Proclamation

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

Country Fire Authority Acts.

ALTERATION OF FIRE CONTROL REGIONS. URBAN FIRE DISTRICTS AND RURAL FIRE DISTRICTS.

- Excise from the rural fire district within the Seventh fire control region and add to the urban fire district within the Third fire control region the areas described in the Schedule hereto.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation of the Governor in Council issued on the sixteenth day of November, 1954, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the seventeenth day of November, 1954, for the purposes of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944*, certain parts of the country area of Victoria were proclaimed as fire control regions; and certain parts of such fire control regions were proclaimed to be urban fire districts; and the remainder (if any) of each such fire control region (being the area not included in any urban fire district) was proclaimed to be a rural district:

And whereas by section sixteen of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944* it is (amongst other things) enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after consideration of a report submitted by the Country Fire Authority by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*—

- add any area to or excise any area from any fire control region;
- add any area to or excise any area from any urban fire district;
- amend or alter the boundaries of rural districts within any region;

And whereas the Country Fire Authority has submitted a report that it is necessary and desirable that certain areas should be excised from the Seventh fire control region and added to the Third fire control region and that the rural fire district in the Seventh fire control region be altered and additions made to the urban fire district in the Third fire control region:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, after consideration of the said report of the Country Fire Authority, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Country Fire Authority Acts*, do by this my Proclamation—

- Excise from the Seventh fire control region and add to the Third fire control region those portions of the respective municipal districts described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

Shire of South Barwon; Parish of Barrarbool, County of Grant: Commencing at the junction of the Barwon River and Kardinia Creek, thence south-westerly along the east bank of the Kardinia Creek to Roslyn-road; thence south-easterly by a line to a point distant eighteen chains southerly from the south boundary of Roslyn-road and six chains twenty-five links westerly from the west boundary of Crown portion 9; thence easterly by a line parallel to and distant eighteen chains southerly from the south boundary of Roslyn-road to its intersection with a line parallel to and distant five chains westerly from the west boundary of the Colac-road; thence south-westerly by the last-mentioned line a distance of fifty chains; thence north-westerly by a line at right angles nine chains; thence south-westerly by a line at right angles eleven chains; thence south-easterly by a line at right angles twenty-two chains to a point five chains distant south-easterly from the east boundary of the Colac-road; thence south-westerly by a line parallel with and distant five chains south-easterly from the east boundary of the aforementioned road a distance of thirty-two chains; thence westerly by a line to a point on the west boundary of Valley-road South distant twenty-three chains and fifty links from the intersection of Valley-road South with the north boundary of Crown portion 8; thence northerly by the west boundary of Valley-road South a distance of fourteen chains; thence westerly by a line at right angles to a point the intersection of this line with the southern prolongation of the west boundary of Thornhill-road; thence northerly by a line and the west boundary of Thornhill-road to the north-east angle of subdivision F-483 on chart Crown portion 10; thence westerly by the north boundary of subdivision F-483 to the north-west angle thereof; thence northerly by the west boundary of Crown portion 10 and the east boundary of Scenic-road to Mount Pleasant-road; thence easterly by the north boundary of Mount Pleasant-road to the south-east angle of allotment 3, section 18; thence northerly by the east boundary of the last-mentioned allotment a distance of ten chains; thence easterly by a line at right angles to a point distant five chains westerly from the west boundary of Valley-road North; thence northerly by a line parallel with Valley-road North and five chains distant westerly from the west boundary thereof to the Barwon River; thence south-easterly by the south bank of the Barwon River to the point of commencement.

Shire of Corio; Parishes of Moorpanyul and Moranghurk, County of Grant: Commencing at a point the intersection of the shore of Corio Bay with the eastern prolongation of Sparks-road, Parish of Moorpanyul, County of Grant; thence westerly along Sparks-road to its intersection with Thompson-street; thence southerly along Thompson-street to its intersection with Separation-street; thence westerly along Separation-street to its intersection with Anakie-road; thence southerly along Anakie-road to the Ballarat-road; thence north-westerly along the Ballarat-road to its intersection with Vines-road; thence southerly along Vines-road to Church-street; thence westerly along Church-street to McCurdy-road; thence southerly along McCurdy-road to the north bank of the Barwon River; thence westerly by the north banks of the Barwon River and the Moorabool River to a point the intersection of the north bank of the Moorabool River with a line the southern prolongation of the west boundary of Rollins-road; thence northerly by a line and the west boundary of Rollins-road to the Geelong-Ballarat railway line; thence south-easterly by the railway line to Anakie-road; thence northerly by the west boundary of Anakie-road to its intersection with Goldsworthy-road; thence easterly by the north boundary of Goldsworthy-road to a point five chains distant westerly from the west boundary of the Bacchus Marsh-road; thence northerly by a line parallel with the Bacchus Marsh-road and five chains distant westerly from the west boundary thereof to its intersection with Plantation-road, Parish of Moranghurk; thence easterly by the north boundaries of Plantation-road and School-road to the intersection of School-road and Shell-parade; thence northerly by the west boundary of Shell-parade five chains; thence easterly by a line parallel with School-road and distant five chains northerly from the north boundary thereof to a point distant five chains westerly from the west boundary of Biddlecombe-avenue; thence northerly by a line parallel with Biddlecombe-avenue and distant five chains westerly from the west boundary thereof to its intersection with Mont View-road; thence easterly by the north boundary of Mont View-road and a line the eastern prolongation of the north boundary of Mont View-road to the shore of Limeburners Bay; thence southerly by the shores of Limeburners Bay and Corio Bay, Parishes of Moranghurk and Moorpanyul, to the point of commencement.

Shire of Bellarine; Parish of Moolap, County of Grant: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 1, section 13, Parish of Moolap, County of Grant; thence southerly by the east boundary of Coppards-road to its intersection with Townsend-road; thence westerly by the south boundary of Townsend-road to the north-west angle of allotment 1, section 8, Parish of Moolap; thence southerly by the east boundary of Wilsons-road to the Barwon River; thence north-westerly by the north bank of the Barwon River to Boundary-road; thence northerly by the east side of Boundary-road to the shore of Corio Bay; thence easterly by the shore of Corio Bay and southerly by the shore of Stingaree Bay to a point on a line the northern prolongation of the west boundary of allotment 1, section 13, Parish of Moolap; thence southerly by a line to the point of commencement.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me thereunto enabling, do by this my Proclamation provide as follows:—

- (1) Game Licences shall be issued by the Director of Fisheries and Game; such licences shall be according to Form "A" hereunder.
- (2) The fee for each Game Licence or renewal thereof shall be One Pound.

This licence confers no right of entry on private property without permission or on any area proclaimed under the Game Acts as a sanctuary for native game.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the seventh year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II., intituled the *Game (Licences) Act 1958* (No. 6473), it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation fix Tuesday, the twenty-seventh day of January, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine, as the day on which the said *Game (Licences) Act 1958* (No. 6473) shall come into operation.

Vermin and Noxious Weeds Acts.
SIMULTANEOUS DESTRUCTION OF RABBITS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 7 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1949* (No. 5431), as amended by section 2 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1957* (No. 6137), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation in relation to land in the whole of Victoria, or to land in any part of Victoria described in the Proclamation, require every owner or occupier of such land to destroy the vermin on such land by means of poisoning with sodium fluoroacetate (Compound 1080), strychnine or arsenic, or by fumigation of burrows and warrens, and specify the method by which poisoning or fumigation shall be undertaken, and further direct the time within which it shall be undertaken, and require such owners or occupiers to continue such poisoning or fumigation until the vermin are destroyed to the satisfaction of an Inspector.

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby, in relation to the land in the whole of Victoria, require every owner or occupier of such land to destroy certain vermin, to wit, rabbits, on such land by means of poisoning with sodium fluoroacetate (Compound 1080) in accordance with the *Monofluoroacetate Acid Derivatives Regulations 1958*, and direct that such poisoning shall be undertaken during the period of two weeks commencing on Monday, the twenty-third day of February, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine, and require such owners or occupiers to continue such poisoning until the rabbits are destroyed to the satisfaction of an Inspector.

PORTS IN VICTORIA—ALTERATION TO PORT RULES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the government and preservation of the said ports respectively and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs: And that any such regulations may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, by this Proclamation do hereby make the following addition and substitution to the Port Rules, that is to say:—

PORT RULES (EXPLOSIVES) 1910.

New Rule 16A.

No person—whether the master or person in charge of any motor or steam launch, yacht, sailing vessel or rowing boat or any other person whomsoever—shall without the written permission of the Port Officer, be within the waters of the area defined hereunder whilst explosives are being stored, conveyed, loaded or unloaded at the Explosives Pier or whilst any ship, launch or lighter engaged in the transportation of explosives is alongside such pier or within such area.

AREA.

Commencing at a point being the north-eastern corner of the fenced boundary of the Truganina Explosives Reserve, thence by a line bearing $116^{\circ} 20'$ for a distance of 1,698 feet, thence by a line bearing $206^{\circ} 20'$ for a distance of 2,476 feet, thence by a line bearing $116^{\circ} 20'$ for a distance of 1,559 feet, thence by the fenced boundary of the reserve to the point of commencement.

Port Rule 58 shall be repealed and the following rule substituted:—

PORT RULE 58.

Bathing or exercising horses is prohibited from or on that part of the foreshore, or in that portion of the sea adjacent to the foreshore, extending from an imaginary line, being the continuation seawards of the centre line of Head-street, Brighton, southerly and south-westerly to an imaginary line, being the continuation seawards of the centre line of New-street, Brighton.

NOTICE.

SIMULTANEOUS DESTRUCTION OF RABBITS BY POISONING WITH SODIUM FLUOROACETATE (COMPOUND 1080).

PURSUANT to the Proclamation for the simultaneous destruction of rabbits issued on 15th January, 1959, and published in this issue of the *Government Gazette*, I hereby give notice and warn the public that owners or occupiers of land in the whole of Victoria are required to lay poison baits incorporating sodium fluoroacetate (Compound 1080) on their land for the destruction of rabbits during the period of two weeks commencing on Monday, 23rd February, 1959.

The taking of rabbits (i.e. the trapping, snaring, shooting, or catching of rabbits by any means except by poison) is prohibited by law within Victoria during the period specified, and rabbits taken during this period are likely to endanger or be detrimental to human health or life if consumed as food.

Any person who takes or attempts to take rabbits in Victoria during the specified period shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

- (b) to continue to pay to the member whilst he is undergoing such course the salary and allowances applicable to his rank notwithstanding that the member whilst undergoing such course will not be called upon to perform police duties to the extent to which, if he were not undergoing such course, he might be called upon to perform—

both of which the Minister has agreed to do.

Now these presents witness that in consideration of the premises the member and the surety do hereby for themselves and their respective executors and administrators and also as separate covenants each of them doth hereby for himself his executors and administrators covenant with the Minister in the manner following, that is to say:—

- 1. That the member will apply himself diligently to the course of study provided and will not relinquish or discontinue such course without the consent, in writing, of the Minister first had and obtained, and will for a period (hereinafter called ‘the period’) of three years from the date of completion by him of the course remain in the said Victoria Police Force and perform such duties as may be assigned to him under and in pursuance of any Act or Regulation for the time being in force relating to the Police Force. Provided that in computing the said period any leave of absence (other than

for annual recreation leave) granted to the member at any time or times after the commencement of such period shall not be reckoned as part thereof.

2. That in the event of—

(a) the termination of the services of the member by any cause whatever other than death or physical or mental incapacity to perform his duties—

(i) at any time during the period of the course; or

(ii) after the completion of the course but before the expiration of the period;

(b) the failure of the member to make satisfactory progress in the course by reason of his own misconduct or neglect or from causes lying within his own powers (and the Minister shall be the sole judge as to whether or not a failure due to any such cause has occurred); or

(c) any relinquishment or discontinuance of the course by the member without the consent of the Minister

the member and the surety or one of them will forthwith on demand pay or cause to be paid to the Minister—

(1) an amount equal to the total amount of—

(i) the salary and allowances paid to the member whilst he was undergoing the course; and

(ii) the tuition fees paid on behalf of the member to the ; or

(2) the sum of Two hundred and fifty pounds, whichever sum is the lesser: Provided that in the event of the termination of the services of the member after the completion of the course but before the expiration of the period aforesaid, the total amount payable to the Minister under this clause may with the approval of the Minister be proportionately reduced in consideration of each completed period of three months' service as a member served after the completion of the course: Provided further that in calculating the amount of the salary and allowances paid to the member whilst undergoing the course there shall not be taken into account any payments made to him in respect of any period or periods during which he performed duties as a member of the Police Force.

3. That the liability of the surety his executors or administrators hereunder shall not be in any way released or discharged by reason of any time or other indulgence which the Minister may in his absolute discretion grant to the member whereby the time or mode of payment by the member of the whole or any portion of the moneys referred to in clause 2 of this Agreement may be extended or altered.

THE OMEO ELECTRIC LIGHTING ORDER No. 277,
1953—AMENDMENT TO TARIFF.

SECTION 1.

Where the undertakers charge any consumer by the electrical quantity supplied to him, they shall be entitled to charge him at the following rates:—

For electricity supplied for lighting purposes—

Two shillings and three pence (2s. 3d.) per unit.

For electricity supplied for purposes other than lighting—

One shilling and three pence (1s. 3d.) per unit.

SECTION 3.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order the undertakers may charge any consumer a minimum charge of 15s. per month irrespective of whether the supply is used for lighting or other purposes. Such minimum charge shall be exclusive of meter rent.

DEFINITION OF AREAS WITH RESPECT TO WHICH ELEVATORS HAVE BEEN CONSTRUCTED.

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of section 10 of the *Grain Elevators Act 1934*, it is amongst other things enacted that when an elevator is constructed, operated, maintained or controlled by the Grain Elevators Board in any place the Governor in Council may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* define an area as the area with respect to which the elevator has been constructed to provide facilities for handling wheat grown or being therein: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth by this Order hereby define each of the respective areas set forth in the subjoined Schedule as the area with respect to which the elevator specified in respect of such area has been constructed to provide facilities for handling wheat grown or being in such area, and doth hereby specify the twenty-second day of January, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine, as the date from and after which any person who, without the consent of the Grain Elevators Board, delivers for transport or for storage within any area so defined any wheat grown in Victoria except through the agency of the Grain Elevators Board shall (unless exempted by the By-laws made under the said Act or otherwise by the said sub-section) be guilty of an offence.
