


Parish of Geelengla, County of Hampden, being the road indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(G.181(3) (D.32039).



LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1958.

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 928 (2) of the Local Government Act 1958 provides—inter alia—that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, at the request of the council of any municipality not being a city or town extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX, of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality, or any nart thereof: part thereof:

And whereas the Councils of the Shires of Bet Bet and Tambo have requested that the said Regulations be extended to parts of the municipal districts of the said Shires:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Local Government Act 1958 to such parts of the municipal districts of the Shires of Bet Bet and Tambo as are described hereunder, and order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the afore-mentioned parts of municipal districts thereof on publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 28th October, 1959, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Councils of the said municipalities to make By-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said chapter, and provided, further, that no such By-law shall come into operation before the 28th October, 1959.

CERTAIN PLANT DECLARED TO BE A NOXIOUS WEED WITHIN THE SHIRE OF SOUTH BARWON.

PROCLAMATION

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 3 sub-section (2) of the Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1958 (No. 6409), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare the plant named hereunder to be a noxious weed for the purpose of the above Act within the Shire of South Barwon, viz:—

Acacia (Armata R. Br.) "Acacia Hedge" or "Prickly Acacia" (except existing hedges not exceeding 6 feet in height and 3 feet in width).



WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange

acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Mornington has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used for a street within the said Shire, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land used for a street being part of land known as Domain-drive, and being part of Crown section 35, Parish of Moorooduc, and being indicated by hachure on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

Country Fire Authority Act 1958.
ALTERATION OF FIRE CONTROL REGIONS, URBAN FIRE DISTRICTS AND RURAL FIRE DISTRICTS.

- PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation of the Governor in Council issued on the sixteenth day of November, 1954, and published in the Government Gazette of the seventeenth day of November, 1954, for the purposes of the Gountry Fire Authority Act 1944, certain parts of the country area of Victoria were proclaimed as fire control regions; and certain parts of such fire control regions were proclaimed to be urban fire districts; and the remainder (if any) of each such fire control region (being the area not included in any urban fire district) was proclaimed to be a rural district:

And whereas by section sixteen of the Country Fire

And whereas by section sixteen of the Country Fire Authority Act 1958 it is (amongst other things) enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after consideration of a report submitted by the Country Fire Authority by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette—

- (1) add any area to or excise any area from any fire $\frac{3\pi^2(n)^{\frac{3}{2}}}{2}$ control region;
- (2) add any area to or excise any area from any urban fire district;
- (3) amend or alter the boundaries of rural districts within any region;

And whereas the Country Fire Authority has submitted a report that it is necessary and desirable that certain areas should be excised from the Tenth fire control region and the urban and rural fire districts contained therein and added to the Ninth fire control region and the urban and rural fire districts contained therein:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, after consideration of the said, report of the Country Fire Authority, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Country Fire Authority—Act, do by this my Proclamation—

- Excise from the Tenth fire control region and add to the Ninth fire control region, the municipal district of the Shire of South Gippsland;
- Excise from the urban fire district within the Tenth fire control region and add to the urban fire district within the Ninth fire control region, the areas described in the Schedule hereto;
- 3. Alter the boundaries of the rural fire districts within/the Ninth and Tenth fire control regions to the extent rendered necessary by the aforementioned excisions from and additions to urban fire districts of those areas which are described in the Schedule hereto.





If within fourteen days after such publication such motor car shall be claimed by any person producing to the Council proof to its satisfaction that he is the owner or entitled to possession thereof, and the appropriate charge prescribed by this By-law shall be paid in respect thereof, such motor car shall be released to such person.
- 6. (a) Where any such motor car is not so released within fourteen days after the publication of such notice as aforesaid, the Council may, after a period of 21 days from the expiration of such notice, cause the same to be

(b) The proceeds of such sale shall be applied firstly in payment of the appropriate charge for the removal thereof, and the residue (if any) shall be payable to any person producing to the Council proof to its satisfaction that he is the owner of such motor car and entitled to receive such residue. receive such residue.

(c) If within three months after the date of such sale no person shall have claimed the residue, and produced such proof as aforesaid to the Council, the residue shall be paid into the Municipal Fund.

- 7. If the Council shall be unable to sell such motor car within one month from the expiration of such period of 21 days, the same may be disposed of by the Council in such manner as it may think fit.
- 8. The charge for the removal of any derelict or unregistered motor car, pursuant to this By-law, is hereby prescribed as a sum equivalent to Fifteen shillings for each mile, or part thereof, of the distance between the place where such motor car was left standing to the place set aside by the Council pursuant to clause 3 hereof.
