the person or persons to whom such eggs were disposed of.
- (b) Any officer, servant or employee of the Board duly authorized by the Board in that behalf may from time to time and at any time by notice in writing order any producer who at any time within twelve months immediately preceding such notice has owned or controlled or had upon his premises more than 40 female domesticated fowls to furnish to him a return in or to the effect of Form 5 of the Schedule setting out in respect of each period specified in such notice the number of eggs produced by female domesticated fowls which during each such period were owned or controlled by him or were upon his premises and setting out the manner in which and the names and addresses of the person or persons to whom such eggs were disposed of.
- (c) No notice pursuant to this Regulation shall require any return relating to eggs produced more than two years prior to the date of the giving of such notice.

- (2) Such producer shall furnish such return to such person so authorized within the time specified in such notice. Such return shall be signed by such producer whose signature shall be attested by a Justice of the Peace.
- (3) Such return shall set out in respect of each period so specified in such notice all the information required by subregulation (1) hereof to be set out, and whenever in any such period no eggs were in fact produced by such female domesticated fowls such return shall expressly so state.
- (4) Any producer who omits to furnish such return to such person so authorized within the time specified in such notice and any producer who furnishes a return which is incorrect or incomplete in any particular shall be guilty of a contravention of these Regulations."

- (a) For the expression "Form 4 (Regulation 35)." there shall be substituted the expression "Form 4 (Regulation 34)."





A By-law of the City of Broadmeadows, made under sections 197 (1) (ii), 197 (1) (xiv), 212, 213 (1), 222, and 228 (1) of the Local Government Act 1946 and all other powers thereunto enabling, passed by a special order of the Council of the City of Broadmeadows, sealed with the common seal of the City of Broadmeadows, advertised in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Acts, and numbered 6, for the purpose of regulating the proceedings of Council meetings, committee meetings, and other meetings conducted by the City of Broadmeadows, and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1946 and in pursuance of all other powers it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Broadmeadows orders as follows:—

#### Short Title

1. This By-law may be cited as the Meetings Procedure By-law.

Commencement and Area of Operation.

2. This By-law shall come into operation on the day after publication in the Government Gazette of-

(a) this By-law; or(b) notice of its making,

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

#### Definitions.

4. In this By-law, unless the contrary appears-

(a) The under-mentioned words and phrases bear the following meanings:-

(i) "Act" means the Local Government Act 1946 as from time to time amended and consolidated;
(ii) "agenda" means the notice of an ordinary, special, or committee

time amended and consolidated;
(ii) "agenda" means the notice of an ordinary, special, or committee meeting;
(iii) "By-law" means a By-law of the City;
(iv) "chairman" means the chairman of a meeting, and includes a temporary or a substitute chairman;
(v) "City" means the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Broadmeadows;
(vi) "clause" means a clause of this By-law;
(vii) "committee" means a committee of the Council;
(viii) "common seal" means the common seal of the City;
(ix) "Councillor" means the Council of the City;
(x) "Councillor" means a person for the time being holding office as a Councillor of the City;
(xi) "Mayor" means a person for the time being holding the office of Mayor of the City;
(xii) "municipal district" means the area from time to time comprising the municipal district of the City;
(xiii) "ordinary meeting" means an ordinary meeting of the Council.
(xiv) "public holiday" means a public holiday observed in the municipal district, and includes a bank holiday, but does not include a Saturday or a half-holiday;
(xv) "ratepayer" means a ratepayer of the City;
(xvii) "resident" means a person who has a place of residence within the municipal district;
(xviii) "Special meeting" means a special meeting of the Council;
(xviii) "Town Clerk" means the person for the time being holding the office of Town Clerk of the City, and includes any person from time to time acting as Town Clerk;
(xix) "Town Hall" means the Town Hall of the City; and
(xx) "visitor" means any person other than a Councillor or an officer or employee of the City.

(b) Words-

(i) of singular meaning include the plural;(ii) of masculine gender include the feminine; and vice versa.

### Notice of Council Meeting.

5. (a) The annual meeting of the Council shall be held at the Town Hall at 10 a.m. on the fourth day after the day on which the returning officer declares the candidates elected at the annual election.

(b) If the fourth day is a Sunday the annual meeting shall be held on the Monday following.

(c) The Mayor shall be elected at the annual meeting.

6. (a) An ordinary meeting shall be held at the Town Hall at 8 p.m. on each alternate Monday commencing with the first Monday in February of each year.

(b) If an ordinary meeting day falls on a public holiday the meeting shall be d on the next meeting day. held on the next

7. (a) A special meeting shall be held at the Town Hall at the time and date specified in its agenda.

(b) A special meeting shall not be held-

(i) before 6 p.m., unless the agenda states why it is to start earlier;

(ii) on a Sunday; (iii) on a public holiday.

8. (a) A Councillor desiring to bring any matter before the Council shall give the Town Clerk notice of the motion or a notice of business.

(b) A notice of business shall in every case suffice and no notice of motion shall be required.

#### Quorum.

Council quorum. Failure to raise

- 12. The quorum for a Council meeting is a simple majority of the whole Council. 13. (a) If a quorum is not present within 30 minutes after the time for which a Council meeting was convened—
  - (i) the meeting may be adjourned for not more than seven days by-
    - (a) the majority of the Councillors present; or
    - (b) one Councillor, if only one is present; or(c) the Town Clerk, if no Councillor is present;
  - (ii) the Town Clerk (except in the case of an adjournment to later on the same day) shall give a notice of the adjourned meeting to all Councillors.
  - (b) A notice under this clause shall comply with clause 10.

Failure of quorum during meeting.

- 14. (a) If a quorum fails after a Council meeting has commenced the meeting shall lapse.
- (b) If an ordinary meeting lapses the Town Clerk shall include the undisposed-of business in the agenda for the next ordinary meeting.

#### Admission of Public.

Right to attend ordinary meeting.

Special seating for certain visitors.

- 15. All ordinary meetings shall be held with open doors, unless it becomes necessary to exclude visitors on account of their disorderly conduct.
- 16. (a) Special and committee meetings shall be held in camera, unless at least a majority of the whole Council votes in favour of the meeting or some part of it being Attendance at special and committee meetings. held with open doors.
  - (b) Officers of the City and persons engaged by the City to advise the Council may attend a meeting held in camera, unless the Council otherwise directs.
  - 17. The Mayor may invite a visitor to sit beside him or at the Council table, unless in the particular case the Council otherwise resolves.

### Chairman.

- 18. (a) The Mayor shall be chairman of every public meeting at which he is present.
- (b) If the Mayor is absent from any part of a public meeting, one of the Councillors present shall be elected to act as temporary chairman in his absence.

Substitute chairman.

(c) If the Mayor refuses to act or is incapable of acting, one of the Councillors may be elected as a substitute chairman.

38. (a) The motion to proceed to the next business shall not be moved-

(i) by any Councillor who has spoken to the motion then before the Council or to any amendment of it; or

(ii) while any Councillor is speaking.

(b) The motion to proceed to the next business shall not be amended and shall be put to the vote immediately it is moved and seconded.

(c) If the motion to proceed to the next business is carried in respect of an amendment the consideration of the motion then before the Council shall proceed without reference to that amendment.

(d) If the motion to proceed to the next business is carried in respect of a motion that motion cannot be further debated or voted upon at that meeting.

#### Special Orders

39. (a) The procedure to make a special order is-

(i) notice of the proposed motion shall be given in accordance with clauses 7 (c) and 8;

(ii) the motion shall be passed by the Council;

(iii) an advertisement shall be published in a newspaper appointed by the Council and generally circulating in the neighbourhood specifying—

(A) the substance of the resolution; and

(B) the time of the meeting at which it is proposed to pass the confirmatory resolution;

(iv) the advertisement shall be republished in the same newspaper not less than seven days later;

(v) notice of the meeting so advertised and of the confirmatory resolution shall be given to each Councillor in accordance with clauses 7 (c) and 8.

(b) The meeting at which the special order is to be confirmed shall be held at least 27 days after the meeting at which the first resolution was passed.

(c) The Council may pass or reject the motion at the first meeting and may confirm or reject it at the second meeting, but shall not amend it in any respect whatsoever.

#### Mode of Debate.

40. (a) Except in the case of sickness or infirmity a Councillor shall rise when speaking at a Council meeting.

(b) The chairman shall remain seated when speaking at a Council meeting.

(c) It shall not be necessary to rise when speaking at a committee meeting.

41. (a) No Councillor when speaking shall be interrupted, except by the chairman or upon a point of order or personal explanation.

(b) If a Councillor is interrupted by the chairman or upon a point of order he shall remain silent until the chairman has ceased speaking or the point of order has been disposed of.

42. In case of competition for the right to speak the chairman shall decide the order in which the Councillors concerned shall be heard.

43. (a) Save that the mover of a motion has a right of reply, no Councillor shall speak more than once to the same motion or amendment.

(b) A Councillor who has spoken to a motion may speak to any amendment of it.

44. If a debate is adjourned by motion the Councillor moving the adjournment has the right to be the first speaker upon the resumption of the debate, unless he has already spoken to the motion or amendment.

45. (a) At an ordinary, special, or public meeting the Mayor shall be-

(i) addressed as "Mr. Mayor";

(ii) referred to as "His Worship the Mayor" or "the Mayor."

(b) At an ordinary, special, or public meeting a Councillor shall address or

(i) a Councillor, as "Councillor

(ii) an officer, by the title of his office (if any).

# Interest in Contract or Works.

46. Unless duly authorized by the Governor in Council, no Councillor shall vote upon or take part in the discussion of any matter in or before the Council in which he has directly or indirectly by himself or his partners any pecuniary interest.

#### Points of Order.

47. (a) A point of order shall be taken by stating-

(i) the matter complained of; and

(ii) the clause constituting the point of order.

(b) A Councillor may take a point of order by drawing the attention of the chairman to-

(i) the fact that a Councillor is out of order; or

(ii) an act of disorder.

notwithstanding that the chairman or a Councillor is speaking at the time.

(c) The chairman may take a point of order although it has not been taken by any Councillor.

(d) Rising to express a difference of opinion or to contradict a speaker shall not be treated as taking a point of order.

48. The chairman may adjourn the meeting to consider a point of order, but shall otherwise rule upon it as soon as it is taken.

- 49. (a) A Councillor may move that the chairman's ruling be disagreed with.
- (b) A motion under this clause-
  - (i) shall specify the ruling to be substituted for the chairman's ruling;
  - (ii) shall be considered in priority to any other business; and
  - (iii) if carried—shall be acted upon instead of the ruling given by the chairman.
- (b) A personal explanation arising out of a statement at a Council meeting shall be made immediately.
- (c) A personal explanation shall not be debated except upon a motion to censure the Councillor who has made it.

#### Criticism of Council Officers.

How officers may reply to criticism.

- 51. (a) A City officer may make a brief statement at a Council or committee meeting in respect of any statement (whether made at a Council meeting or not) affecting him as an officer or any officer under his control.
  - (b) A statement under this clause-
    - (i) in respect of a statement made at a Council or committee meeting shall be made immediately the Councillor concerned resumes his seat;
    - (ii) in respect of a statement made other than at a Council or committee meeting—shall be made at such time during the meeting at which the officer desires to bring it forward as the chairman thinks appropriate.

# Correspondence record.

Councillor's right to inspect correspondence and require its production to Council.

What correspondence to be placed before Council.

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#### Correspondence.

- 52. (a) The correspondence received by the City shall be numbered and recorded.
- (b) At any time during office hours or during a Council or committee meeting a Councillor may inspect the inward correspondence record and any correspondence referred to in it or any file of correspondence, and may require the Town Clerk to place any particular correspondence upon the agenda of the next ordinary special or committee meeting delivered to Councillors.
- 53. (a) The Town Clerk shall determine what inward correspondence should be placed before the Council for its decision.
- (b) The Town Clerk shall determine what outward correspondence should be placed before the Council for its information.
- (c) The City Engineer shall determine what correspondence relating to the Engineers' Department should be placed before the Council for its decision, and he shall place it before the Town Clerk within the time required for notice of business by clause 8 (a).
- (d) The Town Clerk may refer any correspondence directly to the relevant committee without first placing it before the Council.
- (e) In case of doubt the Town Clerk may refer any correspondence to the Mayor, who shall determine whether or not it should be placed before the Council.
- (f) A decision made by the Town Clerk or City Engineer under this clause shall not be subject to criticism and shall not be made the subject of an attack upon the Town Clerk, unless—
  - (i) the correspondence criticizes-
    - (A) the Town Clerk or City Engineer;
    - (B) the municipal administration;
    - (C) a Councillor (referring to him by name or by other description sufficient to identify him);
  - (ii) the decision was not made bona fide; or
  - (iii) the decisions made by the Town Clerk under this clause have been wrong in a substantial number of cases.
  - (g) The Council may nevertheless instruct the Town Clerk that all correspondence—
    - (i) with a particular person; or
    - (ii) of a particular class,

is to be placed before it.

- (h) If the writer of a letter expressly asks that it be placed before the Council-
  - (i) it shall be included in the correspondence summary with a note to that effect; or
  - (ii) if it is anonymous or is abusive defamatory indecent or objectionable in language or in substance, the Town Clerk shall lay it upon the Council table instead of including it in the correspondence summary.

54. (a) The Town Clerk shall prepare summaries of the inward and outward correspondence to be placed before the Council.

- (b) A Councillor may require any correspondence to be produced to him or to be read.
- . (c) No correspondence shall be read at any ordinary, special, or committee meeting, unless -
  - (i) a Councillor; or
- (ii) the writer of the letter,

requests that it be read.

### · Question Time.

# Question time at every ordinary meeting.

Correspondence summaries. Correspondence not to be read at meeting unless Councillor or writer requests it.

- 55. There shall be a question time at every ordinary meeting to enable Councillors to address questions to City officers, but the provision of a question time shall not restrict the right of a Councillor to ask for information in the course of a debate.
  - 55. (a) Question time shall be part of ordinary business.

56. (a) Questions may be asked with or without notice.

(b) A question upon notice shall be delivered to the Town Clerk not later than the time specified for delivery of notice of business in clause 9 (a) column 2.

(c) An officer shall not be required to answer a question without notice.

(d) If an officer replies to a question asked without notice that he needs notice of it, notice shall be treated as having been given for the next ordinary meeting.

57. All questions and answers shall be as brief as possible, and no discussion shall be allowed.

58. A question may be disallowed by the chairman upon the ground that it-

(i) relates to a matter ultra vires the Council; (ii) is defamatory indecent abusive or objectionable in language or substance;
 (iii) is repetitive of a question already answered (whether at the same or any earlier meeting); or
 (iv) is asked to embarrass the officer or the municipal administration.

59. (a) An officer shall advise the Council if it is his opinion that the reply to a question be given in camera.

(b) Any Councillor may require the officer to state briefly the reason why the reply should be given in camera.

(c) Unless the Council resolves to the contrary, the reply to such question shall be given in camera at a special meeting of the Council to be convened for a time five minutes prior to the commencement of the next ordinary meeting.

### Petitions and Joint Letters.

60. A petition or a joint letter-

(i) shall not be in pencil;
(ii) may be in any other legible and permanent form of writing, typing, or printing;
(iii) shall not be defamatory indecent abusive or objectionable in language or

substance; and
(iv) shall not relate to a matter ultra vires the Council.

61. (a) Every page of a petition or joint letter shall bear the whole of the petition or request.

(b) Any signature appearing upon a page which does not bear the whole of the petition or request shall not be considered for the purpose of clause 62, and shall not be considered by the Council.

(c) Every page of a petition or joint letter shall be a single piece of paper, and shall not be pasted stapled pinned or otherwise affixed to any other piece of paper.

62. (a) After a petition or joint letter is received at the Council office, the Town Clerk shall note at the top of the first page—

(i) the total number of signatures;

(iii) the number of signatures of ratepayers; and
(iii) the total number of signatures (other than of ratepayers) known to be of residents.

(b) A copy of the petition or joint letter bearing the Town Clerk's note under this clause shall be distributed to each Councillor.

63. Any person appending to a petition or joint letter, a signature purporting to be that or in the name of any other person, is guilty of an offence against this By-law.

### Deputations.

64. (a) A deputation wishing to be heard by the Council, shall make a written request to the Town Clerk not less than twenty-four hours prior to the latest time for delivering a notice of business under clause 9 (a).

(b) A request under this clause shall specify the name and address of a person authorized to receive notice on behalf of the deputation.

(c) The Town Clerk shall inform the Mayor of the request.
