Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation specify the Shire of Korumburra as an area in which Part II. of the *Road Traffic Act 1956* shall apply in respect only of parking infringements occurring after the date hereof.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust, Meeniyon.

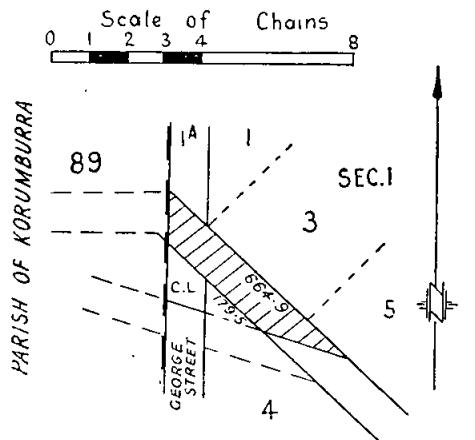

REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Weights and Measures Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

The Weights and Measures Regulations 1952 as amended are hereby further amended as follows:—

1. In Regulation 3, the following definition is hereby inserted after the definition of "Personal weighing machine":—

"'Public weighing' means any weighing made on a public weighbridge for any purpose other than the weighing of—

- (a) vehicles which are owned by the owner of the weighbridge; or
- (b) goods of which the owner of the weighbridge is either the owner, seller or intending seller, or purchaser or intending purchaser (including where necessary the determination of the tare weight of any vehicle in connexion with the weighing of any such goods)."

2. Paragraph (d) of Regulation 19 is hereby revoked and the following paragraph is substituted therefor:—

"(d) any instrument which is not of a pattern approved under section 32 of the Acts or Regulations 25 and 26 hereof, unless such instrument was in use for trade before the twenty-ninth day of October, 1957."

3. The following paragraph is hereby added at the end of Regulation 86:—

"(c) A weighing instrument which is—
(i) of approved pattern;
(ii) used only in sales by wholesale; and
(iii) is prominently marked 'For Use in Measuring Cows' Milk Only',
may, in addition to graduations in terms of weight, be marked in terms of Imperial liquid measure, for which purpose 1 gallon of milk shall be deemed to weigh 10.32 pounds."

4. In paragraph (a) of Regulation 118, the words "or other approved material" are hereby inserted after the word "metal".

5. The following proviso is hereby added after paragraph (d) of Regulation 193:—

"Provided that this paragraph shall—
(a) not prohibit any Government Department or municipality from using any weighbridge not registered as a public weighbridge in the administration of any Act or any Regulations made under any Act, relating to the weights of vehicles or to the wheel-loads or axle-loads of vehicles on public highways; and
(b) be subject to any permit which the Superintendent may issue if he thinks fit, permitting a Government Department to use a weighbridge not registered as a public weighbridge, for purposes specified in such permit."

6. The following paragraph is hereby added at the end of the proviso to Regulation 236:—

“(d) the owner of a public weighbridge which is of ticket-printing type and is used for weighing goods of which he is the owner, seller or intending seller, or purchaser or intending purchaser (including any necessary determinations of the tare weights of vehicles in connexion with such weighings) may for such purposes provide weight tickets which are in other style and not bound in books but so that—

(i) no reference is made in any such ticket to the fact that the weighbridge is a public weighbridge; and

(ii) each such ticket has prominently printed on it ‘This Ticket Not Valid for Public Weighing.’”

7. The following proviso is hereby added at the end of Regulation 242:—

“Provided that paragraphs (e), (f), (g), (h), (l) and (r) of this Regulation shall not apply in any case where tickets of other than the prescribed form are used pursuant to paragraph (d) of the proviso to Regulation 236 hereof.”

8. The following paragraph is hereby inserted after paragraph (h) of Regulation 243:—

“(i) use for any public weighing any weight ticket not of the form prescribed in paragraph (c) of Regulation 236 hereof.”

DECLARATION OF A RECLAMATION AREA AT PORT MELBOURNE.

WHEREAS within an area in the City of Port Melbourne described in the Schedule hereto there are houses which—

- (a) are unfit for human habitation and
 (b) are in the opinion of the Housing Commission insanitary or unhealthy by reason of—
 (i) the excessive number of buildings within the area;
 (ii) the bad arrangement of buildings within the area; and
 (iii) the bad arrangement or narrowness of streets within the area:

And whereas the Housing Commission considers that housing conditions within the area cannot satisfactorily be dealt with unless the said area is dealt with under Part III. of the *Slum Reclamation and Housing Act 1938* (No. 4568) as a Reclamation Area and has recommended that the said area should be constituted a Reclamation Area:

And whereas the Housing Commission having duly complied with the provisions of sub-section (3) of section 19 of the said Act, has submitted to the Governor in Council its recommendation that the said area should be constituted a Reclamation Area:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby declare the said area to be a Reclamation Area.

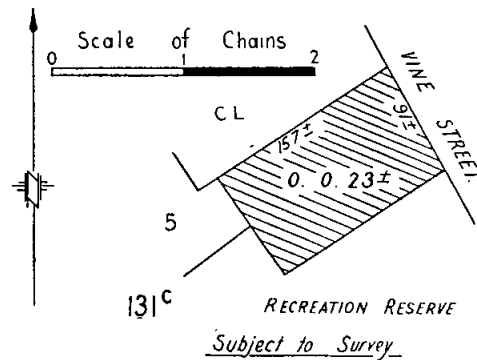

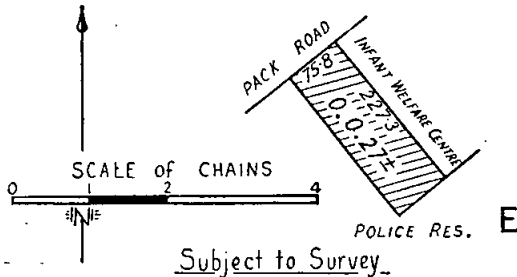

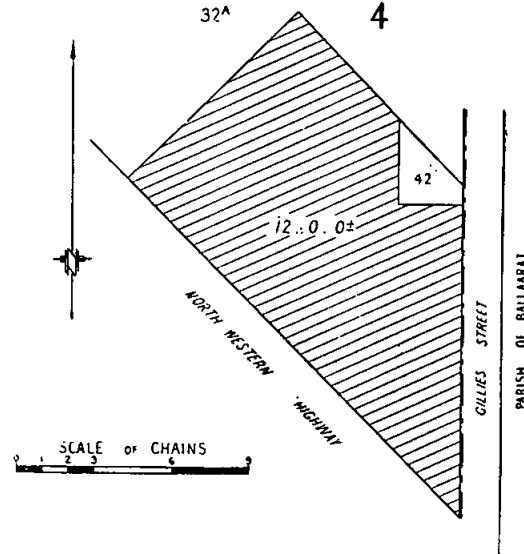
