## PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 900 (2) of the *Local Government Act 1946* provides—*inter alia*—that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the council of any municipality, not being a city or town, extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas the Councils of the Shire of South Gippsland and the Shire of Maffra have requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to the municipal district of such municipality:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act 1946* to the municipal districts of the Shire of South Gippsland and the Shire of Maffra, and order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the municipal districts of the Shire of South Gippsland and the Shire of Maffra on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 25th August, 1958, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipalities to make By-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said chapter, and provided, further, that no such By-law shall come into operation before the 25th August, 1958.

## QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE.

## BUTTER QUOTA.

I, GILBERT LAWRENCE CHANDLER, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of butter at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for butter as follows:—

The proportion shall be Eighty-six point six seven per cent.

The period for which this quota is to operate shall be the month of June, 1958.

## CHEESE QUOTA.

I, GILBERT LAWRENCE CHANDLER, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of cheese at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for cheese as follows:—

## AMENDING PUBLIC BUILDING REGULATIONS 1958 (No. 2).

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1956* (No. 6024) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Amending Public Building Regulations 1958, No. 2" and shall be read and construed as one with the Public Building Regulations 1952 and any amendment thereof, and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. (1) Regulation 26 of the Public Building Regulations 1952 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

"26. Subject to the provisions of Regulation 34—

(a) the maximum number of persons who may be accommodated in any dance hall, cabaret, supper-room or similar building or part of a building shall be the number obtained by dividing the space available for occupation (in square feet) by 8;

(b) the maximum number of persons who may be accommodated in any other public building provided with seating accommodation shall be as shown on a seating plan which has been approved by the Commission."

(2) Sub-regulation (c) of Regulation 27 of the Public Building Regulations 1952 is hereby repealed.

3. Paragraph (1) of Regulation 35 of the Public Building Regulations 1952 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

"(1) Exits shall be at least 6 ft. 8 in. high."

4. At the end of sub-regulation (2) of Regulation 36 of the Public Building Regulations 1952 the following paragraph shall be added:—

"Provided that in any public building with respect to which the Commission has waived any provision of Regulations 89, 90 (a), 91, 92 or 93 the aggregate width of exits shall be double the width specified herein and the number of exits shall be the number required by the foregoing table for such increased width."

5. Regulation 41 of the Public Building Regulations 1952 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

"41. While a public building is occupied by the public all exit doors thereof shall be available for use."

6. At the end of sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 69 of the Public Building Regulations 1952 the following paragraph shall be added:—

"Provided that unless impracticable, at least one exit not less than 3 ft. 4 in. wide in every new building shall be provided with an incline or ramp at a grade not steeper than 1 in 8 from door-sill to ground level, having on each side a handrail complying with the provisions of Regulation 61 (c) hereof."

7. Paragraphs (2) and (3) of Regulation 75 of the Public Building Regulations 1952 are hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

“(2) Outlet ventilators shall be provided and constructed as follows:—

- (a) In the form of flues shafts or tubes extending vertically without avoidable bends or angles from the ceiling line into through and above the roof space and having their lower portions formed as bell-mouths gradually tapered upwards and their upper ends so constructed and so protected by cowls as to prevent the entry of rain. Each bell-mouth shall present an opening double the area required at the outlet of the flue shaft or tube; or
- (b) By means of flues shafts or tubes leading from immediately below the wall-plates and extending horizontally through the external walls and properly shielded outside; or
- (c) By means of an approved ridge ventilator connected by air-tight flues or shafts to openings in the ceiling.

Provided that—

- (i) when the ceiling is coved at least one-half of the required outlet ventilation shall be as described in (a) or (c); and
- (ii) where no ceiling is provided or where the ceiling or roof lining is attached to the purlins or rafters and continued up to the apex of the roof, at least one-half of the required outlet ventilation shall be provided by means of approved ridge ventilators”.

8. Paragraph (5) of Regulation 81 of the Public Building Regulations 1952 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

“(5) Every motor operating ventilating machinery shall be provided with an approved device located in an approved position for the purpose of enabling the supply of current to be cut off in the event of fire and such device and motor shall be maintained in good order and condition.”

9. Paragraphs (7) and (8) of Regulation 81 of the Public Building Regulations 1952 are hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

“(7) Every building which is mechanically ventilated shall be provided with an approved device placed in an approved position which shall show clearly whether or not the ventilating machinery is in operation.”

(8) The ventilating machinery and motors shall be so designed installed and maintained that they will run at full speed without noise or vibration likely to cause annoyance or discomfort to the audience.

The motors driving the fans shall be of the variable speed type, fitted with speed controls capable of providing a reduction in speed of 50 per cent. of maximum and with intermediate speed stops for the purpose of regulating the volume of air delivered to or exhausted from the building.”.

10. At the end of paragraph (a) of Regulation 82 of the Public Building Regulations 1952 the following expression shall be inserted:—

“Seams in ducts shall be of the locked type or be sweated and secured with rivets spaced not more than 6 inches centre to centre.”



11. Regulation 86 of the Public Building Regulations 1952 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

“86. Where not otherwise specified in these Regulations the internal heights of the various parts of a public building shall not be less than the following:—

(1) Compartments occupied by the public—

(a) Under or over any dress-circle, balcony or gallery—8 feet;

(b) elsewhere in the building—

(i) when the width of the compartment is not greater than 25 feet—an average of 10 feet with a minimum of 8 feet at any point;

(ii) when the width of the compartment is more than 25 feet at any point—an average of 12 feet with a minimum of 10 feet at any point.

(2) Dressing rooms and other compartments not occupied by the public—8 feet.”

12. In paragraph (a) of Regulation 90 and in Regulation 92 of the Public Building Regulations 1952 for the words “or other approved non-inflammable material” there shall be substituted the words “or approved non-inflammable material”.

13. In sub-regulation (2) of Regulation 98 of the Public Building Regulations 1952 the words “paints and decorative effects” shall be repealed.

14. Sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 99 of the Public Building Regulations 1952 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

“(1) Closets and urinals suitably situated properly separated and designated for the sexes and decently screened shall be supplied in numbers at least as follows:—

15. Regulation 132 (and the heading thereto) of the Public Building Regulations 1952 is hereby repealed and the following heading and Regulation substituted therefor:—

" EARTHING OF PLUG SOCKETS.

132. (a) Every plug socket shall include an effectively earthed contact and terminal.

(b) Every situation containing a plug socket shall be deemed to be an earthed situation."

16. Regulations 189 and 190 of the Public Building Regulations 1952 are hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

" 189. (1) In every part of the auditorium of a theatre where the floor is stepped or is at an inclination steeper than 1 in 12 the proprietor shall provide—

(a) emergency lighting to illuminate adequately such part in the event of failure of the usual lighting system; and

(b) aisle lights fitted to the ends of the rows of seats and suitably spaced and hooded or other approved lighting system which will effectively illuminate the whole length of each aisle and the tread of each step therein; and he shall cause such lights to be illuminated during the whole time that the auditorium lights are dimmed or extinguished while the theatre is occupied by the public.

(2) The Commission may require the provision of aisle lights in other parts of the auditorium of a theatre if (in the opinion of the Commission) the illumination of the aisles in such parts during public occupation is inadequate.

190. (1) An electric safety lamp shall be securely fixed over the inner side of each theatre exit and during occupation of a theatre by the public each such lamp shall by means of a distinct red light clearly illuminate the word EXIT required under the provisions of Regulation 38 thereof.

(2) Each such lamp shall be connected to an auxiliary lighting system powered by an independent battery.

(3) Every internal exit stairway in a theatre shall be provided with a system of emergency lighting which will come into operation automatically to render the whole stairway clearly visible in the event of failure of the usual lighting system."

17. At the end of paragraph (3) of Regulation 197 of the Public Building Regulations 1952 there shall be added the words—" or to any projector of the totally enclosed type ".

18. In paragraph (4) of Regulation 202 of the Public Building Regulations 1952 the expression commencing " and in the said cabin " and ending " and a bucket of sand and a scoop " is hereby repealed and the words " a similar fire extinguisher " substituted therefor.

19. Sub-regulation (4) of Regulation 206 of the Public Building Regulations 1952 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

"(4) In this Regulation 'seating capacity' means the maximum number of persons who may be accommodated pursuant to Regulation 26."

# ADDITIONAL REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "BRIDGEWATER PUBLIC PARK".

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulation in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Orders in Council, dated 12th November, 1888 and 2nd August, 1889, as a site for Public Recreation and for a Public Park in the Township of Bridgewater, known as the "Bridgewater Public Park", hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve", in addition to the Regulations made by the said Board on 24th November, 1950:—

## REGULATION.

14. The Committee of Management may from time to time set aside certain portions of the Reserve for the playing of any particular game or sport, and may grant the use thereof to any individual, club or association of clubs on such terms and conditions as may be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.—(Rs.1495.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with this Regulation shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

# REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "KARDINIA PARK," GEELONG.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the City of Geelong permanently reserved as a site for Public Park, pursuant to the provisions of the *Geelong (Kardinia Park) Land Act* 1950, and the Lands Acts, and known as the "Kardinia Park", Geelong.

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times free of charge.

2. No person who offends or may offend against decency as regard dress, language or conduct shall enter, be, or remain in the Reserve.

3. No society, club, picnic party or other combined body shall use the Reserve or any part thereof without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

4. The Committee of Management may set apart a portion or portions of the Reserve as and for the purposes of a children's playground.

5. No person over the age of twelve years shall use any swing, cradle-swing, slide, roundabout, see-saw, ocean wave, or other structure or appliance of the like kind usually designed or set apart for the use and amusement of children which may be in the children's playground or elsewhere in any part of the Reserve (hereinafter referred to as an "appliance").

6. Any person using any appliance who, in the opinion of any officer being a bailiff of Crown lands or member of the Police Force or officer or servant of the Committee of Management there present, is over the age of twelve years, shall forthwith, on being so requested by such

officer, immediately desist from the use of such appliance, and if further requested so do to shall leave that portion of the Reserve where any such appliance may be.

7. No person shall climb or jump over any fence or gate or stick any bill thereon, or cut any name or sign on any fence, gate, tree, or seat, or in any way damage any building, gate, fence, or other property in or around the Reserve, or pollute any water therein, or remove therefrom any soil, sand, manure, or other property.

8. No person shall post or place any advertisement, bill, poster, or any other like sign in any part of the Reserve, nor give out or distribute any handbill, placard, notice, advertisement, book, pamphlet, or paper in the Reserve, or litter the same by scattering or throwing down any handbill, placard, notice, advertisement, book, pamphlet, or paper.

9. No person shall interfere with any tree, shrub, or other property in the Reserve, or commit any nuisance, or leave in the Reserve any bottle, paper, cast-off clothing or other litter, except in such places as may from time to time be set apart by the Committee of Management.

10. No person shall erect in the Reserve any building, booth, tent, table or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or for the purpose of any games or amusement, or for any other purpose, or hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or article of any description without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, and then only subject to the payment of such fees and on such conditions as the Committee of Management may determine.

11. No person shall light any fire in the Reserve, or do any act which may cause, or be likely to cause, damage by fire to anything growing or being therein.

12. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserve, shall walk upon any flower bed or enter any plot therein which may be enclosed or used for plantations for young trees, shrubs, or flowers.

13. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a cord or chain, and all dogs, goats, and poultry found wandering in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

14. No person shall put in the Reserve, any cattle, horse, sheep, goat, pig, or other animal.

15. The Committee of Management shall have full authority and power to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purpose of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act* 1928.

16. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport in the Reserve on Sundays, Anzac Day and Good Friday.

17. No person shall play any unlawful game or make any wager for money, or by unseemly conduct interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within the Reserve, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any keeper or other servant of the Committee of Management.

18. No person shall play any musical instrument, preach, deliver any address, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management being first obtained.

19. No person shall camp in the Reserve.

20. No person shall throw, or cause to be thrown, any stone, missile or hard substance in the Reserve, and no person shall play at cricket, hockey, golf, rounders, tennis, or any other game in the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

21. In any part of the Reserve used or set apart for a children's playground—

(a) No child shall use any swing or other appliance except for the purpose for which they are respectively provided.

(b) The Committee of Management shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any swing or other appliance.

(c) No person shall ride or drive any bicycle or tricycle, or have or bring any animal in or into the same.

22. The Committee of Management shall have the right to remove or exclude from the Reserve any person who commits a breach of these Regulations, and such person shall in addition be liable for the penalty for such offence.

23. No person, except those in the employ of or authorized, in writing, by the Committee of Management of the park shall drive any traction engine, tractor, roller, omnibus, char-a-banc, truck, waggon, lorry, dray, cart, van, or other commercial vehicle or machine, whether propelled by steam, motor or other power, or drawn by any horse or other animal on to, over, or through the Reserve.

24. No person shall park a motor car or other vehicle or motor cycle within the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for the purpose, and any person using any such place for parking a motor car or other vehicle or motor cycle shall, on demand by an authorized officer of the Committee of Management, pay such fee as is from time to time determined by such Committee, in respect of any such car or vehicle or motor cycle for the use of such parking area on such days, not exceeding twenty-six in any one year, as a charge is being made for admission to the Reserve for Public Recreation adjoining.

25. No person shall ride or drive any bicycle or motor cycle, motor car or other vehicle on any path, track or way in the Reserve set apart and marked by a notice as for use by pedestrians only.—(Rs.511.)

A By-law of the City of Collingwood made under the *Local Government Act 1946*, and numbered 91 for:—

- Prohibiting on, from and after dates specified herein, the erection or placing against or in front of any house or building abutting upon any public footway in any street or part thereof, specified herein of any verandah over or across such footway, unless such verandah is supported by cantilevers, brackets, or projecting supports, and not otherwise;
- Requiring the pulling down and removal before a date specified herein of all verandahs before the first-mentioned date, erected or placed against or in front of any house or building abutting upon any such public footway, which verandahs are upon, over or across such footway and are supported otherwise than by cantilevers, brackets, or projecting supports.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Collingwood order as follows:—

1. In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires, a "verandah" shall be construed as having the meaning contained in the definition of "verandah" in the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, 1945.

2. That the whole of Part XV. of By-law No. 66 be and is hereby repealed.

3. From and after the 1st day of July, 1958, no verandah shall be erected or placed against or in front of any house or building abutting on any public footway in any street or part thereof, within the City of Collingwood, or over and across such footway, unless such verandah is supported by cantilevers, brackets, or projecting supports and not otherwise.

4. The owner of any verandah erected or placed against or in front of any house or building abutting upon any public footway of any street of the City of Collingwood, which verandah is upon, over, or across such footway, and is supported otherwise than by cantilevers, brackets, or projecting supports, shall pull down and remove such verandah before the 1st day of July, 1968.

5. Any person committing any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

## CITY OF MELBOURNE.

## By-LAW No. 378.

A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under Part IV. of the *Health Act 1956* and Part VII., Division 1 of the *Local Government Act 1946* for regulating the keeping of swine sheep goats and poultry in the City of Melbourne and for other purposes.

THE Council of the City of Melbourne in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1956* and the *Local Government Act 1946* and of every other power it thereunto enabling doth hereby order as follows:—

- The By-laws set out in the Schedule to this By-law are hereby repealed.
- In this By-law unless the context otherwise requires "The Council" means the Council of the City of Melbourne.

"goat" includes kid

"poultry" includes fowls, turkeys, ducks and geese

"poultry house" means a building not greater in height than 10 feet having a roof of corrugated galvanised iron or other material approved by the Medical Officer of Health and enclosed on all sides by walls and a door or doors all of material approved by the Medical Officer of Health or wire netting of half inch mesh and attached to or enclosed within a poultry run and having a floor paved with concrete or other impervious material the surface of which is at least three inches above the level of the surrounding ground and having foundations surrounded by galvanised iron, jointed brickwork or concrete to a depth of at least eighteen inches below the surrounding ground level

"poultry run" means an area of ground enclosed on all sides by walls or wire netting and attached to or enclosing a poultry house

"poultry yard" means the continuation of a poultry house and a poultry run

"sheep" includes lamb.

- No person shall keep live poultry anywhere in the City of Melbourne otherwise than

(a) in a poultry yard no part of which is

- within seventy-five feet from the street or road to which the premises whereon the poultry yard is situated has a frontage
- within ten feet from any other street or road of a greater width than twenty-five feet
- within five feet from any other street or road of a width of twenty-five feet or less or from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land, or

(b) at poultry sale yards or poultry killing premises registered under the Health Acts or at any general market of the City of Melbourne.

4. Subject to Part IV. of the *Health Act 1956* no person shall keep any poultry within or partly within a distance of forty feet from any dwelling in the City of Melbourne whether on the same allotment of land or adjoining land.

5. No person shall keep in any poultry house in the City of Melbourne a number of poultry greater than the number produced by dividing the area in square feet of such poultry house by six.

6. Every person keeping live poultry in the City of Melbourne shall at all times keep the poultry food for such poultry in rat proof containers.

7. Every person keeping live poultry in the City of Melbourne shall at all times keep the poultry yard in which such poultry are kept in a clean and sanitary condition.

8. If any person constructs or uses any poultry yard in breach of any of the provisions of this By-law the Medical Officer of Health of the Council may serve notice in writing on the owner or occupier of the land on which such

poultry yard is constructed requiring the person served with such notice forthwith to pull down remove alter or cleanse such poultry yard or any part thereof.

9. If the pulling down or removal of any poultry yard or part thereof required by notice served under clause 8 hereof is not commenced within seven days after the service of such notice or is not proceeded with and completed as speedily as the nature of the case will admit the Council may call upon the owner or the occupier of the land on which the poultry yard has been constructed to show cause why an order should not be made for the pulling down or removal of such poultry yard or part thereof and if such owner or occupier does not show cause as aforesaid the Council may order such owner or occupier to pull down or remove such poultry yard or part thereof within a time to be fixed by the Council.

10. In the event of non-compliance with an order made by the Council under clause 9 hereof the Council may pull down or remove such poultry yard or part thereof or may authorize any person whom it thinks fit to do so and may sell the materials pulled down or removed in such manner as it thinks fit and may apply the proceeds of such sale in or towards reimbursing itself for the expenses of such pulling down or removal and may also recover any balance of such expenses not satisfied as aforesaid from the owner or occupier in any court of competent jurisdiction.

11. Any person who fails to comply with any order of the Council under clause 9 hereof shall be guilty of an offence.

12. Subject to Part IV. of the *Health Act* 1956 no person shall keep any swine anywhere in the City of Melbourne save and except at the City Abattoirs or at any general market of the City of Melbourne.

13. No person shall keep any sheep or goat anywhere in the City of Melbourne save and except at the City Abattoirs or at any general market of the City of Melbourne.

14. Any person who by any wilful act or default contravenes the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds and shall be liable in respect of each day on which such offence is continued after conviction or order to a further penalty of not more than Five pounds but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.
