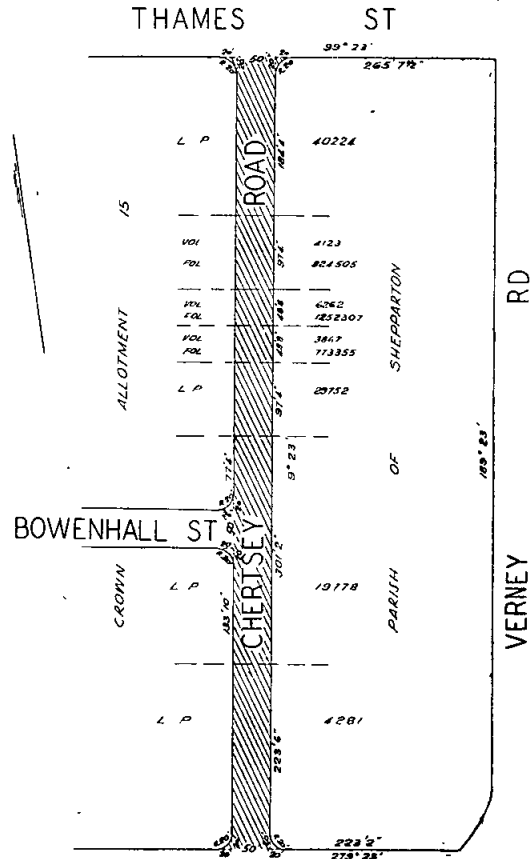
PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1946, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Shepparton has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved for a road within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation, declare that all that piece of land reserved for a road, known as Chertsey-road, being part of Crown allotment 15, Parish of Shepparton, and being the land shown hatched on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, namely:—

YARRAGON WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW 1958.

THE Yarragon Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Three shillings and six pence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Yarragon Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Six pounds fifteen shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than One pound.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1958, and ending on the last day of December, 1958, and shall be payable on the 1st day of October, 1958, at the office of the said Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

In the absence of any specific means of measurement the quantity of water supplied shall be ascertained by accounting a watering as being a volume of water 6 inches in depth over any area watered, and for the purposes of this By-law and any By-law making an irrigation charge a watering shall mean the application of water to land for the purpose of irrigation, and a watering shall be and is hereby deemed to be a volume of water 6 inches in depth over any area watered, provided that where application of water to the land is by means of sprays, the quantity of water so supplied in each watering shall be accounted as being a volume of water 3 inches in depth over the area watered.

5. An acre-foot of water shall be and is for the purposes of this By-law and any By-law making an irrigation charge deemed to be such quantity of water as would cover an area of 1 acre to a depth of 1 foot.

6. The charge for the supply of water under water rights for irrigation of lands to which water rights have been apportioned, during the period beginning with the fifteenth day of August in every year and ending with the thirty-first day of May in each succeeding year (which period is hereinafter called the "irrigation season") shall be as set out in the By-law making the irrigation charge for such period.

7. The charge for water supplied for irrigation other than that under water rights during any irrigation season after the making of the By-law fixing the irrigation charge for that season shall be—

- (a) in respect of water supplied during ordinary watering periods for the delivery of water under water rights—at the same rate of payment per unit of volume as that in respect of water apportioned as water rights for that irrigation season; or

AMENDMENT OF WATCHMAKING TRADES
APPRENTICESHIP REGULATIONS.

“Term of Apprenticeship.

6. The term of apprenticeship in the said trades shall be five years.”

(2) Regulation 8 shall be deleted and the following substituted therefor:—

“Minimum Rates of Wages of Apprentices.

8. The minimum weekly rates of wages to be paid to apprentices in the said trades as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence on or after 1st December, 1957, shall be the under-mentioned percentages of the rate of wages prescribed for a watchmaker from time to time in the determination of the Watchmakers Board calculated to the nearest 6d., half or less than half of 6d. to be disregarded:—

(a) In a term of apprenticeship of six years—

(b) In a term of apprenticeship of five years—

(3) Regulation 12 shall be deleted and the following substituted therefor:—

“Classes for Instruction.

12. The classes for instruction in the subjects of the apprenticeship courses for the said trades shall be as set out in the Second and Third Schedules hereto, but any apprentice or probationer who has the necessary qualifications may, subject to the approval of the Commission, be permitted to enter the classes prescribed for any year of the said courses.”

(4) Regulation 13 shall be deleted and the following substituted therefor:—

“Standard of Education to be Attained by an Apprentice.

13. (1) The standard of education to be attained by an apprentice in the subjects of the first, second, third, or fourth years of his apprenticeship course, in order that he may qualify to proceed to the classes for instruction prescribed for the next succeeding year, shall be not less than 50 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission in each of the subjects prescribed for such year of the said course, or such average percentage of marks in all of the said subjects as is deemed by the Commission to be equivalent thereto.

(2) In order that an apprentice may qualify in respect to education for the ‘final certificate’ of the Commission, he shall, in addition to attaining the standard set out in sub-regulation (1) hereof in the subjects prescribed for the fourth year of the apprenticeship course, make satisfactory progress as

approved by the Commission in the subjects prescribed for the fifth year of the said course, until the completion of the term of his apprenticeship.”

(5) In the Second Schedule after the words “Classes for Instruction in the Subjects of the Apprenticeship Course for the Trades of Watch and/or Clock Making” add the words “for Apprentices Indentured in a Term of Apprenticeship of Six Years”.

(6) After the Second Schedule the following additional Schedule shall be inserted:—

A By-law of the City of Chelsea made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1946*, and every and any other power it thereunto enabling and numbered 47, for—

- (a) Prohibiting the throwing, placing, or leaving upon any public highway of orange peel, banana peel, or other vegetable matter;
- (b) Prohibiting the deposit or leaving of refuse or rubbish on streets, roads, lanes or passages;
- (c) Prohibiting or regulating the deposit or leaving of refuse or rubbish on any land;
- (d) Requiring the removal or destruction by the owner or occupier of any land of refuse or rubbish thereon (other than refuse or rubbish the removal of which the Council has undertaken or contracted for under section 48 of the *Health Act 1956*).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946* and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Chelsea order as follows:—

1. All By-laws of the City of Chelsea, and all parts of any such By-laws inconsistent with or repugnant to any of the provisions hereof and heretofore in force, are hereby expressly repealed.

2. No person shall throw, place or leave upon any public highway any orange peel, banana peel, or other vegetable matter.

3. No person shall deposit or leave or cause to be deposited or left any refuse or rubbish on any street, road, lane or passage.

4. No person shall deposit or leave or cause to be deposited or left any refuse or rubbish on any land.

5. The owner or occupier of any land shall remove or destroy all refuse or rubbish thereon (other than refuse or rubbish the removal of which the Council of the City of Chelsea has undertaken or contracted for under section 48 of the *Health Act 1956*).

6. This By-law shall have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Chelsea.

7. Any person who shall wilfully offend against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, be liable for a first such offence to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds and not less than Five pounds, for a second offence to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds or less than Five pounds, and for a third or any subsequent offence to a penalty of Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day in respect of which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by the Court.

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on 11th August, 1958, and confirmed on 8th September, 1958.

(a) Subject to prior bookings made at the Shire office, Casterton, sales may be held in the market on any day (Monday to Friday inclusive) except on any day which is a public holiday or on which a regular monthly meeting or a special meeting of the Council of the Shire of Glenelg is held. Each application for the holding of a sale shall be for one sale only and the appropriate fee as fixed by this By-law shall be paid either with the booking or immediately upon an account being rendered to the person or firm making the booking. The fee shall be in addition to the usual market dues charged and payable. The market shall be open from sunrise to sunset on every sale day for which a booking has been made in accordance with this By-law for the sale of cattle. With the exception of horses and pigs, cattle shall not be received at the market after the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on any market day provided that if any cattle shall arrive in

Casterton by train or transport on a market day they may be admitted to the market after Twelve o'clock noon if notice of their arrival shall be given to the inspector immediately after the train or transport carrying the cattle shall have arrived.

(b) The Australian Estate Company Limited shall have the exclusive right to make regular fortnightly bookings for the conduct of calf sales between the 1st day of April and the 31st day of October in each year subject to payment of the fees referred to in this By-law.

- Crown allotment 43, Maryvale.

3. *Times for Slaughtering*.—The times for slaughtering at the several establishments shall be such times between the hours of 7 a.m. and 4 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays (inclusive) as are arranged with the concurrence of the Council. No slaughtering shall be done at week-ends except with the special permission of the Council or an officer authorized by the Council.

5. *Diseased Animals*.—No animal visibly, or known to be, affected with any contagious or infectious disease shall be received into an establishment except with the express permission of the Meat Inspector.

6. *Carcass to be Examined and Passed before Removal*.—No person shall remove from an establishment any carcass of any animal slaughtered thereat until the same has been examined by the Inspector and passed by him as fit for human food, and branded by him with the regulation brand.

7. *Slaughtering*.—All slaughtering shall be carried out in good and sufficient light, and the carcasses of large animals, immediately after stunning in accordance with the Meat Supervision Regulations, shall be thoroughly drained of blood, which shall, as far as practicable, be thereupon caught in suitable receptacles. The skin of all carcasses shall, as far as practicable, be kept from contact with blood or flushing water, and all other carcasses shall be so hung as not to touch any other carcass, or any wall, door, or window. No sheep skin shall be removed from an establishment with the head attached.

8. *Diseased Animal to be Reported*.—Immediately any animal slaughtered is discovered to be diseased, the slaughterman shall stop the work of dressing such animal for food and report the fact to the Inspector, and shall not proceed further with such dressing until authorized to do so.

9. *Organs of Diseased Carcasses*.—It shall be the duty of slaughtermen to see that the organs of diseased carcasses are kept apart from the organs of healthy carcasses.

10. *Dogs*.—No dogs, other than cattle or sheep dogs, shall be brought upon or allowed to remain in an establishment and every such cattle or sheep dog, when not in use, shall be locked up or chained or efficiently muzzled by the person in charge of such dog in such place as is assigned for that purpose by the Inspector. All other dogs found in the establishment, whether in the charge of any person or not, will be destroyed.

11. *Clean Clothing*.—The Inspector may refuse to allow any person not wearing clean clothing or clean overalls to load or handle any meat in an establishment.

12. *Penalty*.—Any contravention of this By-law or part thereby by act or omission shall be an offence against the By-law and every person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

13. *Operation of By-law.*—This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Morwell Meat Inspection Area.

The chilling chambers at the establishment shall be open for the despatch of carcasses from 1 a.m. to 9 a.m. on days as enumerated in clause 3, or at such times as the Superintendent shall direct, and at no other times, and all persons doing business at the establishment in connexion with the chilling chambers shall conform to the directions of the Superintendent or the Inspector or other person on duty at the time.
