PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, intituled the *Audit Act 1957, No. 6111*, it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Tuesday, the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight as the day upon which the said Act shall come into operation.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-fifth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight, and in the seventh year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

EXCISION FROM A FIRE-PROTECTED AREA OF THE WHOLE OR PART OF AN URBAN FIRE DISTRICT.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 3 of the *Forests Act 1957* the Governor in Council may, on the joint recommendation of the Minister of Forests and the Chief Secretary, excise from any fire-protected area the whole or part of any urban fire district proclaimed as such under the Country Fire Authority Acts: And whereas by Proclamation made under the Country Fire Authority Acts and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th November, 1954, the urban fire district set out in the Schedule hereto was so proclaimed: Now therefore

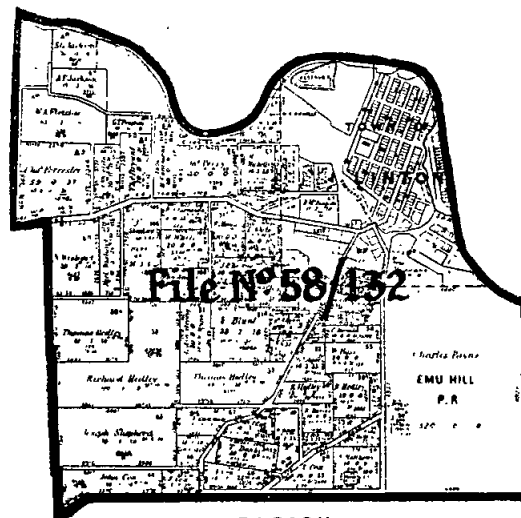

REGULATIONS RELATING TO DERIVATIVES OF
MONOFLUOROACETIC ACID.

WHEREAS the use of derivatives of monofluoroacetic acid is desirable for the destruction of rabbits and other vermin within the meaning of the Vermin and Noxious Weeds Acts: And whereas the use of such derivatives may endanger the health and lives of persons engaged in such work or of other persons: And whereas it is necessary to safeguard the public health and the health of persons engaged in or associated with such work: And whereas it is provided amongst other things by section 106 of the *Health Act 1956* (No. 6024) that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for or with respect to safeguarding the public health and the health of persons engaged in such processes or occupations as are likely to endanger or impair health: Now therefore by virtue of and pursuant to such powers and all other powers enabling him in that behalf the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Monofluoroacetic Acid Derivatives Regulations 1958" and shall come into operation upon publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. The "Sodium Fluoroacetate (Compound 1080) Regulations 1954" are hereby repealed.

3. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Bait" means any single portion of edible matter in which is incorporated any fluoroacetate.

"Fluoroacetate" means sodium fluoroacetate, fluoroacetamide and any other derivative of monofluoroacetic acid, and includes any such derivative whether in its pure state or in solution or suspension in water or any other liquid.

4. No person shall sell any fluoroacetate or any baits except in a sealed package bearing a label as hereinafter prescribed.

5. At the time of the sale and before delivery of any fluoroacetate the vendor shall fill in and the purchaser shall sign a document in the form of the Second Schedule to these Regulations.

6. Such document so filled in and signed shall be forwarded by the vendor forthwith to the Commission of Public Health, 295 Queen-street, Melbourne.

7. Every person who has in his possession any fluoroacetate shall keep it in a locked compartment or cupboard in which no other substance is kept.

8. A record shall be kept by every purchaser of all quantities of any fluoroacetate received used or otherwise disposed of by him.

9. (1) The purchaser shall be responsible for ensuring that only he or some competent person authorized by him in writing handles the fluoroacetate prior to its incorporation in the bait material.

(2) The purchaser shall inform the Commission of the name and address of every person authorized by him pursuant to the preceding sub-regulation.

10. No bait may be laid on any land by any person other than the landholder unless such landholder first gives written authority in the form of or substantially in the form of the Third Schedule to these Regulations.

11. The landholder or his appointee may assist with the laying of baits but before doing so such landholder and appointee shall be warned by the purchaser or person referred to in Regulation 9 of these Regulations of the dangers of the active ingredients and of the special precautions necessary when handling such substance.

12. All persons when handling fluoroacetate or baits shall wear heavy duty rubber gloves and such gloves shall be washed thoroughly in running water, tested for leaks and dried and dusted with talc powder immediately after each use. After removal of the gloves the hands of the persons handling sodium fluoroacetate or baits incorporating such substance shall be washed thoroughly before smoking or eating.

13. No person shall prepare or lay any single bait of a volume exceeding 1 cubic inch or containing more than 5 milligrams of fluoroacetate.

14. Baits shall be laid where practicable in furrows 4 inches deep and all uneaten baits shall be covered with a minimum of 3 inches of soil within a period of four days from the time of laying, provided that in cases where such laying and covering are not practicable all uneaten baits shall within the same period be collected and destroyed.

15. (1) The Commission may grant permission for the laying of baits by dropping them from aircraft in any case where the Commission thinks fit.

(2) Such permission may be given subject to any conditions deemed necessary by the Commission and in giving any such permission the Commission may waive all or any of the requirements of Regulations 14, 16 and 18 hereof.

(3) Except with the permission of the Commission and subject to any conditions imposed by the Commission the laying of baits by dropping from aircraft is hereby prohibited.

16. Baits shall be transported only in a watertight utensil labelled "Poison" followed by the name of the active ingredient. Such utensil shall be washed thoroughly after use and shall be used for no other purpose than the carrying of baits.

17. Mixing of baits and washing of utensils shall not be carried out within 50 yards of any river, creek, stream, channel, or other watercourse, or of any lake, lagoon, reservoir, pond, or other body of water. Such mixing and washing shall be performed on a specially prepared site from which the top soil has been removed to a depth of 4 inches and which shall be filled in with soil when the work is completed.

18. Rabbits and other vermin destroyed by baits shall be collected within four days of laying the bait and shall be buried or burned without prior removal of the skin.

19. Any landholder who uses or authorizes the use on his land of any baits shall notify all of his neighbours of his intention to use such baits before such baits are laid.

20. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done, or failing to do any act directed to be done by these Regulations, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

EXTENT OF DISTRICT INCREASED.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby declare, order, and direct as follows:—

Firstly, that the extent of the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust be increased by adding to the same the lands set out and described in the First Schedule hereto, and as on and from the 1st day of July, 1958, the extent of such district shall be deemed to be increased accordingly.

Secondly, that the extent of the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust be increased by adding to the same the lands set out and described in the Second Schedule hereto, and as on and from the 1st day of July, 1959, the extent of such district shall be deemed to be increased accordingly.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, on the recommendation of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, doth hereby declare, order, and direct as follows:—

Firstly, that there shall be excised from the Shepparton Irrigation and Water Supply District those portions of the same set out and described in the First Schedule hereto (portions 1 and 2), which portions as from the 30th day of June, 1958, shall be deemed to be excised accordingly.

Secondly, that there shall be excised from the Shepparton Irrigation and Water Supply District that portion of the same set out and described in the Second Schedule hereto (portion 3), which portion as from the 30th day of June, 1959, shall be deemed to be excised accordingly.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Portion 1.

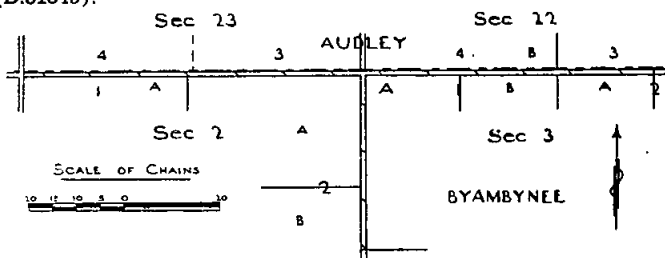

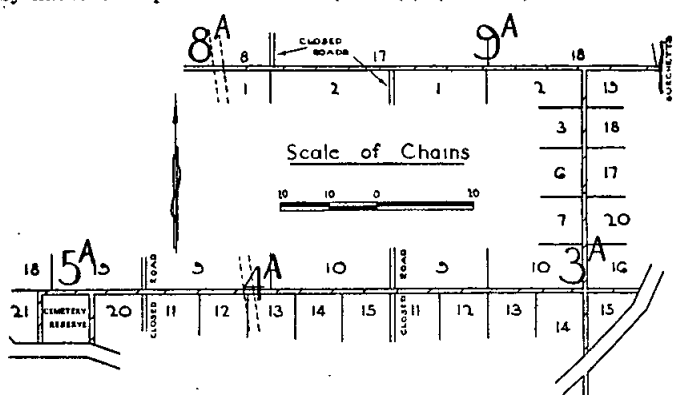

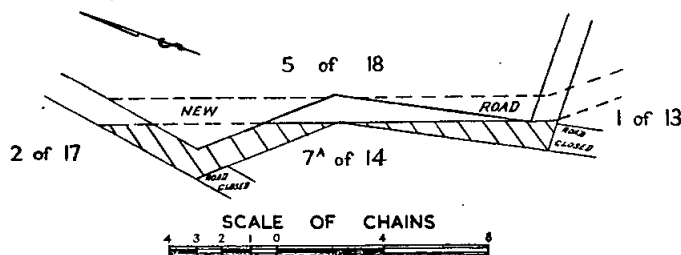
Parish of Caramut, County of Villiers, being the roads indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(C.193⁽²⁾) (D.29452).

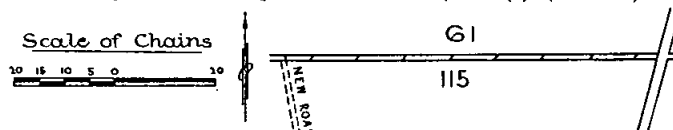
Parish of Weerangourt, County of Normanby, being the roads indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(W.255⁽³⁾) (D.31564).

SHIRE OF BULLA.

INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the Town and Country Planning Acts and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Bulla (hereinafter referred to as the Responsible Authority) having commenced the preparation of a planning scheme, in accordance with the said Act, on the ninth day of June, 1958, hereby makes the following Interim Development Order for the purpose of regulating, restricting, restraining, or prohibiting the use or development of any land or the erection, construction, or carrying out of any buildings or works on any land within the area described or shown on the map as the Schedule hereto:—

1. After the coming into operation of this Interim Development Order, no person shall use or develop any land or erect, construct, or carry out any buildings or works on any land within the area included in the Schedule, except in accordance with the provisions of a permit issued by the Responsible Authority.

2. Any application for a permit to use or develop any land or to erect, construct, or carry out any buildings or works shall be accompanied by a sketch plan or copy of certificate of title of the land and a description of the proposed use or development and type and construction of any buildings or works proposed to be erected, constructed or carried out and such other particulars relating to the application as the Responsible Authority may require.

3. This Interim Development Order shall not prevent the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which such land or buildings were lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

4. *Schedule.*—All that land containing 440 acres, more or less, being part of Crown portion 7, Parish of Will-Will-Rook, County of Bourke, the boundaries of which are as follow:—

Commencing on the Moonee Ponds Creek at the southern angle of Crown portion 7; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of the said Crown portion for a distance of 7,581 links; thence westerly by a line bearing 269 deg. 49 min. 40 sec. to the Moonee Ponds Creek; and thence generally south-easterly by that creek to the point of commencement.

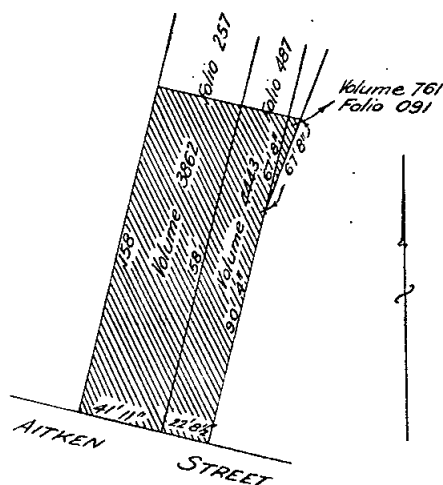

"Commencing at a point on the western side of Lithgow-street 660 feet north from Victoria-street; thence southerly along the western building line of Lithgow-street to the intersection of Lithgow and Victoria streets; thence westerly along the northern building line of Victoria-street to the intersection of Victoria and Little Lithgow streets; thence

northerly along the eastern building line of Little Lithgow-street for a distance of 660 feet; thence easterly along an imaginary line to link up with the commencing point."

CITY OF GEELONG.

BY-LAW No. 138.

A By-law of the City of Geelong, made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts, and numbered 138, for the purpose of prevention and control of fire in relation to the storage of solid fuel and for suppressing nuisances.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1946 and every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Geelong order as follows:—

1. In this By-law "solid fuel" includes firewood, mallee roots, briquettes, coal, coke, and charcoal.

"Ton" in relation to the several kinds of solid fuel set out below shall, without restricting its ordinary meaning, be deemed, until the contrary be shown, to be equal to the number of cubic feet set out in respect thereto ascertained by measurement in the stack or on the ground, namely:—

| Briquettes | 30 cubic feet. |
| Coal | 30 cubic feet. |
| Coke | 75 cubic feet. |

2. Every person who shall in or upon any place or premises within the City of Geelong stack, store, or cause, commit, or suffer to be stacked or stored any solid fuel shall comply with the following requirements:—

(a) No solid fuel shall be so stacked or stored so as to prevent or impede in case of fire access to or exit from any building or to or from the place or premises where it is stacked or stored or to or from any adjoining place or premises.

(b) No solid fuel in any quantity exceeding in the aggregate 20 tons shall be stacked or stored within 4 feet of the boundary of the allotment or premises where such fuel is kept, except where same is stored in a fireproof building approved for the purpose by the Council, provided always that the Council may by permit, in writing under the hand of the Town Clerk, allow solid fuel in excess of 5 tons to be stacked or stored to such closer distance than 4 feet as may be set out in the said permit to the boundary where such boundary is a public street or right-of-way. Where any brick, concrete, or other fire-resisting wall is built on a boundary alignment of the said allotment or premises the Council may authorize wood or other solid fuel to be stacked or stored within such lesser distance than 4 feet as the Council shall think fit, having regard generally to the circumstances of the case, including the fire-resisting qualities of the said wall and the nature of the adjoining premises.

(c) Firewood when stacked on end shall be so stacked that the vertical height of the stack shall not be more than 8 feet above the level of the ground on which it stands.

(d) Firewood when stacked horizontally shall be so stacked that the vertical height of the stack shall not at any point be more than 10 feet above the level of the ground on which it stands.

(e) Mallee roots shall be so stacked that the vertical height of the stack shall not at any point be more than 8 feet above the level of the ground on which they stand.

(f) No solid fuel shall be stacked upon the roof of any building, out-house, shed, or other construction.

3. No solid fuel exceeding in the aggregate 10 tons shall be stacked or stored within 15 feet of any hotel, boarding-house, or private residence or any building within which any person resides. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this section, any proprietor of premises where solid fuel exceeding 10 tons in the aggregate is stacked or stored and which premises were so used prior to or at the time of this By-law was made, may by application, in writing, to the Council seek a reduction of the 15 feet, and the Council may, in writing, authorize the storage of solid fuel at such lesser distance, but in no instance shall it be nearer the boundary of the allotment or premises than 4 feet or as provided in section 2 (b) hereof.

4. No owner or occupier of any woodyard or of any premises where solid fuel is stacked, stored, or kept for the purpose of sale shall permit any chips, bark, sawdust, rubbish, or waste of a combustible nature to accumulate or to remain on the premises so as to create a fire hazard.

5. If any person by wilful act or default contravenes any of the provisions of this By-law he shall be guilty of an offence against the By-law and liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Any person guilty of a continuing offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £5 for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any court.

6. Every woodyard or premises where solid fuel is stored in excess of 10 tons shall be provided with a water service and an adequate length of hosing which shall be retained in position permanently. Such water service and hosing shall be approved by the Council.

7. This By-law shall operate throughout the City of Geelong.

CITY OF MOORABBIN.

BY-LAW No. 238.

A By-law of the City of Moorabbin, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1946, and numbered 238, for the purpose of regulating the proceedings of meetings of the Council and meetings of Committees of the Council of the City of Moorabbin.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1946, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Moorabbin order as follows:—

1. In this By-law, unless the contrary appears—

- (a) "Committee" means a Committee of the Council.
- (b) "Council" means the Council of the City of Moorabbin.
- (c) "Town Clerk" means the person for the time being holding the office of Town Clerk to the Council and includes any person from time to time acting as Town Clerk.

2. The provisions of Part XI. of the Fifteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act* 1946 (except clauses 1, 2, 3, 6, 7, 31, 40, 52, 54, 55, and 56 thereof) be and the same are hereby adopted in and for the whole of the municipal district of the City of Moorabbin.

3. (1) The Council may confirm the minutes of an ordinary or special meeting at that meeting.

(2) Unless the minutes of any meeting are confirmed at the meeting to which those minutes relate the same shall be confirmed at the next meeting of the Council.

4. When minutes are to be confirmed at the next meeting of the Council—

- (a) not later than 48 hours before the time fixed for the holding of such next meeting a copy of the minutes shall be delivered or posted to each Councillor, together with the agenda for that meeting;
- (b) the first business of the meeting shall be the confirmation of the minutes; and
- (c) the said minutes shall not be read and no discussion thereon shall be permitted except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

5. (1) After the confirmation of the minutes as provided for in clause 4 hereof and the signing thereof as by law required, the business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i) Resumption of debate on motions or orders of the day lapsed at previous meeting.
- (ii) Reading the summary of correspondence referred to in clause 6 hereof and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv) Presentation of reports and the authorizing of payments.
- (v) Ordinary business not elsewhere included.
- (vi) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (vii) Extraordinary business not elsewhere included.
- (viii) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (ix) Notices of motion.

(2) The order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

6. (1) The Town Clerk shall prepare and shall place before each meeting of the Council a summary of correspondence received since the last preceding meeting of the Council.

(2) No correspondence shall be read in full at any meeting of the Council unless a Councillor requests that any particular item or items of correspondence be so read.

7. All notices of motion (where notice of motion is required by law to be given) shall be dated and numbered and given by the intending mover to the Town Clerk at the close of the meeting of Council, or at such time before the next meeting of the Council as will permit the Town Clerk to give notice thereof in the manner and in the time required for special meetings, and such clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

8. (1) A motion moved at a meeting of the Council need not be reduced into writing by the mover.

(2) The Town Clerk shall record in the rough minutes all motions moved and seconded at a meeting of the Council.

9. (1) It shall not be necessary to keep minutes of the proceedings of any Committee.

(2) All reports of Committees shall contain a recommendation to the Council on the matters considered and shall be signed by the Chairman of the Committee.

(3) The Town Clerk shall cause a copy of all reports of Committees to be included in the agenda for the meeting of the Council at which such reports are to be presented.

10. (1) Plans and specifications for any public work (other than urgent works) shall be laid before the Council at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon and be open for inspection by any ratepayer during that time.

(2) Plans and specifications for public work deemed urgent by the Council may be considered and ordered upon at any meeting of the Council.

11. The common seal of the Council shall be kept by the Town Clerk in a safe place and shall not be affixed to any document except by the authority of the Council and in the presence of the Mayor and one other Councillor and the Town Clerk or in the presence of two Councillors and the Town Clerk.

12. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained or incorporated in this By-law may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given and not otherwise, except by a unanimous vote of the Council.

13. In all cases not provided for by this By-law resort shall be had to the rules, forms and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Council.

14. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Moorabbin.

15. Every person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

A By-law of the Borough of Kyabram, made under section 326 of the *Health Act 1956*, and numbered 7, for the regulation and management of that portion of the meat area known as the Kyabram Meat Area within the municipal district of the said Borough as at present constituted, and all that piece of land containing 1 acre or thereabouts, being part of Crown allotment 36, Parish of Kyabram East, County of Rodney, being part of the land more particularly described in certificate of title, volume 6032, folio 390, and being part of the said land as is at present occupied by the abattoirs buildings, holding yards, and skin sheds, being the property known as "The Delta Abattoirs", such property being within the municipal district of the Kyabram riding of the Shire of Rodney, and for—

(a) prescribing the conditions on which animals may be received into or supplied or removed from any abattoir therein situate;

(b) fixing the rates of fees or dues payable to the Council of the said Borough under Part XV. of the *Health Act 1956*;

(c) prescribing the times for selling and for slaughtering animals and for selling carcasses or meat at the said abattoirs;

(d) the feeding, watering, and tending and the preventing of cruelty to and overcrowding of animals in the said abattoirs; and

(e) stopping temporarily the manufacture of and the sale of small goods in circumstances in which danger to the consumer is apprehended owing to uncleanness or to the presence of infection on or about the premises where such manufacture or sale is carried on.

IN exercise of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, and of every and any other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Borough of Kyabram hereby order as follows:—

1. In this By-law—

"the Council" means the Council of the Borough of Kyabram;

"the Meat Area" means the area within the municipal district of the Council, and all that piece of land containing 1 acre or thereabouts, being part of Crown allotment 36, Parish of Kyabram East, County of Rodney, being part of the land more particularly described in certificate of title, volume 6032, folio 390, and being that part of the said land as is at present occupied by the abattoirs buildings, holding yards, and skin sheds, being the property known as "the Delta Abattoirs", such property being within the municipal district of the Kyabram riding of the Shire of Rodney, and being portion of the area proclaimed as a Meat Area, to be known as the Kyabram Meat Area, in the *Government Gazette* No. 243, of the 18th of September, 1957, at page 3097;

"the Meat Inspector" means the Meat Inspector appointed and/or provided by the Council for the inspection and supervision of any abattoir in the Meat Area.

2. This By-law shall apply to the Meat Area as defined in clause 1 hereof, and such area shall be under the direction of the Meat Inspector.

3. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

4. No animal shall be slaughtered in the Meat Area except on Monday to Friday of any week, and then only between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m., but the total hours during which slaughtering will be permitted shall not exceed 40 hours in any week. No animal shall be slaughtered on any gazetted public holiday. The above days shall be the days for inspection by the Meat Inspector, and such inspection shall be made at the Abattoir or Abattoirs situate in the Meat Area.

5. No animal shall be slaughtered before it has been examined on the hoof in the Meat Area by the Meat Inspector on the days and within the times set out in clause 4 hereof.

6. No animal visibly or known to be affected with any contagious or infectious disease shall be received into any abattoirs in the Meat Area except with the express permission of the Meat Inspector.

7. No person shall remove or cause or permit to be removed from any abattoir in the Meat Area any carcass or part of the carcass of any animal slaughtered thereat until the same has been examined by the Meat Inspector and passed by him as fit for human food, and branded by him with the regulation brand, or rendered unfit for human consumption in the manner prescribed by the Meat Supervision Regulations.

8. No sheep skin shall be removed from the abattoir in the Meat Area with the head attached.

9. The fees payable to the Council for examining and branding carcasses, parts of carcasses, or meat by or under the direction of the Meat Inspector shall be as follows:—

(a) For examining and branding any carcass of, or meat derived from any—

Bull, cow, heifer, ox, steer—Six shillings.

Calf—exceeding 200 lb.—Six shillings.

Calf—100 lb. to 200 lb.—Three shillings.

Lamb, sheep—One shilling and six pence.

Swine—Four shillings.

Bobby-calf (40 lb. to 100 lb.)—One shilling.

(b) For any certificate as to an examination made by the Meat Inspector—Two shillings and six pence.

(c) for examining any—

- Bull, cow, heifer, ox, steer or calf (other than a bobby-calf)—Two shillings and six pence.
- Calf—exceeding 200 lb.—Two shillings and six pence.
- Calf—100 lb. to 200 lb.—One shilling and three pence.
- Goat, kid, lamb, sheep or bobby-calf—Six pence.
- Bobby calf (40 lb. to 100 lb.)—Six pence.
- Swine—Two shillings and six pence.

The said fees shall be paid by the person using the abattoir and shall be so paid to the Town Clerk of the Council at the office of the Council at Kyabram, once at least in every week, and the amount of each such payment shall correspond with and be accompanied by a voucher from the Meat Inspector.

10. The proprietor of each abattoir in the Meat Area shall not nor shall any person having the management or control of any animal or animals in such abattoir—

- (a) suffer any cruelty to take place towards any animal at any time in the abattoir;
- (b) suffer animals to be overcrowded in the abattoir.

11. If the Meat Inspector, the Health Inspector of the Council, or the Council's Medical Officer of Health shall at any time find a condition of uncleanness of the presence of infection on or about the premises within the Meat Area where the manufacture or sale of small goods is carried on in circumstances in which danger to the consumer of such small goods is apprehended by such Inspector or Officer, such Inspector or Officer may by notice in writing under his hand directed to the occupier of such premises prohibit the manufacture thereat and/or the sale therefrom of small goods until such condition of uncleanness is rectified or such infection is removed, and any such notice may be served in the manner provided by section 425 of the *Health Act 1956*.

12. Any person who shall by wilful act or default contravene any of the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
