ADDITION TO AND EXCISION FROM URBAN FIRE DISTRICT IN THE TWENTY-THIRD FIRE CONTROL REGION.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation of the Governor in Council issued on the sixteenth day of November, 1954, and published in the Government Gazette of the

seventeenth day of November, 1954, for the purposes of the Country Fire Authority Act 1944, certain parts of the country area of Victoria were proclaimed as fire control regions; and certain parts of such fire control regions were proclaimed to be urban fire districts; and the remainder (if any) of each such fire control region (being the area not included in any urban fire district) was proclaimed to be a rural district:

And whereas by section sixteen of the Country Fire Authority Act 1944, it is (amongst other things) enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after consideration of a report submitted by the Country Fire Authority by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette add any area to or excise any area from any urban district:

And whereas the Country Fire Authority has submitted a report that it is necessary and desirable that the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Benalla be included in the Urban Fire District within the Twentythird Fire Control Region:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, after consideration of the said report of the Country Fire Authority, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Country Fire Authority Acts, do by this my Proclamation—

- (a) add to the Urban District within the Twenty-third Fire Control Region the municipal dis-trict of the Borough of Benalla; and
- (b) excise from the Urban District within the Twenty-third Fire Control Region the area described in the Schedule hereto.

#### SCHEDULE.

Borough and Shire of Benalla, Town and Parish of Benalla, Counties of Moira and Delatite: Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 1 of section G, Parish of Benalla; bounded thence by a road, a line, and a road bearing southerly to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of allotment 2 of section S; thence by a line, said allotment 2, a line, and allotment 2 of section R bearing south-easterly to the south-east angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence by said allotment 2 and allotment 1 bearing south-westerly to a road; thence by that road bearing north-westerly to a point in line with the east boundaries of said allotment 23; thence by a line, and allotment 1 of section H bearing south to Holland's Creek; thence by that creek bearing south to the north-west angle of allotment 5 of section I; thence by a line and allotment 1 of section K, bearing west to the north-west corner thereof; thence by Broken Creek bearing northerly to the north-east corner of allotment 1 of section A; thence by a road bearing west to the north-east angle of allotment 16 of section U; thence by that allotment bearing south westerly to the north-west angle thereof; thence by a line and allotment 16 of section U; thence by that allotment bearing south the north-east angle of allotment B, G, and 4 bearing north-westerly to the north-west angle thereof; thence by a line bearing north-westerly to the south-west angle of allotment B, D, a line, 12 and 11 bearing northerly to the north-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence by a road bearing easterly to the north-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment 5 of section D; thence by the south boundaries of that allotment and allotments 4, 3, and 2 to the south-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment 5 of section D; thence by the south boundaries of that allotment and allotments 4, 3, and 2 to the south-west angle of allotment 1 of section D; thence by a road bearing easterly to the south-west angle of allotment 1 of section D; thence by a road bearing easterly

(a) All other matter duly certified by a responsible officer for publication should be lodged with the Gazette Officer not later than half-past Ten a.m. on Tuesday.

(b) Lengthy or involved notices should be forwarded several days before publication.

(c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested, or at the direction of the *Gazette* Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.

(d) No additions or amendments to matter for publication will be accepted by telephone.

THE VICTORIA GOVERNMENT GAZETTE is published on Wednesday Evening in each week, and Notices for insertion will be received by the Government Printer at or before Two p.m. at ordinary rates, and late advertisements between Two p.m. and Five p.m. at double rates on the day preceding the day of publication.
