W HEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be Whereas by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part 1., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2 and 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,

WHEREAS section 900 (2) of the Local Government Act. 1946 provides—inter alia—that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, at the request of the council of any municipality not being a city or town, extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality, or any part thereof: part thereof:

And whereas the operation of the said Regulations has been extended to parts of the municipal districts of the Shires of Colac and Korumburra by Proclamations published in the Government Gazettes of the 11th August, 1954, (Shire of Colac), and the 25th May, 1949, and 21st January, 1953 (Shire of Korumburra):

And whereas the Councils of the Shires of Colac and And whereas the Councils of the Shires of Colac and Korumburra have requested that the said Regulations be extended to further parts of the municipal districts of the said Shires, and the Council of the Shire of Numurkah has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to the municipal district of the Shire of Numurkah: .

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Local Government Act 1946 to the municipal district of the Shire of Numurkah and to the further parts of the municipal districts of the Shires of Korumburra and Colac as cipal districts of the Shires of Korumburra and Colac as are described hereunder and order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the aforementioned municipal districts or parts thereof on publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 22nd September, 1958, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Councils of the said municipalities to make By-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter, and provided, further, that no such By-law shall come into operation before the 22nd September, 1958.

 - (b) providing that in the event of failure of any owner or occupier of any property or premises to comply with the requirements of this Bylaw, the Council may cause measures to be taken to destroy such weeds at the expense of the owner or occupier and recover the cost thereof as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of any and every other power enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Caulfield order as follows:—

- 1. By-law No. 106 of the City of Caulfield is hereby repealed.
- 2. In this By-law--

 "Noxious Weeds" means any weeds declared by this By-law to be noxious weeds.

- 5. In the event of the fallure of any owner or occupier of any property or premises within 21 days of the service of any notice under this By-law to destroy all such noxious weeds, as may be specified in such notice, which are on such property or premises and the adjacent half-width of any street or road on which such property or premises abuts, the Council may cause measures to be taken to destroy such positives weeds at the expense of such owner or occupier, and may recover the cost thereof as a civil debt recoverable summarily.
- 6. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of a breach of this By-law shall (in addition to any other liability to which he may be subject) be liable upon conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
- 7. This By-law shall apply and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Caulfield.

PUBLIC SERVICE ACT 1946.

THE Public Service Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Public Service Act* 1946, hereby amends the Public Service (Public Service Board) Regulations as on and from the 29th June, 1958, as follows:—

PART II.—PROMOTIONS AND TRANSFERS.

(1) The Technical and General Division shall be classified in grades as set out in the Second and Seventh Schedules and the annual rates of salary of officers in the Technical and General Division shall subject to sub-regulation (2) of this Regulation be in accordance with the scale set out in the said Second Schedule or (as the case requires) the said Seventh Schedule.
