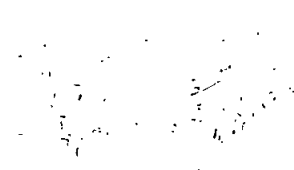

ROCKLANDS RESERVOIR WATER SUPPLY CATCHMENT.

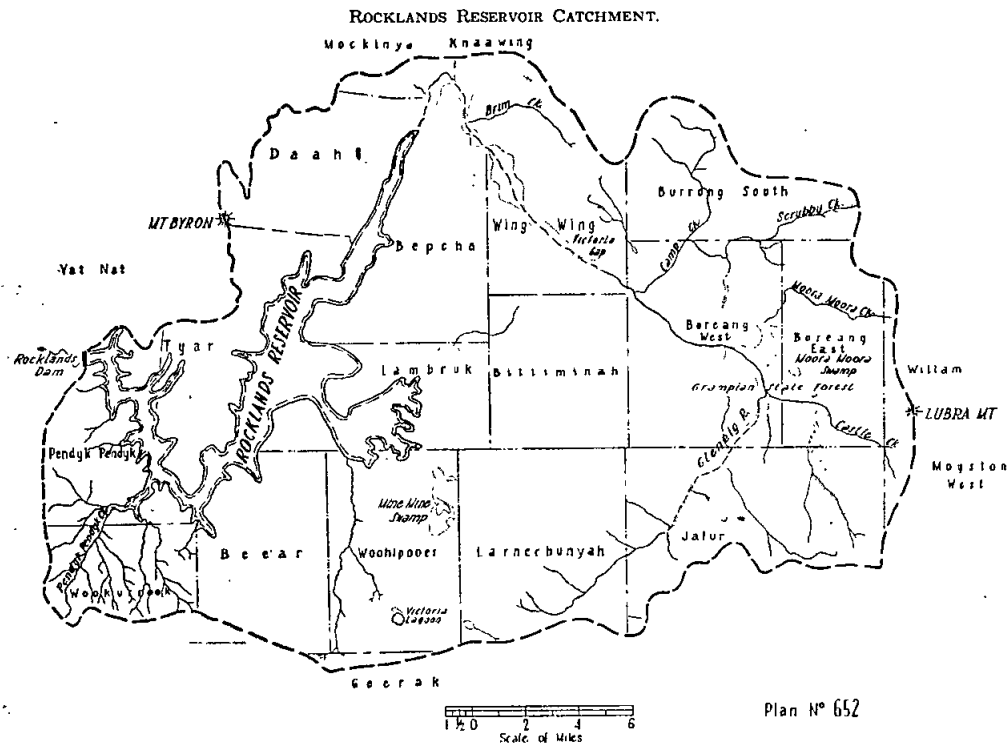
PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 22 of the *Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1947* do and by this Proclamation define the water supply catchment area to be known as the Rocklands Reservoir Water Supply Catchment:

Commencing at the northern abutment of the Rocklands Dam in the Parish of Yat Nat; thence along the watershed dividing the flow of water to the Rocklands Reservoir from that flowing away from it, in a general easterly and northerly direction through the Parishes of Yat Nat, Tyar, Daahl, Mockinya, Knaawing, Wing Wing, and Burrong South; thence generally in a southerly direction through the Parishes of Burrong South, Boreang East; thence following the eastern boundary of the Parishes of Boreang East and Jalur to the watershed between the head of the Glenelg River and Dwyers Creek; thence generally in a westerly direction along the watershed through the Parishes of Jalur, Larneebunyah, Woolpooper, Geerak, Moralla, Beear, Wookurrook to the western boundary of that Parish; thence generally northerly along the western boundary of the Parishes of Wookurrook and Pendyk Pendyk; thence generally north-easterly through that Parish to the southern abutment of the Rocklands Dam and across the structure to the commencing point.

The area described is more particularly defined on plan No. 652 hereunder the original of which is lodged at the Head Office of the Soil Conservation Authority, 378 Cotham-road, Kew:—

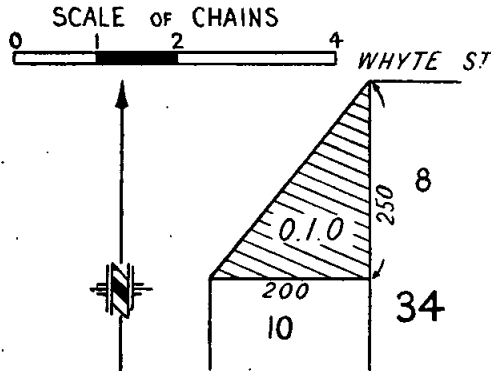

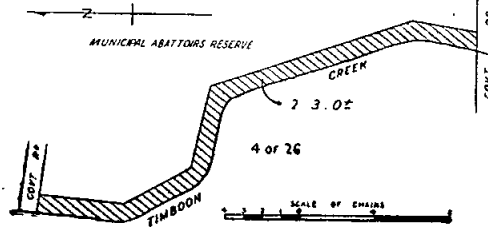

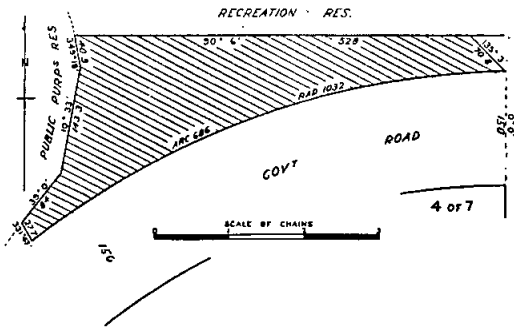

APPROVAL FOR THE CANCER INSTITUTE BOARD TO ENTER INTO AN ARRANGEMENT.

WHEREAS the Cancer Institute Board may, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council, enter into such financial and other arrangements as are necessary with any institution within the meaning of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1948*, in order to carry out the objects for which the Cancer Institute was established:

And whereas the Mildura Base Hospital is such an institution:

And whereas the Cancer Institute Board and the Committee of Management of the Mildura Base Hospital desire to provide at that hospital a special clinic at which patients may seek relief from conditions in respect of which appropriate treatment is available at the Cancer Institute:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, hereby approve of the entry by the Cancer Institute Board into an arrangement on the following terms and conditions with the Mildura Base Hospital—

1. The agreement shall remain in force until the expiration of at least six months' written notice of intention to terminate the agreement given by either party hereto to the other.

2. The Clinic shall be designated the "Peter MacCallum Clinic at the Mildura Base Hospital".

3. The Board shall—

- (a) Subject to the provision of accommodation as hereinafter provided, conduct the Clinic whenever necessary for the examination or treatment of patients;
- (b) appoint a specialist or consultant in radiotherapy as the medical officer in charge of the Clinic;
- (c) supply on loan for use in the Clinic and pay the costs of installation therein of a 140 K.V. Superficial Therapy Unit (hereinafter called "the Unit") and associated equipment necessary for treatment of patients;
- (d) bear the cost of maintaining and servicing the Unit including the cost of tube replacements;
- (e) provide such technical staff as is necessary for the operation of the Unit;

(f) provide any special equipment or instrument required for the Clinic and which is not in use within the Hospital;

(g) in consideration of the use of the Clinic by the said medical officer for the purpose of private practice within the meaning of the by-laws made by the Board pursuant to the *Cancer Institute Act 1948*, pay to the institution the weekly rental of Two pounds two shillings.

4. The Institution shall—

(a) make available at the Hospital for the Clinic accommodation approved by the Board and with such alterations as may be necessary for the safe operation of the Unit;

(b) hold the Unit and associated equipment as aforesaid and the proceeds of any insurance thereof in trust for the Board and shall insure and keep insured the Unit and the associated equipment in the name of the Institution against loss or damage by fire to their full insurable value or such other sum as the Board may approve;

(c) clean and maintain the accommodation as aforesaid and provide electric power and space heating for the Clinic;

(d) provide such nursing staff as the Board deems necessary for the conduct of the Clinic;

(e) not charge out-patients' fees to persons attending the Clinic for examination or for follow-up procedures.

5. The Board may request any patient of the Clinic to contribute towards the cost of his treatment therein and the Institution shall on behalf of the Board receive that contribution. The Institution shall be entitled to retain 10 per centum of any moneys so received and the Board shall pay to the Institution 10 per centum of any contribution as aforesaid paid directly to the Board.
