AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2 and 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

MILK PASTEURIZATION ACT 1949.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the *Milk Pasteurization Act 1949* (No. 5444) it is provided that a day be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* in relation to a prescribed district: And whereas an area known as the Geelong district has been prescribed as a district for the purposes of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Monday the seventeenth day of November, 1958, as the day after which no person shall in the prescribed district known as the Geelong district—

- sell or deliver milk except milk pasteurized at licensed pasteurizing premises and bottled and sealed as prescribed; or
- (in the case where the milk is sold and delivered at a shop for immediate consumption by a customer at the shop) sell or deliver milk except milk pasteurized at licensed pasteurizing premises.

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF NUNAWADING.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946*, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and

from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or there- after in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Nunawading has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved for a street within the said City, be declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land reserved for a street, being part of Crown allotment 116C, Parish of Nunawading, and being shown as Shady Grove on lodged plan of subdivision No. 40154, and being more particularly described hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, namely:—

SHADY GROVE (PORTION OF).

Commencing at a point on the north alignment of Canterbury-road distant 834 ft. 9½ in. east of Springvale-road; thence on a bearing of 8 deg. 52½ min. for a distance of 1,396 ft. 3 in.; thence on bearing of 39 deg. 29 min. for a distance of 98 ft. 2½ in.; thence on a bearing of 188 deg. 52½ min. for a distance of 1,480 ft. 6½ in.; thence on a bearing of 278 deg. 38 min. for a distance of 50 ft. 0 in. to the point of commencement.

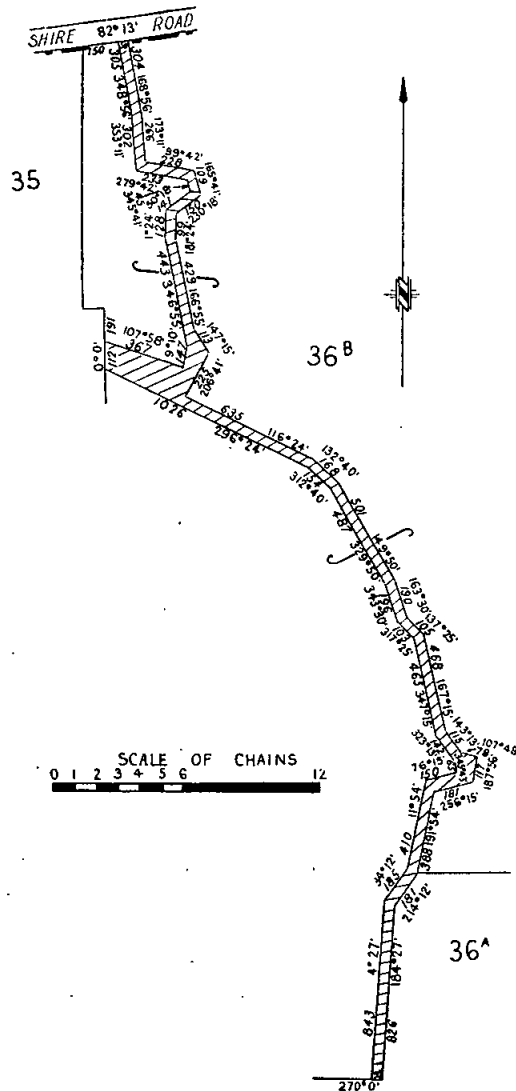

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACTS.

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 900 (2) of the Local Government Act 1946 provides, *inter alia*, that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, at the request of the council of any municipality, not being a city or town, extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Towong has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to a part of the municipal district of such municipality:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Local Government Act 1946 to that part of the Shire of Towong described hereunder:—

TALLANGATTA TOWNSHIP.

Commencing at the north-eastern angle of lot 1 on a plan of subdivision lodged in the Office of Titles in red ink, No. A159772, being part of allotment 10, section 1, Parish of Bolga, County of Bogong; thence by lines bearing north 79 deg. 49 min. west 1,832 ft. 10½ in. and north to the southern shore of Hume Reservoir; thence generally westerly by that shore to a point therein north 30 deg. 0 min. west of the intersection of the western boundary of the new showgrounds reserve in allotment 3, section XI., Parish of Beethang, with the northern boundary of the Wodonga to Cudgewa railway reserve; thence by a line bearing south 30 deg. 0 min. east to the southern boundary of that railway reserve; thence generally easterly by that railway reserve boundary to a point in line with the eastern boundary of aforesaid lot 1 on a plan of subdivision lodged in the Office of Titles in red ink, No. A159772; thence northerly by a line and the last-mentioned boundary to the point of commencement.

And order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in such part of the municipal district of the Shire of Towong on publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation vary the Proclamation made the nineteenth day of October, 1954, and published in the Government Gazette of the twenty-seventh day of October, 1954, respecting prohibition of fishing in certain waters as follows:—

(a) By adding the words "Bullen Merri", "Coregulac near Colac", "Deep near Derrinallum", "Toollarook near Lismore" in the "Lakes" column of Section "B" of such Proclamation.

- (b) By substituting for all the words set opposite "Kiewa River" in Section "B" of such Proclamation the words "Above or upstream from Keegan's Bridge, also known as Keighan's Bridge, over such river at Dederang".
- (c) By deleting the words "Rocky Creek, nor" and "nor Croppers Creek" in the words set opposite "Ovens River" in Section "B" of such Proclamation.
- (d) By deleting all the words after "River Murray" in the words set opposite "Jeremal Creek or Geromal Creek" in section "B" of such Proclamation.

PROCLAMATION

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation vary the Proclamation made the nineteenth day of October, 1954, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-seventh day of October, 1954, respecting a bag limit for trout in certain waters as follows:—

- (a) By substituting for the expression "Four (4) trout" set opposite "Lake Guy at Bogong" in the "Bag Limit" column of such Proclamation the expression "Six (6) trout".
- (b) By adding in the "Waters Referred to" column of such Proclamation the words "Clover Dam near Bogong" and setting opposite thereto in the "Bag Limit" column the expression "Six (6) trout".

PROHIBITION OF ALL FISHING IN OR THE TAKING OF FISH FROM THE MARRABOOR RIVER FROM THE 1ST SEPTEMBER TO THE 30TH NOVEMBER IN EACH YEAR.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation—

- (a) Vary the Proclamation made the first day of September, 1937, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the eighth day of September, 1937, respecting the prohibition of fishing in certain streams by deleting therefrom all reference to the Little Murray.
- (b) Prohibit all fishing in or the taking of fish from the Marraboor River also known as the Little Murray from the first day of September to the thirtieth day of November (both days inclusive) in each year.

MARKING OF FISH TRAPS AND CRAYFISH COFFS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation prescribe that no person shall engage in fishing by means of a fish trap or use any crayfish coff for the purpose of holding crayfish, unless there is clearly and distinctly marked on each buoy, stake flag or other similar object attached to each fish trap or crayfish coff the registered number of such person's fishing boat or the number of his current fishing licence, and prescribing further that when no buoy, stake flag or similar object is used the registered number of such person's fishing boat or the number of his current fishing licence shall be clearly and distinctly marked on each fish trap or crayfish coff.

- (2) ‘Grade 1 Government Certified.’—This grade shall comprise whole beans of the same variety which are sealed and certified under the certification scheme of the Department of Agriculture of Victoria and which are sound, dry, free from broken, shrivelled, malformed or sprouted seeds, undamaged by disease or insects and capable of germinating 85 per cent. or over.
- (3) ‘Premium Grade Board Approved.’—This grade shall comprise whole beans of the same variety which have been grown from seed certified under an approved certification scheme, or produced from a crop sprayed where necessary with a fungicide in accordance with the recommendations of the Department of Agriculture for the control of Halo Blight, and approved by the Board, and which are sound, dry, of a good natural colour, free from broken, shrivelled, malformed or sprouted seeds, undamaged by disease or insects and capable of germinating 85 per cent. or over.
- (4) ‘Grade 1. Board Approved.’—This grade shall comprise whole beans of the same variety which have been grown from seed certified under an approved certification scheme, or produced from a crop sprayed where necessary with a fungicide in accordance with the recommendations of the Department of Agriculture for the control of Halo Blight, and approved by the Board, and which are sound, dry, free from broken, shrivelled, malformed or sprouted seeds, undamaged by disease or insects and capable of germinating 85 per cent. or over.
- (5) ‘Grade 1. Commercial.’—This grade shall comprise whole beans of the same variety which are sound, dry, of a good natural colour, free from broken, shrivelled, malformed or sprouted seeds, undamaged by disease or insects and capable of germinating 85 per cent. or over.
- (6) ‘Grade 2. Commercial.’—This grade shall comprise whole beans of the same variety which are sound, dry, free from broken, shrivelled, malformed or sprouted seeds, undamaged by disease or insects and capable of germinating 85 per cent. or over.”
