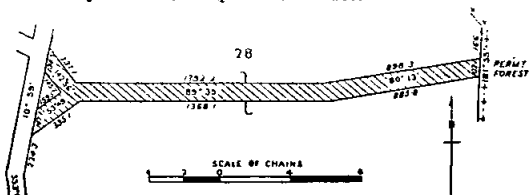

## PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF MORDIALLOC.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946*, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Mordialloc has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved for a street within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare that all that piece of land reserved for a street, being part of Crown allotment 1, section 23, Parish of Mordialloc, and being the land described hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act; namely:

## HICKS-STREET.

Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of Keiller-avenue, as shown on plan of subdivision No. 27445, lodged in the Office of Titles, and distant westerly 600 ft. 4 in. from the northern intersection of Keiller-avenue and Warren-road; bounded thence by lines bearing respectively 179 deg. 51½ min. 380 ft. 1 in., 269 deg. 24 min. 49 ft. 9½ in., 359 deg. 11 min. 60 feet, 359 deg. 55 min. 320 ft. 6½ in., and 89 deg. 55 min. 50 ft. 2 in. to the point of commencement.

## MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.

## INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

*Notice of Approval.*

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Town and Country Planning Acts, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, having taken into consideration a Report of the Town and Country Planning Board on the eighteenth day of March One thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight approved an Interim Development Order by the said Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works for the whole of the metropolitan area.

The Interim Development Order provides that the use or development of any land and the erection construction or carrying out of any buildings or works on any land within the whole of the metropolitan area is prohibited except insofar as such Order or the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works pursuant to such Order permits (absolutely or subject to any condition or conditions) the use or development of such land and the erection construction or carrying out thereon of buildings or works.

Copies of the Interim Development Order and of the Planning Scheme prepared by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works for the whole of the metropolitan area (copies of which have been deposited in accordance with the provisions of the Town and Country Planning Acts) to which such Order refers are available for inspection free of charge at the office of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, at the office of the Town and Country Planning Board and as to so much of the said Order and the said Planning Scheme prepared by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works and referred to in such Order as relates to land in the municipal district of any municipality at the office of such municipality.

## SWAN HILL SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1958.

1. The constitution of the said Waterworks Trust.
2. That the name of the Trust shall be "The Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust".
3. That on and from the first day of April, 1958, all works, liabilities, assets, receipts, disbursements, funds, properties, duties, and powers of the Shire of Nathalia Waterworks Trust appertaining to those portions of the Waterworks District of the said Trust situated within the Shire of Numurkah, namely the Katunga Urban District, the Urban Districts known as the "Numurkah Urban District", "Wunghnu Urban District", "Strathmerton Urban District", and the rural section of the Waterworks District shall be taken over by the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust.
4. That the Councillors for the time being of the Shire of Numurkah, together with one other person, shall be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust.
5. That the amount of money which may be borrowed by the Trust, pursuant to the *Water Act 1952* (No. 5637), shall not exceed, in the whole, the sum of Fifty thousand pounds (£50,000).
6. That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those within the following boundaries:—

Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred, doth hereby make the following Regulations:—

The Regulations made by the Board on 16th December, 1929, notified in the *Government Gazette* of the 27th December, 1929, for the care, protection, and management of the land reserved by Order in Council of 26th November, 1928, as a site for Public Park, Recreation, and Public purposes in the Township of Lucknow, Parish of Wy-Yung, and known as "Howitt Park" at Lucknow, are hereby applied to the land in the Township of Lucknow, Parish of Wy-Yung, temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 4th March, 1958, as a site for Public Park, Recreation, and Public purposes in addition to and adjoining the first-mentioned site, the whole together known as "Howitt Park" at Lucknow.—(Rs.3789.)

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "BOTANIC GARDENS" IN THE CITY OF MELBOURNE.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to, *inter alia*, make regulations for the care, protection, and management of lands reserved pursuant to the provisions of the *Land Acts* and not conveyed to or vested in trustees and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board, in pursuance of the power conveyed as aforesaid, doth hereby make the Regulations following for so much of the lands reserved for Public Park and Gardens in the City of Melbourne, as is known as the "Botanic Gardens", hereinafter referred to as the "Gardens".

##### REGULATIONS.

(1) The gates of the Gardens shall, unless the Minister of Lands otherwise directed, be opened daily at 7 a.m. during the months of October, November, December, January, February, and March, and at 7.30 a.m. during the months of April, May, June, July, August, and September, and shall be closed at sunset: Provided, however, that on all Sundays during the months of May, June, July, and August the gates shall be opened at 9 a.m., and on all Sundays during the months of September, October, November, December, January, February, March, and April, the gates shall be opened at 8.30 a.m.

A bell shall be rung five (5) minutes before the locking of the gates and any person found in the Gardens during hours when the Gardens are required by this Regulation to be closed shall be liable to prosecution.

(2) No person shall enter or remain in the Gardens who is in a state of intoxication, or who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, nor shall any person behave in a disorderly manner, or create or take part in any disturbance, or use indecent or abusive language, or commit any nuisance, or in any way offend against decency or commit any act of indecency therein.

(3) No person shall interfere with any bulb or thing growing within the Gardens, or with any seed or fruit of any such thing, nor shall any person, without the authority of the Director of the Gardens, have in his possession therein any shrub, plant, flower, bulb, fern, or seed.

(4) No person shall whilst in the Gardens—

- (a) Interfere with or deface any property or tree or plant life therein, or any fence in or around the Gardens.
- (b) Trespass on any flower or shrubbery bed, border, or edging therein, or any plot specially planted or enclosed for a plantation or any other purpose therein.
- (c) Interfere with any fish, bird, or other animal, or bird's nest or bird's egg therein.
- (d) Engage in any game or sport therein.
- (e) Throw stones or any other material or missiles therein.
- (f) Commit any nuisance or leave any refuse therein.
- (g) Spit on the paths, lawns, or on or in any structure or building therein.
- (h) Lie on the seats or on the grass in an offensive or indecent attitude or manner.

(i) Enter without lawful excuse any enclosure or area wherein a dwelling, conservatory, equipment shed, or other building or propagating frames are located.

(j) Ride any bicycle or tricycle therein, or drive or allow to enter therein any carriage, car, or other vehicle unless the same be used or required in connexion with works therein.

(k) Wilfully obstruct or interrupt any person employed therein in the proper execution of his work or duty.

(l) Annoy any person therein.

(m) Bathe, wade, or wash in any lake, pond, stream, or other ornamental water therein, or pollute any such water, or use any drinking fountain for any purpose other than drinking.

(n) Fish or attempt to fish in any lake, pond, stream, or other ornamental water therein.

(5) No person other than a member of the staff of the Gardens, or the lessee of the kiosk or his servants, shall light any fire therein.

(6) No male person shall enter any of the women's lavatories, and no female person shall enter any of the men's lavatories.

(7) No child under the age of ten (10) years shall enter the Gardens unless accompanied by and in the care or charge of an adult.

(8) No person shall, unless authorized in writing by the Board of Land and Works, offer for sale or sell in the Gardens any goods or article, or let for hire any chair or seat.

(9) No person shall cause or suffer any dog in his charge to enter the Gardens unless such dog be and remain under proper control on a chain, cord, or leash, and be at all times effectually restrained from causing annoyance to any person, or from entering any ornamental water or area enclosing a house or other building, or going on or being upon any garden or bed.

(10) No assembly for a concert, musical performance, fête, or picnic, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meeting of a like character shall take place in the Gardens without the approval, in writing, of the Secretary for Lands first obtained.

(11) No person whilst in the Gardens shall, without the approval, in writing, of the Secretary for Lands first obtained—

- (a) Distribute any bill, programme, or like thing.
- (b) Collect, or attempt to collect, money.
- (c) Take part in any public entertainment of any kind.
- (d) Preach or deliver an address or speech of any kind to members of the public.
- (e) Display any flag, banner, sign or device.
- (f) Take any photograph for commercial purposes.

(12) No person shall take part in or be a member of any assembly in the Gardens unless such assembly has been duly authorized as provided in clause 10 hereof.

(13) Any person offending against any of these Regulations shall, upon being requested by any member of the staff of the Gardens, or of the Police Force, to leave the Gardens, forthwith leave the same, and such person shall, in addition, be liable to prosecution.

(14) No person shall remain in the Gardens when lawfully directed to leave the same, and any person who refuses to so leave may be removed therefrom, and be liable to prosecution.

(15) No person shall bring a bicycle into the Gardens unless such bicycle be required for official duty therein.—(Rs.1041.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of these Regulations shall for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "KARDINIA PARK", GEELONG.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the City of Geelong permanently reserved as a site for Public Recreation, pursuant to the provisions of the *Geelong (Kardinia Park) Land Act 1950*, and the Land Acts, and known as the "Kardinia Park", Geelong.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times free of charge.
2. No person who offends or may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct shall enter, be, or remain in the Reserve.
3. No society, club, picnic party or other combined body shall use the Reserve or any part thereof without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
4. The Committee of Management may set apart a portion or portions of the Reserve as and for the purposes of a children's playground.
5. No person over the age of twelve years shall use any swing, cradle-swing, slide, roundabout, see-saw, ocean wave, or other structure or appliance of the like kind usually designed or set apart for the use and amusement of children which may be in the children's playground or elsewhere in any part of the Reserve (hereinafter referred to as an "appliance").
6. Any person using any appliance who, in the opinion of any officer being a bailiff of Crown lands or member of the Police Force or officer or servant of the Committee of Management there present, is over the age of twelve years, shall forthwith, on being so requested by such officer, immediately desist from the use of such appliance, and if further requested so to do shall leave that portion of the Reserve where any such appliance may be.
7. No person shall climb or jump over any fence or gate or stick any bill thereon, or cut any name or sign on any fence, gate, tree, or seat, or in any way damage any building, gate, fence, or other property in or around the Reserve, or pollute any water therein, or remove therefrom any soil, sand, manure, or other property.
8. No person shall post or place any advertisement, bill, poster, or any other like sign in any part of the Reserve, nor give out or distribute any handbill, placard, notice, advertisement, book, pamphlet, or paper in the Reserve, or litter the same by scattering or throwing down any handbill, placard, notice, advertisement, book, pamphlet, or paper.
9. No person shall interfere with any tree, shrub, or other property in the Reserve, or commit any nuisance, or leave in the Reserve any bottle, paper, cast-off clothing or other litter, except in such places as may from time to time be set apart by the Committee of Management.
10. No person shall erect in the Reserve any building, booth, tent, table, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or for the purpose of any games or amusement, or for any other purpose, or hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or article of any description without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, and then only subject to the payment of such fees and on such conditions as the Committee of Management may determine.
11. No person shall light any fire in the Reserve, or do any act which may cause, or be likely to cause, damage by fire to anything growing or being therein.
12. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserve, shall walk upon any flower bed or enter any plot therein which may be enclosed or used for plantations for young trees, shrubs, or flowers.
13. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a cord or chain, and all dogs, goats, and poultry found wandering in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.
14. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horse, sheep, goat, pig, or other animal.
15. The Committee of Management shall have full authority and power to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that

status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purpose of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

16. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport in the Reserve on Sunday, Anzac Day, or Good Friday.

17. No person shall play any unlawful game or make any wager for money, or by unseemly conduct interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within the Reserve, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any keeper or other servant of the Committee of Management.

18. No person shall play any musical instrument, preach, deliver any address, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management being first obtained.

19. No person shall camp in the Reserve.

20. No person shall throw, or cause to be thrown, any stone, missile or hard substance in the Reserve, and no person shall play at cricket, hockey, golf, rounders, tennis, or any other game in the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

21. In any part of the Reserve used or set apart for a children's playground—

- (a) No child shall use any swing or other appliance except for the purpose for which they are respectively provided.
- (b) The Committee of Management shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any swing or other appliance.
- (c) No person shall ride or drive any bicycle or tricycle, or have or bring any animal in or into the same.

22. The Committee of Management shall have the right to remove or exclude from the Reserve any person who commits a breach of these Regulations, and such person shall in addition be liable for the penalty for such offence.

23. No person, except those in the employ of or authorized, in writing, by the Committee of Management of the park shall drive any traction engine, tractor, roller, omnibus, char-a-banc, truck, wagon, lorry, dray, cart, van, or other commercial vehicle or machine, whether propelled by steam, motor or other power, or drawn by any horse or other animal on to, over, or through the Reserve.

24. No person shall park a motor car or other vehicle or motor cycle within the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for the purpose, and any person using any such place for parking a motor car or other vehicle or motor cycle shall, on demand by an authorized officer of the Committee of Management, pay such fee as is from time to time determined by such Committee, in respect of any such car or vehicle or motor cycle for the use of such parking area on such days, not exceeding 26 in any one year, as a charge is being made for admission to the Reserve for Public Recreation adjoining.

25. No person shall ride or drive any bicycle or motor cycle, motor car or other vehicle on any path, track or way in the Reserve set apart and marked by a notice as for use by pedestrians only.—(Rs.511.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff or member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "KARDINIA OVAL", GEELONG.

##### REGULATION.

No person shall offer any article or commodity whatsoever for sale or hire within the Reserve or within any structure thereon without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained and then only subject to such terms and conditions as shall be determined by such Committee.—(Rs.72.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with this Regulation shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.
