# AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

# PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c. WHEREAS by the Land Act 1958 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, Section 5, of the said Land Act 1958, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

# SHIRE OF BERWICK.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACTS.

Interim Development Order.

WHEREAS by virtue of the powers conferred by the Town and Country Planning Act, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the said Act has been commenced by the Council of the Shire of Berwick (hereinafter referred to as the "Responsible Authority") which hereby makes the following Interim Development Order.

- 1. The development of all land referred to in the Schedule and the erection, construction and carrying out of any buildings, roads, or other works on any of the said land is hereby prohibited.
- 2. Any person may apply to the Responsible Authority for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works, during the operation of this Order.
- 3. Any application for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works may be granted by the Responsible Authority subject to such conditions as are specified in the permit, or may be refused.
- 4. Any owner of any land who, after the publication of a copy of this order, contravenes any of the provisions contained herein, shall, when directed by notice in writing, remove, pull down, take up or alter any building, road or other works, and, if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any of such works and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier in accordance with the provisions of the Act.
- 5. None of the provisions of this order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this order.
- 6. This order shall remain in operation until the approval of the Planning Scheme in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Act, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.

Consent for Water Heating Systems Supplied by Named Persons.

PURSUANT to and for the purposes of the Restrictions on Electrical Apparatus Regulations, the State Electricity Commission of Victoria hereby consents to the installation, the connexion, and, subject as hereunder set out, the use in areas supplied with electricity by the Commission or obtained from it, of 4,812 electrical elements for the heating of water, each of a capacity not exceeding—

1,500 watts for a 30-gallon container 1,750 watts for a 40-gallon container 2,000 watts for a 50-gallon container

2,500 watts for a 60-gallon container

3,000 watts for a 70-gallon container 3,500 watts for an 80-gallon container

3,500 watts for an 85-gallon container

4,000 watts for a 100-gallon container

and so in proportion at the rate of 40 watts per gallon for any container larger than 100 gallons

in which water is heated by the element and each forming part of each of a number of hot-water systems supplied by the person whose name is set out opposite to that number in a list which the Commission has deposited with the Chamber of Manufactures, 312 Flinders-street, Melbourne, provided that at the time when the element is installed and at the time when it is connected there is fixed to the outer casing of the apparatus containing the element and applied in such a manner as to be conspicuous when the system is installed, an allocation label provided by the Commission to the said named person for the purpose of being fixed.

IN pursuance of section 36 of the Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1958 (No. 6312), the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

- 1. The Regulations made the Tenth day of October, 1956, entitled Melbourne Harbor Trust Superannuation Regulations are in these Regulations referred to as "the Principal Regulations". These Regulations shall come into operation on the 15th day of January, 1959, and shall be read as one with the Principal Regulations.
- 2. Regulation 23 of the Principal Regulations is amended as follows:
  - A. Delete paragraph (i) thereof and substitute the following new paragraph (i):—
  - "(i) Subject to paragraph 4 hereof, when a pension paid by the Commissioners is based upon the making by the employee throughout the period of his contribution of contributions corresponding at all times to the rates prescribed for the age of the employee there shall be debited to the Melbourne Harbor Trust Fund Account established under Melbourne Harbor Trust Act (No. 6312) and credited to the Superannuation Account by the Commissioners:—
    - 1. In respect of each such unit of pension paid-
      - (a) to a former contributor—a sum equal to the amount of such unit less £13;
      - (b) to a widow—a sum equal to the amount of such unit less £6 10s.
    - 2. In respect of the pension paid to a child—a sum equal to the amount of the annual rate of such pension less £6 10s. per annum."
  - B. Delete paragraph (3) thereof and substitute the following new paragraph (3):—
  - " (3)

# " (a) Contributor's Pension

Subject to paragraph 4 hereof, to determine the sum to be debited and credited as by the last preceding paragraph provided the total of the amount of the contributions made by the employee from time to time shall be subtracted from the amount of 3½ times the total amount of the contributions which would have been payable by the employee had he at all times

during the period of his contribution made contribution at the rates prescribed for his age, and the ratio of this difference to the amount of 3½ times the total of the amount of the contributions, which would have been payable by the employee had he at all times during the period of his contribution made contributions at the rates prescribed for his age, shall represent the fraction of the pension payment to be so debited and credited: Provided always that where the employee has made contributions pursuant to clause 17 for four Units of pension and no more, then in the above calculation there shall for the figure 3½ wherever appearing be substituted the figure 4.

(b) Widow's Pension

In respect of a pension payable to the widow of a contributor whose contributions were at any time at a rate other than that prescribed for the age of the employee (paragraph (2) of this clause) the amount to be debited to the Melbourne Harbor Trust Fund Account and credited to the Superannuation Account shall be the amount of such widow's pension less one-half of the amount that would be credited to the Superannuation Account pursuant to sub-paragraph 3 (a) immediately above, if the pension to which the said contributor would if he were alive be entitled under these Regulations was in fact being paid to him.

# (c) Child's Pension

In respect of a pension payable to a child, the amount to be debited to the Melbourne Harbor Trust Fund Account and credited to the Superannuation Account shall be the amount of the annual rate of pension payable less £6 10s. per annum."

For paragraph (a) of clause 56 there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

"(a) All provisions of this By-law applicable to service pipes shall apply equally to fire service pipes. Subject to the prior written consent of the Board private fire service pipes without meters will be allowed but every fire hose tap on such fire service pipe must be sealed except in cases where the Engineer-in-Chief shall have certified in writing that the sealing thereof is unnecessary. For each fire service pipe laid from a water main, arterial main or aqueduct there shall be paid to the Board on the fixing thereof a fee of Five pounds and thereafter an annual fee of Fifteen shillings. When with the approval of the Engineer-in-Chief a fire service pipe is extended from one tenement to one or more Fifteen shillings. When with the approval of the Engineer-in-Chief a fire service pipe is extended from one tenement to one or more abutting tenements under separate valuations there shall be paid to the Board an initial fee of Fifteen shillings in respect of each such extension and thereafter an annual fee of the like amount. When the fire service is installed and is required to be sealed by the Board there shall also be paid to the Board a sealing fee of Fifteen shillings. Except in the case of fire no person shall without the authority of the Board wilfully break the seal affixed to any fire hose tap on a fire service pipe, and in the event of any such seal being broken accidentally or otherwise the occupier of the tenement shall within twenty-four hours thereafter give notice in writing of the fact at the office of the Board. Should such occupier fall to do so he shall be guilty of an offence and of a continuing offence in respect of each day during which he shall neglect to give such notice. He shall, except in the case of fire, pay a resealing fee of Fifteen shillings."
