### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2 and 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the *Game Act 1958* and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do hereby direct that the Proclamation made the seventh day of September, 1926 and published in the *Government Gazette* of the fifteenth day of September 1926 prohibiting the use of spotlights or any similar light of any kind whatsoever for taking, killing or hunting, or for attempting or assisting to take kill or hunt any species of native game shall not apply to the common opossum the ringtailed opossum or the short eared or mountain opossum during the period from the 1st day of August, 1959 to the 12th day of September, 1959, both days inclusive.

## THE STATE SAVINGS BANK OF VICTORIA.

## GENERAL ORDER No. 58.

THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE STATE SAVINGS BANK OF VICTORIA in pursuance and by virtue of the several enactments in that behalf contained in the *State Savings Bank Act 1958*, do hereby order and direct that the Rules of the Provident Fund of the Bank shall be amended in accordance with rules 16 and 17 of this General Order and that rules 1 to 15 inclusive of the General Order shall be Rules of the Provident Fund of the Bank.

1. An employee who has attained the age of fifty years (females forty-five years) at the operative date shall on and after the first pay day after that date make such increased contributions to the Fund per diem as are in the same proportion to the contributions per diem made by the employee immediately prior to the operative date as the annuity payable to him on the normal retiring date under the Rules of this General Order will be to that which would have been payable to him under the Rules of the Fund in force immediately prior to the operative date: PROVIDED that in the calculation of the amounts of the said annuities for the purposes of this rule no allowance shall be made for any variation which after the operative date might be made in the salary of the employee.

2. On and after the first pay day after the operative date the contributions to the Fund of a male employee immediately prior to the operative date plus any additional contributions of a male employee referred to in rule 1 of this General Order shall be increased by ten per centum.

3. (1) An employee who is required to make increased contributions to the Fund under both rules 1 and 2 of this General Order may within three months of the operative date (or at any time afterwards in the absolute discretion of the General Manager) elect in writing to defray the increased contributions so payable by receiving advances from the Fund on account of and charged against the proceeds or anticipated proceeds on maturity of policies on his life held in the Fund and/or payments made by him under rule 20 of General Order 43.

(2) Compound interest at five per centum per annum shall be chargeable on any such advances and the sum of all such advances and the interest thereon shall be repaid by him from the proceeds of such policies and/or from moneys held for him in the Fund pursuant to the said rule 20.

4. (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in the Rules of the Provident Fund of the Bank concerning the method of calculating the amount of any annuity the following provisions shall apply in lieu thereof on the retirement of an employee on or after the operative date—

(2) The amount of the annuity payable to an employee retiring at the normal retiring date shall be one-fortieth of his average annual salary, calculated in accordance with the provisions of sub-rule (3) of this rule, multiplied by the number of years of his service up to a maximum of twenty-five years.

(3) Average annual salary shall be calculated in respect of a period ending on the normal retiring date and beginning with the day of appointment or the day preceding by five years the normal retiring date, whichever is the later. Provided that, for the purposes of this sub-rule, if an employee retires under the provisions of sub-rule (1) of rule 9 of General Order No. 43 (as amended by any other General Order) his annual salary, during the period between the day of retirement and the normal retiring date, shall be deemed to be his annual salary immediately before his retirement.

(4) On the death of a male annuitant there shall be payable to his widow (until her death or remarriage) provided that her marriage to the annuitant was contracted prior to his retirement an annuity equal in amount to one-half of that payable to the annuitant at the date of his death.

5. If an employee who has been in the service of the Commissioners for five years dies on or after the operative date and before retirement and (1) leaves a widow, there shall be payable to his widow (until her death or remarriage) an annuity equal in amount to one-half of the annuity he would have been entitled to receive had he retired on the grounds of ill-health or other disability on the day before the day of his death or (2) does not leave a widow or a dependent child, there shall be payable to his legal representatives an amount equal to his contributions to the Fund together with interest thereon at the rate of five per centum per annum compounded yearly.

6. (1) The annuity payable to an employee who has been in the service of the Commissioners for five years and who with the consent of the Commissioners retires or is retired after the operative date on account of ill-health or other disability shall be a proportion of the prospective annuity which would have been payable to him had he retired at the normal retiring date (assuming for this purpose that there would be no variation in his salary), the proportion being one-half of such prospective annuity plus the fraction of such prospective annuity calculated by dividing his actual years of service by twice his years of service had he retired on his normal retiring date.

(2) On the death of an employee who retires or is retired after the operative date on an annuity on account of ill-health or other disability there shall be payable to his widow (until her death or remarriage) provided that her marriage to the deceased annuitant was contracted prior to his retirement an annuity equal in amount to one-half of that payable to the annuitant at the date of his death.

7. With the consent of the Commissioners, an employee may at any time elect that in lieu of the annuity which might be payable to his widow under the provisions of sub-rule (4) of rule 4, sub-rule (1) of rule 5 or sub-rule (2) of rule 6 of this General Order there shall be payable to his legal representatives an amount equal to his contributions to the Fund together with compound interest thereon at the rate of five per centum per annum less any amounts received by him by way of annuity together with interest thereon calculated as aforesaid.

8. If the sum of the benefits paid under rules 4, 5, and 6 of this General Order and under rule 8 and sub-rule (1) of rule 16 of General Order No. 43 as amended by this General Order together with compound interest thereon at the rate of five per centum per annum be less than the contributions (together with compound interest thereon at the rate of five per centum per annum) made by an employee who has died or has retired or been retired after the operative date there shall on the cessation of the payment of such benefits be payable to his legal representatives an amount which together with the sum of all such benefits so paid equal his contributions to the Fund together with compound interest thereon at the rate of five per centum per annum.

9. If after the operative date an employee (a) dies or retires or is retired on account of ill-health or other disability, prior to the completion of five years' service with the Commissioners or (b) withdraws from the Fund otherwise than on an annuity there shall be payable to him or to his legal representatives within three months of his death, retirement or withdrawal an amount equal to his contributions to the Fund together with compound interest thereon at the rate of three per centum per annum: Provided that this rule shall not affect the right of an employee to recover the benefit provided in sub-rule (6) of rule 9 of General Order No. 43.

10. The percentage of salary to be contributed by an employee appointed after the operative date (and before the date on which any subsequent alteration in rates is fixed under the provisions of General Order No. 43) in respect of his salary on the date of appointment, and the percentage of salary to be contributed by an employee (whenever appointed) in respect of additions to salary taking effect after the operative date (and before the date on which any subsequent alteration in rates is fixed under the provisions of General Order No. 43) shall be in accordance with the scales of rates set out in the schedules "A" and "B" to this General Order.

11. (1) On the death of a male annuitant who was in receipt of an annuity on the operative date there shall be payable to his widow (until her death or remarriage) an annuity equal in amount to one-half of that payable to the annuitant at the date of his death: Provided that her marriage to the annuitant was contracted prior to his retirement: Provided further that an annuitant who retired or was retired within seven years prior to the operative date elects within three months of the making of this General Order that his annuity shall be payable during his lifetime.

(2) An election once made shall be irrevocable.

12. (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-rule (1) of rule 29 of General Order No. 43 architects, valuers, clerks of works and other persons not on the clerical staff may at any time elect either to be exempted from or to conform to the provisions of the rules of this General Order or only to those relating to the payment of benefits by way of annuity or to those relating to life insurance.

(2) A person referred to in sub-rule (1) of this rule making the election to conform to the provisions of the rules relating to the payment of benefits by way of annuity shall forthwith pay to the Fund a sum representing the amounts he would have contributed had he made the said election on the day of his appointment, with compound interest at five per centum per annum, and the Bank shall pay to the Fund contributions provided in rule 4 of General Order No. 43 as amended by rule 16 of this General Order.

13. The amount of each annuity which on the operative date is being paid from the Fund shall be increased in the case of a retired male employee by £100 per annum and in the case of a retired female employee by £75 per annum: Provided that the increase shall not be payable to:—

- (a) a retired employee whose annuity together with the additional annuity payable under rule 11 of General Order No. 43 exceeds £1,500 per annum;
- (b) a retired employee who has retired before attaining the age of 60 years (female 55 years) on any ground other than ill-health or other disability; or
- (c) a retired female employee who has married after the date of her retirement.

14. The Bank, out of its general revenue shall pay to the Fund within a period of ten years from the operative date the amount which the Actuary shall certify to be necessary to meet the deficiency in the Fund as at the 30th day of June 1958 with compound interest thereon at the rate of five per centum per annum to date of payment consequent upon the granting of the increased benefits provided by this General Order.

15. The words "operative date" mean the 23rd day of April 1959.

16. General Order No. 43 (as amended by any other General Order) is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) In rule 3 the interpretation of "Dependants" is hereby repealed;

(b) For sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (a) of sub-rule (1) of rule 4 there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—  
" (i) up to the operative date of General Order No. 58 a sum equal to the amount of contributions made by employees during the same period under the provisions of these rules and after the said date a sum which bears the same ratio to the amount of contributions made by employees as aforesaid as fifty-five bears to forty-five ";

(c) Sub-rules (2) and (3) of rule 5 are hereby repealed;

(d) In rule 6 for the expressions "1953" and "5 years" there shall be substituted the expressions "1961" and "3 years";

(e) For rule 8 there shall be substituted the following rule: "8. (1) Save as provided in sub-rule (2) of this rule an annuity shall be payable from the Fund during the life of the annuitant after retirement. (2) If an annuitant who has not made an election under the provisions of rule 11 of General Order No. 58 dies within a period of seven years after retirement the annuity shall, during the remainder of the said period of seven years, be payable to his widow or to one or more of his dependent children, as the Commissioners determine."

(f) Sub-rules (2), (5), and (7) of rule 9 are hereby repealed;

(g) Rule 10 of General Order No. 43 is hereby repealed;

(h) In rule 12 the words "under the provisions of rules 9 and 10" are hereby repealed;

(i) At the end of sub-rule (3) of rule 14 there shall be added the following words "and before the operative date of General Order No. 58";

(j) For sub-rule (1) of rule 16 there shall be substituted the following rule: " (1) Each child under the age of 18 years admitted by the Commissioners to be a child of, and a dependant of, an employee who has died or dies, whether before or after retirement, or who has retired or retires on account of ill-health or other disability, shall receive, through his guardian, an allowance of £75 per annum ";

(k) For rule 17 there shall be substituted the following rule—" Employees (except female employees who exercise the election referred to in sub-rule (2) of rule 20) shall, on appointment, insure their lives with companies approved by the Commissioners and the policies shall be in accordance with tables corresponding with table J65 (females J60) of the Australian Mutual Provident Society, and shall be for an amount of £1,250 (females £825) " ; and

(l) Paragraph (b) of sub-rule (4) of rule 21 is hereby repealed.

17. Rule 4 of General Order No. 53 is hereby repealed.

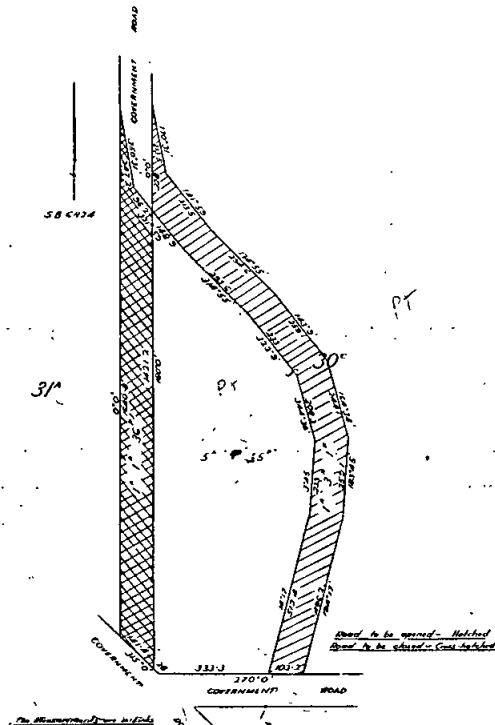

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the said Trust.

REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Police Regulation Act 1958*, doth hereby further amend the Police Regulations 1957 as follows (that is to say):—

1. At the end of Regulation 406 the following sub-regulation shall be added:—

When white covers to be worn.

“(2) Except when white helmets are worn as hereinafter provided, caps with white cotton or waterproof covers shall be worn by Station Officers, Sub-Officers and Constables of all uniform branches when performing duty”; and

2. Regulation 408 shall be revoked and the following Regulation substituted therefor:—

Definition of “summer period”.

“408. (1) The summer period is defined as the period beginning on the 1st November in each year and ending on the 31st March in the following year.

Summer uniform.

(2) During the summer period members (other than those not required to possess a white helmet) may fasten their trousers with a navy-blue belt of approved design, remove their tunics and perform their duties in the prescribed uniform, namely: shirt with sleeves worn full length, trousers, collar and tie and white helmet, as illustrated in the Twenty-first Schedule.

Wearing of white helmets.

(3) When weather conditions are suitable, white helmets shall be worn during the summer period, provided that, after sunset, caps with white cotton or waterproof covers may be worn.

Direction re wearing of uniform.

(4) Notwithstanding anything in the preceding sub-regulations the Chief Commissioner or the Officer in charge of a district or a division may at any time issue directions to the members of the Force under his control as to the uniform to be worn on any day or on any particular occasion.”

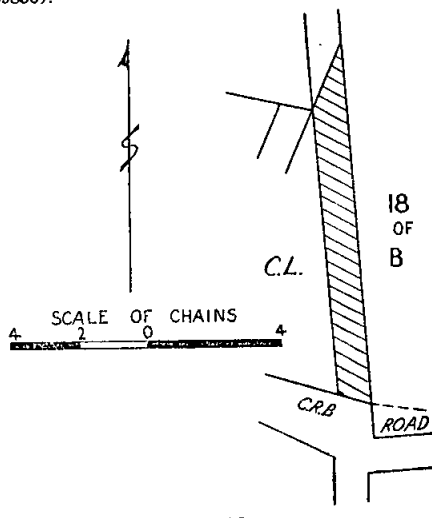

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "ALFREDTON RESERVE", AT BALLARAT.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 5th August, 1958, as a site for Pre-school Centre, Public Hall and Public Recreation in the Township of Ballarat, and known as the "Alfredton Reserve", hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve".

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management hereinafter referred to as the "Committee".

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be parcelled out in the following divisions:—

*First:* The Buildings.

*Second:* The remainder of the Reserve.

2. The following Regulations are hereby for the control of each or both divisions.

*First Division:* The Buildings shall be open to the public at such times and subject to such terms and conditions and the payment of such fees and charges as the Committee of Management may determine.

*Second Division:* The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times free of charge, except on such days not exceeding twelve in any one year as the whole or portions of it may be set aside for special occasions and under such conditions as may be approved by the Committee of Management.

3. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner or create or take part in any disturbance.

4. No person shall interfere with, damage or destroy any trees, shrubs, grass, lawns, flowers or any other property in the Reserve, throw stones or other missiles or light fires therein or deposit litter or refuse of any kind.

5. No person shall climb on any building, seats or structures or embellishments within the Reserve or in any manner deface, damage or interfere with any buildings, seats, culverts, playground equipment or other

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the *Land Act 1958*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and

every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE GOON NURE PUBLIC HALL AND RECREATION RESERVE.**

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Goon Nure temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 30th September, 1958, as a site for a Public Hall and Public Recreation, hereinafter referred to as "the Reserve".

In these Regulations the expression "the Committee" shall mean the Committee of Management of the Reserve, as appointed by the Board of Land and Works, pursuant to the provisions of section 221 of the *Land Act* 1958, and the expression "person" shall include societies and organizations.

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The Hall shall be open to the public at such times and subject to such terms and conditions and the payment of such fees and charges as the Committee may determine.
2. The remainder of the Reserve shall be open to the public at all times, free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding 26 in any one year, as it or any portion thereof may be set aside by the Committee for fêtes, entertainments or amusements on any of which occasions admission shall be subject to such conditions as the Committee may determine.
3. No person shall enter or remain in any portion of the Reserve or in any building thereon who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
4. No person shall interfere with, damage or destroy the vegetation or any buildings in the Reserve nor throw stones or other missiles, nor light fires, except in fire-places specially provided by the Committee, nor deposit litter or refuse of any kind therein.
5. No person shall bring into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals nor permit the same to enter, without the permission of the Committee being first obtained, otherwise the same may be impounded by the Committee.
6. No person shall erect any tent, booth or other structure nor offer any article for sale or hire in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee being first obtained.
7. No person shall use, or cause to be used any structure, tent, caravan, or any vehicle of any description in the Reserve for camping or living therein.
8. No person shall have use of the Hall or any stand, erection or enclosure in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee being first obtained. Such permission shall not be unreasonably or arbitrarily withheld but shall be subject to such conditions as the Committee may consider reasonable.
9. Persons renting or hiring the Hall or any stand, erection or enclosure in the Reserve, may be required to deposit any sum of money which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of the Hall or any stand, erection or enclosure and the Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any loss, damage or injury sustained by the Hall or any stand, erection or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such renting or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss, damage or injury from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee and all such persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.—(Rs.7770.)

A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under Part VII. Division 1. of the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 391 for the carrying out of the purposes provided for in subdivision (2) of Part 1 of the Fifteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1958* relating to the naming of streets and numbering of houses.

THE Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby in pursuance of the powers conferred by Part VII. of Division 1 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf order as follows:—

1. This By-law may be cited as "The City of Melbourne Naming of Streets and Numbering of Houses By-law".

2. By-law No. 81 entitled "A By-law for numbering houses" is hereby repealed.

3. It shall be lawful for the Council from time to time to cause to be painted or affixed on a conspicuous part of some house or building or on a pole erected for the purpose or on any other pole subject to the approval of the authority erecting such other pole at or near each end corner or entrance of every street, and in the direction of the line of such street, the name of such street in legible characters, and the Council may alter the name of any street or road in the municipal district (to be described in the order altering the same) to any other name which to the Council may seem fit, and before any name is given to any new street or road notice of the intended name shall be given to the Council, and the Council may, by notice given to the person by whom notice of such intended name was given to them, at any time within fourteen days of the receipt of such last-mentioned notice, object to such intended name and it shall not be lawful to give any name to any street or road or to set up any such name thereto until the expiration of fourteen days after notice thereof has been given as aforesaid to the Council, or to give or set up any name objected to as aforesaid. Where the Council changes the name of any street it shall forthwith cause a notice thereof, stating the old name and the new name, to be published in the *Government Gazette*.

4. The owners or occupiers of houses or buildings shall, on the gate or gatepost or in such other conspicuous position as the Council determines, mark such houses or buildings with such numbers and names, for the purpose of distinguishing the same, as the Council may from time to time direct or approve, and shall renew the numbers or names of such houses or buildings as often as they are obliterated or defaced; and if any owner or occupier of any such house or building neglects for one week after notice to him from the Council to mark such house or building with such number or name as the Council may direct or approve, or to renew the number or name thereof as aforesaid, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings and the Council may cause such number or name to be so marked or renewed, and recover the expense thereof from the owner or occupier of such house or building before any justice; and where such expense is paid by or recovered from the occupier he may deduct the same from any rent payable by him to the owner.

5. It shall be lawful for the Council from time to time to cause to be painted or affixed immediately beneath the name of any street painted or affixed pursuant to clause 3 of this By-law the distinguishing numbers of the houses or buildings marked or liable to be marked, pursuant to clause 4 of this By-law and the distinguishing number or numbers allocated by the Council as aforesaid to any property on which for the time being there is no house or building in that street or in any indicated part thereof.

6. If any person wilfully and maliciously destroys pulls down obliterates or defaces the name of any street or road, or the name or number of any house or building, or paints affixes or sets up any name to any street or road, or any name or number to any house or building, contrary to the provisions of this By-law, he shall for every such offence forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds; and it shall be lawful for the Council to cause such name or number so unlawfully painted affixed or set up to be obliterated or destroyed.

7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
