AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

Vegetation Diseases (Fruit Fly) Act 1947 (No. 5258). DECLARING A PROCLAIMED AREA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the Vegetation Diseases (Fruit Fly) Act 1947 (No. 5258), it is provided that, where the Governor in Council is of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family Trypetidæ (commonly known as fruit flies), he may by Proclamation declare any portion of Victoria specified therein to be a proclaimed area, and prohibit the planting on any land in the proclaimed area of any plant or vegetable specified, and prohibit the removal from any property within the prescribed area to any other property within the area and from any place in the prescribed area to any place outside the area of any fruit or vegetable, and require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take such action for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit fly as is specified in the Proclamation: Now therefore, I the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family Trypetidæ (commonly known as fruit flies) and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby—

1. Declare that portion of Victoria-

In the Parish of Mooroopna in the Shire of Rodney, commencing at the junction of the road known as the Rifle Range-road and the Midland Highway, thence across the Highway to its southern boundary, thence westerly along that boundary to its intersection with Toolamba-road, thence northerly across the Highway to its northern boundary, thence westerly along the northern boundary of the Highway to the eastern boundary of allotment 65, thence to the eastern boundary of allotment 65, thence northerly to the southern boundary of allotment 20, northerly to the southern boundary of allotment 20, thence easterly and northerly along the boundary of allotment 20, thence by a line projected due north to the road known as McIsaacc's-lane, thence easterly along McIsaacc's-lane and by a line projected easterly rom it to the boundary of the State Forest Reserve, thence southerly and easterly along that boundary to a point on McFarlane's-lane opposite the northeastern boundary of allotment 155, thence across McFarlane's-lane and south-easterly along the boundary of allotment 155 and Rifle Range-road to the starting point to be a proclaimed area. starting point to be a proclaimed area.

- 2. Prohibit the removal from any place within the area prescribed in clause 1 to any other place within the area or to any place outside the area of any fruit or vegetable or any case or package which has contained any fruit or vegetable unless such removal is made on the instruction of any inspector.
- 3. Require occupiers and owners of land not being a commercial orchard, in the proclaimed area to apply to all trees and plants of the following kinds:—

Apples, apricots, brambles and other berry fruits, cape gooseberries, cherries, citrus fruits, cucumbers, egg fruit, figs, gooseberries, grapes, guavas, loquats, medlars, nectarines, passion fruit, peaches, pears, peppers, persimmons, plums, prunes, quinces, rock melons, sweet melons, tomatoes and all other trees and plants which have edible fruits,

one of the following treatments:-

- of the following treatments:—

 (a) Thoroughly spray with an efficient garden spray pump the whole of the foliage with a solution containing two thousand (2,000) parts of Dichlorodiphenyl-trichloroethane (D.D.T.) to one million (1,000,000) parts of water (0.2 per cent.) at intervals of not more than twenty-one (21) days commencing at the time fruit on such trees and plants has set and continuing until one (1) month after it has been harvested. or
- (b) Apply by spraying, or by splashing the required quantity of solution on the foliage of trees and plants by any suitable method such as with a large paint brush dipped in an open container or from a bottle with a perforated stopper at intervals not longer than seven (7) days commencing at the time the fruit has set and continuing until one (1) month after it has been harvested to the foliage on at least these been harvested to the foliage on at least three

- (3) different parts of each tree and to the foliage of all plants a solution consisting of two (2) ounces of tartar emetic and two and one-half (24) pounds of white sugar in four (4) gallons of water, or a solution consisting of two (2) ounces of sodium fluosilicate and two and one-half (24) pounds of white sugar in four (4) gallons of water, at the rate of ten (10) fluid ounces per two hundred (200) square feet of planted area of such plants.
- 4. Require occupiers and owners of land in the pro-claimed area to take action as and when directed by a notice served on such occupier or owner by an inspector and within the time specified in such notice—
 - (a) To remove all plants ofo remove all plants of—

 Tomato (Lycopersicum sp.),
 Pepper (Capsicum sp.),
 Egg Plant (Solanum melongena),
 Ornamental Solanum (Solanum sp.),
 Rock Melon (Cucumis sp.),
 Sweet Melon (Cucumis sp.),
 Cucumber (Cucumis sp.),
 Cape Gooseberry (Physalis edulis),
 Brambles (except cultivated varieties),
 Box Thorn, provided that where box thorn
 is grown as a hedge along a boundary or
 dividing fence the occupier or owner may
 continue to so grow it on the following concontinue to so grow it on the following conditions:-
 - (i) Cut back the hedge forthwith and periodically as necessary to retain it within a height not exceeding six (6) feet from the ground level and a middle has exceeding two (2) feet width not exceeding two (2) feet.
 - width not exceeding two (2) feet.

 (ii) That when such hedge has been cut back to within the foregoing dimensions, he shall thoroughly spray it forthwith to cover all parts of the plants forming the hedge with a solution containing two thousand (2,000) parts of two-four Dichloro-phenoxyacetic acid (2-4D), or one of its derivatives to one million (1,000,000) parts of water (0.2 per cent.) and he shall spray it thereafter as often as is necessary to prevent the plants from forming fruit, nd refrain from planting such plants while

and refrain from planting such plants while this Proclamation remains in force.

(b) To remove from all trees and plants growing upon the said land and to pick up from the said land all of the following fruits and/or vegetables:

Apples, apricots, brambles and other berry fruits, cape gooseberries, cherries, citrus fruits, cucumbers, egg fruit, figs, gooseberries, grapes, guavas, loquats, medlars, nectarines, passion fruit, peaches, pears, peppers, persimmons, plums, prunes, quinces, rock melons, sweet melons, tomatoes and all edible fruits of all trees and plants, including all such fruits and vegetables which shall form on such trees and plants after the service of the said notice during such time as this Proclamation remains in force.

- Proclamation remains in force.

 (c) To dispose of all such fruits and/or vegetables by boiling for fifteen (15) minutes, or burning them so as to destroy all eggs and larvæ of the fruit fly or burying them under a depth of soil of at least three (3) feet after having applied to the upper layer of such buried fruit or vegetables D.D.T. at the rate of not less than one-half ounce per square yard in the form of a spray containing not less than 0.2 per cent. of the pure para para isomer of D.D.T. or in the form of a dust containing not less than 2 per cent. of the pure para para isomer of D.D.T. or by otherwise treating them as an inspector may direct, in such a manner as to kill all eggs, larvæ and pupæ of fruit flies.
- (d) To spray all trees and plants growing on the said land with a solution containing two thousand (2,000) parts of Dichloro-diphenyl-trichloroethane (D.D.T.) to one million parts of water (0.2 per cent.) or in the case of a commercial orchard equipped with a power spraying plant approved by an inspector, with a solution containing one thousand (1,000) parts of D.D.T. to one million parts of water (0.1 per cent.) at intervals not exceeding

twenty-one (21) days during the period specified in such notice, and/or with such other solution as is specified in the said notice and at times specified therein.

- (e) To treat the soil beneath and around trees suspected by an inspector to be infested or to have been infested with fruit fly by applying uniformly to the surface of an area or areas marked by an inspector a dust containing 1 per cent. of the pure gamma isomer of Benzene hexachloride at the rate of not less than two (2) ounces per square yard, and/or by giving such other treatment as is specified in the said notice.
- (f) To reduce, if necessary, all tall growing trees and plants covered by this Proclamation, except when grown as a commercial orchard or plantation, to a height which will permit them to be stripped of fruit and/or sprayed to the satisfaction of an inspector.

5. Require occupiers and owners of land in the pro-5. Require occupiers and owners of land in the pro-claimed area to give access to such land at all times to an inspector with or without assistants for the purpose of inspection and/or applying on such properties any spray material and/or for the purpose of removing any fruit or vegetables or prohibited plant, and/or perform-ing such other acts which in the opinion of an inspector are necessary for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit files.





CASTLEMAINE SEWERAGE AUTHORITY. By-LAW No. 3 (RATING).

- 1. If any rateable property which is unsewered at the time of the making of the aforesaid rate becomes during the said year a "sewered property" there shall be levied upon such property a proportionate part of the sewerage rate for the portion of the year after it has become a sewered property, and such property shall be deemed to have been lawfully rated accordingly.
- 4. Such person or persons as the Castlemaine Sewerage Authority may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates.

The Resolution for passing the foregoing By-law was agreed to by the Castlemaine Sewerage Authority at a special meeting called for the purpose on the 2nd day of December, 1957, and was confirmed by the said Authority on the 19th day of December, 1957.

All those pieces of land in the Parish of Hazelwood, County of Buln Buln, being Crown allotments 1, 26, 27, 28, 29, 37, 38, 38A, 38E, 39; and Crown allotments B1, F, F1, F2, F3, F4, F8, F8A, F10, F19, F20, F21, G1, G2, and a State School Reserve, section B; and the closed Government road shown on certificate of title, volume 6049, folio 640.

RE-SUBDIVISION OF THE SHIRE OF BARRABOOL.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1946, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, from time to time, make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others to subdivide or resubdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight, and that every such Order shall be published in the Government Gazette, and whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in Council by the said Act are now exercised upon an application of the Council of the Shire of Barrabool for the re-subdivision of the municipal district of the said municipality:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this Order re-subdivides the municipal district of the Shire of Barrabool in the manner described hereunder, such descriptions to be in lieu of those of the Riding boundaries of the Shire published in the Government Gazette of the 3rd February, 1865, and the 31st May, 1927:

SHIRE OF BARRABOOL.

Ceres Riding (enlarged and re-defined).

Commencing on the western boundary of the Shire at the south-eastern angle of the Parish of Modewarre; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of that parish and generally easterly by the southern boundary of the Parish of Barrarbool to the eastern boundary of the Shire; and thence northerly, generally westerly, southerly, and easterly by the Shire boundary to the commencing point.

Moriac Riding (enlarged and re-defined).

Commencing on the eastern boundary of the Shire where it is intersected by the southern boundary of the Parish of Barrarbool; thence southerly, easterly, southerly, and generally south-westerly by the Shire boundary to a point in line with the western boundary of allotment 27b, Parish of Jan Juc; thence northerly by a line, the western boundaries of allotments 27b, 27b, 26b, and 26b to the Ocean-road; thence south-westerly by that road to a road known as Forest-road; thence north-westerly by Forest-road to the Shire boundary; thence northerly by the Shire boundary to the south-eastern angle of the Parish of Modewarre; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of that parish and generally easterly by the southern boundary of the Parish of Barrarbool to the commencing point.

Coast Riding (reduced and re-defined).

Commencing on the south-eastern boundary of the Shire at a point in line with the western boundary of allotment 27b, Parish of Jan Juc; thence northerly by a line and the western boundaries of allotments 27b, 27b, 26b, and 26b to the Ocean-road; thence south-westerly by that road to a road known as Forest-road; thence north-westerly by Forest-road to the Shire boundary; and thence generally south-westerly and generally north-easterly by the Shire boundary to the commencing point.

And the Honorable Sir Thomas Karran Maltby, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PUBLIC SERVICE BOARD ELECTIONS REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 22 of the *Public Service Act* 1946 His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby revoke the Public Service Board Elections Regulations made by Order on the third day of June, 1946, as amended by Order on the seventh day of June, 1949, and substitute therefor the following Regulations:—

Preliminary.

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Public Service Board Elections Regulations".
 - 2. In these Regulations--
 - "Act" means the *Public Service Act* 1946 as amended by any subsequent enactments;
 - "Extraordinary election" means an election to fill an extraordinary vacancy;
 - "Public Service Representative" and
 - "Mental Hygiene Representative" have the same meaning as in sub-section 3 of section 6 of the *Public Service Act* 1946 as amended by the *Public Service (Amendment) Act* 1957.
 - "Nomination day" means the day appointed on or before which all candidates for any election must be nominated;
 - "Polling day" means the last day appointed at any election for the delivery of ballot-papers by voters to the Returning Officer;
 - "Minister" means the Premier of Victoria;

and any reference to a form shall be a reference to a form in the Schedule hereto or to any form to the like effect.

Appointment of Election Officials.

- 3. The Governor in Council may from time to time appoint some fit and proper person to be the Returning Officer to conduct elections of members.
- 4. The Returning Officer may, by writing under his hand, appoint some person to be the Substitute Returning Officer to assist the Returning Officer or to act for him in his absence, and may in like manner appoint such other persons as he may deem fit to assist him as Poll Clerks in the conduct of elections.
- 5. The Returning Officer, the Substitute Returning Officer, and every Poli Clerk, upon entering upon any of their duties, shall make a statutory declaration in accordance with Form A.

Extraordinary Elections.

6. Every extraordinary election shall be held within a period of three months after the occurrence of the vacancy.

Notice of Election.

7. The Minister shall give notice in the Government Gazette of every election. In such notice the polling day (which shall be not less than six weeks after the publication of such notice), the nomination day (which shall be not less than two weeks after such publication), the name of the Returning Officer and the place where he will receive nominations, shall be specified.

Nominations.

8. (1) In order that any person may become or be a candidate at any election, he shall before Twelve o'clock noon on the nomination day deliver or cause to be delivered to the Returning Officer, who shall if required give a receipt for same, a nomination paper in accordance with Form B naming such person as a candidate at the

election, and signed by not less than twenty persons entitled to vote at the election for which the candidate is nominated, and having at the foot thereof a statement under the hand of the person so nominated that he consents to such nomination.

(2) No person who has not been so nominated shall be or be deemed to be a candidate at any election.

Retirement or Death of a Candidate.

- 9. Any person nominated may, by written notice addressed to the Returning Officer, withdraw his consent to his nomination at any time not later than Twelve o'clock noon on the nomination day, and such person shall be considered as not having been nominated, and the Returning Officer shall thereupon omit the name of such person from the ballot-papers.
- 10. If, before polling day, a candidate dies he shall be considered as not having been nominated and, if there is only one remaining candidate, the Returning Officer shall by notice in the Government Gazette declare such remaining candidate duly elected and forward a copy of such notice to the Minister, or, if there are two or more remaining candidates, the Returning Officer shall delete from the ballot-papers the name of such deceased candidate and the number placed opposite his name, and each such ballot-paper shall thereupon be given effect to as if the numbers opposite the names of the remaining candidates were altered to the appropriate numbers indicated by the voter's order of preference in respect of such remaining candidates.

Contested Elections.

- 11. After Twelve o'clock noon on the nomination day, the Returning Officer shall, in respect of every contested election, announce the full name and (if any) the Department and Branch of each candidate nominated; and shall cause notice thereof to be published in the Government Gazette.
- 12. (1) Within seven days after the nomination day, the Minister shall arrange for a responsible officer of each Department concerned to supply the Returning Officer with a roll of persons entitled to vote at the election, including the departmental or other address (as the case may require) of each such person, together with an envelope addressed to each of such persons.
- (2) No person who is not a permanent officer of the Public Service on the nomination day shall be eligible to vote at any election.

Uncontested Elections.

13. If there is only one candidate duly nominated at any election, the Returning Officer shall by notice in the *Government Gazette* declare such candidate duly elected and shall forward a copy of such notice to the Minister.

Polling.

- 14. If at any election two or more candidates have been duly nominated, a poll shall be taken, and the Returning Officer shall forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed in accordance with Form C, and shall, not later than the fourteenth day before polling day, send by post, or cause to be delivered, to each voter, one of such ballot-papers pertaining to the appropriate election, duly signed or initialed by the Returning Officer or at his direction by the Substitute Returning Officer or a Poll Clerk, together with an open returnenvelope bearing the Returning Officer's name and address.
- 15. When the voter has marked his vote on the ballot-paper, he shall place it in the addressed return-envelope, and he shall sign his name and state his Department and Branch on the face of such return-envelope, and stamp and post it, or deliver it or cause it to be delivered, to the Returning Officer in time to reach the Returning Officer not later than Four o'clock in the afternoon of the polling day. Any ballot-paper which is not enclosed in an envelope with the voter's signature thereon, and in respect of which the direction in accordance with Form C have not been substantially complied with, or which is forwarded through the post without the postage thereon being fully prepaid, or which is received from a person whose name is on the roll of voters, but who has ceased to be an officer before the polling day, shall not be counted at the scrutiny. The decision of the Returning Officer as to the validity or invalidity of any vote or ballot-paper shall be final.

16. Upon a voter making and transmitting to the Returning Officer a declaration that he has not received a ballot-paper, or that the ballot-paper received by him has been lost, spoilt, or destroyed, and that he has not already voted, the Returning Officer may issue a new ballot-paper to such voter.

Preferential Voting.

17. A voter shall mark his ballot-paper by placing the number 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference, and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing the numbers 2, 3, and 4 (and so on as the case may require) opposite their names, so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference:

Provided that where there are only two candidates a ballot-paper shall be valid if marked in any way which in the opinion of the Returning Officer indicates the voter's first preference only.

Scrutineers.

18, Each candidate at any election shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present during the scrutiny. Each scrutineer shall, before he acts as such, make and sign before the Returning Officer a declaration in the like form to that which the Returning Officer and other officers employed in the conduct of the election are required to make and sign.

The Scrutiny.

- 19. As soon as practicable after the close of the poll, the Returning Officer or the Substitute Returning Officer, with the assistance of any Poll Clerk duly appointed, and in the presence of such scrutineers as are present, shall—
 - (a) produce unopened all return-envelopes received up to the close of the poll:
 - (b) examine each envelope, and, if it is properly signed and otherwise complies substantially with the provisions herein contained, accept the vote for further scrutiny;
 - (c) place the envelopes containing unrejected votes on a table face downwards, so that the signatures of the voters shall not be visible;
 - (d) open each such envelope, withdraw the ballot-paper contained therein, and, without inspecting the vote or permitting any other person to do so, deposit the ballotpaper in a ballot-box;
 - (e) when all such envelopes have been opened and the ballotpapers withdrawn therefrom and deposited in the ballotbox, open the ballot-box and count the votes.

Adjournment of Scrutiny.

20. The Returning Officer may from time to time adjourn the scrutiny to a day and hour fixed by him and notified to the scrutineers.

Provisions of State Law to Operate.

21. Subject to the provisions contained herein, the mode of conducting each election, and the method of counting the votes and ascertaining the result, shall be in accordance with the provisions of the law for the time being regulating elections for the Legislative Assembly, so far as they can be made applicable, *mutatis mutandis*.

Cases of Equal Voting.

- 22. (1) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one has to be declared defeated, the Returning Officer shall decide by lot which candidate shall be declared defeated.
- (2) In the case of equality between two candidates in a final count, the Returning Officer shall decide by lot which candidate shall be declared elected.

Recounts.

- 23. At any time before the gazettal of the result of any election as hereinafter provided, the Returning Officer may, if he thinks fit, on the written request of any candidate setting forth the reasons for the request, or may, of his own motion, make a recount of the votes.
- If the Returning Officer refuses on the request of a candidate to make a recount of the votes, the candidate may, in writing, appeal to the Minister to direct a recount, and the Minister may, as he thinks fit, either direct a recount or refuse to direct a recount.

Publication of Results.

24. At the conclusion of every election, the Returning Officer shall by notice in the Government Gazette declare the result of the election, and shall forward a copy of such notice to the Minister.

Disposal of Ballot-papers, &c.

25. The Returning Officer shall, at the expiration of seven days after publication in the Government Gazette of the result of any election, cause all ballot-papers and envelopes used at such election to be destroyed.

Election of a Deputy.

- 26. (1) The provisions of these Regulations shall, with such modifications, adaptations, and substitutions as are necessary, apply to the election of any deputy pursuant to section 15 of the Act.
- (2) The counting of the votes and the ascertainment of the result of an election of a deputy shall not proceed until after the result of any concurrent election of a member has been ascertained.
- (3) In any case where a person has been elected as the Mental Hygiene Representative, or the Public Service Representative, and has also been nominated as a candidate for election as a deputy in respect to the office to which he has been elected as such representative, he shall cease to be regarded as a candidate for election as such deputy and, in the ascertainment of the result of the election of such deputy, the Returning Officer shall follow the same procedure as is provided in clause 10 of these Regulations.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO CAMPS AND CAMPING AREAS.

I NDER the powers conferred by the Health Act 1956 and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Camping Regulations 1958" and shall come into operation upon publication in the *Government Gazette*.
 - 2. The Camping Regulations 1956 are hereby repealed.
- 3. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—
 - "Camping Area" means any area of land which persons are frequently intermittently or seasonally permitted to use for camping for a consideration to the proprietor of the land.
 - "Council" means Council of a Municipality; and "the Council" means the Council of the Municipality to the municipal district of which the provision in which the term is used applies.
 - "Occupier" includes each and every person camping in a camp.
 - "Proprietor" includes the owner occupier or person having the control or management of any land.
 - "Refuse" includes waste food and all discarded matter from any camp.

- "Sanitary convenience" includes urinals water-closets earthclosets privies refuse-pits refuse bins and all other receptacles used for the deposit of night-soil or refuse.
- "Source of water supply" includes any stream spring reservoir or well if the water therein or therefrom is or is likely to be used for drinking purposes by man or for domestic purposes or for any purpose in connexion with the preparation manufacture or sale of food or in connexion with a dairy-farm or dairy.
- "Stream" includes river creek stream watercourse lake lagoon swamp marsh or open irrigation channel.

GENERAL PROVISIONS.

- 4. A person who establishes or occupies a camp in the vicinity of a stream spring well or waterhole shall take all practicable steps to avoid polluting the water therein.
- 5. Every occupier of a camp which is not in a camping area shall—
 - (a) provide sanitary conveniences satisfactory to the Council or its authorized Officer in number kind construction and location, but so that no cesspool-closet and no urinal discharging onto or into the ground will be situated within 300 feet of any source of water supply or within 100 feet of any other stream spring well dam or waterhole;
 - (b) dispose of all night-soil refuse offensive matter and rubbish in a sanitary manner to the satisfaction of the Council or its authorized Officer.
- 6. No person shall throw or deposit any refuse rubbish or offensive matter from any camp into any watercourse ditch drain stream or body of water or on any street or road, or permit any such material to remain exposed on the surface of the ground.
 - 7. Every occupier of a camp shall-
 - (a) maintain such camp in a clean and sanitary state;
 - (b) on vacating the camp site leave it in a clean and sanitary condition.

· Provisions Relating to Camping Areas.

- 8. Every application for registration of a camping area shall be made in writing by the proprietor and shall be accompanied by plans, specifications and particulars in duplicate setting out—
 - (a) the position of the camping area in relation to any adjacent streets roads dwellings streams or sources of water supply:
 - (b) the layout of the camping area including the positions of all sanitary conveniences and any other buildings;
 - (c) the materials and method of construction of all buildings;
 - (d) the provision made for water supply, drainage and the temporary storage and the disposal of refuse and rubbish:
 - (e) the number of camp sites provided in the area.
- 9. The Council shall not grant registration unless the camping area complies to its satisfaction or can be altered to so comply with the requirements hereinafter set out.
 - 10. Every camping area shall have-
 - (a) a site well drained and with a reasonably even surface;
 - (b) a minimum space of 600 square feet allotted for each caravan tent or hut; and each such space, hereinafter referred to as a site, shall be defined by fences hedges walls posts or any suitable markings above ground-level at the corners;
 - (c) proper access to each site;
 - (d) an adequate supply of wholesome water either from a public water supply system or from tanks wells bores or springs suitably protected against contamination;
 - (e) adequate provision for carrying away all foul drainage and for disposing of it so as not to cause nuisance or danger to health or to pollute any stream or source of water supply;
 - (f) suitable provision for cooking;

- (g) no kitchen or fireplace located within 20 feet of any closet or urinal;
- (h) provision for suitably located sanitary conveniences and lavatory and laundry facilities in accordance with regulations 11, 12 and 13 hereof.
- 11. (1) The proprietor of a camping area shall provide sanitary and ablution facilities as follows:—
 - For Women.—One closet for each 10 sites or portion thereof for the first 200 sites, and one additional closet for each 20 sites or portion thereof in excess of 200.

One wash-basin and one shower for each 20 sites or portion thereof for the first 200 sites and one additional wash-basin and one additional shower for each 40 sites in excess of 200.

For Men.—One closet, one urinal, one wash-basin and one shower for each 20 sites or portion thereof for the first 200 sites, and one additional closet, urinal, wash-basin and shower for each 40 sites or portion thereof in excess of 200.

Provided that in the case of a camping area where in the opinion of the Council the water supply is not sufficient to serve the number of showers required by this regulation the Council may accept a lesser number of showers.

- (2) In calculating urinal accommodation, 2 feet length of urinal slab or trough shall be calculated as one urinal.
- (3) All such conveniences shall be suitably screened, separated and designated for the sexes, and shall be adequately lighted at night.
- (4) The proprietor shall provide suitable facilities for washing and drying clothes.
- 12. All sanitary and laundry fittings shall be drained to the satisfaction of the Council.
 - 13. The proprietor shall provide—
 - (a) sufficient metal bins for the reception of garbage, such bins being equipped with closely-fitting covers and so placed that no camp site is more than 100 feet from such a bin;
 - (b) sufficient receptacles for rubbish such as waste paper, boxes, bottles and tin cans.
- 14. (1) The proprietor shall make provision for the proper supervision of the camping area and for the maintenance of sanitary conditions therein, and shall cause all sanitary conveniences and their surroundings to be cleaned as often as may be necessary and at least twice each day whilst the area is occupied by campers.
- (2) The proprietor shall cause all refuse and rubbish to be removed at least once weekly, and more often if required by the Council, and to be disposed of in accordance with the provisions of the General Sanitary Regulations 1950 or any amendments thereof.
- 15. (1) The proprietor shall provide and maintain in proper order and readily accessible on the premises for protection of the camping area against fire—
 - (a) when a public reticulated water supply is available adequate fire plugs or hydrants equipped with suitable hoses and all necessary fittings to the satisfaction of the Council;
 - (b) when a public reticulated water supply is not available adequate water knapsacks or buckets or chemical fire extinguishers, set apart for the purpose, to the satisfaction of the Council.
- (2) All hoses shall be maintained in good condition, all knapsacks and buckets shall be kept filled with water, and all extinguishers shall be kept charged and ready for instant use.
- 16. When with respect to any camping area which by section 221 of the *Health Act* 1956 is required to be registered with the Council any of the requirements of these Regulations are not complied with the Council may and when required by the Commission shall refuse to register or as the case may be renew the registration of such camping area.

ENFORCEMENT OF REGULATIONS.

17. The Council of every Municipality shall and is hereby required to superintend and see to the execution of these Regulations, and at its own cost do and provide all such acts, matters and things as are necessary for the purpose.

18. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done or failing to do any act directed to be done by these Regulations shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds; but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.




