Land Act 1928.

AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 6, and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

Health Act 1956 (No. 6024).

LOCALITY DEFINED IN WHICH IT SHALL NOT BE LAWFUL TO ESTABLISH OR AFTER A PERIOD OF DISUSE TO CARRY ON ANY OFFENSIVE TRADE OR ANY CATTLE SALE-YARD.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1956* (No. 6024), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation, define the area described in the Schedule attached hereto being a locality within the municipal district of the Shire of Bright in which it shall not be lawful to establish or after a period of disuse to carry on any offensive trade within the meaning of the *Health Act 1956* or any cattle sale-yard.

SCHEDULE.

All that piece of land in the Parish of Myrtleford, commencing at the junction of the Ovens River and the Barwidgee Creek, and bounded thence north-easterly along the eastern side of the Barwidgee Creek to a point where the prolongation of the southern boundary of Crown allotment 13A of section 9A intersects the said creek; thence south easterly along the southern boundary of Crown allotment 13A of section 9A and a line in prolongation thereof to its intersection with the western boundary of allotment 11A; thence in a south-westerly direction along the eastern side of the Government road to the north-western corner of Crown allotment 19A; thence in a south-easterly direction along the northern boundary of Crown allotments 19A, 47 and 47A, and a line in prolongation thereof to its intersection with the State Forest boundary, *Gazette* 32-1625; thence generally in a south-westerly direction along the said State forest boundary to its point of intersection with the Myrtleford township boundary; thence in a south-westerly direction along the said township boundary to its intersection with the Happy Valley Creek; thence generally in a north-westerly direction along the southern side of the Happy Valley Creek to a point on the prolongation of the northern boundary of section G; thence north-westerly along the northern boundary of section G to the south-eastern boundary of the Buffalo River road; thence generally in a south-westerly direction along the eastern boundary of the Buffalo River road to its junction with the northern side

of the Ovens River; thence generally north-westerly along the northern bank of the river to its junction with the Barwidgee Creek at the point of commencement.



PORTS OF VICTORIA, ADDITION TO PORT RULES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1928*, it is amongst other things enacted that His Excellency the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the government and preservation of the said ports respectively and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs:

And that any such regulations may from time to time be in the like manner altered, amended or repealed, and others substituted in their stead:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, by this Proclamation, do hereby make the following addition to the Port Rules, that is to say:—

"48c. No vessel shall moor in waters less than six feet deep at low water with any anchors or sinkers which project above the sea-bed".

Vegetation Diseases (Fruit Fly) Act 1947 (No. 5258).

DECLARING A PROCLAIMED AREA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the *Vegetation Diseases (Fruit Fly) Act 1947* (No. 5258), it is provided that, where the Governor in Council is of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family *Trypetidae* (commonly known as fruit flies), he may by Proclamation declare any portion of Victoria specified therein to be a proclaimed area, and prohibit the planting on any land in the proclaimed area of any plant or vegetable specified, and prohibit the removal from any property within the prescribed area to any other property within the area and from any place in the prescribed area to any place outside the area of any fruit or vegetable, and require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take such action for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit fly as is specified in the Proclamation: Now therefore, I the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family *Trypetidae* (commonly known as fruit flies), and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby—

1. Declare that portion of Victoria—

Within the Parish of Coomboona in the Shire of Rodney and the Parish of Tallygaroopna in the Shire of Shepparton to be a proclaimed area.

2. Prohibit the removal from any place within the area prescribed in clause 1 to any other place within the area or to any place outside the area of any fruit or vegetable or any case or package which has contained any fruit or vegetable unless such removal is made on the instruction of an inspector.

3. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to give access to such land at all times to an inspector with or without assistants for the purpose of inspection and/or applying on such properties any spray material and/or for the purpose of removing any fruit or vegetables or prohibited plant, and/or performing such other acts which in the opinion of an inspector are necessary for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit flies.

4. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take action as and when directed by a notice served on such occupier or owner by an inspector and within the time specified in such notice—

(a) To remove all plants of—

Tomato (*Lycopersicum* sp.),
Pepper (*Capsicum* sp.),
Egg Plant (*Solanum melongena*),
Ornamental Solanum (*Solanum* sp.),
Rock Melon (*Cucumis* sp.),
Sweet Melon (*Cucumis* sp.),
Cucumber (*Cucumis* sp.),
Cape Gooseberry (*Physalis edulis*),
Brambles (except cultivated varieties),
Box Thorn, provided that where box thorn is grown as a hedge along a boundary or dividing fence the occupier or owner may continue to so grow it on the following conditions:—

(i) Cut back the hedge forthwith and periodically as necessary to retain it within a height not exceeding six (6) feet from the ground level and a width not exceeding two (2) feet.

(ii) That when such hedge has been cut back to within the foregoing dimensions, he shall thoroughly spray it forthwith to cover all parts of the plants forming the hedge with a solution containing two thousand (2,000) parts of two-four Dichloro-phenoxy-acetic acid (2-4D), or one of its derivatives, to one million (1,000,000) parts of water (0.2 per cent.) and he shall spray it thereafter as often as is necessary to prevent the plants from forming fruit,

and refrain from planting such plants while this Proclamation remains in force.

(b) To remove from all trees and plants growing upon the said land and to pick up from the said land all of the following fruits and/or vegetables:—

Apples, apricots, brambles and other berry fruits, cape gooseberries, cherries, citrus fruits, cucumbers, egg fruit, figs, gooseberries, grapes, guavas, loquats, medlars, nectarines, passion fruit, peaches, pears, peppers, persimmons, plums, prunes, quinces, rock melons, sweet melons, tomatoes and all edible fruits of all trees and plants, including all such fruits and vegetables which shall form on such trees and plants after the service of the said notice during such time as this Proclamation remains in force.

(c) To dispose of all such fruits and/or vegetables by boiling for fifteen (15) minutes, or burning them so as to destroy all eggs and larvæ of the fruit fly or burying them under a depth of soil of at least three (3) feet after having applied to the upper layer of such buried fruit or vegetables D.D.T. at the rate of not less than one-half ounce per square yard in the form of a spray containing not less than 0.2 per cent. of the pure para para isomer of D.D.T. or in the form of a dust containing not less than 2 per cent. of the pure para para isomer of D.D.T. or by otherwise treating them as an inspector may direct, in such a manner as to kill all eggs, larvæ and pupæ of fruit flies.

(d) To apply to all trees and plants of the following kinds:—

Apples, apricots, brambles and other berry fruits, cape gooseberries, cherries, citrus fruits, cucumbers, egg fruit, figs, gooseberries, grapes, guavas, loquats, medlars, nectarines, passion fruit, peaches, pears, peppers, persimmons, plums, prunes, quinces, rock melons, sweet melons, tomatoes and all other trees and plants which have edible fruits,

one of the following treatments:—

(i) In the case of land not being a commercial orchard, thoroughly spray the whole of the foliage with a solution containing two thousand (2,000) parts of Dichloro-diphenyl-trichloroethane (D.D.T.) to one million (1,000,000) parts of water (0.2 per cent.) at intervals of not more than twenty-one (21) days commencing at the time fruit on such trees and plants has set and

continuing until one (1) month after it has been harvested, or apply by spraying, or by *splashing* the required quantity of solution on the foliage of trees and plants by any suitable method such as with a large paint brush dipped in an open container or from a bottle with a perforated stopper at intervals not longer than seven (7) days commencing at the time the fruit has set and continuing until one (1) month after it has been harvested to the foliage on at least three (3) different parts of each tree and to the foliage of all plants a solution consisting of two (2) ounces of tartar emetic and two and one-half (2½) pounds of white sugar in four (4) gallons of water, or a solution consisting of two (2) ounces of sodium fluosilicate and two and one-half (2½) pounds of white sugar in four (4) gallons of water, at the rate of ten (10) fluid ounces per tree and ten (10) fluid ounces per two hundred (200) square feet of planted area of such plants.

- (ii) In the case of a commercial orchard equipped with a power spraying plant approved by an inspector, thoroughly spray the whole of the foliage with a solution containing one thousand (1,000) parts of D.D.T. to one million parts of water (0.1 per cent.) at intervals not exceeding twenty-one (21) days during the period specified in such notice, and/or with such other solution as is specified in the said notice and at times specified therein.
- (e) To treat the soil beneath and around trees suspected by an inspector to be infested or to have been infested with fruit fly by applying uniformly to the surface of an area or areas marked by an inspector a dust containing 1 per cent. of the pure gamma isomer of Benzene hexachloride at the rate of not less than two (2) ounces per square yard, and/or by giving such other treatment as is specified in the said notice.
- (f) To reduce, if necessary, all tall growing trees and plants covered by this Proclamation, except when grown as a commercial orchard or plantation, to a height which will permit them to be stripped of fruit and/or sprayed to the satisfaction of an inspector.

Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1928 (No. 3797).

INSECTS AND DISEASE DECLARED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

UNDER the powers conferred upon me by the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1928 (No. 3797)*, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare to be Insects within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1928 (No. 3797)* the Insects hereunder named: And I further declare every abnormal condition of or in any plant, or of or in the product or part of any of the same, whether consisting of the presence of or caused by or due to the operations, development, growth, or decay of the Insects hereunder named, shall be a disease within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1928*—

All Insects belonging to the order Tylenchida (Thorne 1949), commonly known as nematodes.

Medical Act 1928.

PHARMACY BOARD OF VICTORIA.

PHARMACY REGULATIONS 1957.

WHEREAS by Part III. of the *Medical Act 1928*, the Pharmacy Board of Victoria with the approval of the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter or rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in section eighty-six of that Act:

And whereas the said Board is desirous, subject to such approval, of altering or rescinding certain of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 as amended by any Regulations:

Now therefore the Pharmacy Board of Victoria subject to the approval of the Governor in Council doth make regulations as set forth hereunder, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Pharmacy Regulations 1957 and shall be read and construed as one with the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 and all Regulations amending the same, all of which Regulations and these Regulations may be cited together as the Pharmacy Regulations.

2. In Regulation 4 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 for the expression "a fee of £2 2s." there shall be substituted the expression "a fee of Five guineas (£5 5s.)."

3. For sub-regulation (a) of Regulation 17 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 there shall be substituted the following sub-regulation:—

"(a) Ordinary Meetings. The board shall meet once in every month at such time and place as it shall from time to time appoint."

4. Regulation 18 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 is hereby rescinded.

5. For Regulation 24 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 there shall be substituted the following Regulation:—

"24. *Travelling Expenses.* The Board may reimburse members any travelling expenses incurred in attending any meetings of the Board or any examinations."

6. Regulation 25 "Duties of Registrar" of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) For the expression "sum of £100" there shall be substituted the expression "sum of Five hundred pounds (£500);"

(b) At the end of the Regulation there shall be added the following:—

"Any person appointed by the Board under the provisions of section 83 of the *Medical Act 1928* as Deputy Registrar shall carry out such duties as the Board directs and in the absence of the Registrar such Deputy Registrar shall act in his stead and shall carry out the duties of Registrar as set out in Part III. of the *Medical Act 1928* and in these Regulations."

7. Regulation 37 "Appointment of Examiners" of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) For the words "Three guineas" (wherever occurring) there shall be substituted the words "Five guineas"; and

(b) for the words "Five shillings" there shall be substituted the words "Ten shillings and six pence".

8. Regulations 2 and 3 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1947 which rescinded Regulation 40 and Appendix "A" of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 are hereby rescinded and the following new Regulation 40 is added to the Pharmacy Regulations:—

"40. (1) The Preliminary Examination shall be held in the month of November in each year and at such other times as the Board may from time to time determine.

(2) Pass Standard.—The marks for a pass in any subject prescribed for the Preliminary Examination shall be not less than 50 per cent. of the maximum marks allotted thereto, but a candidate who gains an average of 50 per cent. of the aggregate marks allotted for all of the subjects for which he presents himself at the one examination shall be entitled to be passed in each subject the marks gained in which are not less than 40 per cent. of the marks allotted to that subject.

(3) If at any subsequent examination the marks gained by a candidate, added to the marks gained by him in the subjects in which he passed at a prior examination aggregate 50 per cent. or more of the possible marks for a complete examination, he shall be awarded a pass in the subjects offered, provided that he shall not be passed in any subject in which he gains less than 40 per cent. of the possible marks."

9. In Regulation 41 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 as amended by the Pharmacy Regulations 1931 and the Pharmacy Regulations 1947, the expression "The conditions of the said Preliminary Examination are set out in Appendix "A" hereto." is hereby repealed.

10. In Regulation 46 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 the expression "(except the subject of Practical Chemistry)" is hereby repealed.

11. Regulation 50 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 as amended by the Pharmacy Regulations 1935 and the Pharmacy Regulations 1939 is hereby further amended as follows:—

- (a) After the words "Materia Medica" there shall be inserted the words "Pharmaceutics"; and
- (b) the expression "The details of the Intermediate Examination are set out in Appendix "B" of the said 1930 Regulations." is hereby repealed.

12. The Regulation relating to the Intermediate Examination added to the Pharmacy Regulations in substitution for Appendix "B" of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 by Regulation 8 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1947 is hereby rescinded and the following sub-regulation (2) added to the Regulation 50 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930:—

"(2) (a) The Intermediate Examination shall be held in the month of November in each year and at such other times as the Board from time to time determines.

(b) *The Pass Standard.*—A candidate at the Intermediate Examination must obtain not less than 50 per cent. of the total marks allotted to each of the subjects in order to secure a pass.

A candidate who passes in three subjects shall, on the recommendation of the examiners, be eligible to present himself for examination in the remaining subjects as single subjects at a subsequent examination.

When presenting at a subsequent examination the candidate must enter for all of the subjects in which he previously failed, unless exempted by the Board in writing from this requirement.

A candidate who fails to pass at the one time at a subsequent examination in all of the subjects he is eligible to take as single subjects, shall be required to present himself again for examination and in such subjects as the Board, on the recommendation of the examiners, directs.

(c) *Examination Syllabus and Text Books.*—The syllabus of the Intermediate Examination shall be as determined by the Board from time to time and published in the official Handbook issued by the Board annually."

13. Regulation 51 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 is hereby rescinded.

14. Regulations 52 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 as amended by the Pharmacy Regulations 1935 and the Pharmacy Regulations 1939 is hereby further amended by the repeal of the following words:—

"The detailed subjects of the Final Examination shall be those set out in Appendix "C" of the Pharmacy Regulations."

15. The Regulation relating to the Final Examination added to the Pharmacy Regulations in substitution for Appendix "C" of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 by Regulation 9 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1947 is hereby rescinded and the following sub-regulation is added to Regulation 52 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930:—

"(2) (a) The Final Examination shall be held in March, June, September and December in each year on such days as may be fixed by the Board.

(b) *Subjects of Examination.*—The syllabus of the Final Examination shall be as determined by the Board from time to time and published in the Official Handbook issued by the Board annually.

(c) *The Pass Standard.*—The percentage of marks necessary to secure a pass in the Final Qualifying Examination shall be not less than 60 per cent. of the maximum marks in each subject.

A candidate who passes in four subjects may on the recommendation of the examiners be permitted to present himself for examination in the remaining subjects as single subjects at a subsequent examination.

When presenting at a subsequent examination the candidate must enter for all of the subjects in which he previously failed unless exempted by the Board in writing from this requirement.

A candidate who fails to pass at the one time at a subsequent examination in all of the subjects he is eligible to take as single subjects, shall be required to present himself again for examination and in such subjects as the Board, on the recommendation of the examiners, directs."

16. For Regulation 57 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 there shall be substituted the following Regulation:—

"57. The Board may from time to time approve of such text-books as it deems necessary for each subject of the Intermediate and Final Examinations under these Regulations and the names of the text-books so approved shall be published each year in the Board's Official Handbook."

17. In Regulation 58 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 "allotted to a subject" there shall be substituted the words "allotted to all subjects".

18. (1) In paragraph (b) of the new regulation headed "Apprenticeship Indentures" made by Regulation 14 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1935 the expression "Forms may be obtained from the Registrar on payment of One shilling a copy or three copies for Two shillings and six pence" is hereby rescinded.

(2) Paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f) and (g) of the new regulation made by Regulation 14 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1935 as amended by any Regulation are hereby respectively numbered 60, 61, 62 (1), 62 (2), 62 (3), 64 and 65 and shall in future for any purpose be referred to by such numbers.

19. In paragraph (8) of Regulation 76 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 for the expression "a fee of £1 1s." there shall be substituted the expression "the registration renewal fee and the fee for restoration of a name to the register prescribed under the provisions of section 85 of the Medical Act as amended by any Act".

20. Regulations 85, 86 and 87 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 as substituted by Regulation 16 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1935 are hereby rescinded and the following substituted therefor:—

"85. Every pharmaceutical chemist who carries on business as a pharmaceutical chemist or chemist and druggist in any premises shall cause to be displayed and kept displayed prominently on such premises so as to be clearly visible from the street or thoroughfare in which the business is located, the name including the Christian names or initials of the proprietor of such business.

86. When the business of a registered pharmaceutical chemist is commenced or carried on under a firm name or style by a registered chemist, or by two or more pharmaceutical chemists in partnership, the said chemist or the chemists forming the partnership shall cause to be exhibited prominently on the premises and in such manner as to be clearly visible from the street or thoroughfare in which the business is located the name or names including the Christian names or initials of the proprietor, or in the case of a partnership of each of the partners.

87. The name, including the Christian names or initials of any registered pharmaceutical chemist who is employed for any period exceeding 21 days as manager of a pharmacy or of a Friendly Society dispensary shall with the addition of the word "Manager" be exhibited and kept exhibited by the employer whilst such chemist is employed therein in a prominent position on an outside window of the pharmacy or dispensary or in some other part thereof approved by the Board in letters of not less than one and a half inches placed not higher than 6 feet from the ground. Every pharmaceutical chemist and the committee of management of any Friendly Society dispensary shall notify the Board in writing of the full name and address of every pharmaceutical chemist appointed as a manager or relieving manager of such pharmacy or dispensary prior to the date on which such person is to take up duty or within 24 hours thereof."

21. Regulation 88 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930 as amended by Regulation 16 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1935 is hereby further amended by deleting the following expression:—

"And every registered pharmaceutical chemist who after the said date becomes employed, or acts as manager of, or who is placed or acts in charge of any pharmacy or pharmaceutical business for any period shall within fourteen days from the commencement of such period make and furnish to the Board the like statutory declaration provided that this part of this regulation shall not apply in cases where such employment or acting as manager as aforesaid or being placed or acting in charge as aforesaid is due to and continues only during the temporary illness or unavoidable absence of the proprietor or employer for a period not exceeding fourteen days."

22. These Regulations shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

The preceding Regulations were made at a meeting of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, held at Melbourne in the State of Victoria, on the ninth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven.

1. The Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 8th August, 1956, approved by the Governor in Council on 4th September, 1956, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 17th September, 1956, and any amendment thereto, are hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Regulations."

2. The paragraph 6 of Regulation No. 118 of the Principal Regulations is amended by the insertion immediately after the scale of charges, and before the paragraph reading "Charges on all other goods &c.", of the words:—

"In respect of goods delivered by the Licensed Wharfinger after the expiry of twenty-four hours after notice to remove such goods has been received by the Commissioners from him as in paragraph 3 hereof provided the Licensed Wharfinger may make the following additional charge:—

An amount of Ten shillings per day per Bill of Lading covering such goods in respect of each day or part of a day during which such goods have been held by him subsequently to the expiry of the notice to remove aforesaid."

NURSES ACTS.

THE Nurses Board of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by section 29 of the *Nurses Act 1928* (No. 3744) as amended by any Act, hereby makes the following Regulations, that is to say:—

(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Nurses Regulations 1957 (No. 2) and shall be read and construed as one with the Nurses Regulations 1941 and all Regulations amending the same.

(2) These Regulations shall come into operation upon approval by the Governor in Council and publication in the *Government Gazette*.

(3) The Nurses Regulations 1941, as amended by any Regulations, are hereby amended as follows:—

(i) At the end of Regulation 36 after Section IX. of that Regulation which deals with Care of the Pre-school Child there shall be added the following new section:—

"RADIOTHERAPEUTIC NURSING.

X. Any hospital or institution treating patients by radiation which fulfils the following requirements may, for the purposes of the Act, be approved by the Board as a Training School in the special branch of nursing known as Radiotherapeutic Nursing:—

- (a) No person other than a registered nurse shall hold (except in the case of emergency) any appointment thereat, whether honorary or otherwise, as the Matron, Sister, or Nurse in charge of the nursing of patients.
 - (b) The Matron or Sister, or Nurse in charge of the nursing thereat shall have had not less than three years' training in a hospital or hospitals recognized by the Board for the purpose of such training.
 - (c) The period of the course of training shall be six months.
 - (d) Proper facilities shall be available thereat to ensure that trainees receive from the Matron or other registered nurse approved by the Board practical instruction in the wards and clinics thereof: Provided, however, that such instruction shall not be approved, unless the building, equipment, and appliances are approved by the Board.
 - (e) Proper facilities shall be available to ensure that trainees are able to attend a systematic course of lectures and receive instruction from legally qualified medical practitioners and other instructors and from the Matron or other registered nurse approved by the Board in the special subjects which relate to the nursing received at such institution and to pass an examination therein and receive a certificate to that effect.
 - (f) A certificate shall be issued to trainees who complete the course of training and pass the examination."
- (ii) At the end of the Twelfth Schedule to the Regulations there shall be added the following new Schedule:—



IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Marketing of Primary Products Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

The Marketing of Primary Products (Polls and Elections) Regulations 1935, made on the 24th December, 1935, as amended, are hereby further amended as follows:—

For Regulations 27, 28 and 34 there shall be substituted the following Regulations:—

" 27. At any poll the voter shall record his vote by placing the number '1' in the square or substantially therein on the ballot-paper opposite the answer for which he desires to give his vote.

28. Any ballot-paper which does not contain the number '1' in the square or substantially therein opposite one of the answers or which contains the number '1' in the square opposite each of the answers shall be informal and shall not be counted, but otherwise a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for informality.

34. (1) Ballot-papers shall be in accordance with form 'G' of the Schedule.

(2) The voter shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure '1' in the square or substantially therein opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing the figures '2', '3' and '4' (and so on, as the case may require) in the squares or substantially therein, opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference:

Provided that—

(a) where there are only two candidates the requirements of this regulation as to the marking of ballot-papers by voters shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked with the figure '1' as aforesaid so as to indicate the voter's first preference only;

(b) where there are more than two candidates the requirements of this regulation as to the marking of ballot-papers by voters shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked with the figures '1', '2', '3' and '4' (and so on as the case may require) in the squares or substantially therein, opposite the names of all the candidates on the ballot-paper except one, and in any such case the voter shall be deemed and taken to have indicated the order of his preference for all the candidates and to have given his last contingent vote to the candidate opposite whose name no figure is placed.

(3) A ballot-paper shall be rejected at the close of the poll if it is not marked in a manner prescribed or allowed by these regulations, provided that a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the foregoing but shall be given effect to according to the voter's intention so far as his intention is clear."

**VARIATION OF SPECIFICATIONS FOR A PRIVATE
STREET CONSTRUCTION SCHEME.—CITY OF
SHEPPARTON.**

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government (Private Street Construction) Act 1947*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, being satisfied that the works provided for in the scheme adopted by the Council of the City of Shepparton for the construction of Maxwell-street, being a private street within the municipal district of the said City cannot be satisfactorily executed in accordance with the specifications, maps, plans, sections and elevations in the scheme, doth by this Order, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, authorize the Council of the City of Shepparton to vary the said specifications, maps, plans, sections and elevations by substituting for the specifications set out in Schedule A hereunder the specifications set out in Schedule B:—

SCHEDULE A.

Formation:

The earth foundation shall be carefully prepared and trimmed to correct levels and cross sections for a width of five feet unless otherwise directed.

Any wet or soft places shall be removed and made good with approved material. The whole foundation is to be made firm and solid.

Bottom Course:

After formation has been completed to the satisfaction of the Engineer, five-eighths (5/8) in aggregate shall be spread and rolled to produce a minimum consolidated thickness of two (2) inches except at vehicular crossings where the thickness shall be increased to not less than four (4) inches. After compaction, the aggregate shall be penetrated with bitumen emulsion at the rate of one-half (1/2) gallon per square yard.

Top Course:

Top course shall consist of premixed bituminous macadam. Maximum size of aggregate in premix shall not exceed one-quarter (1/4) inch and minimum quantity of bitumen per cubic yard of aggregate shall be not less than twelve (12) gallons. The premix macadam shall be spread over bottom course and rolled to produce a consolidated thickness of one (1) inch. The surface of the top course shall be sealed with bitumen emulsion at the rate of one-tenth (1/10) gallon to the square yard and covered with clean sharp sand approved by the Engineer at the rate of approximately 150 square yards per cubic yard. The sand shall be rolled and broomed.

Edges:

Along the outer edge of footpath 3 in. x 2 in. redgum plinths shall be fixed by double railing to 3 in. x 2 in. redgum stakes two feet in length placed not more than five feet apart and driven solid into the ground. At joints the plinths shall be double staked. Plinths shall be not less than ten feet long and there shall always be a stake at each end of every length of plinth. All plinths and stakes shall be left in place after construction of paths has been completed.

SCHEDULE B.

Formation:

The earth foundation shall be carefully prepared and trimmed to correct levels and cross sections and for a width of five feet unless otherwise directed.

Any wet or soft places shall be removed and made good with approved material. The whole foundation is to be made firm and solid. Formation shall provide for a minimum thickness of concrete of three inches except at vehicular crossings where the thickness shall be increased to a minimum of five inches for the full width of the crossing.

Concrete:

All concrete shall be composed of one part Portland cement, one part approved fine sand, one part approved coarse screenings and four parts mixed half-inch and three-quarter inch approved screenings, in equal proportions. The exact proportions may be varied slightly by the Engineer to suit aggregates supplied. All materials including water shall be accurately measured by volume. A weight of ninety-four (94) pounds of cement shall be considered as occupying one cubic foot and an approved box which contains a known weight of loose cement shall be provided and used for the purpose of gauging cement. Fine and coarse aggregate shall be measured loose in approved measuring boxes.

Water:

All water used shall be clear and obtained from the Shepparton water supply mains. The quantity of water to be used shall be determined by the Engineer during the progress of the work.

Mixing and Placing:

All concrete shall be machine mixed, the quantity of water and time of mixing shall be entirely at the discretion of the Engineer. Concrete shall be placed immediately after mixing. During and immediately after placing, concrete shall be thoroughly compacted by means of continuous tamping and spading. Care must be taken to fill every part of the forms without displacing them and to remove all air bubbles and void. The finished concrete shall be protected from damage and persons for a period of at least ten days.

Concrete footpath shall be constructed in one course on the previously prepared subgrade, graded to true levels and grades.

The rise or fall shall be determined by the Engineer. The surfaces of all concrete footways shall be finished with a wood float and before the concrete has taken a final set, the entire surface shall be finished with a brush or fine broom. Every five feet the concrete shall be cut through for the full width and depth and lined with a grooving tool having a radius of quarter of an inch. Such grooves shall be perpendicular to the building line.

At 120 feet intervals expansion joints three-quarter (3/4) inch wide shall be provided and filled with approved bituminous material. All edges shall be finished with an edging or grooving tool having a radius of one-quarter inch.

Curing:

After the concrete is finished off, it shall be covered with wet bags or hessian for forty-eight (48) hours. Thereafter for a further seven (7) days the concrete shall be kept covered with two (2) inches of wet sand or loam and kept constantly wet.

Forms:

Forms shall be of wood or steel securely fastened and braced to prevent movement during placing of concrete. Wooden forms shall be constructed of well-seasoned, straight and sound oregon dressed on all four sides.

AMENDMENT TO THE RULES OF THE ESTATE AGENTS COMMITTEE.

IN pursuance to the powers in this behalf conferred by section 8 of the *Estate Agents Act 1956* (No. 5989), the Estate Agents Committee hereby amends the Rules of the Estate Agents Committee approved by Order in Council dated the 27th day of November, 1956, by the deletion therefrom of "Rule No. 4," and the substitution in lieu thereof of Rule No. 4 in the manner following:—

4. (i) For the purposes of sub-paragraph (b) of sub-section (1) of section 11 of the Act where on application to the Committee the Committee is satisfied that in any special case an applicant possesses suitable qualifications and experience to be the holder of an estate agent's licence, the Committee may reduce or waive the period of three years for which a person must hold a sub-agent's licence.

(ii) The provisions of sub-paragraph (b) of sub-section (1) of section 11 of the Act shall not apply to an officer or employee of the Crown or of any Department corporation council or authority not required by section 4 of the Act to hold a licence provided such officer or employee produces satisfactory evidence that, during the period of five years immediately preceding his application for a certificate that he is eligible to apply for a licence, he was for at least three years continuously and exclusively employed on work which, but for the provisions of sub-paragraph (e) of sub-section (1) of section 4 of the Act, would have required him to be the holder of either an estate agent's licence or a sub-agent's licence.



TOWNSHIP OF MALDON





SHIRE OF MARONG.

BY-LAW No. 24.

A By-law of the Shire of Marong made under the Health Act, and all other powers thereunto enabling it in that behalf, and numbered 24, for the provision, use, and control of receptacles for the deposit and collection of refuse and rubbish (whether temporary or otherwise), and prescribing the size, shape of, and the materials to be used in the construction of such receptacles.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1956, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Marong, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the Township of Kangaroo Flat and adjacent built-up area of the Parish of Mandurang or such portions of the said municipality as may be determined from time to time by the Council, and unless exempted by the Council shall apply to every house, building or premises therein.

3. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

“Proprietor” means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

“Household refuse or garbage” shall mean all waste matter which is ordinarily produced in connexion with the preparation of food, but does not include trade waste from food manufacturing or processing plants.

“Wet refuse” shall mean any fluid matter, and water shall have the same meaning.

“Ashes” shall mean the residue of any combustible material after burning.

“Inspector” means the Health Inspector of the Shire of Marong and shall include any assistant or acting Inspector.

4. The proprietor of every house, building, or premises shall provide, keep and maintain at all times upon his premises a properly constructed receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building, or premises.

5. Such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24 gauge or other approved material in such a manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein, or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle.

6. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than 4 cubic feet, and shall be so constructed as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man.

7. It shall be strongly constructed and provided with property attached side-lifting handles.

8. Such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close-fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle, and shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom), and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep such refuse in an inoffensive condition.

9. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops, wet refuse or liquid waste in such receptacle, nor shall deposit any moist refuse in such receptacle, unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in paper.

10. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited any hot ashes in the rubbish receptacle.

11. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and inoffensive, and shall coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance when deemed necessary by the Council.

12. The proprietor (at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse), shall cause such receptacle to be deposited close to the entrance to such house, building, or premises from the street, lane or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council.

13. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall be responsible for the complete emptying (without spilling any of the contents), of such receptacle or receptacles directly into a vehicle provided for its reception. Such contractor or person shall also be responsible for the replacement of such receptacle properly covered with its lid.

14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall at least once in each week, or at such greater frequency as the Council directs, collect and remove such refuse in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness.

15. Such vehicle shall be provided with a cover and kept covered, except when refuse is being put into or discharged from such vehicle.

16. Such vehicle shall as far as practicable be rendered watertight by means of an impervious lining or by painting the inside thereof with tar or by other suitable and effective means.

17. The person in charge of such vehicle shall cause it to be taken when full by the shortest practicable route to the tip, incinerator or destructor.

18. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall cause all vehicles used for the reception and removal of such refuse to be properly constructed, kept clean, and thoroughly disinfected with approved disinfectant, and maintained in a proper state of repair.

19. No person shall either directly or indirectly in any manner whatsoever deposit or leave, or cause to be deposited or left, any rubbish or refuse on any street, road, lane, or on any land within the Township of Kangaroo Flat or adjacent built up area of the Parish of Mandurang, except upon an authorized tip site.

20. The owner or occupier of any land on which the refuse or rubbish (other than refuse or rubbish the removal of which the Council of the Shire of Marong has undertaken or contracted for under the *Health Act 1928*), is deposited or left, on receiving written notice from such Council under the hand of its Shire Secretary or of such officer of the Municipality who may for the time being be acting on behalf of the Shire Secretary requiring such owner or occupier to remove or effectively destroy any such refuse or rubbish, shall comply with such notice within seven days after the receipt thereof.

21. If default shall be made in compliance with any notice in respect of refuse or rubbish referred to in the last preceding clause, then notwithstanding the imposition

or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the said Council by its inspector or any other of its officers, or by any authorized agent or agents, with a sufficient number of workmen to enter upon any land upon which such refuse or rubbish is deposited or left, and if necessary for that purpose to open forcibly or break down any gate on such land, and to remove or destroy such refuse or rubbish, and any expense incurred thereby shall be made good, and paid by the owner or occupier of the said land to the Council on demand and in default of such payment the same may be recovered by the Council from such owner or occupier in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

22. Where refuse is authorized to be disposed of at a tip the proprietor thereof shall cause it to be deposited and covered in accordance with Schedule 4 of the General Sanitary Regulations 1950 or any amendment thereof.

23. Land upon which refuse has been deposited shall be seasonably planted or sown with seed of grass or any forage or cereal crops or other such vegetable life as the Council shall direct or approve.

24. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.
