Vegetation Diseases (Fruit Fly) Act 1947 (No. 5258) DECLARING A PROCLAIMED AREA.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Depend-encies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the Vegetation Diseases (Fruit Fly) Act 1947 (No. 5258), it is provided that, where the Governor in Council is of opinion that it is necessary the Governor in Council is of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family Trypetidæ (commonly known as fruit flies), he may by Proclamation declare any portion of Victoria specified therein to be a proclaimed area, and prohibit the planting on any land in the proclaimed area of any plant or vegetable specified, and prohibit the removal from any property within the prescribed area to any other property within the prescribed area to any other property within the area and from any place in the prescribed area to any place outside the area of any fruit or vegetable, and require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take such action for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit fly as is specified in the Proclamation: Now therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family Trypetidæ (commonly known as fruit flies) and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby—

1. Declare that portion of Victoria-

Within the Township of Yarrawonga, Parish of Yarrawonga and County of Moira to be a proclaimed

- 2. Prohibit the removal from any place within the proclaimed area to any other place within the area or to any place outside the area of any fruit or vegetable or any case or package which has contained any fruit or vegetable unless such removal is made on the instruction of an inspector.
- 3. Require occupiers and owners of land, not being a commercial orchard, in the proclaimed area to:—
 - (a) Apply to all trees and plants of the following kinds:—

Apples, apricots, brambles and other berry Apples, apricots, brambles and other berry fruits, cape gooseberries, cherries, citrus fruits, cucumbers, egg fruit, figs, gooseberries, grapes, guavas, loquats, medlars, nectarines, passion fruit, peaches, pears, peppers, persimmons, plums, prunes, quinces, rock melons, sweet melons, tomatoes and all other trees and plants which have edible fruits,

one of the following treatments:-

of the following treatments:—

(i) Thoroughly spray with an efficient garden spray pump the whole of the foliage with a solution containing two thousand (2,000) parts of Dichloro - diphenyl - trichloroethane (D.D.T.) to one million (1,000,000) parts of water (0·2 per cent.) at intervals of not more than twenty-one (21) days commencing at the time fruit on such trees and plants has set and continuing until one (1) month after it has been harvested, or (ii) Apply by spraying, or by spileshing the

(ii) Apply by spraying, or by splashing the required quantity of solution on the foliage of trees and plants by any suitable method such as with a large paint brush dipped in an open container or from a bottle with a perforated stopper at intervals not longer than seven (7) days commencing at the time the fruit has set and continuing until one (1) month after it has been harmorted to the foliage on the least until one (1) month after it has been harvested to the foliage on at least three (3) different parts of each tree and to the foliage of all plants a solution consisting of two (2) ounces of tartar emetic and two and one-half (2½) pounds of white sugar in four (4) gallons of water, or a solution consisting of two (2) ounces of sodium fluosilicate and two and one-half (2½) pounds of white sugar in four (4) gallons of water at the rate of ten (10) fluid ounces per tree and ten (10) fluid ounces per two hundred (200) square feet of planted area of such plants.

- (b) Pick up from the said land before noon each day all fallen fruits of the kinds specified in paragraph 3(a) above, and dispose of all such fruits as prescribed in paragraph 4 (c) below.
- 4. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take action as and when directed by a notice served on such occupier or owner by an inspector and within the time specified in such notice-
 - (a) To remove all plants of-Tomato (Lycopersicum sp.),
 Pepper (Capsicum sp.),
 Pepper (Capsicum sp.),
 Egg Plant (Solanum melongena).
 Ornamental Solanum (Solanum sp.),
 Rock Melon (Cucumis sp.),
 Sweet Melon (Cucumis sp.),
 Cucumber (Cucumis sp.),
 Cape Gooseberry (Physalis edulis),
 Brambles (except cultivated varieties),
 Box Thorn, provided that where box thorn is
 grown as a hedge along a boundary or
 dividing fence the occupier or owner may
 continue to so grow it on the following continue to so grow it on the following conditions:-
 - (i) Cut back the hedge forthwith and periodically as necessary to retain it within a height not exceeding six (6) feet from the ground level and a width not exceeding two (2) feet.
 - width not exceeding two (2) feet.

 (ii) That when such hedge has been cut back to within the foregoing dimensions, he shall thoroughly spray it forthwith to cover all parts of the plants forming the hedge with a solution containing Two thousand (2,000) parts of two-four Dichlorophenoxy-acetic acid (2-4D), or one of its derivatives to One million (1,000,000) parts of water (0.2 per cent.) and he shall spray it thereafter as often as is necessary to prevent the plants from forming fruit, fruit.

and refrain from planting such plants while this Proclamation remains in force.

(b) To remove from all trees and plants growing upon the said land and to pick up from the said land all of the following fruits and/or

vegetables:—

Apples, apricots, brambles and other berry fruits, cape gooseberries, cherries, citrus fruits, cucumbers, egg fruit, figs, gooseberries, grapes, guavas, loquats, medlars, nectarines, passion fruit, peaches, pears, peppers, persimmons, plums, prunes, quinces, rock melons, sweet melons, tomatoes and all edible fruits of all trees and plants, including all such fruits and vegetables which shall form on such trees and plants after the service of the said notice during such time as this Proclamation remains in force.

- force.

 (c) To dispose of all such fruits and/or vegetables by boiling for fifteen (15) minutes, or burning them so as to destroy all eggs and larvæ of the fruit fly or burying them under a depth of soil of at least three (3) feet after having applied to the upper layer of such buried fruit or vegetables D.D.T. at the rate of not less than one-helf currener square yard in the form of vegetables D.D.T. at the rate of not less than one-half ounce per square yard in the form of a spray containing not less than 0.2 per cent. of the pure para para isomer of D.D.T. or in the form of a dust containing not less than 2 per cent. of the pure para para isomer of D.D.T. or by otherwise treating them as an inspector may direct, in such a manner as to kill all eggs, larvæ and pupæ of fruit flies.
- kill all eggs, larvæ and pupæ of fruit files.

 (d) To spray all trees and plants growing on the said land with a solution containing Two thousand (2,000) parts of Dichloro-diphenyltrichloroethane (D.D.T.) to One million parts of water (0.2 per cent.) or in the case of a commercial orchard equipped with a power spraying plant approved by an inspector, with a solution containing One thousand (1,000) parts of D.D.T. to One million parts of water (0.1 per cent.), at intervals not exceeding twentyone (21) days during the period specified in such notice, and/or with such other solution as is specified in the said notice and at times specified therein.

(e) To treat the soil beneath and around trees suspected by an inspector to be infested or to have been infested with fruit fly by applying uniformly to the surface of an area or areas marked by an inspector a dust containing 1 per cent. of the pure gamma isomer of Benzene hexachloride at the rate of not less than two (2) ounces per square yard, and/or by giving such other treatment as is specified in the said

(f) To reduce, if necesary, all tall growing trees and plants covered by this Proclamation, except when grown as a commercial orchard or plantation, to a height which will permit them to be stripped of fruit and/or sprayed to the satis-

faction of an inspector.

5. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to give access to such land at all times to an inspector with or without assistants for the purpose of inspection and/or applying on such properties any spray material and/or for the purpose of removing any fruit or vegetables or prohibited plant, and/or performing such other acts which in the opinion of an inspector are for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit flies.

EXPLOSIVE-POWERED TOOL REGULATIONS.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Labour and Industry Acts, The Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, to have effect on the 21st day of April, 1958, that is to say:—

SHORT TITLE.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Explosive-powered Tool Regulations" and shall apply to any tool used or intended for use in or in connection with a trade or business.

DEFINITIONS.

- 2. (1) In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter-
 - " Approved " means approved in writing by the Chief Inspector.
 - "Authorised person" means:-
 - (a) a maker of tools or a person authorised by a maker to repair tools.
 - (b) a person who by way of trade or business manufactures, sells, deals in, repairs, tests, or proves firearms as defined by the Firearms Acts, or has in his possession any such firearms for sale, dealing in, repair, testing or proving and whether such person manufactures, deals in, sells, repairs, tests or proves any other goods or not.
 - (c) a person working under the direct supervision of a person referred to in paragraph (a) or paragraph (b) of this definition.
 - "Chief Inspector" means the chief inspector of factories and shops under the Labour and Industry Acts.
 - "Defect" means any defect which may impair or affect the safe and normal operation of a tool.
 - "Repair" means repair, renovate, modify, alter or adjust or attempt to repair, renovate, modify, alter or adjust.
 - "Owner" means the owner, borrower or hirer of any tool or the employer of any person who, by his direction, or by the direction of his servant or agent, uses any tool but does not include an employé.
 - " Projectile" means stud, pin, dowel, screw, rivet, spike, nail or other object driven against, into or through any substance by means of a tool, or adapted or intended to be so driven.
 - "Qualified operator" means a person registered as being qualified under these Regulations to operate any tool or tools described in his certificate of registration issued under these Regulations.
 - "Tool" means a tool whereby a projectile may be driven against, into or through any substance by means of an explosive charge, and includes every attachment to and accessory of such a tool and every device used or adapted or intended to be used therewith, but does not include a firearm within the meaning of the Firearms Acts.
- (2) For the purpose of these Regulations a person shall be deemed to use a tool if he loads, unloads, or discharges or attempts to load, unload or discharge a tool.

OPERATORS OF TOOLS.

- 3. (1) If the Chief Inspector is satisfied that a person:-
 - (a) is over the age of 18 years;
 - (b) (i) is at the date of coming into operation of these Regulations proficient in the safe use, adjustment, assembly and taking apart of any tool or tools, or
 - (ii) has attended a course of instruction approved by the Chief Inspector concerning the use of any tool or tools and has successfully passed a test set by the person or body which provided such course of instruction;
 - (c) is in the opinion of the Chief Inspector not suffering from any defect of colour vision which would render him unfit to use a tool;
- (d) has a thorough knowledge of these Regulations; he may register such person as a qualified operator by entering his name and address and the type or types of tool which he is qualified to operate in a register kept for that purpose and issue to him a certificate or certificates in the form of Schedule A hereto which shall state the type or types of tool of which he is a qualified operator under these Regulations.
- (2) If the Chief Inspector believes that any applicant for registration is suffering from a defect of colour vision of the kind mentioned in paragraph (c) of sub-clause (1) hereof, he may require the applicant to produce a certificate from a legally qualified medical practitioner as to the state of his colour vision so that the Chief Inspector may be satisfied whether the applicant is suffering from any such defect.
- (3) (a) No person unless he is a qualified operator shall use any Operators to be qualified. tool.

- (b) No person shall employ cause or allow any person to use a tool without first ensuring by proper enquiry-
 - (i) that such person is a qualified operator and
 - (ii) is not by reason of any infirmity, disability or incapacity unfit to use a tool.
- (c) the provisions of paragraph (a) and sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (b) of this sub-clause shall have no force or effect until the first day of September, 1958.
- (d) nothing in this sub-clause shall require an authorised person as defined in clause 2 of these Regulations to be registered as a qualified operator.
- (4) Nothing in sub-clause (3) of this clause shall apply to the Trainee Operators use of any tool by a person who, under the immediate supervision and control of a qualified operator is being trained to be a qualified operator.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR TOOLS AND PROJECTILES.

- 4. (1) No person shall sell, offer for sale, let under hire purchase agreement or otherwise, loan, use, or cause to be used for any purpose whatsoever, any tool unless:-
 - (a) it corresponds in all respects with an approved sample.
 - (b) there is permanently engraved or embossed upon the tool in a conspicuous position so as to be clearly legible at all times, a notice as follows:-
 - "Do not remove tool from work surface for at least ten (10) seconds if tool fails to fire;"
 - (c) there is permanently engraved or embossed upon the tool a clearly legible serial number by which it can be readily identified:
 - (d) there is attached to such tool at its muzzle end a protective shield or device:-
 - (i) which will arrest effectively the escape of projectiles and other objects and particles liberated by the discharge of the tool, and
 - (ii) of which the outer edge may not be closer to the centre of the barrel at any point than a distance of two inches (2") except when the tool may be used in the circumstances mentioned in subclause 8 of clause 7 hereof.

- (2) Any person who applies for approval of any tool shall submit to the Chief Inspector—
 - (a) a sample of such tool for the determination, by examination and tests of the safe functioning characteristics of the tool;
 - (b) samples of such materials used in the construction of such tool as the Chief Inspector may, from time to time, require;
 - (c) fully dimensioned drawings and specifications which will establish the pattern, the detailed construction and the nature of the tool;
 - (d) such further information in writing as may be required by the Chief Inspector for the purposes aforesaid.
- (3) Any sample tools, samples of materials, drawings, specifications and other written information submitted in accordance with this clause may be retained by the Chief Inspector.
- (4) Every person who applies for approval of a tool shall satisfy the Chief Inspector that—
 - (a) it would not be discharged if dropped on a concrete floor from a height of ten feet (10') or less.
 - (b) it may not be discharged unless the operator is required to maintain a load of not less than twenty-five pounds on the spring which propels the firing pin.
 - (c) it may not be accidentally discharged when being handled.
 - (d) it may not be discharged when the axis of the barrel of the tool deviates by more than six degrees (6°) from the perpendicular to the surface into which a projectile is being fired.
- (5) When the Chief Inspector is satisfied that any sample of a tool is manufactured in accordance with these Regulations, he shall grant his approval thereto and notify the same in the *Government Gazette* and by such notice specify the manner in which such tool is to be described for the purpose of these Regulations.
- (6) No person shall falsely represent either by marking the same or in any other manner that any tool corresponds with a sample approved under these Regulations.
- (7) Any owner of a tool if required by the Chief Inspector shall submit such tool to the Chief Inspector for examination.

REGISTRATION OF TOOLS.

- 5. (1) The Chief Inspector shall cause to be kept a register in which shall be entered the type and serial number of each tool and the name and address of the purchaser of each such tool.
- (2) Any person who sells a tool shall, within forty-eight hours of such sale notify the Chief Inspector in writing of the sale and of the type and serial number of the tool and of the name and address of the purchaser.
- (3) The purchaser of any tool shall, within forty-eight hours of his obtaining possession of such tool notify the Chief Inspector in writing of the type and serial number of the tool and of his name and address.
- (4) A document signed by the Chief Inspector stating that any person is registered under this clause as the purchaser of any tool shall be prima facie evidence that such person is the owner of such tool.
- (5) In this clause, owner means legal owner but does not include any other person.

INSPECTION AND REPAIR OF TOOLS.

6. (1) (a) the owner of each tool shall cause it —

Inspection.

- (i) to be inspected for defects by a qualified operator immediately prior to its use on any day.
- ately prior to its use on any day.

 (ii) after each sixty hours use and before it is again used to be thoroughly examined by a qualified operator for defects.
- (iii) to be completely overhauled by an authorised person at least once in each twelve months. After each such overhaul the tool may be used again only when such authorised person has certified that the tool is free from defects.

- (b) No owner shall use or cause to be used a tool unless:-
 - (i) it has been inspected, examined and overhauled as prescribed by paragraph (a) of this sub-clause or
 - (ii) it is free from any defect which has been revealed on such inspection, examination or overhaul as prescribed by paragraph (a) of this sub-clause.
- (c) An Inspector of Factories and Shops may declare any tool unsafe for use whereupon the owner thereof shall cause such tool to be removed from service until it has been repaired and a certificate in the form of Schedule B hereto relating to such tool has been issued by an authorised person.
- (2) (a) No person other than an authorised person shall repair a tool. Provided that a qualified operator or person who under the immediate supervision and control of a qualified operator is being trained to be a qualified operator shall not be deemed to repair a tool by reason only of his making or attempting to make such minor adjustments as are incidental to its ordinary operation.
- (b) No person shall:-
 - (i) employ, cause or permit any person other than an authorised person to repair a tool.
 - (ii) knowing that a tool has been repaired by a person other than an authorised person use such tool or employ, cause or permit any person to use such tool unless it has since being so-repaired been overhauled by an authorised person.
 - (iii) at any time repair a tool in such a way that when repaired it does not correspond with a sample tool approved under these Regulations.

Use of Tools.

7. (1) No person shall, knowing that a tool has any defect, use or General. employ, cause or permit any person to use any such tool.

(2) (a) No person shall use a tool for driving a projectile into:— Limitation of

- (i) high tensile steel, steel hardened by heat treatment, cast Hard substances, iron or other similarly hard or unyielding substances. In this paragraph "high tensile steel" means steel, the nominal ultimate tensile value of which exceeds forty-five tons per square inch.
- slate or other readily shatterable substances.

(iii) concrete which contains aggregate which will not pass Concrete wholly through one inch (1") mesh screens.

(iv) reinforced concrete where the projectile may penetrate Reinforced further than three-quarters of the distance measured from the place of entry on the face of the concrete to the nearest surface of reinforcing.

(v) any material or materials when it is intended to lodge the General. projectile to its effective full length so that it may foul any object contained by the material or materials which would prevent the projectile from following a straight

path.

(vi) any substance at a point so close to the edge thereof or to Use near edges. any hole therein that there is danger that the substance might crack or break or the projectile escape therefrom.

- (vii) steel within half an inch of the edge thereof or,
- (viii) brick or concrete or any similar substance within three inches of an edge of any structure of which such brick, concrete or substance forms a part.
- (b) No person shall use a tool in the presence of an explosive or inflammable gas, dust or vapour or in compressed air or in any place where the explosive charge may be exploded or rendered dangerous by heat.

Explosive or

- (3) No person shall use a tool for driving a projectile into any substance unless before so doing he knows or ascertains by suitable tests that the explosive charge which he is about to use-
 - (a) is of no greater strength than is necessary for the purpose for which the tool is to be used.

- (b) is of such strength that the whole of the projectile will not pass through the substance on which the tool is to be used except where such substance is backed by protective material capable of fully absorbing the energy of the projectile.
- (4) No person shall sell, offer for sale, or have in possession for sale, any explosive charge for use in a tool unless it is marked on the top or bottom in colour in accordance with the following scale to indicate the relative strength thereof.

Brown Minimum Green Weak Yellow Medium Red Strong Purple Very Strong White Especially Strong Black Maximum

- (5) No person shall use a barrel extension on a tool unless there is attached to the tool a protective shield or device which will perform the same functions as the shield or device mentioned in clause 4(1)(d)of these Regulations.
- (6) Every person while using a tool or carrying or handling a Care in handling tools loaded tool shall at all times:-

(a) keep all parts of his body clear of the muzzle end of the barrel of the tool and keep such end pointed away from himself and all other persons.

(b) exercise the utmost care to avoid injury to himself and others

(7) No person shall discharge a tool unless:--

Discharging tools.

- (a) he is in a safe well-balanced position so that tilting or misalignment of the tool at the time of firing may not
- (b) it is so placed upon the substance into which a projectile is being driven that the shield or device mentioned in clause 4 (1) (d) will arrest effectively the escape of projectiles and other objects and particles liberated by the firing of the tool.
- (8) No person shall use a tool which is fitted with an interchangeable or adjustable shield or device as mentioned in clause 4 (1) (d) hereof in such a manner that the distance between any part of the outer edge thereof and the centre of the barrel is less than two inches unless the escape of any projectile which may ricochet into the area outside the shield but which is within a radius of less than two inches from the centre of the barrel will be effectively arrested by other surrounding material.

(9) If when any person attempts to use a tool on any surface the charge fails to explode he shall continue to hold it in the firing failure. position for at least ten seconds and if the charge has not then exploded he shall unload the tool or place it in such a position that no person may be injured in the event of the charge exploding.

(10) A person using a tool shall, after each firing, carefully Removing foreign examine it and remove from it all pieces of projectile explosive matter. charge and other foreign matter that may be present.

(11) No person shall intentionally fire a tool in such a manner as Flying projectiles to cause the projectile to fly free.

(12) No person shall use in or with any tool any projectile, Use of explosive charge, breech plug, barrel extension or adaptor which is equipment. not of a type correctly suited to the particular tool and to the purpose for which the tool is being used. No person shall use a tool for a purpose for which it is not made or adapted.

(13) Where there appears on any tool, on the container of any Manutool, or in any printed matter supplied with any tool any instruction, advice or recommendation not inconsistent with these Regulations as to the safe use of the tool or the use therewith for reasons of safety of any substance or thing, such tool, substance or thing shall be used in accordance with such instruction, advice or recommendation pro-vided that nothing in this sub-clause shall require the use of any particular brand or make of any substance or thing.

(14) No person shall manufacture for sale or use with any tool any explosive charge or projectile which if used as intended by the manufacturer may cause injury to any person.

CARE AND STORAGE OF TOOLS AND EXPLOSIVE CHARGES.

- 8. (1) The owner of any tool shall keep or cause to be kept such tool in a securely locked container at all times when it is not required to be removed for use, inspection, repair or other necessary purpose. No person shall take or keep any tool out of its container unless the tool is required for use, inspection, repair or other necessary purpose.
- (2) No person shall leave unattended any tool or any explosive Safekeeping of tools. charge made for use in a tool unless effective precautions are taken to ensure that it will not be taken away, handled or used by an unauthorised person.

- (3) No person shall elsewhere than at the place at which the London tools tool is to be used load any tool for use. No person shall carry or transport a loaded tool from place to place unless by reason of mechanical failure the tool cannot be unloaded.
 - (4) (a) The owner of any explosive charges for a tool shall:-
 - (i) provide a metal container or metal containers in which he shall cause such charges to be kept.
 - (ii) cause each such container to be kept clearly marked with the words "EXPLOSIVE CHARGES".
- (b) The owner or the person for the time being having the custody of any explosive charges for a tool shall:-
 - (i) keep the same in the said metal container or containers.
 - (ii) keep such container or containers locked at all times except when explosive charges are being placed therein or removed therefrom.
 - (iii) not permit any such container to be opened except by a person using a tool or assisting in the use of a tool.
 - (iv) not use or permit any other person to use such container or containers except for the storage of explosive charges.

PROTECTIVE DEVICES.

- 9. (1) The owner of a tool shall provide for the use of each person who uses or assists in the use of it a device or devices to be worn by such person so as to protect as far as possible the eyes of such person from injury arising from the use of such tool.
- (2) The owner of a tool shall provide for the use of each person who uses or assists in the use of it a device or devices so as to protect as far as possible the hearing of such person from injury arising from the use of such tool.
- (3) An owner shall not supply any device mentioned in sub-clause (1) or (2) of this clause to any person if it has been used previously by any other person unless it is of metal, plastic or other nonabsorbent material and has been thoroughly cleaned.
- (4) No person for whose use any device has been provided in accordance with this clause shall use or assist in the use of any tool unless he is using such device or devices.

WARNING NOTICES.

10. At all times when a tool is being used the owner thereof shall cause to be displayed so as to be clearly legible by all persons who are at or near the place where the tool is being used a notice or notices containing the following words:

"WARNING-EXPLOSIVE-POWERED TOOL IN USE KEEP CLEAR."

Such notice or notices shall be displayed on a rigid rectangular notice board measuring not less than thirty inches wide by nineteen inches deep and shall be printed in black poster type lettering of not less than 36 point measurement on a yellow background and no other matter whatever shall be included on any such notice board.

GENERAL.

11. A document certifying that any person is or is not or was or was not registered as a qualified operator or a purchaser under these Regulations shall if signed by the Chief Inspector be prima facie evidence of the facts therein stated. All courts and persons acting judicially shall take judicial notice of the signature to any such document of every person who is or has been the Chief Inspector.

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Gas Appliances (Prescribed Gases) Regulations 1958." and shall come into operation upon publication thereof in the Government Gazette.
- 2. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or . subject-matter---
 - "Petroleum gas" means a gas which is a mixture of hydrocarbons basically consisting of butanes or butenes or propane or propene or any mixture of all or any of them.
- 3. Petroleum gas is hereby prescribed as a gas for the purposes of section 67 of the Health Act 1956 (No. 6024).

And the Honorable Ewen Paul Cameron, Her Majesty's Minister of Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS AMENDING THE FOOD PREMISES REGULATIONS 1955.

NDER the powers conferred by the *Health Act* 1956 (No. 6024) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Amending Food Premises Regulations 1958" and shall come into operation upon publication in the *Government Gazette*.
- 2. In Regulation 2 of the Food Premises Regulations 1955 after the interpretation of "Approved" there shall be inserted the following interpretation:—
 - "Exempted premises" means premises which are food premises only by reason of one or more of the following circumstances, namely:—
 - (i) Fruit or vegetables are packed stored or sold there.
 - (ii) Food which has been packed otherwise than on the premises so as to be enclosed in securely fastened packages or containers is stored or sold there in such packages or containers.
- 3. Regulation 3 of the Food Premises Regulations 1955 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—
 - "3. Every person who is required by the *Health Act* 1956 to register any food premises shall apply to the Council in the form prescribed in the Schedule to the Registration (Health Acts) Regulations and shall submit with such application a sketch plan to a scale not smaller than 8 feet to 1 inch showing every part of the premises in which it is intended to manufacture prepare pack store or sell food and indicating the use to which each such part is to be put and the nature and use of any compartments with a door window or other opening connecting with any such part."
- 4. Regulations 4 and 5 of the Food Premises Regulations 1955 are hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—
- "4. No alteration in the use of any part of the premises as shown on the plan submitted pursuant to regulation 3 hereof shall be made except with the consent or at the direction of the Council.
 - "5. Regulations 6 to 21 inclusive of these Regulations shall not apply in the case of exempted premises."
- 5. Regulation 9 of the Food Premises Regulations 1955 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—
 - "9. Every shop or other place in which any food not in sealed containers is sold shall be provided with wash-hand basins in approved positions in the ratio of 1 to every 10 persons working therein, together with a sufficient supply of soap, water and clean paper towels or other approved hand-drying equipment; or be provided with equivalent handwashing facilities to the satisfaction of the Council."

- 6. Paragraph (f) of sub-regulation (2) of regulation 13 of the Food Premises Regulations 1955 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:-
 - "(f) The surfaces which come into contact with meat or fish of all tables, benches, shelves, trays and similar fittings and appliances shall be impervious to water:

Provided that a cutting table or chopping-block of approved design the upper surface of which is constructed of closegrained wood and in a good state of repair shall be accepted as complying with this requirement."

AMENDING PUBLIC BUILDING REGULATIONS 1958 (No. 1).
