WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the eighth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. intituled the Hire-Purchase Act 1959 (No. 6531), it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Wednesday the 1st day of July One thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine as the day upon which the Hire-Purchase Act 1959 (No. 6531) shall come into operation.

Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1928 (No. 6407). PROHIBITION OF THE BRINGING OF CERTAIN FRUITS AND VEGETABLES INTO VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958, it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor in Council by Proclamation in the Government Gazette may subject to any. Regulations prohibit the importation, introduction or bringing into Victoria or any portion of Victoria of any tree, plant or vegetable which is in the opinion of the Governor in Council likely to introduce any disease or insect into Victoria: And whereas

by the said Act it is further enacted that insect means any insect whatever which the Governor in Council from time to time by Proclamation in the Government Gazette declares to be an insect within the meaning of Part I. of the said Act: And whereas the insect Fruit Fly (Trypetidæ) is in my opinion likely to be introduced into Victoria by the importation, introduction or bringing into Victoria of the fruits or vegetables specified hereunder: Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation declare the said insect to be an insect within the meaning of Part I. of the said Act and do further prohibit, subject to Regulations made under the Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1915, on the ninth day of October, 1916, as amended, and to Regulations by the said Act it is further enacted that insect means day of October, 1916, as amended, and to Regulations made this day under the Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958, any person importing, introducing or bringing into Victoria any of the fruits or vegetables specified hereunder:-

INDER the powers conferred by the Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958 (No. 6407), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby revoke the Proclamation made under the Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1928 on the thirtieth day of January, 1957, prohibiting the importing, introducing or bringing into Victoria the fruit of Capsicums, Plums or Mangoes.

VEGETATION AND VINE DISEASES ACT 1958 (No. 6407).

REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby amend the Regulations made under the Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1915 on the ninth day of October, 1916, as amended—

- (a) by the deletion from paragraph (d) of Regulation 8 of the following expression:—
 - "(3) Capsicums, Mangoes and Plums in the form of Schedule 'N'. After Schedule 'M' the following Schedule shall be inserted.";
- (b) by the deletion from paragraph (e) of Regulation 8 of the expression "Albury, Gooramadda, Wahgunyah, Mulwala, Cobram, Tocumwal, Echuca or Serviceton, or other places as may be approved by the Minister of Agriculture for the State of Victoria" and the substitution therefor of the expression "Albury, Wodonga, Echuca, Mildura, Bordertown or Mount Gambier."; and
- (c) by the deletion from the said Regulations of Schedule . ' N '.;

And being of opinion that the importation, introduction or bringing into Victoria of the fruits or vegetables specified in the First Schedule to these Regulations is likely to spread the insect Fruit Fly (*Trypetidw*) in Victoria, doth hereby make the following Regulations:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Fruit and Vegetables Importation Regulations 1959.
- 2. For the purposes of these Regulations, "inspection" means examination by an inspector appointed or holding office under and in accordance with the provisions of the Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958.
- 3. No person shall import, introduce or bring into Victoria any of the fruits or vegetables specified in the First Schedule hereto unless such fruits or vegetables are packed in accordance with the provisions of the *Fruit and Vegetables Act* 1958 and the Regulations made or continued thereunder (except that the exemptions provided for in paragraphs (a) and (b) of Part V. of the Regulations made on the eleventh day of November, 1935, shall not be permitted) and—
- (a) are accompanied by a certificate in the form contained in the Second or Third Schedules to these Regulations, or, except in the case of Capsicums, Mangoes and Plums—
 - (b) are carried by rail only or air only to the City of Melbourne for inspection thereat, or
 - (c) are carried by sea only to the Port of Melbourne or Geelong for inspection thereat, or
 - (d) are carried by road and are submitted for inspection at the border town of Albury, Wodonga, Echuca, Mildura, Bordertown or Mount Gambier.

Any person who commits a breach of or fails to comply with this Regulation shall be liable for the first offence to a penalty not exceeding One pound and for any subsequent offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

4. Notwithstanding the provisions contained in Regulation 3 of these Regulations, fruit or vegetables not packed in accordance with the provisions of the *Fruit and Vegetables Act* 1958 may be brought into Victoria provided that such fruit or vegetables are consigned to a packing house or factory for packing or processing for sale and comply with paragraphs (a), (b), (c) or (d) of that Regulation.

- 5. Notwithstanding any of the provisions contained in Regulations 3 and 4 of these Regulations, fruit or vegetables grown by a commercial horticulturist on land lying in the State of New South Wales within 20 miles of the River Murray between the Township of Mulwala and the South Australian border may be brought into Victoria for the purpose of sale or packing or processing for sale provided that-
 - (a) the fruit or vegetables are transported directly from the land on which they are produced to the place of sale or packing or processing by a route which does not enter any other part of the State of New South Wales, and that
 - (b) if fruit fly is known to have occurred in the State of New South Wales within a radius of 25 miles of the land on which they were produced within a period of twelve months prior to harvest, they are submitted for inspection at the nearest border crossing.
