WHEREAS by a Proclamation of the Governor in Council issued on the sixteenth day of November, 1954, and published in the Government Gazette of the seventeenth day of November, 1954, for the purposes of the Country Fire Authority Act 1944, certain parts of the country area of Victoria were proclaimed as fire control regions; and certain parts of such fire control regions were proclaimed to be urban fire districts; and the remainder (if any) of each such fire control region (being the area not included in any urban fire district) was proclaimed to be a rural district:

And whereas by settion sixteen of the Country Fire

And whereas by section sixteen of the Country Fire Authority Act 1944, it is (amongst other things) enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after consideration of a report submitted by the Country Fire Authority by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, create any new urban fire district and amend or alter the boundaries of rural fire districts within any fire control region:

And whereas the Country Fire Authority has whereas

(a) Create as a new urban fire district that part of the Ninth Fire Control Region which is described in the Schedule hereto; and

(b) alter the boundaries of the rural fire district within the Ninth Fire Control Region to the extent rendered necessary by the excision of the part of such region which is described as aforesaid.

#### SCHEDULE.

Commencing at a point on the western boundary of allotment 104 Parish of Allambee East distant 150 feet northerly from the south-western angle of that allotment; thence easterly by a line to a point in the prolongation northerly of the eastern boundary of allotment 13 section A Township of Mirboo North and distant 1,200 feet from the north-eastern angle of that allotment; thence southerly by a line, the eastern boundary of the afore-mentioned allotment and a line the prolongation southerly of such boundary to the southern boundary of allotment 38 Parish of Mirboo; thence westerly by the southern boundary of allotment 38 and allotment 41 to the south-western angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence by a line to the southernmost angle of the north-western part of allotment 8 Parish of Mardan; thence northerly by the western boundary of allotment 8 to the north-western angle of that allotment; thence by a line to the south-western angle of allotment 104 Parish of Allambee East; thence northerly by the western boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to the point of commencement.

(b) alter the boundaries of the rural fire district within the Eleventh Fire Control Region to the extent rendered necessary by the excision of the part of such region which is described as aforesaid.


