Land Act 1928.

AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Class 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of section 4 of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944* it is enacted that the Governor in Council, after consultation by the Chief Secretary of Victoria with the Minister of Forests, may from time to time by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* proclaim any period as the summer period in respect of the country area of Victoria or any specified part or parts thereof and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may proclaim different summer periods in respect of different parts of the said country area:

And whereas by the said sub-section it is further enacted that any Proclamation so published may be revoked, amended, or varied by a subsequent Proclamation so published:

And whereas by Proclamations issued on the 3rd December, 1957, 10th December, 1957, and 18th December, 1957, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 4th December, 1957, 11th December, 1957, and 18th December, 1957, respectively, different summer periods expiring on the fifteenth day of April, 1958, were proclaimed in respect of different parts of the country area of Victoria, including the parts of the said country area specified in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas it is deemed expedient that the aforesaid Proclamations should be varied in the manner hereinafter described:

And whereas the Chief Secretary and the Minister of Forests have consulted accordingly:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Country Fire Authority Acts, do by this my Proclamation vary the aforesaid Proclamations by proclaiming that the summer period in respect of the parts of the country area of Victoria which are specified in the Schedule hereto shall end at midnight on the second day of April, 1958.

SCHEDULE.

The Second Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the City of Bendigo, the Borough of Eaglehawk and those portions of the Shires of Marong and Strathfieldsaye not included in the Twenty-first Fire Control Region;

the Fifth Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Cities of Hamilton and Warrnambool, the Boroughs of Koroit and Port Fairy, and the Shires of Belfast, Dundas, Minhamite, Mortlake, Mount Rouse and Warrnambool;

those portions of the Seventeenth Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Shire of Kowree and those portions of the Shires of Arapiles and Wimmera respectively which lie in a southerly direction from the under-mentioned boundaries, that is to say:—

(a) *Shire of Arapiles*.—Commencing at the intersection of the Rifle Butts-road with the McKenzie River; thence generally westerly and north-westerly along the aforementioned road and the Clear Lake-Tooan-Duffholme road to its intersection with the western boundary of the municipal district;

(b) *Shire of Wimmera*.—Commencing at the intersection of the Wimmera River with the Rocklands-Lubeck Channel on the eastern boundary of the municipal district; thence generally in a westerly and south-westerly direction along the aforementioned channel to its intersection with the McKenzie River on the western boundary of the municipal district;

those portions of the Nineteenth Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Town of St. Arnaud, the Borough of Inglewood and the Shire of Bet Bet;

those portions of the Twenty-first Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Town of Castlemaine, the Shires of Maldon and Metcalfe and those portions of the Shires of Marong and Strathfieldsaye not included in the Second Fire Control Region;

those portions of the Twenty-second Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal district of the Shire of Seymour;

those portions of the Twenty-third Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal district of the Shire of Mansfield;

and the Twenty-fourth Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Shires of Beechworth, Bright, Chiltern, Towong, Upper Murray, Wodonga, and Yackandandah.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1956.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Road Traffic Act 1956* it is amongst other things enacted that Part II. of the said Act shall apply only in respect of infringements occurring in any area or circumstance specified for the purpose of such Part by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* and occurring after the date of such Proclamation:

And whereas it is also enacted in the said Act that any such Proclamation may provide that such Part of the said Act shall apply only in respect of parking infringements or in respect of traffic infringements or in any particular area or circumstance:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation specify the State of Victoria as an area in which Part II. of the *Road Traffic Act 1956* shall apply in respect of traffic infringements occurring after the date hereof.

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act* 1946, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Cranbourne has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used for a road within the said Shire, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare that all that piece of land, used for a road, being part of Crown portions 1, Parishes of Lyndhurst and Cranbourne, and being the land described hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, namely:

HUON PARK-ROAD.

Commencing at a point on a line bearing north 34 deg. 43 min. west 1,722 links, north 34 deg. 47 min. west 1,300 links, north 35 deg. 4 min. west 1,847 links from the most south-westerly angle of Crown Portion 1, Parish of Lyndhurst, County of Mornington; and thence bounded by lines bearing north 27 deg. 44 min. 30 sec. east 27.4 links, south 89 deg. 27 min. east 2,758.7 links, south 89 deg. 53 min. east 2,450.4 links, due east 306.8 links, due north 100 links, due west 306.8 links, north 89 deg. 53 min. west 2,450.4 links, north 89 deg. 27 min. west 2,860.3 links, south 35 deg. 4 min. east 153 links to the commencing point.

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Romsey has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to the municipal district of such municipality:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act* 1946 to the municipal district of the Shire of Romsey and order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the municipal district of the Shire of Romsey on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 14th July, 1958, except insofar as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make by-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter, and provided further, that no such by-law shall come into operation before the 14th July, 1958.

REGULATION XXIX.—SCHOOL COMMITTEES.—AMENDMENT
No. 142.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Education Act 1957*, and all other powers thereto enabling doth hereby amend Regulation XXIX.—School Committees—as follows:—

1. Rescind clauses 1 to 14 and substitute the following clauses—

1. The Governor in Council may for any State primary school or group of State primary schools appoint a committee—

- (a) of not more than twelve members in the case of a school of the Special Class,
- (b) of not more than ten members in the case of a school of the First Class,
- (c) of not more than eight members in the case of a school of any other class

to be called the school committee for the school or groups of schools for which it is appointed.

2. (a) For the purpose of electing members to be submitted to the Minister for appointment by the Governor in Council to the school committee the head teacher shall summon a meeting of the parents and guardians of the pupils attending the school.

(b) The meeting shall be at an hour convenient to the majority of the parents and guardians, and shall if possible be in the month of March at the end of the quadrennial period during which the retiring members of the school committee held office.

3. In the case of a newly established school or when, for any other reason, it has been found impossible to hold a meeting as provided in clause 2 above, arrangements may be made by the Minister for a special meeting of parents and guardians at a time and on a date to be fixed, and the members shall be elected at that meeting for such period not exceeding four years as is determined by the Minister.

4. (a) No person shall be appointed a member of a school committee for more than four years, but any person appointed a member shall, on ceasing to be a member, be eligible for re-appointment, except as provided in clause 44 below.

(b) If, however, the biennial meeting is held later than the month of March as provided in clause 2 above, the members of the school committee who shall at that meeting retire shall continue in office during the intervening period.

5. Subject to the provision of sub-clause (b) of clause 4, all members of the school committee shall retire on the thirty-first day of March in the year in which their term of office expires. Provided that in the first election to be held under these regulations half the number of members prescribed for such committee shall hold office for four years; the remainder, being those who received the lowest number of votes at the election, shall hold office for two years.

6. Fourteen days before the date fixed for the meeting of parents and guardians the head teacher shall—

- (a) notify parents and guardians in the form prescribed by the Director of the date, hour, place and object of the meeting and of the prescribed manner of making nominations; and
- (b) post a notice containing such particulars on the door of the school building.

7. The head teacher or a deputy appointed by him shall preside at the meeting of parents and guardians.

8. (a) Nominations shall be made in writing on a form prescribed by the Director which shall be lodged at the school with the head teacher.

(b) The nomination form shall bear the date on which the nomination is made, together with the signature of—

- (i) the person nominated,
- (ii) the person making the nomination,
- (iii) the person seconding the nomination.

(c) Except as provided in clause 9 the head teacher shall not accept a nomination lodged with him after 4 p.m. on the date seven days before the date fixed for the holding of the meeting of parents and guardians referred to in clause 2.

(d) As soon as possible after the closing of nominations the head teacher shall post a notice on the door of the school building showing the name of each person nominated, together with the names of the persons making and seconding the nomination.

(e) The head teacher or his deputy shall, if required, produce at the meeting of parents or guardians each nomination form lodged with him prior to the closing of nominations.

(f) Each nomination form shall be filed at the school by the head teacher for a period of two years after the holding of the meeting of parents and guardians.

(g) No person other than the parent or guardian of an enrolled pupil shall be entitled to nominate a candidate.

(h) The head teacher or his deputy may require a person claiming as a guardian the right to nominate a candidate to produce satisfactory evidence that he is the bona fide guardian of an enrolled child.

(i) Persons nominated may be of either sex and need not be the parents or guardians of pupils attending the school.

(j) A person employed in any capacity at a school or the wife or husband of such a person shall not be, in respect of that school, eligible—

- (i) for nomination;
- (ii) to make or second a nomination;
- (iii) to vote;
- (iv) to continue as a member of the school committee on acceptance of such employment.

9. (a) If on the date fixed for the closing of nominations there are for any reason no nominations or a less number of nominations than is necessary for the constitution of the school committee the date for the closing of nominations shall be extended until the same day of the following week, and the holding of the meeting of parents and guardians shall also be adjourned for seven days from the date originally fixed.

(b) If it is necessary for the date for the closing of nominations to be extended or for the meeting of parents to be adjourned the head teacher shall—

- (i) notify parents and guardians of the new dates fixed for the closing of nominations and the holding of the meeting of parents and guardians, and
- (ii) post a notice containing such particulars on the door of the school building.

(c) If at the expiry of the extended period for the lodging of nominations there are no nominations or a less number of nominations than is necessary for the constitution of the school committee the head teacher shall forward a report to that effect to the Education Department.

10. If at the time fixed for the closing of nominations the number of candidates equals the number of persons to be appointed to the school committee, the head teacher or his deputy shall—

- (a) forthwith declare the candidates to be elected,
- (b) post a notice to that effect on the school door,

- (c) notify parents and guardians that the holding of a ballot under the provisions of clause 11 is unnecessary, and that the meeting of which notification had been given in accordance with the provisions of clause 6 is cancelled unless for any reason he considers a meeting of parents and guardians for some other school purpose desirable,
- (d) notify the Education Department on a form prescribed by the Director of the names (including the full christian names) of the persons so elected.

Provided that in the first election to be held under these regulations a ballot must be taken to determine the order of preference. If two or more candidates receive an equal number of votes, the provisions of clause 11 (j) shall apply to determine the order of preference and period of office.

11. If the number of candidates exceeds the number of persons to be appointed to the school committee, the head teacher shall proceed at the meeting to hold a ballot in accordance with the following directions:—

- (a) The ballot shall be held in the school building unless otherwise sanctioned by the Director.
- (b) The head teacher or his deputy shall have entire control of the ballot and shall have power to decide any question or dispute that may arise in reference to the ballot.
- (c) No person other than the parents or the guardians of an enrolled pupil shall be entitled to vote.
- (d) The head teacher or his deputy may require a person claiming the right to vote as a guardian to produce satisfactory evidence that he is the bona fide guardian of an enrolled child.
- (e) A vote for more or less than the full number of members required shall be deemed to be invalid.
- (f) The head teacher or his deputy shall write on a black board the names of all the candidates.
- (g) Two persons who are not candidates for election shall be appointed as tellers by the parents and guardians at the meeting.
- (h) The tellers shall—
 - (i) hand to each voter a ballot-paper on which the voter shall write the names of the candidates he desires to be elected,
 - (ii) collect the ballot-papers,
 - (iii) count the number of votes given to each candidate, and
 - (iv) report to the head teacher or his deputy the result of the voting.
- (i) The head teacher or his deputy shall—
 - (i) declare the candidates up to the number required who have received the greatest number of votes to be elected,
 - (ii) post a notice to that effect on the school door, and
 - (iii) notify the Education Department on a form prescribed by the Director of the names (including the full christian names) of the persons so elected.
- (j) (i) If two or more candidates receive an equal number of votes, and a further ballot is rendered necessary to determine which of such candidates shall be included in the required number of persons to be elected, the head teacher or his deputy shall announce to the meeting the names of such candidates, and shall forthwith take action to hold the ballot.
- (ii) If the ballot proves inconclusive, lots shall be drawn.

12. (a) Whenever during the quadrennial period for which a school committee is elected a vacancy occurs through death, resignation, forfeiture of seat, or other cause, the committee shall nominate some suitable person to fill the vacancy and if the

person nominated is appointed by the Governor in Council, that person shall hold office for the remainder of the term of his predecessor.

(b) The head teacher shall, as early as possible after the vacancy has occurred, notify the Education Department of the names (including the full christian names) of each person nominated under the provision of sub-clause (a) of this clause for appointment to a vacancy on the school committee and shall include the name of the member replaced.

13. Notification of the appointment by the Governor in Council of members of the school committee shall be made to the head teacher, who shall thereupon notify each member of his appointment.

14. At the request of the school committee the head teacher shall once in every twelve months summon a general meeting of the parents and guardians of the pupils attending the school, to hear a report of the committee's activities. The chairman of the school committee shall preside at this meeting.

2. In sub-clause (a) of clause 18 for the expression "three members" substitute the expression "not less than half the members".

REGULATIONS RELATING TO FOODS, DRUGS, SUBSTANCES,
AND METHODS OF ANALYSIS.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1956* (No. 6024) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and on the recommendation of the Food Standards Committee, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Amending Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1958 (No. 1), shall be read and construed as one with the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 and any Regulations amending the same and shall, except where otherwise stated, come into operation upon publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. Sub-regulation (3) of Regulation No. 9 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby amended by deleting the expression " (here insert the name or names of the preservative or preservatives) ".

3. Sub-regulation (1) of Regulation No. 11 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby amended by deleting the expression " (other than any food in its natural form) " and substituting therefor the expression " (other than any food in its natural form or as standardized in these Regulations) ".

4. Paragraph (aa) of sub-regulation (4) of Regulation No. 27 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939, including the heading thereto, is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefore:—

" (4) (aa) Fish packed in tinned containers may contain sodium hexametaphosphate in proportion not exceeding one half of one part per centum ".

5. Regulation No. 32 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby amended by—

It may contain not more than three parts per centum of sodium citrate and/or sodium phosphates (expressed as di-sodium hydrogen phosphate) as emulsifying agent"; and

(b) inserting—

(i) immediately after paragraph (b) of sub-regulation (9); and

(ii) immediately after paragraph (b) of sub-regulation (10);—the following paragraph; namely:—

“(c) not more than three parts per centum of sodium citrate and/or sodium phosphates (expressed as di-sodium hydrogen phosphate) as emulsifying agent.”

(a) inserting immediately after the word “concentrated”

(iv) in paragraph (c) of sub-regulation (2);—

the words “powder or solid”.

8. Sub-regulation (11) (c) of Regulation No. 70 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following:—

“The word ‘champagne’ shall not appear in the label attached to any carbonated wine.”

This Regulation shall come into operation on the first day of January, 1959.

9. Sub-regulation (5) (a) (ii) of Regulation No. 75 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby amended by deleting the words “‘Geneva’ and”.
