## PROCLAMATION OF PROHIBITED PERIOD.

### PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 3 of the *Forests Act 1957*, I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this my Proclamation proclaim the period commencing at midnight between the fifteenth and sixteenth days of April, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight and ending at midnight between the thirtieth day of April and the first day of May, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight to be the prohibited period in respect to any fire protected area other than a State forest or national park in the State of Victoria situated in such municipalities as are specified in the Schedule hereto.

No. 6186. "An Act to amend the *Marriage Act 1928*, and for other purposes"—

which was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon, has been laid before Her Majesty in Council and that by an Order in Council bearing date the fourteenth day of March, 1958, Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to same.

## ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1956.

### PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Road Traffic Act 1956* it is amongst other things enacted that Part II. of the said Act shall apply only in respect of infringements occurring in any area or circumstance specified for the purpose of such Part by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* and occurring after the date of such Proclamation:

And whereas it is also enacted in the said Act that any such Proclamation may provide that such Part of the said Act shall apply only in respect of parking infringements or in respect of traffic infringements or in any particular area or circumstance:

And whereas it is further enacted that no such Proclamation shall be made in relation to parking infringements unless the council of any municipality the municipal district or any part of the municipal district

of which is specified therein has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such Part to such municipal district or part thereof:

And whereas the Council of the City of Geelong West has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such Part in respect only of parking infringements to the City of Geelong West:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation specify the City of Geelong West as an area in which Part II. of the *Road Traffic Act 1956* shall apply in respect only of parking infringements occurring after the date hereof.

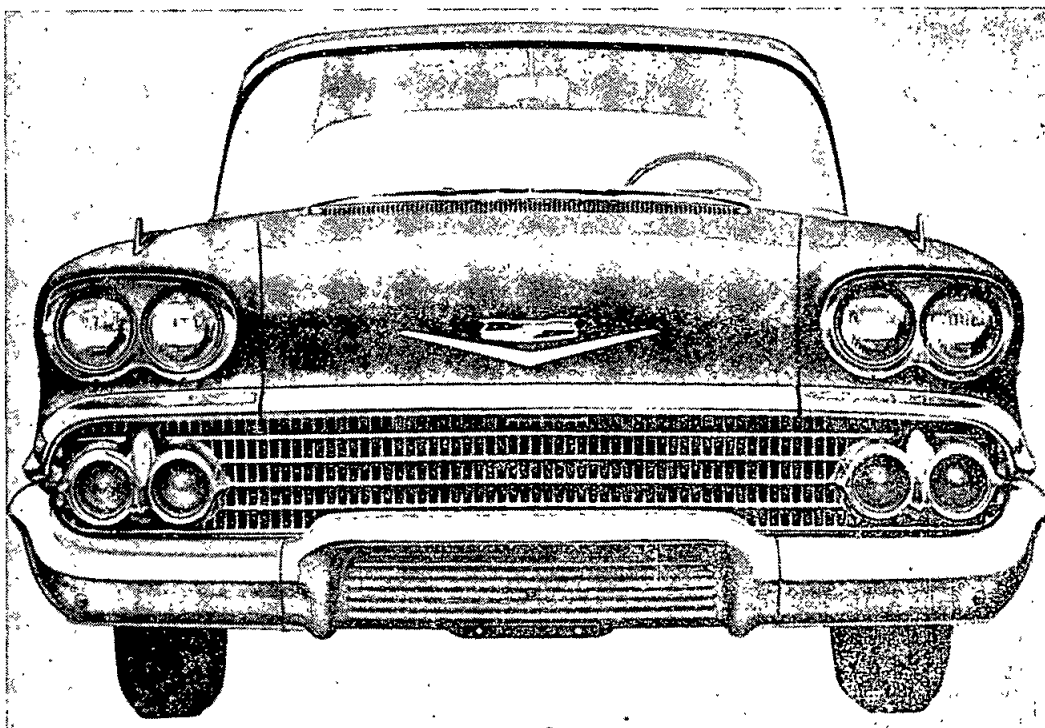

## DUAL HEADLAMPS.

**T**AKE notice that the Chief Commissioner of Police has approved of the equipping of motor cars with Dual Headlamps, as illustrated hereunder, provided they comply with the following conditions:—

- I. That Dual Headlamps are part of the standard equipment of the motor car when first registered.
- II. That Headlamps, when illuminated, comply with the Motor Car Regulations dealing with lighting.



One lamp on each side operates on dipped beam and all four on main beam.

HIGHWAY IN THE SHIRE OF BALLARAT.

**N**OTICE is hereby given that the Country Roads Board, under the powers conferred upon it by the *Country Roads Act 1948* (No. 5290), has fixed a new alignment for the west side of the North-Western Highway in the Shire of Ballarat, as described hereunder, that is to say:—Commencing at a point on the north-eastern boundary of a Public Purposes Reserve in the Parish of Dowling Forest, distant 320 deg. 29 min. 930 links from the north-western angle of allotment 72 of the said Parish; thence by lines bearing 148 deg. 4 min. 1,451.7 links, and 175 deg. 36½ min. 1,346.7 links to a point on the eastern boundary of allotment 26, section 4, of the said Parish, distant 183 deg. 47 min. 529.9 links from the north-eastern angle of the allotment last named—which said new alignment is shown on survey plan numbered 6772, lodged in the office of the Country Roads Board.

## SALES OF CROWN LANDS BY AUCTION.
